2015 WRAP

MORE THAN \$1.7 MILLION IN PRIZE MONEY IN GROUP AND LISTED RACES AND MORE THAN \$3 MILLION ACROSS ALL 11 CARNIVAL MEETINGS BETWEEN 11 JANUARY AND 25 FEBRUARY 2015.

THE 2015 Betfair Tasmanian Summer Racing Carnival will be remembered as arguably the best since the carnival's inception in 2005.

More than \$1.7 million in prize money was attached to Group and Listed events during the carnival with more than \$3 million in total paid to owners across the 11 meetings staged throughout the carnival that ran from January 11 to February 25.

Engagement with the carnival grew enormously during the six weeks of the carnival.

The addition of carnival contender videos and a sound marketing strategy were the major contributors to a massive increase in reach through social media.

It was a home grown finish in both the Betfair Hobart and Launceston Cups with Geegees Blackflash taking out the Group 3 Betfair Hobart Cup from Genuine Lad and Banca Mo before the Bill Ryan-trained Genuine Lad reversed that result by emerging triumphant in the \$225,000 Group 3 Betfair Launceston Cup ahead of Banca Mo and Geegees Blackflash.

From an owner perspective the 2015 carnival will be remembered as the year of the Gee Gees with Paul

and Elizabeth Geard-owned horses winning seven of the feature races during the carnival.

Their three-year-old filly Geegee's Goldengirl captured the classic double of the Strutt Stakes (2100m) and the Tasmanian Oaks, both carrying prize money of \$100,000.

They also won the \$100,000 Listed Tasmanian Derby with Geegees Classicboy, the \$100,000 Listed 2YO Elwick Stakes with Gee Gees Top Notch and the Carbine Club Trophy with Geegees Doublejay.

Only five of the feature races during the carnival were won by interstate horses.

Warrior of Fire from the Jerome Hunter stable in Victoria won the Listed \$100,000 Hobart Guineas.

Victorian mare I Love It won the \$150,000 Group 3 Bow Mistress for trainer Frank Salanitri and the Glenn Thornton-trained mare Vibrant Rouge, also from Victoria, won the \$125,000 Group 3 Vamos Stakes fillies and mares.

Talented juvenile Gold Busker took out the Magic Millions 2YO Classic and the \$100,000 Gold Sovereign Stakes for young Victorian trainer Logan McGill.

TASMANIA'S MILLION DOLLAR HERO



Geegees Blackflash

When Geegees Blackflash ran into second place in the Brighton Cup in January he earned enough stake money to take his career earnings beyond \$1 million. Other Tasmanian owned and trained gallopers have achieved that goal but no other had done it without leaving the state.

While the racing industry marveled at the feat it was a milestone that only his owners and trainer could fully appreciate and it is a record that might never be repeated. His journey to become an equine millionaire has been remarkable and a tale that proves that it is possible to reap big rewards without having to venture off the island.

THE STORY

SIX years ago Paul and Elizabeth Geard were doing little more than hoping for the best when their long-legged two-year-old Geegees Blackflash made his debut in a 2YO maiden over 1100 metres at Tattersall's Park in Hobart.

Geegees Blackflash finished sixth of nine and was beaten almost 18 lengths, so needless to say nobody paid any attention to the gelded son of Clangalang that day.

He improved at his next start a month later finishing sixth again but this time he was only 3-1/2 lengths from the winner.

He had six starts at two with his best results three minor placings.

But at his first start as a three-year-old, which was still in his first preparation, he emerged triumphant and it was that day in Hobart on August 9, 2009 that the Geards and the gelding's trainer John Luttrell started to believe they might have a handy one in their midst.

'The Flash' continued to improve and when he won the 3YO Vase in Hobart with Victorian rider Lee Smith aboard, connections began to think about winning better races such as the 3YO Cup.

He finished ninth of 14 behind Obstinado in the 3YO Cup but it was evident that Geegees Blackflash was looking for more ground and at his second and third tries over 1400m he was successful and when he stepped out in the Listed Tasmanian Guineas it took an in-form Victorian Excuse My Friends to beat him home but only by a narrow margin.

The same horse beat him home at his subsequent start in the Hobart Guineas over 2100m, again by a narrow margin, but it was in the Tasmanian Derby that Geegees Blackflash made his mark as a star.

