TRAINERS

PREMIERSHIP WINNERS

... David and Scott Brunton

Successful father and son duo
David and Scott Brunton

The father and son training partnership of David and Scott Brunton celebrated another great season by winning the 2011-12 trainers' premiership by a healthy margin.

Team Brunton finished with 70 and 1/2 winners to be a clear winner from their nearest rival Leon Wells, who enjoyed one of his best seasons with 38 wins that included capturing the Group 3 Bow Mistress Takes with his star mare Rebel Bride.

The season started slowly for the Bruntons but as the big races loomed their team began to blossom.

David Brunton is very pleased with the outcome. "This has been a very good season for us for a lot of reasons," he said.

"Lady Lynette winning a Group 2 was a big thrill, but winning the Launceston Cup with Prevailing was probably the best win because it is a major in our own state, however, winning with Prevailing at Moonee Valley was also a buzz."

"Good things have happened for us during the season and there have been a lot of highlights including our three-year-old Buzzing Along when she won the 3YO Cup in a head-bobber and then ran second to Lady Lynette in the Vamos Stakes – that was a bit special," he said.

According to David the stable went through a cleaning out process as the season progressed.

"We've had a bit of a clean-out year where horses have got to their marks and had to be moved on and we also have unearthed a couple of very promising young horses that showed up and were tipped out with the hope of doing well this coming season," he said.

JOCKEY PREMIERSHIP WINNER

... Stephen Maskiell

STEPHEN MASKIELL has long been one of Tasmania's best and most consistent jockeys and his toil last season was rewarded by winning his eighth premiership.

Maskiell ended the season with 64 and 1/2 winners to finishing only a half-a-win clear of his arch-rival Brendon McCoull who had his hopes of winning a 13th title dashed by an injury that sidelined him for the last four meetings of the season.

There were feature race highlights for Maskiell that included winning the Brighton Cup aboard the highly promising stayer The Cleaner and he produced a gun ride to get Buzzing Along home in the very last stride to win the 3YO Cup over Anelene in one of the tightest photo-finishes of the season.

Maskiell spread his wins around the state with the majority emerging in Hobart where he rode 23 winners (including a dead-heat) but only marginally over Launceston (22) and Devonport (20).

He is the consummate professional who is an avid track walker and there is no rider who studies the form better than Maskiell.


Maskiell is in the twilight of his riding career but he is adamant he still has a few more good years left in him and has the capacity to win more premierships.



APPRENTICE JOCKEY

PREMIERSHIP WINNER

... Rasit Yetimova



RASIT YETIMOVA is one of two apprentices who arrived in Tasmania from Turkey last year to make an impact on Tasmanian racing.

Yetimova and Bulent Muhcu have developed into top young riders during their time in the state as indentured apprentices to Tasmanian Hall Of Fame trainer Walter McShane.

But it was Yetimova who tackled the challenge head-on and emerged

as one of the top five riders in the state with a season tally of 35 winners to clearly win the apprentice's title from his fellow countryman Bulent Muhcu who ended the season with a double at the last meeting to take his tally to 20 and 1/2 wins.

Yetimova had success for many trainers but his multiple wins aboard Gee Gees La Quita and Jay Bee's Gee Gee for Brighton trainer Stuart Gandy were probably more special as trainer and rider have become mates.

Yetimova had more success in Launceston where he rode 15 winners compared to 10 in Hobart and Devonport.

The horse on which he enjoyed most success was the Stephen Lockhart-trained mare Vivre La Nett on which he had three wins.

Yetimova spent the last part of the season on loan to Spreyton trainer Leon Wells and while there he rode 5 winners for his temporary mentor.

BUILD A BRIDGE

has been a good money spinner for her owner-breeders Runnymede Stud Syndicate in the past 12 months.

The Charlie Goggin and Luella Meaburn-trained mare won six races over two preparations that included five from six starts from June to mid August last year.

She was undoubtedly Victorian apprentice Talia Rodder's favourite horse as she partnered

the now six-year-old mare in all of those wins that varied in distance from 1400-1620m.

Her four consecutive wins in the space of seven weeks was testament to her consistency and ability to handle various types of going ranging from dead 4 to a heavy 8.

Build A Bridge went for a lengthy spell and returned for two runs in January-February with

a third at her second run back her best effort. After another short let-up she returned to tackle a few races that included the \$25,000 Autumn Classic for fillies and mares over her pet distance of 1400m in Launceston which she won with talented jockey Shannon Brazil aboard.

No doubt Build A Bridge will continue to be a valuable asset for Runnymede as a broodmare.

AUTUMN STARS



Talented two-year-old **WESTERN HERO** took his owners on the ride of a lifetime last season winning five of his nine starts for over \$120,000 in stakes.

The Terry Evans-trained gelded son of West Quest won four feature races including the Alexandra Plate before having his colours lowered by Kenjorwood in the Alfa Bowl in Launceston.

After a 10-week break he returned to be placed in the \$100,000 Listed Elwick Stakes behind Victorian Bush Aviator and he followed up with a second to Tiger's Cub in the Magic Millions Classic at the same venue.

Western Hero closed with three wins in succession, ending his campaign with an emphatic victory in the \$50,000 Sires Produce Stakes in which he scored by almost five

lengths from the highly promising Keep The Cash.

