Thoroughbred Policies | Local Jockey Travel Subsidy

TPOL0002

1. OBJECTIVE

1.1 The objective of this policy is to clearly define the criteria for determining whether or not a travel subsidy is payable to Tasmanian jockeys that travel 150 kilometers or more (return) to race meetings.

2. POLICY

2.1 Subsidy Exclusions

Jockeys are excluded from receiving a subsidy under any of the following circumstances:

- a. Jockeys travelling to King Island race meetings;
- b. Jockeys that have been paid 3 or more riding fees, or have won a feature race worth \$25,000 or more;
- c. An apprentice jockey that is not the holder of a current driver's license, in this circumstance the subsidy will be paid to the apprentice's master.

For Tasmanian based riders, that travel 150kms or more (return) for race meetings, a travel subsidy will be paid at the rate of:

Rides	Subsidy	(Riding Fee)	Total Minimum
1	\$60	\$165 + % prizemoney	\$225
2	\$30	\$330 + % prizemoney	\$360

2.2 Abandoned or Postponed race meeting subsidy

In accordance with the conditions 2.1, if a race meeting is abandoned or postponed after scratching time (7.30 am on race day) or a part of a meeting is abandoned or postponed at any stage during a race meeting, a subsidy of \$60 will be paid.

The amount will be paid directly into the jockey's prescribed bank account within ten working days of the race meeting.