He powered home to win the Derby, passing the Gai Waterhouse-trained Kinnersley close to home prompting the rider of that horse Nash Rawiller to acknowledge "The Flash" as a great stayer in the making.

He was spelled after the Derby win but during a trackwork gallop soon after being brought back into work he suffered a bleeding attack and missed almost a year of racing.

Luttrell took his time with his stable star and after four modest performances that included finishing last of 14 in the 2011 Devonport Cup he finished 11th of 14 in the Hobart Cup but only 4.5 lengths from the winner Bid Spotter.

But it was his subsequent outing in the 2011 Launceston Cup that proved he was on the brink of greatness.

With then apprentice Talia Rodder aboard he powered home along the rails to be beaten into third place and only a half-length from the winner Fast Future.

He returned in the winter to win twice over 1600 metres from seven starts.

But when he embarked on his next campaign Luttrell struggled to find a rider prepared to commit to the gelding so he ventured across the water and secured Peter Mertens who agreed to ride him first-up in the state's richest open sprint the Newmarket Handicap.

When Mertens returned to the unsaddling enclosure to guide Geegees Blackflash into the winner's stall he dismounted looked at Luttrell and said - "He's mine for the campaign."

Mertens went on to partner Geegees Blackflash to victory in two weight-for-age classics at his next two starts and then left his rivals in his wake in the Summer Cup before emerging triumphant in the 2012 Group 3 Hobart Cup (2400m).

Victory at his next start in the Launceston Cup would have given the big black horse a perfect strike rate but it took an exceptional effort from the David Brunton trained Prevailing to spoil the party.

Geegees Blackflash was named Tasmanian Horse of the Year for season 2012-13 and he also had earned notoriety for his feats nationally leading to a cult following.

He again resumed in the Newmarket Handicap (2012) but he failed to flatter but he bounced back to win the first running of the Conquering weight-for-age over 1400m in Launceston.

But it was at his last start that preparation which set the big black horse apart from any other that has raced in the state since the great Brallos that dominated during the mid 1970s.

Geegees Blackflash gunned down a quality line-up to win the 2013 Launceston Cup which led Mertens to demand the gelding be dubbed a true champion.

He returned in the winter for two runs that produced a win in the Sorell Cup (1600m) carrying 63.5 kilograms, courtesy of a four kilogram claim for apprentice Ismail Toker and he ended his campaign with a second in the St Leger (2100m) to outsider Richoman, beaten in a head-bobbing photo-finish.

The Flash spelled well and as a seven-year-old he resumed with a game second in the Goodwood Handicap in Hobart over 1100 metres.

On the way to both major cups he placed in several weight-for-age events and won twice before finishing second in the 2014 Hobart Cup and third in the Launceston Cup.

“ Everyone dreams of owning a horse like Geegees Blackflash and we still marvel at what he is able to do on the racetrack. After The Flash finished second in the Brighton Cup to take his earnings beyond \$1 million Paul said: “the end is far from over for the champ. He loves racing but he will tell us when it’s time for him to retire to a lush paddock at our place at Broadmarsh.”

His victory in the 2015 Betfair Hobart Cup and courageous effort in the Launceston Cup was proof that the big black horse was a long way from retirement.



Siggie Carr & 'the Flash'

Talented apprentice Siggie Carr has always been one to grasp an opportunity when it comes along with both hands and such was the case when offered the ride on Geegees Blackflash in the 2015 Betfair Hobart and Launceston Cups.

Carr has taken her career to a new level since moving to South Australia.

She enjoyed much success during the Betfair Tasmanian Summer Racing Carnival winning the

\$225,000 Group 3 Betfair Hobart Cup aboard Geegees Blackflash and the Listed \$100,000 Strutt Stakes on three-year-old filly Geegees Goldengirl and capped that filly’s season but guiding her to victory in the \$100,000 Tasmanian Oaks in Launceston.

Carr also partnered Geegees Blackflash into third place in the Betfair Launceston Cup as well as picking up a number of minor wins during the carnival.



MISSION ACCOMPLISHED

GENUINE LAD WINS 2015 BETFAIR LAUNCESTON CUP

Trainer Bill Ryan set about preparing him for his main mission in June last year and while there were a couple of hiccups along the way the Ladoni four-year-old gelding didn't let him down.

