

Epingle wins 2014 Betfair Hobart Cup

... Quality mare Epingle registers her first Black Type win in the Group 3 feature A DECISION BY Victorian trainer Mick Kent to keep his mare Epingle in Tasmania, after the \$225,000 Group 3 Betfair Hobart Cup meeting was postponed after four races, ended up being a master stroke.

The balance of the Hobart Cup meeting was postponed due to a storm that swept across Tattersall's Park with sleet, hail and winds up to 130 kph, leaving the complex in tatters.

Instead of taking Epingle back to Melbourne to contest the Mornington Cup he opted to keep her in Tasmania and when she emerged triumphant over gallant local hero Geegees Blackflash in the delayed edition of the Hobart Cup, his decision was justified.





Epingle scored an emphatic win in the Betfair Hobart Cup with Craig Williams aboard, scoring from a courageous Geegees Blackflash (Stephen Maskiell) with his half-sister Gee Gee's La Quita (David Pires) a closing third.


"I changed my mind a few times about sending her back for the Mornington Cup but in the end I opted to stay in Tasmania and I'm glad we did. We've been chasing Group or Listed success with this mare for some time and to finally achieve the result is very pleasing," Kent said.

Williams had Epingle settled in fourth place off the strong speed set by The Cleaner (Anthony Darmanin) while Geegees Blackflash settled at the rear of the field from his outside gate (9).


The Cleaner set a solid pace but it was evident 400 metres out that he may have spent his lot and that's how it panned out.

Epingle hit the front at the top of the home straight, kicked clear and then had to stave off a determined challenge from Geegees Blackflash that was very brave in defeat. It was Williams' third Hobart Cup triumph and he was particularly pleased to win.

"Mick had this mare in top order for this race and she was always going to be the one to beat in the run," Williams said.

star Tasmanian mare teams with Tasmania's premier jockey

First the Newmarket ...

TASMANIA'S premier jockey Brendon McCoull had to wait 22 years to finally win a Newmarket Handicap (1200m) and he did it in style aboard classy mare Black 'N' Tough at The TOTE Racing Centre in Launceston.

Winning the State's most prestigious sprint race had been on McCoull's bucket list for some time.

McCoull had Black 'N' Tough handily placed just off the speed set by The Cleaner, while the race favourite and the winner's stablemate Rebel Bride sat at the leader's side to the home turn. Rebel Bride hit the front at the top of the home straight and looked set to add the Newmarket to her long list of feature race wins, but The Cleaner fought back and regained the lead. Just when The Cleaner was being hailed the winner Black 'N' Tough slipped into overdrive and swept to the lead hitting the line almost a length clear of the sole interstate invader Bocuse while The Cleaner hit the line in sync and just ahead of Geegees Blackflash that rattled home late.

"It's taken me all of my riding career (22 years) to win this race and it's great to finally do it ... and it's great that it was on one of Wicky's (owner Chris Wickham) mares," McCoull said.

"It is a race that I have longed to win because as a jockey you hope to make your mark riding feature race winners and I was starting to think that this one (Newmarket) might evade me." he said.

... then the Tasmanian Stakes

BLACK 'N' TOUGH was then put to the test in the Kevin Sharkie Tasmanian Stakes over 1600 metres at Tattersall's Park in Hobart for what was her test at running a strong 1600 metres.

The gallant mare passed the test with flying colours by outgunning Geegees Blackflash that was out to defend his crown from the previous year.

Black 'N' Tough has lived in the shadow of her stablemate Rebel Bride that won two Group 3 Bow Mistress' in succession.

This time in Black 'N' Tough has gone to a new level, firstly winning the \$90,000 Newmarket Handicap first-up from a spell, and while she was second to Rebel Bride at her subsequent outing in Launceston over 1400 metres she proved beyond doubt she is more than capable over 1600 metres with her Tasmanian Stakes victory.

Brendon had the mare placed third in pursuit of tearaway leaders The Cleaner (\$2.20 favourite) and 100/1 shot Pengalas Gee Gee.

When the leaders punctured turning for home Black 'N' Tough assumed control but the champion Geegees Blackflash loomed to win when they straightened for the run home.

Black 'N' Tough answered the challenge and if anything was extending her lead on the line, scoring by a short neck from Geegees Blackflash with interstate invader Langridge Street four lengths away third.

Black 'N' Tough's trainer Leon Wells was thrilled with the win admitting the win was more convincing by the fact that his mare had been able to hold out Geegees Blackflash.

"That was a terrific battle in the straight and a super effort from my mare to hold out Geegees Blackflash because he is such a great horse," Wells said.