Western Hero was purchased at the Tasmanian Magic Millions Yearling Sale for \$11,000 by The Horse Racing Tragics Two Syndicate that is managed by Adam Upton.

The gelding's feats last season are likely to earn him the title of Tasmanian 2YO of the Year.

had only six starts in Tasmania last season for four wins and two seconds making him one of the most consistent three-year-olds in the state.

He opened his 3YO account with consecutive wins in Hobart and after two gallant seconds, the first to Bionic Star and

the next to Galibier, he won an open 3YO defeating Galibier and ended his Tasmanian campaign with a resounding victory in the \$25,000 Autumn Classic over 1400 metres in Launceston.

Huon Knight was bred by Rex Colless and is raced by him and his partner Kerstin Braun, along with

friends David Garlic, Mark Greenhaigh, Bob Powell and Cheryl Nichols.

Connections sent the horse to Victoria for a short campaign in June but he didn't settle in as well as expected and was spelled after only two runs on country tracks.



AUTUMN STARS

ROYAL MISWAKI

began the 2011-12 season as a troubled four-year-old that had won one race and that was at her first start as a two-year-old.

She won the 2YO Alfa Bowl in November 2009 but it wasn't until she changed stables into the care of Spreyton-based mentor Michael Trinder that the mare began to realise her potential.

The daughter of Tough Speed from the Rory's

Jester mare Royal Ruby was one of the most consistent mares to race in Tasmania.

She had 10 starts in the five months from mid December to mid May that reaped six wins and included victories in the Ulverstone Cup (1650m) and Deloraine Cup (2360m) on her home track at Devonport and she ended her campaign with a brilliant victory in the \$30,000 St Leger over 2100 metres in Launceston.

Trainer Michael Trinder regards Royal Miswaki as a potential major cups prospect and he no doubt is hoping she can improve further to be competitive in this season's AAMI Hobart and Launceston Cups.

Even if she doesn't measure up there are a plethora of middle distance and staying races she can contest along the way.

Programme Notes

September - November 2012

The programme was delivered following consultation with industry delegates. This occurred following the completion of the initial draft grid supplied by the RVL programming department.

The Spring 2012 Calendar marks the last programme grid to be delivered covering 3 months. The next edition 'Summer 2012', will not only cover the Tasmanian Summer Racing Carnival (TSRC), but will also encompass a 4 month programme grid from December 2012 to March 2013, as Tasracing recognises the importance of producing a programme that allows Trainers and Owners greater information and transparency to facilitate the programming of their horses preparations.

The September - November grid sees a number of minor initiatives which are predominantly centered around the TSRC and brought about to enhance diversity in options for owners. These include:

- The restructure of the early season 2YO feature races, namely the Alexandra Plate and Alfa Bowl, to December and January respectively. Providing a more realistic lead in time to the major 2YO features in February, the Elwick Stakes and Gold Sovereign Stakes.
- With regard to the early season 2YO fixtures, races will continue to be held for 2YO's from early November, in line with 2011.
- The realignment of the 3YO Cup to early December and the inclusion of a 1400m 3YO Set Weights race mid December, providing better continuity for 3YO's heading into the Tasmanian Guineas on 2 January and beyond to the Tasmanian Derby and Oaks.
- The Spring programme sees the reintroduction of Class 4 races to assist in the promotion of the progressive class of horse through towards the TSRC feature races.
- The continuation of Maiden 1350m races at DRC Tapeta Park, providing greater opportunities through diversification in distances and surfaces. This follows a successful trial during the winter programme.
- Another initiative is the alteration of the barrier trial nomination closing times. Introduced on 1 August 2012, the closing time for Tuesday barrier trial nominations will now be the day before, Monday 9am.



tasBonus Scheme

Why do we need a new bonus scheme?

For many years, the Tasmanian scheme has been closely aligned to RVL's (Racing Victoria Limited) SuperVOBIS scheme and partially subsidised by RVL. A change in funding arrangements with RVL for the Tasmanian scheme has necessitated the implementation of the new tasBonus scheme. Continued support for Tasmanian owners and breeders is consistent with Tasracing's Corporate Plan.

The SuperVOBIS working group committee which included representatives from TasBreeders and Thoroughbred Racehorse Owners Association (TROA), agreed upon the structure and details of the new scheme.

Eligibility

Yearlings that qualify for the scheme are:

- Tasmanian-sired (Tasmanian-based sire)
- Tasmanian-bred (mare must be Tasmanian-owned), based on Australian Stud Book registered breeder location
- Catalogued for sale at the Tasmanian Yearling Sale (any breeding)

Costs

Breeder Nomination: \$220 (incl GST)
Owner Nomination: \$330 (incl GST)

A horse may be only breeder nominated or only owner nominated or both.

The dual nomination shares the costs between both parties and reduces the overall cost from \$660 including GST (previous SuperVOBIS) to \$550 including GST (tasBonus).

A once-off fee is paid to Tasracing when the horse is a yearling and the horse then becomes eligible for a bonus whilst it is a 2, 3 and 4 year old, for its maiden win or for one of any special bonus races.

Mainland Sale Horses

Under the new tasBonus scheme, interstate-sired horses purchased at mainland sales or as tried racehorses will no longer be eligible for the bonuses.