LONGFORD trainer Bill Ryan realised a lifetime dream when his tough young stayer Genuine Lad outgunned his older and more experienced rivals to win the \$225,000 Group 3 Betfair Launceston Cup over 2400 metres.

Genuine Lad was running around in class two events at the same time last year but Ryan was adamant he had a genuine (pardon the pun) major cups prospect in his midst.

He set about preparing him for his main mission in June last year and while there were a couple of hiccups along the way the Ladoni four-year-old gelding didn't let him down.

Genuine Lad delivered three consecutive seconds in feature races leading up to his grand final, finishing runner-up in the Devonport Cup, Summer Cup and the Group 3 Betfair Hobart Cup. But with those runs under his belt and with a change of rider, he finally delivered on the promise he showed his trainer so long ago.

With Victorian based jockey Craig Williams aboard, the Ladoni gelding travelled well just off the pace to the home turn where he took an inside run when the leader Ollie's Gold shifted off the fence turning for home.

Geeges Blackflash and Banca Mo emerged to issue their challenges and the trio settled down to a true test of staying ability over the final 200 metres with Genuine Lad emerging triumphant over Banca Mo with Geeges Blackflash a courageous third carrying a massive 60.5 kilograms.

It was Ryan's biggest win as a trainer although he had tasted success in multiple Listed races with Colonel Parker, Wealthy Lad and last season with his star three-year-old filly Iggimacool that won the \$100,000 Strutt Stakes and \$100,000 Tasmanian Oaks.

"This is magnificent – what a tough horse he is," Ryan said. "He is clearly the best stayer I have trained and he's only a four-year-old."

"I had reasonably high expectations of this horse after what he showed me last season but to actually achieve the result we set our sights on about eight months ago is very satisfying."

"We work hard and long hours at the stables and there is a lot of work from a lot of people to make it all happen."

The trainer had booked Williams for the ride in an attempt to gauge whether or not he should venture across the water with the young stayer and Williams gave him a glowing report.

"This horse is the real deal and is very tough. It took a lot of riding to get him home today but he is young and still learning," Williams said.

"I'd take him interstate for a decent race and I'd be happy to ride him again."

Genuine Lad is owned in partnership by Maurice and Jenny Mace, Andrew Jones and the trainer and his wife Mary Ryan.

Newmarket reveals a Hellova Horse!

Premier Tasmanian trainer Scott Brunton celebrated one of the biggest wins of his training career when his rising star Hellova Street scored an emphatic win in the \$100,000 Newmarket Handicap over 1200 metres in Launceston.

Brunton also saddled up the runner-up, Royal Rapture, and it took an outstanding effort from top mare Isibaeva to edge out Brunton's other runner, Banca Mo, for third.

It was rated one of the most wide open Newmarket Handicaps of recent years but Hellova Street made it look easy and warranted the solid backing that saw him firm to start the \$5.50 favourite.

Not only did he treat a star-studded cast of rivals with contempt he also broke the track record

Hellova Street covered the 1200m in track record time of 1.09.15 to eclipse the previous best of 1.09.60 set by Miewa's Quest in February 2009.

The four-year-old gelding began well from gate seven but had to survive some buffeting as riders jostled for position over the first 200 metres, but Victorian jockey Dean Holland was able to find a cozy spot behind the leaders Arenzano and Snippetee Bee to the home turn. The leaders kicked clear but when Holland called on his charge for the supreme effort Hellova Street responded magnificently and went on to score by more than a length.

Brunton was speechless, literally, as a result of cheering his stable star home but later spoke of the respect he has for the Helike gelding.

"We haven't seen the best of Hellova Street but at the end of this season we might be talking about him in the same vein as some of the great Tasmanian horses.

"I think he will be even better over more ground and we'll give him the chance to prove that as the season progresses," Brunton said.

Holland said he was always going to win the Newmarket.

"This horse looked to be well placed at the weights and when I got on him in the mounting yard I could see what all the fuss was about because he looked and felt enormous. He copped a bump early and got off stride but he recovered quickly and at the half-way mark I was confident he would be in the finish."

Battler lands the big bucks

\$100k Devonport Cup Winner 2015

LANDER DOLLAR, the green galloper that was struggling to make his way in class one races just over a year ago, scored the biggest win of his career when he led throughout to take out the Simons Design Centre Devonport Cup over 1880 metres at Spreyton Park in January.