Wells said he would discuss Black 'N' Tough's immediate future with her part-owner Chris Wickham in the next few days to determine where they go with the mare.

A HOBBY trainer and horse bought on a whim from an ad in a magazine teamed up to win the \$100,000 Simons Design Centre Devonport Cup at Tapeta Park.

Red Eagle Soars

Red Eagle, a lightly raced five-year-old gelding that was purchased for an undisclosed sum from an advertisement in a thoroughbred breeding magazine a year ago has taken his trainer Shirley Berger on an incredible ride that culminated in victory in the North-West Coast's premier event.

Red Eagle went into the race with only three wins to his credit from 16 starts but one of those wins was on the synthetic surface at Devonport over the cup distance of 1880 metres and it was run in track record time (1.56.56).

Berger gave the responsibility of riding the stable star to Turkish apprentice Bulent Muhcu who took the initiative as soon as they jumped by urging the five-year-old to make the most of an inside barrier and lead the field to the first turn.

With the interstate invader Langridge Street parked at his girth a solid pace was ensured and when nothing else had applied pressure until nearing the home turn Muhcu waited until straightening for the long run up the home straight to ask his charge for the supreme effort.

Red Eagle held out all challenges and hit the line safely clear of former Victorian Gotta Dream that was having his first start in the state for Spreyton trainer Adam Trinder, with the well-backed Royal Rapture a closing third.

The race favourite Jakcorijim had won the two major leadup races to the Devonport Cup left his run too late and finished fourth, but was galloped on from behind during the race. RAINER SHIRLEY BERGER Is a housewife and full-time fire fighter whose love of horses has taken her on a marvellous journey.

But what many in the racing industry were not aware of prior to her horse's brilliant all-the-way win in the Devonport Cup was her courageous battle to be recognised as a talented firefighter.

In May 2007, Berger completed the necessary qualifications and assessments to become the first female to carve a career as a professional firefighter with the Tasmania Fire Service, making her a trailblazer for women in this male dominated profession.

As a leading firefighter she is also qualified as a station officer and is able to act in this position as required.

Berger grew up as one of 12 children on a farm in West Ridgley and was educated at Ridgley Primary School and Parklands High.

After a period of travel, and working at various jobs Shirley settled on the North-West Coast and married Ueli Berger.

She has three children, two girls, Melanie and Holly, and a son, Toby.

While the children were growing up Berger worked from home and ran a successful hydroponic strawberry farm along with a piggery and small farming operation.

Berger undertook university studies as a mature age student and started work with the Education Department.

Looking for a career change, in 2001, she joined the Tasmania Fire Service (TFS) as a recruit firefighter.

After her initial training she spent time at the Launceston Fire Brigade before transferring to the North-West Coast in 2002.

As the first permanent female firefighter on the North-West Coast, there were significant challenges for her and she had to work hard to become accepted in a stereotypical male domain.

In 2001, her leadership skills were already evident and she was selected in the contingent that went to assist fighting the devastating Christmas fires in New South Wales

Berger remains a firefighter but she also hopes to slightly increase the number of horses she has in work on her property at Stowport.







Trainer: Terry Evans Jockey: Siggy Carr

QUALITY three-year-old gelding Inner Warrior confirmed his status as a rising star when he stormed home to win the \$90,000 Betfair Tasmanian Guineas over 1600 metres in Launceston on New Year's Eve.

Inner Warrior went into the race on the back of an impressive win in the 3YO Trophy over 1400 metres and connections were confident the gelded son of God's Own had the stuff to demolish arguably one of the best Guineas fields in decades.

Inner Warrior was well ridden by Tasmania's leading apprentice Sigrid 'Siggy' Carr who allowed her charge to settle just beyond midfield and settled three-wide with cover to the 600 metre peg.

When Carr called on Inner Warrior to make his charge he quickly moved around the field and had the race in his keeping turning for home.

He hit the line with something in reserve to defeat Geegees Velvet by two lengths with interstate invader Countersnip a gallant third and just in advance of the Graeme McCulloch trained filly Frolicked.

Inner Warrior's trainer Terry Evans was ecstatic after the race.

"I just heard someone call this horse a star and I'm here to say they got that right," Evans said.

"He isn't a flash looking horse and he doesn't have any sparkle about him but when it comes to being a racehorse he is just a thorough professional," Evans said.

"He has taken a few runs to come right this season but when he won that 3YO Trophy race last start over 1400 metres I knew I had him right where I wanted him."

"He's a pleasure to train and the owners are a great bunch," he said.

Carr admitted she shed a tear before she guided the gelding back

to the unsaddling enclosure but understandably so as it was clearly her biggest win to date.