Commencement of the tasBonus Scheme

The tasBonus scheme will be implemented for horses turning one year of age on 1 August 2012 (foaled in 2010). Tasracing will honour the current arrangements with the SuperVOBIS scheme for this season's (and prior) yearlings.

The new tasBonus scheme does not pay bonuses for any horses that win or are placed in SuperVOBIS bonus races run in Victoria.

However, in order to cater for those wishing to have access to these bonuses, a separate scheme SuperVOBIS (Tas) will operate in conjunction with the new tasBonus scheme and be administered by Tasracing.

The SuperVOBIS (Tas) scheme will be available to nominators of Tasmanian sired horses only and will operate under the same fee, bonus and dead-line structure as the existing Victorian scheme. This will allow breeders targeting interstate purchasers to enhance their yearling with Victorian SuperVOBIS endowments.

There is no association between RVL Victorian SuperVOBIS Scheme and Tasracing's SuperVOBIS (Tas) Scheme and as such Victorian sired horses need to be nominated and paid through RVL to be eligible for the SuperVOBIS Victorian Scheme.

Bonus Payments

This bonus differs from the original SuperVOBIS scheme by increasing the bonus from \$3,000 (SuperVOBIS) to \$4,000 (tasBonus) for 2YO and 3YO horses.*

*Refer bonus table below.

Special Bonus Races

In addition, owners and breeders will receive an additional \$4,000 (\$3,000 owner/\$1,000 breeder) bonus for non-maiden horses winning specified 2YO and 3YO races (under \$50,000). A maiden winning a specified race will however only be eligible for its maiden bonus (i.e. The special race bonus will not apply). These will include four feature 2YO races, three feature 3YO races and approximately 16 open 2YO and 3YO races throughout the season.

Double Up Sale Voucher Option

The new scheme will also feature a "Double Up Sale Voucher" facility for owners (this feature does not apply to breeders). These will allow the winning owners of specified races as mentioned above, the option of converting their \$3,000 cash bonus into a \$6,000 sale credit. This credit must be redeemed at the subsequent Tasmanian Yearling Sale. Owners will be given 14 days to notify whether they would like their \$3,000 cash bonus converted into a \$6,000 sale credit.







Benchmark Racing in Tasmania

What is a Benchmark race?

- A Benchmark race is a Handicap based on rating.
- There is no upper or lower limit on eligibility. In simple terms a Benchmark race is open to all horses.
- The weights assigned to each entry relate to the Benchmark rating assigned to the race.

Where are Benchmark Races currently run?

Benchmark races were first introduced in South Africa in 1999 and then in Singapore in 2002. They are also run in Dubai and Japan. In Australia they were introduced into NSW racing in October 2009.

How do Benchmark Races vary from ratings based races currently run in Tasmania?

The main point of difference between Benchmark races and ratings based (RB) races conducted, is eligibility. As an example: in a 0-75 RB race only horses rated 75 and below can enter. A horse rated 75 will receive 59kg. Any horse with a rating higher than 75 is ineligible. In a Benchmark 78 race any horse can enter (irrespective of rating). A horse rated 78 will receive 59kg. A horse rated 79 is eligible and will carry 59.5kg (i.e. an additional 0.5kg for each point over the Benchmark number). A horse rated 80 will carry 60kg and so on.

Fillies and Mares Allowance

When competing against male horses fillies and mares shall receive a 2.0kg weight allowance.

3YO Allowance

When 3YO's race against older horses they will receive a weight allowance which is a sliding scale adjusted quarterly from an initial 2.5kg in August to nil by the end of the season. This reflects on the developing maturity of 3YO's as the season progresses. When competing in open class races the Handicapper will assess their form against the current WFA scale to determine an appropriate allowance if any.

The elimination order for both races is exactly the same. The construction of weights for both races are exactly the same other than in Benchmark races each point over the 59kg Benchmark rating is the equivalent of an extra 0.5kg in weight.

While the Benchmark weight for races in Tasmania will be 59kg the same policies with regard to minimum top weight at declaration of weights 59kg and minimum top weight at final acceptance (59kg in all races) would continue to apply. As an example if the highest rate horse entered for a Benchmark 78 race was a horse rated 77 (normally 58.5kg) he would be allocated 59kg and all other weights would be adjusted accordingly (+0.5kg).

What are the benefits of Benchmark Races?

- Creates more opportunities for industry participants to place their horses by reducing the restrictions on eligibility.
- Likely to have a modest positive impact on field sizes as horses which may have not been catered for in a particular week might source a suitable Benchmark race in which they can enter and run with a high weight.
- Benchmark races open the top of the weight scale providing bigger spreads in weights, in turn, theoretically delivering more competitive races with additional form lines driving wagering.

Stewards Segment

Licence Identification

The Stewards would like to remind trainers and strappers of the provisions of the local rule 21.6 which states:

21.6 Licensed persons shall at all times when present on a racecourse in connection with the care, control, supervision or training of a horse, display his identification card when requested.

Failure to adhere to this rule may result in action being taken. Licence checks will also be conducted regularly for strappers and track work riders and penalties applied to trainers for the employment of any unlicensed staff.

Race Day Barrier Manners and Local Rule 4.11

4.11 The Stewards may suspend from starting, for a period as they think fit, any horse which they consider has been unruly or wayward. Any horse so suspended, shall not be permitted to start in any race until such time as it has performed a designated trial, test or gallop to the satisfaction of the Stewards.