With Victorian jockey Dean Holland in the saddle, Lander Dollar showed his customary early speed to lead while the well backed At The Weekend trailed along the rails with Lingo parked in the breeze as they travelled down the back straight. But 450m from home Holland allowed his charge to slip into another gear and the five-year-old gelding put four lengths on the opposition as they wheeled into the home turn.

Under strong riding from Holland Lander Dollar responded and he held on to defeat the fast-finishing Genuine Lad by a half head with the heavily backed Jakcorijim a game third ahead of At The Weekend. Lander Dollar was specked at odds firming from \$15 to start at \$9.

Trainer Scott Brunton was ecstatic after the race.

"To think that this horse was punching around the tracks as a class one horse 12 months ago and here he is winning his ninth race and a \$100,000 race at that is quite amazing," he said.

"This horse has come such a long way and to do it as a front-runner makes it even more special. I've won this race before with Dad (David) training but this is my first as trainer in my own right and it feels great.

"You don't get to be standing in the winner's circle for big races without a great team behind you and I am very fortunate to have some of the best around me at Seven Mile Beach".

Lander Dollar (Snowland-Dollar Dollie) found his way into the Brunton stable just over two years go and made an impact by winning on debut in Hobart in December, 2012. But further down the track he lost his way so in July 2013 and on the advice of his trainer, the gelding's part-owner Alan Johnson sent him to a spelling paddock at his property.

He sent the gelding back to Brunton's stable six months later and the horse blossomed during his next preparation winning four of his last six starts before being sent for another spell.

Lander Dollar formed a special relationship with apprentice Kodie Grace who partnered the gelding to 4 of his 5 wins in 2014.

Brunton was unsure if there were any more specific targets for Lander Dollar.

“The Devonport Cup was clearly his main mission and we thought he would have to win the Sheffield Cup to be guaranteed a start in the race,” he said.

“But whatever he does from here on in will be a bonus.

CHERRY DANCER trained by Scott Brunton and ridden by David Pires produced a whirlwind finish coming from last to score a narrow victory over Keukenhof with Crystal Reef third.

2 TASMANIAN GUINEAS

ADMIRAL trained by Barry Campbell and ridden by Brendon McCoull was last season's best two-year-old and is on his way to owning the 3YO title after his demolition of a quality field in the \$100,000 Kevin Sharkie Tasmanian Guineas.

3 ALFA BOWL

SIORCA trained by Barry Campbell and ridden by Brendon McCoull was forced to race three-wide without cover for most of the race but still emerged triumphant over quality filly Gee Gees Top Notch in the \$30,000 feature over 1100 metres.

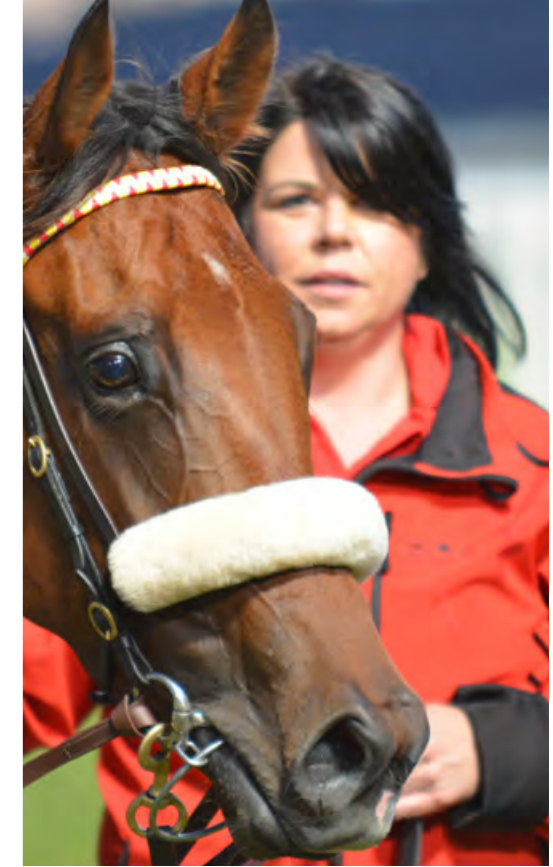

Valiant Warrior lives up to his name

When prominent thoroughbred owner Wayne Roser reached the stage of naming a yearling he purchased at the 2013 Tasmanian Magic Millions Yearling Sale he was hoping the youngster by West Quest would live up to his moniker.