"It was a great feeling from the 600m because I knew he was going to win that far out. I am rapt for Terry (Evans) because he is a great trainer who has always had an opinion of this horse," Carr said.

"This is my biggest win by far and to get it on Inner Warrior makes it even better," she said.

Inner Warrior is raced by the Horse Racing Tragics Syndicate that has had a lot of success with horses trained by Terry Evans but Inner Warrior has the potential to be the best.

Inner Warrior was tested over 2100 metres in the Hobart Guineas but he failed to get the trip.







Elwick Stakes - Admiral

Trainer: Barry Campbell Jockey: Brendon McCoull

THE Barry Campbell trained Admiral confirmed his status as Tasmania's best two-year-old when he powered home to win the \$100,000 Listed Motors Elwick Stakes over 1100 metres at Tattersall's Park in Hobart.

Admiral (Mossman-Reunification) missed the start and was forced to play catch-up with the field and rider Brendon McCoull opted to send him three and four-wide with cover in an attempt to get into the race from the 700 metre peg.

Interstate invader Hennessy Rock (Craig Newitt) found the lead turning for home with Geegees Doublejay hot in pursuit but Admiral was still three lengths off them and the widest runner on straightening.

But when McCoull called on Admiral for the big effort 150 metres out he dug deep and cruised to a comfortable win over Geegees Goldengirl that was at big odds with her stablemate Geegees Doublejay a close-up third ahead of Hennessy Rock from the David Hayes stable.

Admiral won on debut in Hobart and followed up with a third to Geegees Doublejay before being sent for a short break.

He resumed with blinkers on for the first time in the Alfa Bowl and reversed the outcome over Geegees Doublejay.

"He could be the best I've trained. We'll wait and see what he does at three," Campbell said. "Everything went wrong in this race but he still won and that's the sign of a very good horse," he said.





Thomas Lyons - Road Trippin'

Trainer: Stephen Theodore Jockey: Luke Currie

VICTORIAN gelding Road Trippin' almost turned his win in the \$100,000 weight-for-age Thomas Lyons Stakes (1400m) into a home town victory at Tattersall's Park last Friday.

Road Trippin' was ridden by former Tasmanian jockey Luke Currie who produced a superb ride to secure victory for the Stephen Theodore trained gelding.

Road Trippin' drifted back in the field after beginning well but when the leaders started to tire Currie was able to secure a saloon passage run along the inside rail to go on and score a comfortable win over Jakcorijim and Rebel Bride.

"The horse did a great job to win but I was amazed when the field just opened up for us in the home straight," Currie said.

"Nobody could see it but when the gap appeared I just couldn't get the smile

off my face and it was still there when we were coming back to the unsaddling enclosure," he said.

The gelding was aimed at two races in Tasmania during the Summer Carnival with the George Adams on Launceston Cup day (February 26) his main mission.

The trainer's father Les Theodore said the two weight-for-age races over 1400m and 1600m in Tasmania fitted perfectly into his program.

"Stephen had the two races locked in some time back with the George Adams his main mission so winning the Thomas Lyons is a real bonus," Theodore said.

Jakcorijim delivered another outstanding effort to run second while Rebel Bride ran another solid race off a muddling speed.





Bow Mistress - Isibaeva

Trainer: Ian Hay Jockey: David Pires

JOCKEY David Pires notched one of the most memorable wins of his career when he guided smart mare Isibaeva to victory in the \$150,000 Group 3 Programmed Turnpoint Bow Mistress Trophy over 1200 metres at Tattersall's Park in Hobart.

Isibaeva produced her best effort this campaign to draw clear of her rivals 200 metres out and went on to easily defeat the well-backed Miss Stellabelle with the Peter Moody trained Kneeling a close-up third ahead of race favourite Rebel Bride that was attempting to win the race for the third year in succession.

Isibaeva had been close at her three starts this season and in a couple of those outings she was very unlucky not to win.

The Ian Hay trained mare is home grown being by Johannesburg from former star race mare Dragila, that also has been a top performer at stud.

For Pires it was almost a case of lightning striking twice in the same spot as he also partnered Dragila to victory in the Bow Mistress in 2002 and today he claimed the most prestigious fillies and mares race on the Tasmanian thoroughbred racing calendar aboard one of that mare's daughters.

Isibaeva gave an inkling that she was bound for greatness last season when she won three feature mares races to signal her arrival as a major contender for a Bow Mistress-Vamos Stakes double.

"I couldn't be happier after this win and to be honest the enormity of riding Dragila to win this race and being able to partner one of her daughters to win it probably won't sink in properly until later in the week," Pires said.

"I was able to ride her further forward than we have been of late and that helped our cause, and when the gaps appeared turning for home I just drove her through and she did the rest – it was a very soft win," he said.