Horses which prove difficult to load, fractious behind or in the gates or display any behaviour which may cause safety issues and/or delays will be subject to some form of action by the Steward's panel.

The following measures may apply:

- The horse will be declared a late scratching by order of Stewards acting on either advice from the Starter, Veterinary Surgeon or the Steward's own observations.
- A warning - this will be noted in Events on the RISA database with a description of the manners in question.
- Stood down from racing until the completion of a satisfactory barrier test (Jump out) or pre race manners test (mounting yard or preliminary) with a number of other horses. This can be completed under the supervision of a Steward or Track Steward at any time during track work hours.
- Stood down pending a satisfactory trial or a number of consecutive trials. The horse should be nominated for official trials and will then be scrutinised by the officiating RST Steward.
- Barred from racing - Once all the appropriate avenues of re-education and trials have been exhausted and the manners of a horse have not improved then the last option is to prohibit the horse from racing completely.

Pre Race Manners

Horses that are fractious in the mounting yard and/or display manners which are dangerous en route to the barriers such as bucking, rearing, "jacking up" bolting or lead to a delay to the starting time of the race will be subject to the same actions as listed above.

StrideMASTER



StrideMASTER in situ

Weighing less than 70 grams, the tracker is carried in the saddle cloth of each horse. It uses a combination of GPS and movement sensors to capture detailed information about each horse's performance.

The device provides a wealth of information that would have previously only been available in a university testing environment. Tasracing understands that this is the first time that this type of information is being collected and made available anywhere in the world.

Tasracing has launched a revolutionary new sectional timing device which provides a way of collecting performance information of horses during races. Working closely with the developer, Tasracing launched the StrideMASTER system in July 2011.

For the first time, sectional timing information is available for all Tasmanian races for the entirety of the race, tracking each individual horse.

As well as collecting speed, sectional times and positions in running, it is the first system that has been implemented that captures biometric data on each horse's stride.

This includes stride length, stride count and stride duration.

When the stride data is combined with speed information, the system can provide a measure of each horse's stride efficiency. Stride efficiency looks at how stride length, stride duration and speed compare to known performance benchmarks.

The data from StrideMASTER enables trainers, owners, jockeys and punters to better understand a horse's performance, its level of fitness and its athletic potential.

The data is amassed quickly and reports can be generated within a few minutes of the finish of a race,

providing extremely detailed insights into individual horse performance.

StrideMASTER has the potential to assist with race day integrity functions (utilising GPS information), as a research tool and as a veterinary diagnostic device. Being able to collect large amounts of actual racing data will allow statistically powerful studies examining correlation between biometric data and racehorse performance.

In time, StrideMASTER data will greatly assist in the identification and quantification of a superior athlete or a potential superior athlete.



StrideMASTER – tracker case

The StrideMASTER Tracker Case is a portable mobile hub which houses the StrideMASTER trackers. Three sets of trackers are housed in the hub, with each set of trackers used once every three races. When the hub is connected to the StrideMASTER laptop, trackers are assigned for each horse in the upcoming race. After each race the data is downloaded from each tracker back to the StrideMASTER laptop from which reports can be subsequently generated. The hub also charges the trackers continuously throughout the day.

These figures reflect the average of the horse's overall performance for the race. For example this horse had an average stride length of 6.87m throughout the race.

- POSITION IN RUNNING**
Position in running is the horse's actual position during the race at each designated 200 metre section. Margins reflect the actual distance from the lead horse (measured in lengths).
- SECTIONAL TIME (Seconds)**
Time taken between two points on the track, 200 metres apart.
- CUMULATIVE TIME (Seconds)**
The cumulative time taken at each sectional marker in the race.
- SPEED (Metres per Second)**
Average speed measured over each 200 metre section.
- STRIDE LENGTH (Metres)**
Stride length is the individual length of a horse's stride. The figure presented is an average stride length for each 200m section. [Stride Length = 200m ÷ Stride Count]
- STRIDE DURATION (Seconds)**
Stride Duration is the time taken for the horse to take each stride. The figure presented is an average stride duration for each 200m section. [Stride Duration = Sectional Time ÷ Stride Count]
- STRIDE EFFICIENCY (%)**
Compares stride length, stride duration and speed to an elite racehorse running 11 second 200m sections. The benchmark for stride length, stride duration and speed are 8m, 0.44s and 18.18 metres per second respectively.
- STRIDE COUNT**
Stride Count is the total number of strides taken in each 200m section. [Stride Count = Number of Strides]

StrideMASTER Speed Maps

Incorporating all previous runs, StrideMASTER Speed Maps positions horses in the race based on recent racing patterns.

Generated by the settling position of each horse, StrideMASTER Speed Maps gauge a horse's racing pattern and positions them in one of three categories: FORWARD, MIDDLE or BACK.

The inclusion of additional runs collected from StrideMASTER reduces variables and allows the system to determine the horse's exact settling position based on previous starts.

These patterns are then positioned against the other horses in the field to determine the horse's position in the run as well as predicting the race tempo based on the number of horses in each category.

And the more data StrideMASTER collects, the more accurate it becomes.

Increased accuracy of the field also allows for the running of a justified tempo, providing a clearer reflection of how the race will unfold.