He named the yearling Valiant Warrior after his grandson Christopher who was born premature and who fought valiantly to survive but in the end lost his quest for life.

Valiant Warrior showed all the courage that both Roser and the gelding's trainer Adam Trinder were seeking to win the Tony Carrick 3YO Vase over 1100 metres in Hobart. He then went on to snare the scalp of arguably Tasmania's best galloper Admiral in the 3YO Cup.

Roser was understandably very emotional after the 3YO Cup win when asked to reveal how the horse was named.

"My grandson Christopher was born premature but after countless operations he died," Roser said as he tried valiantly to hold back the tears.

We had this horse by then so I wanted to name him in my grandson's honour and it looks like we chose the right horse".

Valiant Warrior won twice at two and won his first two starts at three but his 3YO Cup win at his fifth outing stamped him as a star sprinter.

He possesses a never-say-die attitude to racing and his rider Anthony Darmanin described the gelding as: "A real bulldog that is in for the fight when the going gets tough."

The 3YO Cup win showed another side of Valiant Warrior.

"In the 3YO Cup he showed another dimension because he didn't lead as he had done at his four previous starts.

"I eased him back and he relaxed well and when I got him off the fence to stake his claim he hit the front and then he dug deep when Admiral came at him – it was a very courageous win," Darmanin said.

Valiant Warrior had a short freshen-up and returned in the Magic Millions 3YO Classic only to be swamped at the business end of the race to finish fourth behind smart filly Rumeron.

But Trinder accepted responsibility for that loss claiming a training error brought about the gelding's demise.

Valiant Warrior responded to a heftier workload on the training track and bounced back with an emphatic win in the 3YO Classic on the last day of the carnival, much to the delight of both owner and trainer.



Off The Track

The stories of thoroughbreds thriving in the equestrian ring after failing as racehorses are becoming more common each year in Tasmania. The latest to excel in the show ring is Oh, So You Think

Oh, So You Think, was known as Jetson when he was trialing to become a racehorse. He is by Hatta's Mill out of Miss Revival and was bred by the late Danny Randall. Groover, as he is known at home, was the epitome of a failed racehorse. He had a handful of barrier trials and two starts where he failed to impress anyone. He was duly passed on to attempt a more relaxed and refined career. At the end of January 2015 he competed at the 2015 Equestrian Australia Horse of the Year event in Hobart and emerged the winner in the Large Open Show Hack category.

Tania Hay came across Oh, So You Think and immediately saw his potential as a show horse. He had been with Lydia Jackson before he went to Tania and was a trickster where he felt life was too good to pass up on and play the game, preferring to play with his riders instead of taking it seriously.

He is a big horse that stands well over 16.2 hands. When Tania decided he should go to someone younger, Jess Elphinstone was keen to take up the challenge.

After a six-month hiatus of playing the fool Groover decided to put his mind to the task of becoming a show hack and in doing so he became a force on the Tasmanian equestrian scene.

His first show under saddle was Champions of Champions in September 2014. He stepped out and took all before him, Champion Led TB, Champion Hack, Supreme Ridden Exhibit. His career had begun with a bang.

Groover then fronted Launceston Royal where again he was Champion Hack and won the TasRacing Off the Track Thoroughbred Class. Jess was very excited, his first royal, his first royal show sash.

Hobart Royal rolled around and he proved his wins were no fluke, backing up Champion at his first royal show with Champion Hack at Hobart Royal and again winning the TasRacing Off the Track Thoroughbred Class.

It is no mean feat for a newcomer horse still presented in a snaffle to take the dual champion hack awards at both royal shows. It's known to the showing fraternity as the 'elusive double'. Groover was starting to make his presence felt.

Roll on a fortnight after Hobart Royal and Jess presents him before three judges at the Show Horse Council Tasmania Horse of the Year show. Groover loves his life as a show horse, he has determined it's actually quite easy to be a superstar in the show ring as opposed to the arduous task of being a racehorse. He has a big future ahead of him and Jess will partner him on the journey, truly a horse that will continue to prove there "is a life after racing".