Hay was thrilled and rightly so.

"What can I say. This mare took all before her last season and this time in she has been second at all three starts but today it was her day and she shone," Hay said.

"When you breed them to win a big race like this it is very special and this will be remembered by our family as one of our best days in racing," he said.





Hobart Guineas - Moonless

Trainer: Ken Hanson Jockey: Georgie Catania

A LONG range plan was realised when Moonless caused a boilover to win the \$100,000 Betfair Hobart Guineas over 2100 metres at Tattersall's Park in Hobart.

The Ken and Tanya Hanson trained three-year-old went into the race a maiden performer although he had promised to win a few times leading up to the \$100,000 Listed race.

Despite having decent form going into the race with placings in good company in Launceston, punters let the gelded son of Helike start at the lucrative price of \$21.

Talented apprentice Georgie Catania had Moonless settled third and travelling comfortably while rank outside Abinka (\$101) and Victory Medal set a solid pace in front.

The well-backed favourite Inner Warrior settled fifth outside of his arch rival Geegees Velvet and they both travelled well to the home turn.

Victory Medal swept on the lead turning for home but Catania had Moonless wound up and full of running as he entered the home straight. Moonless hugged the rail to claim the lead and when he was challenged strongly 200 metres from home the gelding dug deep and staved off all-comers to go on and score narrowly from Varian and Geegees Velvet.

Moonless was considered too small to be put through the ring at the 2014 Tasmanian Magic Millions Yearling Sale and he ended up being leased to co-trainers Ken and Tanya Hanson at Longford and they race the gelding with family and friends.

Moonless was well ridden by apprentice Georgie Catania who was booked straight after the race to ride the gelding in the \$100,000 Tasmanian Derby (2200m).

Moonless was bred by Armidale Stud being by one of its stallions Helike from the Danehill mare Elfin Hill. At one stage co-trainer Ken Hanson was on the verge of sacking Moonless.

"I was about to sack this horse because he was the slowest horse I had ever trained, but jockey Yassy Nishitani was riding him in work and he kept saying the horse was improving so I persevered. We are very grateful to Yassy for his advice," said Hanson.

Leading up to the Hobart Guineas Moonless had notched four minor placings and Hanson said he had mapped out a program that would tell him if the horse might be good enough to win a Tasmanian Derby.

"We ran him over 1880 metres at Devonport on Cup day and he finished the race off well to run second and while it was only in a maiden-class one it was good enough to convince me that he would run out the 2100 metres and a bit beyond," Hanson said.







TattsBet.com - Rebel Bride

Trainer: Leon Wells Jockey: Stephen Maskiell

... Wells trained duo stage another epic battle

TASMANIA'S star mares Rebel Bride and Black 'N' Tough staged another epic battle in Launceston with Rebel Bride emerging triumphant by a narrow margin in the \$100,000 Listed weight-for-age tattsbet.com stakes over 1200 metres.

The Leon Wells trained duo engaged in a two-horse war over the final 200 metres that brought the crowd to its feet as they fought it out tooth and nail at the business end of the race.

It was the second time Rebel Bride had emerged triumphant over her stablemate under weight-for-age conditions this preparation.

Rebel Bride and Black 'N' Tough are both raced by Chris and Sharon Wickham and it was a delighted Chris Wickham who led Rebel Bride back to the unsaddling enclosure.

"I don't have anything new to say about these two great mares," Wickham said.

Trainer Wells said he can't help getting nervous every time the two mares race against each other.

"I don't know why I get so nervous when they race. It's probably the expectation of everyone else that gets to you in the end," Wells said.

Rebel Bride (Stephen Maskiell) showed good speed from the outside barrier (7) to easily cross to the rails and led while Brendon McCoull was content to let Black 'N' Tough move up to race outside of her stablemate.

Rebel Bride slipped two lengths clear at the top of the straight but when Black 'N' Tough got wound up she made a race of it over the concluding stages and fell short by a short half-head.







Tasmanian Derby - Liberty Leader

Trainer: Tony Vasil Jockey: Jack Hill

TOP Victorian trainer Tony Vasil hatched a plan to aim his promising threeyear-old stayer Liberty Leader at the Schweppes Tasmanian Derby long before the gelding broke his maiden status at Geelong in late January.

Liberty Leader lived up to expectations when he powered his way to an impressive win in the \$100,000 Listed race over 2200 metres in Hobart two weeks later to earn a possible trip to South Australia for that's state's Derby.

With underrated hoop Jack Hill aboard, Liberty Leader settled back in the field while the long odds-on favourite Rainbow Storm led the field of 12 and looked to be travelling like a winner 600 metres from home.