INDUSTRY NOTICE

HELMETS

This notice informs industry stakeholders of developments concerning the helmets worn in Australian thoroughbred racing.

In 2007 Racing NSW engaged the University of New South Wales (UNSW) to collaborate with it and to undertake research and development in respect of a high performance equestrian helmet study ("the helmet study"). The helmet study is a sub-project of the RIRDC safety study.

The helmet study has attempted to construct a helmet that will meet a higher safety specification for thoroughbred racing activity.

The Australian Racing Board wishes to ensure that helmets which meet certain higher performance safety requirements become used within Australian racing so as to enhance the safety of the industry's participants.

The Australian Racing Board makes the Australian Rules of Racing. Pursuant to AR.87A every licensed or registered person or permit holder must, when mounted on a horse, wear a properly-affixed helmet which conforms to one of the standards that have been approved by the Australian Racing Board. The purposes of AR.87A are to make the wearing of helmets by riders compulsory; and to ensure that the helmets which are worn are helmets which offer the maximum protection to riders. Upon being satisfied that a manufacturer is able to manufacture helmets which comply with one of the nominated equestrian helmet standards required by AR.87A and the additional ARB 2012 higher performance safety requirements - together known as ARB HS 2012 (short for ARB Helmet Safety Standard 2012), and are suitable for use in Australian racing, the Australian Racing Board intends to exercise its power under AR.87A so as to make it compulsory for jockeys riding in races to wear helmets which comply with ARB HS 2012. This requirement would come into effect no later than 6 months from the date of the Australian Racing Board's exercise of this power. The Australian Racing Board will also exercise its power under AR.87A to make it compulsory for track work riders and others riding horses in the racing industry to wear helmets which comply with ARB HS 2012, no later than 12 months from the date of the exercise of this power. The Australian Racing Board is not fettered in its future exercise of power under AR.87A.

ALLOWABLE MAXIMUM NO OF INDIVIDUAL OWNERS PER HORSE

The Australian Racing Board is pleased to announce that it has increased the maximum number of individual owners allowed per horse from 10 to 20.

The change came at the request of the national body representing owners, ATROC. From talking to it members ATROC believe that increasing the cap from 10 to 20 will enhance interest in horse racing ownership. The Australian Racing Board is keen to do everything possible to increase participation in race horse ownership.

The rule amendment will come into effect from the commencement of the new racing season on 1st August 2012.

ADDITIONS TO DEFINITIONS

1. The following be added to AR.1 (Definitions) with effect from 1st October 2012.

“therapeutic substance” means a prohibited substance to which a screening limit applies, and which is promulgated as such from time to time by the Australian Racing Board and published in the Racing Calendar,

“screening limit” means the concentration of a therapeutic substance or its specified metabolite present in a sample during a screening test or analysis as specified in AR.178(2), above which the therapeutic substance will be notified as a prohibited substance.

2. The following new provision AR.178EA be added to the Australian Rules of Racing with effect from 1st October, 2012.

“AR.178EA”

- (1) In relation to the testing for the presence of a therapeutic substance in a sample taken at any time from a horse there must be an initial screening test or screening analysis of the sample.

- (2) As a minimum requirement, the initial screening test or screening analysis is to be conducted as follows:
 - (a) A biological matrix, equivalent in volume to the sample, is to have added to it a quantity of the therapeutic substance, or its specified metabolite, sufficient to bring its concentration to the screening limit specified for that therapeutic substance. This is known as the spiked sample and is to be analysed concurrently with the sample.
 - (b) The sample is then to be tested to ascertain whether or not it contains a quantity of the therapeutic substance, or its specified metabolite, that exceeds that screening limit by making a direct comparison with the spiked sample.
 - (c) If the screening limit is not exceeded, the detection of the therapeutic substance is not to be reported.
 - (d) If the screening limit is exceeded then the sample is to be further tested in accordance with normal laboratory procedures designed to certify the presence of the therapeutic substance in the sample.
- (3) A therapeutic substance for the purpose of this Rule and the screening limit applicable to it or its specified metabolite shall be promulgated from time to time by the Australian Racing Board and published in the Racing Calendar.
- (4) The screening limit testing provided for in this Rule is not intended and does not operate to mean that for the purpose of the Rules and the therapeutic substance only becomes prohibited substance if and when the screening limit is exceeded.
- (5) It shall not be a defence to any charge under AR.177, AR. 177A or AR.178 that the result of any initial screening test or screening analysis should have been below the screening limit for the therapeutic substance in question.

SCREENING LIMITS POLICY

Background relating to prohibited substances

1. The ARR include provisions dealing with what are termed prohibited substances. The definition of what is a prohibited substance is deliberately framed to cast an extremely wide net. This has been done so as to give effect to a policy which is colloquially described as “zero tolerance” or drug-free racing. The three definitional provisions are as follows:

AR.1. “Prohibited Substance” means a substance declared by these Rules to be a prohibited substance, or which falls within any of the groups of substances declared by these Rules to be prohibited substances unless it is specifically excepted.