The Tasmanian Autumn Program presents several initiatives, which will provide excellent opportunities for participants throughout the racing period.

Significantly the Autumn Carnival has been revamped with the inclusion of races that cater for Open class sprinters and a redistribution of prizemoney that will culminate in an Autumn finals day at the Tote Racing Centre on Sunday 10 May with four \$40,000 races highlighting the program.

Key Autumn carnival changes are:

- The Devonport Easter meeting in 2015 is complimentary to the 2015 Autumn Carnival, and this was capitalized on with the programming of the \$25k Easter Diamond over 1000m as an optional starting point for the Open class Sprinters.
- An additional race has been added to the program in the form of a \$30k 1200m Quality Handicap to be run at the final Launceston night meeting for the season on Wednesday 22 April.
- The third race, the final within the race series, which has been programmed as a \$40k 1400m Open Set Weights & Penalties race, will be maintained as the most lucrative of the Autumn Sprint races is viewed as important to allow the opportunity to all Open class runners.
- The two initial Fillies and Mares races from the previous Autumn carnival, both of which are run at Hobart, the \$25k 1100m Handicap and the \$25k 1200m Quality Handicap, remain in their previous format restricted to Fillies and Mares, to continue providing exclusive opportunity against their own sex.
- The addition of a \$15k 2YO & 3YO 1600m set weights, on the 24 May following on from the Autumn features for younger horses which may be looking for the opportunity to step to a middle distance.

In late 2014 Racing Queensland signalled its restructure of midweek racing, vacating its Tuesday midweek timeslot in favour of greater weekend racing. Tasracing approached Sky Channel with regards to securing Sky 1 coverage for its winter midweek meetings. Sky have confirmed the running of selected Tasmanian Tuesday race meetings on Sky 1 including

- TRC Tattersall's Park Tuesday 19 May
- TRC Tattersall's Park Tuesday 9 June
- DRC Tapeta Park Tuesday 7 July

The Autumn program also maintains significant changes from the 2014 Summer program which saw the introduction of increased base level stakes in Maiden, Class 1 and Benchmark 62 races by \$1,500 to \$14,000 and to maintain balance in the tiered stakes structure Class 2 and Benchmark 72 race stakes will also be increased by \$1,000 to \$15,000 and Class 4 by \$1,000 to \$16,000.

TRAINERS NOTICE

Cobalt threshold introduced into the Australian Rules of Racing

NOTICE TO TRAINERS COBALT THRESHOLD INTRODUCED INTO THE AUSTRALIAN RULES OF RACING

Trainers are advised of the introduction of the following new Australian Rule of Racing which takes effect from 1 January 2015:

AR.178C (1) The following prohibited substances when present at or below the concentrations respectively set out are excepted from the provisions of AR.178B and AR.178H:-

“(l) Cobalt at a mass concentration of 200 micrograms per litre in urine.”

Cobalt is a naturally occurring trace element which may normally be present in horses at very low levels as a result of the ingestion of feedstuffs that contain it in trace amounts. Cobalt is also present in the structure of vitamin B12 (cyanocobalamin). However, it is known that excessive amounts of cobalt have an effect on the blood system (AR.178B(1)) and that it is a hypoxia inducible factor (HIF)-1 stabiliser (AR.177B(2)(l)) and a haematopoietic agent (AR.178B(2)). Accordingly, it is a prohibited substance pursuant to AR.178B(1), AR.177B(2)(l) and AR.178B(2) when occurring at levels above those naturally occurring or as a result of routine nutritional sources.

A threshold level has been introduced into the Rules of Racing to recognise that cobalt can be present at very low levels when naturally occurring or as a result of routine nutritional sources

This threshold has been determined following a national survey of the racing horse population which measured cobalt levels in normal racehorses during training and racing.

The threshold has been set at a level to allow for normal levels of cobalt supplementation through routine nutritional sources. However, trainers are advised that the administration, particularly by injection and on multiple occasions, of certain registered vitamin supplements close to racing may result in a level of cobalt in a subsequent sample that exceeds this threshold. Trainers are therefore advised to avoid the use of these supplements close to racing.

Examples of injectable vitamin supplements that contain cobalt and/or vitamin B12 include, but are not limited to, V.A.M. injection, Hemo-15 and Hemoplex.