But that's when Hill sent his charge around the field to tackle the favourite.

Rainbow Storm was in for the fight but it was Vasil's promising young stayer that

emerged triumphant scoring by almost two lengths from Rainbow Storm with Varian over two lengths away third.

"The way this horse dealt with this race I have no doubts he will handle the 2400 metres of the SA Derby," Vasil said.

"They are only three once so we might as well have a crack," he said.

"His pathway was always directed to this race (Tasmania Derby) provided everything fell into place."

"The time span I had to work with meant there was no room for error as he only had the three prior runs leading up to this race."

"Winning his maiden over 1700 metres then jumping straight to the 2200 metres to win the Tasmanian Derby is quite an achievement for this horse," he said.

Liberty Leader always showed staying promise.

"He was a slow maturer but the last spell he had, really made him as a racehorse."

"It's hard to get your hands on a staying three-year-old because they are a rarity, but when you do it is quite exciting," he said.

Vasil heaped praise on Hill, declaring him one of the most talented riders in Victoria.

"I've said it before and I will say it again, Jack Hill is one of the most improved riders in Victoria these past 18 months. He's fearless and he has a good race brain as he showed by his very tactical ride to win the Tasmanian Derby."

"If Jack really knuckled down and stays on the straight and narrow he has a huge future," Vasil said.







Strutt Stakes - Spinning Jenny

Trainer: Brendan McShane Jockey: Bulent Muhcu

QUALITY Tasmanian three-yearold filly Spinning Jenny may be aimed at the Australian Oaks in Adelaide or the AJC Oaks in Sydney.

That plan was announced after the filly won the \$100,000 Listed Strutt Stakes over 2100 metres at Tattersall's Park in Hobart last month.

Spinning Jenny, prepared at Broadmarsh by Brendan McShane, has long been regarded as a high grade staying prospect and when she won the Strutt Stakes she took her first major step towards realising that potential.

With in-form stable apprentice Bulent Muhcu in the saddle the filly settled second off the speed set by the David Hayes trained Poussin while the other well fancied fillies Geegees Velvet, At The Weekend and Thousand Guineas winner Iggimacool were allowed to settle near the rear of the field.

Muhcu called on Spinning Jenny to advance about 600 metres from home and assumed control just prior to turning for home.

Spinning Jenny (Hard Spun-Suraya) kicked two lengths clear at the top of the straight and had enough in reserve to stave off late challenges from Iggimacool and Geegees Velvet with David Hayes' other runner Pressure Down hanging on for fourth ahead of At The Weekend.

It was an important win to McShane who won the race as a 17-year-old apprentice aboard Someos that was trained by his father Walter McShane.





2YO Magic Millions Classic - Lustica

Trainer: Barry Campbell Jockey: Anthony Darmanin

WELL bred two-year-old filly Lustica signaled her arrival as a potential star when she powered her way to an emphatic win in the \$50,000 Magic Millions 2YO Classic, under lights in Launceston last month.

The Barry Campbell trained filly showed good early speed to lead but when Stephen Maskiell's mount Rumeron was sent scurrying around the field she easily found the lead while Lustica's rider Anthony Darmanin wisely opted to take a trail.

The heavily backed first starter Scouting Around (\$4 into \$2.60) settled third and looked to be traveling like the winner 500 metres from home.

When Darmanin called on Lustica (Tale of the Cat-Ehor) to extend she grabbed the bit and quickly collared the leader.

She hit the front well into the straight and went on to score comfortably from Rumeron with Scouting Around a closing third but just in advance of outsider Galeocerdo (\$31).

"She is a very nice filly with a bit of depth about her and I am confident she will get over more ground later on," Campbell said.

It was another great result for Campbell who has earned a reputation as a master trainer of two-year-olds.

Last season he prepared two-yearold of the year Grand Tycoon to win seven from eight and he already has had success in the \$100,000 Listed Elwick Stakes with Admiral.

WHEN a pre-race plan is turned on its head it usually ends with a disastrous outcome unless the rider is Brendon McCoull.



Jess Cowen with 'Nigel', after winning the inaugural Tasracing 'Champion Off The Track" Award FORMER racehorse Green Rises (Festival Hall-Aristocrat Lady) was bred in Tasmania by Nancy Stubbs who prepared him to win his maiden in Hobart before he was dispatched to Victorian trainer Quinton Scott at Warrnambool.

Green Rises went on to win five more races for Scott and he also notched seven minor placings before an injury forced the gelding into early retirement in 2011.

When Green Rises was sent back to Stubbs she needed to find a new home for the gelding and she couldn't have found better lodgings than with the Cowan family in the north of the state.