AR.178B. The following substances are declared as prohibited substances:

- (1) Substances capable at any time of causing either directly or indirectly an action or effect, or both an action and effect, within one or more of the following mammalian body systems:

the nervous system
the cardiovascular system
the respiratory system
the digestive system
the musculo-skeletal system
the endocrine system
the urinary system
the reproductive system
the blood system
the immune system

- (2) Substances falling within, but not limited to, the following categories:

acidifying agents
adrenergic blocking agents
adrenergic stimulants
agents affecting calcium and bone metabolism
alcohols
alkalinising agents

anabolic agents
anaesthetic agents
analgesics
antiangina agents
antianxiety agents
antiarrhythmic agents
anticholinergic agents
anticoagulants
anticonvulsants
antidepressants
antiemetics
antifibrinolytic agents
antihistamines
antihypertensive agents
anti-inflammatory agents
antinauseants
antineoplastic agents
antipsychotic agents
antipyretics
antirheumatoid agents
antispasmodic agents
antithrombotic agents
antitussive agents
blood coagulants
bronchodilators
bronchospasm relaxants
buffering agents
central nervous system stimulants
cholinergic agents
corticosteroids

- (3) Metabolites, artifacts and isomers of the prohibited substances prescribed by subrules (1) and (2) of this rule.

AR 178C. (1) The following prohibited substances when present at or below the concentrations respectively set out are excepted from the provisions of AR.178B:

- (a) Alkalinising agents, when evidenced by total carbon dioxide (TCO₂) at a concentration of 36.0 millimoles per litre in plasma.
- (b) Arsenic at a mass concentration of 0.30 milligrams per litre in urine.
- (c) Dimethyl sulphoxide at a mass concentration of 15 milligrams per litre in urine or 1.0 milligrams per litre in plasma.
- (d) In male horses other than geldings, 5- α -estrane-3 β , 17 β -diol in urine (including both the free substance and that liberated from its conjugates) at a mass concentration equal to or less than that of 5(10) estrane-3 β , 17 β -diol in urine (including both the free substance and that liberated from its conjugates).
- (e) Salicylic acid at a mass concentration of 750 milligrams per litre in urine or 6.5 milligrams per litre in plasma.
- (f) Hydrocortisone at a mass concentration of 1.00 milligrams per litre in urine.
- (g) Testosterone (including both free testosterone and testosterone liberated from its conjugates):
 - (i) in geldings: at a mass concentration of 20 micrograms per litre in urine;
 - (ii) in fillies and mares: at a mass concentration of 55 micrograms per litre in urine.
 - (iii) in fillies and mares that have been notified as pregnant pursuant to the requirements of AR.64E(2): at any concentration.
- (h) 3-Methoxytyramine (including both free 3-methoxytyramine and 3-methoxytyramine liberated from its conjugates) at a mass concentration of 4.0 milligrams per litre in urine.
- (j) Boldenone in male horses other than geldings, (including both free boldenone and boldenone liberated from its conjugates) at a mass concentration of 15 micrograms per litre in urine.

- (k) Theobromine at a mass concentration of 2.00 milligrams per litre in urine.

- (2) The following substances are excepted from the provisions of AR.178B:

antimicrobials (antibiotics) and other anti-infective agents but not including procaine penicillin
antiparasitics approved and registered for use in horses
ranitidine
omeprazole
ambroxol
bromhexine
dembrexine
registered vaccines against infectious agents orally administered glucosamine orally administered chondroitin sulphate altrenogest when administered to fillies and mares.

2. There are then a number of provisions dealing with the consequences of a prohibited substance being detected in a sample taken from a horse:

AR.177 (which provides that any horse that has been brought to a racecourse and a prohibited substance is detected in any sample taken from it prior to or following its running in any race must be disqualified from any race in which it started on that day).

AR.177A (which provides that when a horse is brought to a racecourse or recognised training track to engage in either an official trial, a jump-out, or other test for the purpose of obtaining a permit to start in a race, and a prohibited substance is detected in any sample taken from it prior to or following such engagement, the trainer and any other person who was in charge of the horse at any relevant time may be penalised).

AR.178 (which provides that when any horse that has been brought to a racecourse for the purpose of engaging in a race and a prohibited substance is detected in any sample taken from it prior to or following its running in any race, the trainer and any other person who was in charge of such horse at any relevant time may be penalised).

3. Importantly each of these rules prohibits the detectable presence of these substances. The rules are deliberately not framed in terms of the substance's impact on performance or health or otherwise. This is consistent with the policy of zero tolerance.

4. The role of the official racing laboratories in analysing samples taken from horses is provided for in AR.178D as follows:

AR.178D. (1) Samples taken from horses in pursuance of the powers conferred on the stewards by AR.8(j) shall be analysed by only an official racing laboratory.

- (2) Upon the detection by an official racing laboratory of a prohibited substance in a sample taken from a horse such laboratory shall -

(a) notify its finding to the stewards, who shall thereupon notify the trainer of the horse of such finding; and

(b) nominate another official racing laboratory and refer to it the reserve portion of the same sample and, except in the case of a blood sample, the control of the same sample, together with advice as to the identity of the prohibited substance detected.

- (3) In the event of the other official racing laboratory detecting the same prohibited substance, or metabolites, isomers or artefacts of the same prohibited substance, in the referred reserve portion of the sample and not in the referred portion of control the certified findings of both official racing laboratories shall be prima facie evidence that a prohibited substance has been detected in that sample for the purposes of these rules.

5. In a practical sense zero tolerance testing by racing laboratories is not testing down to zero molecules, which no analytical chemist can yet accomplish, but rather testing to the "Limit of Detection" (LOD) of the best available technology and analytical methods used.