ARB CALENDAR NOTICE

Advice on Screening Limits - Dexamethasone Limits

IMPORTANT NOTICE REGARDING THE DETECTION OF THE CORTICOSTEROID DRUG DEXAMETHASONE

The International Screening Limit (ISL) for dexamethasone of 0.2ng/mL in urine has been adopted by the Australian Racing Board and will be implemented by Australian racing laboratories with effect from 1 May, 2015.

This will have important implications for the detection of dexamethasone following its administration to racehorses, and will lead to a prolongation of detection times for this corticosteroid drug.

By way of an example, the ISL was applied to the analysis of samples collected during an administration trial involving a short-acting dexamethasone preparation (dexamethasone sodium phosphate) given intravenously and conducted as part of the Equine Therapeutics Research Australia (ETRA) project and published by the Rural Industries Research Development Corporation (RIRDC). The published ETRA data sheet for dexamethasone reports a detection time of three days for the dosage regimen and pharmaceutical preparation used in the ETRA trial, and is valid for the new ISL to be applied by the Australian racing laboratories.

It should be noted that this three day detection time for dexamethasone sodium phosphate is longer than the detection time of 48 hours previously reported in the Australian Equine Veterinary Association (now Equine Veterinarians Australia – EVA) publication ‘Detection of Therapeutic Substances in Racing Horses’ (‘The White Book’), using the analytical methodology at that time.

Therefore veterinarians are advised that recommended withdrawal periods for treatment with dexamethasone sodium phosphate (for example, in products including Colvasone, Dexadreson, Dexapent, Dexason, Dexol-5, Dexone-5) must be based on the new ETRA data sheet detection time of three (3) days and not on the previous advice provided in the EVA publication, and that trainers are warned accordingly.

It is important to note that a withdrawal (or withholding) period is not the same as a detection period. Any withdrawal period should be calculated based on the published detection time, with the addition of a suitable safety margin based on the circumstances of the administration, including dose, route of administration, preparation administered.

There have been no studies conducted on the detection of long-acting forms of injectable dexamethasone in relation to the ISL, and due to their long and unpredictable excretion, their use in racehorses should be avoided.

ARB CALENDAR NOTICE ... AR.178EA

Advice on Screening Limits for therapeutic substances

For the purpose of AR.178EA, it is hereby notified that screening limits applicable to the following therapeutic substances, as approved by the Australian Racing Board, are set out as follows:

- acepromazine – 10 nanograms per millilitre (ng/mL) of the 2-(1-hydroxyethyl) promazine sulphoxide metabolite in urine
- betamethasone - 0.20ng/mL in urine
- butorphanol – 1ng/mL in urine
- carprofen – 100ng/mL in urine
- dantrolene – 1ng/mL of the 5-hydroxydantrolene metabolite in unhydrolysed urine
- detomidine - 2ng/mL of the 3'-hydroxydetomidine metabolite in urine
- dexamethasone – 0.2ng/mL in urine
- diclofenac – 50ng/mL in urine
- dipyrone – 1000ng/mL of the 4-methylaminoantipyrine metabolite in urine
- eltenac – 50ng/mL in urine
- flunixin – 100ng/mL in urine
- frusemide – 50ng/mL in urine
- hyoscine butylbromide (or n-butylscopolammonium) - 25ng/mL in urine
- ipratropium - 0.25ng/mL in urine
- ketoprofen - 100ng/mL in urine
- lignocaine – 10ng/mL of the 3'-hydroxylignocaine metabolite in urine
- meclofenamic acid – 250ng/mL in urine
- meloxicam – 10ng/mL in urine
- mepivacaine – 10ng/mL of the 3'-hydroxymepivacaine metabolite in urine
- naproxen – 250ng/mL in urine
- phenylbutazone – 100ng/mL in urine
- romifidine – 1ng/mL in urine
- salbutamol - 0.5ng/mL in urine
- triamcinolone acetonide - 0.5ng/mL in urine
- vedaprofen – 50ng/mL in urine

Date of Effect: 1 May, 2015

AMENDMENTS TO AUSTRALIAN RULES OF RACING ... AR.64G

Stomach Tubing

SUMMARY:

AR.64G makes it an offence to stomach-tube, attempt to stomach-tube, cause to be stomach-tubed or to be a party to the stomach-tubing of a horse on race day (prior to a race), or during the one clear day prior to the day of the race.