Green Rises has developed into a handy competitor in the show ring under the guidance of Scotch Oakburn College student Jess Cowan.

"He came to us in August 2011 and he was originally meant to be my mum's horse," Jess Cowan said.

"I began schooling him so mum wouldn't get hurt but soon realised he had talent and might be really good as a show horse."





"He was smart, quick, had lots of energy and he could jump," she said. Needless to say Nigel became Jess' project and her new show horse.

"The first year we did a few agricultural shows and not much else."

"Nigel was extremely excitable and every outing he would have to be worked for at least twenty minutes before he would stop trying to jump in the air and give mum a heart attack!"

"In our first season we jumped in the unofficial ring and evented up to Prelim (95cm) and hacked and qualified for Super Schools Nationals for jumping at 1.00m."

Last year's show season was Raise the Colours' first full season on the circuit and he emerged with placings at the Launceston, Ulverstone, Westbury, Scottsdale and Stanley Shows.

"We started the season at the 90cm-1.00m and progressed extremely quickly to jumping 1.10m with ease and placed at the Pony Club Show Jumping Championship at Grade 1." Cowan said.

"At the ET State Titles our best results included second in the 'Rebecca White' 1.05m Junior Championship and third in the 'JKW Homes' 1.10m Championship as well as winning the Tasracing Award," she said.

Cowan has been riding since she was seven, starting at pony club and progressing to jumping, eventing, dressage, hacking and hunting.

She is a member of Deloraine District Pony Club (DDPC), North West Tasmania Show Jumping Association (NWTSJA) and the Youth Show Jumping Squad. "I also play netball and am currently working at Alva Thoroughbred Stud," she said.

Next season 'Nigel' and Cowan will be consolidating at 1.10m and will hopefully travel to the Australian Championships.

"I just want to thank my family, friends and coaches who have helped me this season and to Tasracing for donating the award," she said.

programme notes

The Tasmanian Autumn-Winter Programme noticeably now has the inclusion of two additional Wednesday programs at Tattersall's Park Hobart. Both these dates are courtesy of the increased allocation to the Thoroughbred Code following strong results in 2012/13.

The dates scheduled are

When structuring the position of potential mid week dates for the 2014 season, the 2013 dates were subject to a turnover review. The data in turn established that there is minimal difference in turnover when scheduling a SKY 2 Wednesday to best fit the Tasmanian Racing Calender and taking a rarely available SKY 1 timeslot on a day immediately adjacent to another Tasmanian race day (which invariably results in reduced field sizes at both meetings).

As a result the additional meetings and previously scheduled midweek meetings will receive SKY 2 coverage on the nation's premier midweek metropolitan race day, Wednesday.

Program alterations are minimal through this period with minor variation to the feature races.

- A later Easter period sees the \$20k Diamond Bracelet and \$20k Deloraine Cup completed at Tapeta Park on Easter Monday 21 April.
- As this is closer to the Autumn Carnival the \$20k
 Deloraine Cup will be run at 1880m to provide horses the ability to train onto the staying events of the Autumn carnival.
- In keeping with the desire to promote the progressive Stayers within the state, the \$30k St. Leger Quality Handicap will be run at 2400m this season.





NOTICES TO ALL LICENSED PERSONS

New rules pertaining to the banning of anabolic steroids in the Australian Thoroughbred industry.

On 1 November 2014, the Australian Racing Board (ARB) introduced new rules banning the use of anabolic steroids in thoroughbred racehorses. The ban will be enforced from 1 May 2014.

A full copy of the relevant rules pertaining to this ban of anabolic steroids for reference can be found following this advice. There are many implications arising from the introduction of these rules, and to assist trainers and veterinarians to comply with the new rules the following explanatory statement has been prepared.

Which steroids are banned under these rules?

The new rules ban the use of "anabolic androgenic steroids" in Thoroughbred horses at any time from birth until retirement.

"Anabolic androgenic steroids" include those that are currently registered in Australia by the APVMA for use in horses, such as boldenone, ethylestrenol (in Nitrotain), methandriol, nandrolone, stanozolol and testosterone.

They also include but are not limited to those listed in the WADA prohibited list, such as 1-androstenediol; 1-androstenedione; bolandiol; bolasterone; boldione; calusterone; clostebol; danazol; dehydrochlormethyltestosterone; desoxymethyltestosterone; drostanolone; fluoxymesterone; formebolone; furazabol; gestrinone; 4-hydroxytestosterone; mestanolone; mesterolone; metenolone; methandienone; methasterone; methyldienolone; methyl-1testosterone; methylnortestosterone; methyltestosterone; metribolone; mibolerone; 19-norandrostenedione; norboletone; norclostebol; norethandrolone; oxabolone;

oxandrolone; oxymesterone; oxymetholone; prostanozol; quinbolone; stenbolone; 1-testosterone; tetrahydrogestrinone (THG); trenbolone; and other substances with a similar chemical structure or similar biological effect(s).