Thresholds

6. In that small number of cases where prohibited substances are substances that are naturally present in horses, either due to being endogenous to horses or naturally occurring in feedstuffs or in the environment, the ARR includes thresholds - see AR.178C(1). When the concentration at which one of these substances is present in a sample is at or below the threshold then the sample is not a positive sample.
7. Screening Limits are not thresholds.

Increased sensitivity of analysis

8. Sensitivity of analysis is the term which the industry has given to the capacity of the racing analytical laboratories to detect the presence of a prohibited substance in a sample. Over time, new technologies and research and development means that analytical equipment and methods improve, resulting in increased sensitivity of analysis (i.e. enhanced LODs). Increased sensitivity of analysis means that a substance present in a sample at a certain concentration which was not able to be detected in 2001, may be able to be detected using the analytical equipment and methods available in 2011.
9. In the case of illicit performance-modifying substances which have no legitimate role or accepted therapeutic use, increased sensitivity of analysis is an unambiguously good thing. It is the *raison d'être* of the racing analytical laboratories to harness the full capabilities of modern science to detect the presence of such substances at any level.
10. However, as a matter of policy the Australian Racing Board does not believe it is necessary to employ the same sensitivity of analysis for therapeutic substances, which do have a legitimate place in our industry including for welfare reasons.
11. It is for this reason, as well as the desire for objectivity and transparency, that the concept of screening limits for certain therapeutic substances has been developed.

Screening limits

12. De facto, in-house "screening limits" have been employed within a number of racing laboratories for several years. These laboratories have used internal protocols in an attempt to maintain LODs for therapeutic substances at constant levels. For example, with current technology a racing chemist could easily find traces of phenylbutazone or its metabolites for 14 days or more after administration. However as a matter of practice laboratories would only call a sample positive to phenylbutazone if the concentration present in the sample is at or above a level that would have been detectable say 15 years ago.
13. In these circumstances the Australian Racing Board has approved the development of formal screening limits for certain therapeutic substances (SLs). These SLs set out the concentration of the particular substance above which the racing laboratory will call the sample positive.

14. The SL is the urine or plasma concentration adopted for the screening of a specified therapeutic prohibited substance; it is derived from administration studies followed by a risk analysis consisting of two components: a risk assessment (evaluation of the effect of the substance and factors related to its control) and a risk management (decision step for harmonisation). SLs are harmonised detection limits agreed following input by international consensus and are conveyed by instruction from racing authorities to their laboratories. The SLs are simply the detection limits to be used by the laboratories when screening for certain therapeutic substances as instructed by the authorities; they are not international thresholds. When the screening procedure indicates the SL has been exceeded, all that is required is qualitative confirmatory analysis (usually by mass spectrometry) to confirm the presence or absence of the prohibited substance. Quantification is not required.

Screening limits do not affect liability

15. The implementation of screening limit testing of racing is not intended and does not operate to mean that for the purpose of the Rules of Racing the therapeutic substance only becomes a prohibited substance if and when the screening limit is exceeded.

16. It shall not be a defence to any charge under AR.177, AR.177A or AR.178 that the result of any initial screening test should have been below the screening limit for the therapeutic substance in question.



Thoroughbred Deleted Races Policy

1. OBJECTIVE

The objective of this policy is to clearly define the criteria for determining whether or not a thoroughbred race can be deleted from a programme.

2. POLICY

2.1 Insufficient Nominations

- 2.1.1. A race will be deleted if there are seven (7) or less nominations at the prescribed extended nomination closing time, unless otherwise approved by Tasracing.
- 2.1.2. Should the race be deleted, Tasracing will endeavour to contact the trainers of those have nominated in the deleted race, on their registered telephone numbers.
- 2.1.3. Notice of the race deletion will be posted on the Tasracing website: www.tasracing.com.au.
- 2.1.4. Feature Races (with prizemoney of \$25,000 or more) shall be exempt from the deleted race policy.

2.2 Insufficient Acceptances

- 2.2.1. In the event of six (6) or less acceptors, the acceptance time may be extended by an additional 30 minutes.
- 2.2.2. Tasracing will endeavour to contact all trainers who have nominated but not accepted with their horse(s) and advised of the status of the race.
- 2.2.3. A race will be deleted if there are six (6) or less acceptances at the prescribed closing time of acceptances, unless otherwise approved by Tasracing.
- 2.2.4. Feature Races (with prizemoney of \$25,000 or more) shall be exempt from the deleted race policy.
- 2.2.5. Once a decision has been made to delete the race, Tasracing will endeavour to contact the trainers of horses in that particular race and advise of the decision to delete that race. If their horse had been nominated for any other races on the programme then the acceptance closing process will be delayed for a maximum of thirty (30) minutes to allow the trainer to accept in another race.
- 2.2.6. In the event of a deleted race occurring the stakes allocated to that race, will be added to the divided race pool, for use in the running of divided races.
- 2.2.7. Notice of the race deletion will be posted on the Tasracing website www.tasracing.com.au.

Thoroughbred Race Divide Policy

1. OBJECTIVE

1.1 The objective of this policy is to clearly define the methodology for determining whether or not a thoroughbred race is eligible to be divided.