Altrenogest (in, for example, Regumate) is still permitted to be used in fillies and mares to regulate their oestrus cycle.

Which horses are affected by these rules?

The use of anabolic androgenic steroids will be banned from birth. There are no time or therapeutic exemptions of any kind. The ban applies to all unregistered and registered racehorses until their retirement as a racehorse. Horses can be tested at any time and this includes when spelling and in training and racing.

Can I have anabolic steroids present in my stables even when prescribed by a veterinarian?

No – the possession of any anabolic androgenic steroid, including oral paste preparations such as Nitrotain, at any premise used in relation to the training and racing of horses will be considered an offence under the new rules. Further any person who either administers or attempts to administer an anabolic androgenic steroid to a thoroughbred horse at any time commits an offence under these rules.

How will compliance with this ban be enforced by Principal Racing Authorities?

Compliance with these rules will be enforced by Principal Racing Authorities through regular stable inspections, inspections of medications and medication records and regular out of competition testing of Thoroughbred horses, as well as through routine race day sampling.

Any registered horse that tests positive at any time for a banned anabolic androgenic steroid will not be eligible to trial or race for 12 months from the date of collection of the sample.

Any unregistered horse that tests positive at any time for a banned anabolic androgenic steroid will not be eligible to trial or race for 12 months from the later of a) the date on which the horse, having been registered, is allowed to start in a race or b) the date of collection of the sample.

AMENDMENTS TO AUSTRALIAN RULES OF RACING

A. Amendment to AR.178D

The ARB considers the current Rule inadequately addresses the situation where a third laboratory may be needed to test a sample when the first laboratory can only screen for the presence of a substance but not be able to certify that the substance has indeed been detected. In such circumstances a third laboratory is required in order that there be a valid referee laboratory certificate.

Please delete AR.178D and replace with the following:

"AR.178D (1) Samples taken from horses in pursuance of the powers

conferred on the stewards by AR.8(j) shall be analysed by only an Official Racing Laboratory.

- (2) Upon the detection by an Official Racing Laboratory of a prohibited substance in a sample taken from a horse such laboratory shall
 - (a) notify its finding to the stewards, who shall thereupon notify the trainer of the horse of such finding; and
 - (b) nominate another Official Racing Laboratory and refer to it the reserve portion of the same sample and, except in the case of a blood sample,

- the control of the same sample, together with advice as to the identity of the prohibited substance detected.
- (3) In the event of the other Official Racing Laboratory detecting the same prohibited substance, or metabolites, isomers or artefacts of the same prohibited substance, in the referred reserve portion of the sample and not in the referred portion of control the certified findings of both official racing laboratories shall be prima facie evidence that a prohibited substance has been detected in that sample for the purposes of these rules.

- (4) Where an Official Racing Laboratory is unable, for any reason, to analyse a sample to detect and/or certify as to the presence of a prohibited substance in that sample, that Official Racing Laboratory or the Stewards may refer the sample, or any portion of the sample, to another Official Racing Laboratory for analysis.
- (5) If the Official Racing Laboratory to which a sample or portion of a sample was referred in accordance with AR 178D(4) detects a prohibited substance in that sample or portion of that sample, that Official Racing Laboratory shall -
 - (a) notify its finding to the stewards, who shall thereupon notify the trainer of the horse of such finding; and
 - (b) nominate another Official Racing Laboratory and refer to it a reserve portion of the same sample and, except in the case of a blood sample, the control of the same sample, together with advice as to the identity of the prohibited substance detected.
- (6) In the event of the Official Racing Laboratory to which a sample was referred pursuant to AR 178D(5) detecting the same prohibited substance, or metabolites, isomers or artefacts of the same prohibited substance, in the referred reserve portion of the control sample and not in the referred portion of control the certified findings of both Official Racing laboratories shall be prima facie evidence that a prohibited substance has been detected in that sample for the purposes of these rules."

Date of Effect: 1st February 2014

B. New Rule AR.64

The ARB considers that horses with bad or unruly actions should be banned as a safety precaution.

Please insert new Rule AR.64 as follows:

- "AR.64 (1) Without limiting any power contained in these Rules, the Stewards may prevent or suspend a horse from participating in track work, or from starting in any jumpout, official trial or race, for any period and upon any conditions that the Stewards consider appropriate if, in the Stewards' opinion:
 - (a) the horse has a galloping action or races in a manner which is likely to pose a safety risk to either itself, any other horse, or to any person;

- (b) the horse has barrier manners which are considered to be unruly or intractable and/or which may pose a safety risk to itself or any other horse in a race or to any person.
- (2) Where the Stewards suspend or prevent a horse from starting in any jump-out, official trial or race for a temporary period in accordance with AR 64DA(1), the Stewards may also order that the horse not be permitted to be nominated or entered for any official trial or race (as applicable) until the horse has:
 - (a) participated to the satisfaction of the Stewards in any test, jumpout or official trial (or series of tests, jump-outs or official trials); and/or
 - (b) passed any veterinary examination or any other examination considered appropriate.

Date of Effect: 1st February 2014

C. Amendments to AR.175(f) 8 AR.175(g)

The ARB considers that AR.175(f) which covers false and misleading evidence in an inquiry or appeal, should extend to an investigation.

Please delete the following subparagraphs and replace with the following:

"175(f) Any person who refuses or fails to attend or give evidence at any investigation, inquiry or appeal when directed or requested by the Principal Racing Authority or Stewards, or other person authorised by the Principal Racing Authority, to do so."

"175(g) Any person who gives at any interview, investigation, inquiry, hearing and/or appeal any evidence which is false or misleading in any particular."

Date of Effect: 1st February 2014

D. Amendment to AR.111A

The ARB considers that handicappers and stewards under AR.111A should have the power to re-handicap a horse winning a race after weights have been released.

Please insert the following sub-paragraph:

AR.111A

"(5) The handicapper may amend the allotted weight of a horse in a handicap race to carry an additional weight if, after weights are declared for that handicap race, that horse wins a race."

Date of Effect: 1st February 2014

E. New Rule AR.8E

The ARB considers that a new Rule enabling Principal Racing Authorities to give authority to persons other than stewards to conduct investigations is necessary for integrity purposes.

Please insert new Rule AR.8E as follows:

- "AR.8E (1) The Principal Racing Authority may from time to time appoint one or more persons to undertake investigations at the direction of the Principal Racing Authority and such investigators shall have and may exercise all the powers, duties and authorities conferred on Stewards by AR.8(b),(c), (jj), (k)(ii), AR.8B and AR.8C.
- (2) Any licensed person, owner or any other person engaged in or associated with racing who, whilst the investigators are exercising such powers, duties and authorities, refuses to obey any reasonable direction of investigators or obstructs, hinders or delays investigators in exercising such powers or carrying out their duties, or incites any other person or person to obstruct, hinder or delay investigators from exercising such powers or carrying out their duties, may be penalised."

Date of Effect: 1st February 2014


F. Amendment to AR.103(3)(a)

The Board believes that the Doncaster Mile should be added.

Please delete AR.103(3) and replace with the following:

- "(3) The minimum weight allocated for handicap flat races must not be less than
 - (a) 50 kilograms for the Melbourne Cup, Caulfield Cup and Doncaster Mile;
 - (b) 52 kilograms for Group 1 handicap races other than the Melbourne Cup and Caulfield Cup;
 - (c) 53 kilograms for Group 2 handicap flat races;
 - (d) 54 kilograms for all other handicap flat races."

Stewards Segment

THOROUGHBRED IDENTIFICATION CARD

Recently, especially in organised trials, trainers have failed to have the THOROUGHBRED IDENTIFICATION CARD in their possession. Please be aware of the requirements of AR.59 and AR.59A as Stewards may commence to issue penalties to trainers who continue not to adhere to the provisions of the above rule.

TREATMENT LOG BOOKS

Over the past months Racing Services Tasmania Investigation Unit has, on a regular basis, visited the stables of trainers on race day and non-race day. Part of the purpose of these visits is to assist trainers with a simple interpretation of the rules that relate to race day treatment, the holding and labelling of medications and the requirement to enter treatments into a log book. Trainers should familiarise themselves with Rules AR.178A, AR.178AA, AR.178E, AR.178F, AR.178H, as Stewards will penalise trainers who breach these rules.

USE OF "SQUEEZE BOTTLES"

It has recently come to Stewards notice that some trainers are using "squeeze bottles" to rinse a horse's mouth prior to being presented in the birdcage area. This practise is to cease as it infringes the provisions of AR.178A.(1) which reads —


"No person, unless he has first obtained the written permission of the Stewards, shall have in his possession on a racecourse where a race meeting is being conducted or in any motor vehicle, horse float or other mode of transport being used for the purpose of conveying a horse or horses to and/or from a race meeting any prohibited substance or a syringe, needle, naso-gastric tube or other instrument that could be used:

- (a) To administer a prohibited substance to a horse; or
- (b) To produce a prohibited substance in a horse."