2. POLICY

2.1 MAIDEN AND MAIDEN/CLASS 1

The divide rule is based around the maiden balloting conditions in Local Rule 11 below:

LR.11.1(a)(i) Balloting conditions and order of entry for Maiden and Maiden/Class 1 races are as follows, and where necessary, horses equal for the ballot will be eliminated by lot:

1. First starters;
2. Placed 1st last start;
3. Placed 2nd last start;
4. Placed 3rd last start;
5. Horses subject to Balloted Out List conditions and rankings (refer LR11(a)(ii)&(iii) below)
6. Placed 4th or 5th last start or only had 1 career start;
7. Placed 1st, 2nd or 3rd at their second last start.
8. Placed 4th or 5th at their second last start or only had 2 career starts.
9. Placed 1st, 2nd or 3rd at their third last start.
10. Placed 4th or 5th at their third last start or only had 3 career starts.
11. 4 career starts
12. 5 career starts
13. Least number of consecutive unplaced runs.

LR.11(a)(ii) Maiden horses that have had fewer than 11 race starts and are balloted out (or fail to gain a start as an emergency) on two successive occasions in Maiden or Maiden/Class 1 races are placed on the Balloted Out List and ranked in ascending order by the date they were balloted on the second occasion. Horses with the same second balloted out date are ranked according to the least number of unplaced runs, and then by lot, if equal. Horses that gain a start and are subsequently scratched from the race will only retain their position on the Balloted Out List on presentation of a veterinary certificate. Abandoned, cancelled or deleted races are not considered for Balloted Out listing purposes.

LR.11(a)(iii) The ballot out list will not be implemented on the following race days: Devonport Cup day, Tasmanian Derby day, Hobart Cup day and Launceston Cup day.

LR.11(a)(iv) The Maiden Balloting Conditions will be declared at the declaration of weights only.

At the close of nominations, if 6 or more horses, which qualify under clauses 1 to 10 above, will miss out on a start if the race is run as one division, then the race is eligible to be divided.

2.2 BENCHMARK 62

At the close of nominations, if 6 or more horses rated 58 or higher, will miss out on a start if the race is run as one division, then the race is eligible to be divided.

2.3 CLASS 1 HANDICAPS

At the close of nominations, if 6 or more horses rated 61 or higher, will miss out on a start if the race is run as one division, then the race is eligible to be divided.

2.4 CLASS 2

At the close of nominations, if 6 or more horses rated 64 or higher, will miss out on a start if the race is run as one division, then the race is eligible to be divided.

2.5 BENCHMARK 68

At the close of nominations, if 6 or more horses rated 64 or higher, will miss out on a start if the race is run as one division, then the race is eligible to be divided.

2.6 ALL OTHER CLASSES

All divides will be determined at the discretion of Tasracing.

2.7 All divides are subject to a minimum of 12 final acceptances being received for each division of the race.

2.8 Where there are more races eligible for division than there is capacity for on the race programme, then preference is given to the class which has the least opportunity with regards to races programmed in the following two weeks.

2.9 While a race may be eligible for division, there is no obligation for Tasracing to divide that race. Trainers will be advised via SMS of the intention to divide the nominated race

Thoroughbred Extended Nominations Policy

1. OBJECTIVE

The objective of this policy is to clearly define the criteria under which nominations can be extended beyond the prescribed closing time.

2. POLICY

2.1 Undivided Races

If, for any race, at the prescribed closing time of nominations, there are fewer nominations than the track safety limit for that race, nominations will be extended for that race, (refer Thoroughbred Deleted Race Policy). Trainers will be advised via SMS of the extension and the extended nomination closing time. Extended nominations will rank below original nominations in the race ballot order.

2.2 Divided Races

If it is determined under the Thoroughbred Race Divide Policy that a race is to be divided into two or more divisions, nominations will be extended if there are fewer nominations than the track safety limit multiplied by the number of divisions. Trainers will be advised via SMS of the extension and the extended nomination closing time. Extended nominations will rank below original nominations in the race ballot order.

2.3 Feature races over \$25,000

Races staked at over \$25,000 will only be extended at the discretion of Tasracing after consultation with the club concerned.

1. OBJECTIVE

The objective of this policy is to clearly define the criteria for determining the Premiership tables for riders and trainers.

2. POLICY

For the purposes of determining the winners of both the Jockeys Premiership and the Trainers Premiership, one (1) point will be allocated for each win throughout the racing season, commencing on 1 August and finishing 31 July the following year. In the result of a dead heat, both the jockey and the trainer will receive one (1) point.

2.1 Race Premiership Tables

Tasmanian racing premierships are tabulated in three sections, incorporating all racetracks within the state, at meetings allocated by the principle racing authority, Tasracing.

Tables are recorded, maintained and published on the RISA website after the conclusion and entering of race result data. Sections of premiership data that is published include:

Statewide

Incorporating the tables of the metropolitan and country premierships, as prescribed on RISA.

2.2 Method of Calculation

From the start of the 2012-13 season on 1 August, Tasracing record dead heats in its Jockey and Trainer Premierships as full wins.

Dead heats will now be scored as one (1) win for jockeys and trainers in the premiership table rather than as a half (1/2) win.

This change reflects how dead heats are recognised in horse form, in handicapping and in the calculation of apprentice claims throughout Tasmania.

It brings the Tasmanian Premiership in line with other racing jurisdictions, notably Victoria and RVL policy.