Stewards have raised an issue with AR.64G in that a party to the attempted stomach-tubing of a horse does not appear specifically to commit an offence under the rule.

The ARB Board decided that AR.64G should be amended to include an offence for being a party to an attempted stomach-tubing. Whilst AR.175(l) provides a general offence to attempt to commit a breach of the Rules, it is preferable for there to be an express provision for this offence.

The ARB Board decided that AR.196(5) be amended consequentially.

AMENDMENT TO RULE 64G

Please delete AR.64G and insert the following:

“(1) A horse which is engaged to run in any race, official trial or jump-out must not be stomach- tubed without the permission of the Stewards:

- (a) at any time on the day of the scheduled race, official trial or jump-out and prior to the start of such event; and
- (b) at any time during the one Clear Day prior to 12:01am on the day of the scheduled race, official trial, or jump-out.

(2) Any person who, without the permission of the Stewards:

- (a) stomach-tubes a horse;
- (b) attempts to stomach-tube a horse;
- (c) causes a horse to be stomach-tubed or
- (d) is a party to the stomach-tubing of a horse, or an attempt to

stomach-tube a horse, contrary to this rule, commits an offence and may be penalised.

(3) Where the Stewards are satisfied that a horse has, or is likely to have been, stomach-tubed contrary to the provisions of this rule, the Stewards may prevent the horse from starting in any relevant race, official trial or jump-out.

(4) Where a horse has been stomach-tubed contrary to this rule, the horse may be disqualified from any relevant race in which the horse competed.

(5) For the purpose of this rule, “stomach-tubed” and variations of that term means any application to a horse of a naso-gastric tube.”

Date of Effect: 1 February 2015

AMENDMENT TO RULE 196(5)

Please delete AR.196(5) and insert the following:

“Where a person is found guilty of a breach of any of the Rules listed below, a penalty of disqualification for a period of not less than the period specified for that Rule must be imposed unless there is a finding that a special circumstance exists whereupon the penalty may be reduced:

- AR.64G(2) (where the stomach-tubing or attempt to stomach-tube occurred on race day or on the one Clear Day prior to race day for a horse engaged to run in a race on that race day) – 12 months
- AR.83(d) – 2 years
- AR.84 – 2 years
- AR.135(d) – 3 years
- AR.175(aa) – 5 years
- AR.175(h)(i) – 3 years
- AR.175(hh)(i) – 2 years
- AR.177B(6) – 2 years
- AR.178E – 6 months
- AR.178H(2) – 2 years

For the purpose of this sub-rule, a special circumstance is as stipulated by each Principal Racing Authority under its respective Local Rules.”

AMENDMENTS TO AUSTRALIAN RULES OF RACING ... AR.177C and 178G
Elevated Testosterone Levels

SUMMARY:

Racing authorities have recognized a phenomenon of elevated testosterone levels in excess of the threshold for testosterone in AR.178C(1)(g)(i) in race day urine samples arising from unusual endogenous adrenal gland production in certain geldings. These findings were repeatable in the affected individuals. Subsequently, new AR's 177C and 178G were introduced to deal with the consequences of these unusual findings in the affected geldings.

More recently, a similar issue has been identified in a very small number of female thoroughbreds, again a repeatable phenomenon in the affected individuals.

As for geldings, there is the need to address the consequences of atypical endogenous elevations in affected female racehorses in terms of the disqualification of the horse and the culpability of the trainer.

Therefore, the ARB Board has decided that ARs 177C and 178G be amended to include provision for atypical endogenous testosterone production in female horses leading to elevations in urinary testosterone concentrations in excess of the threshold specified in AR.178C(1)(g)(ii).

AMENDMENT TO RULE 177C

Please delete AR.177C and insert the following:

"In the case of the presence of testosterone (including both free testosterone and testosterone liberated from its conjugates) above a mass concentration of 20 micrograms per litre being detected in a urine sample taken from a gelding, or above a mass concentration of 55 micrograms per litre being detected in a urine sample taken from a filly or mare, prior to or following its running in any race, it is open to the Stewards to find that the provisions of AR.177 or AR.178H do not apply if on the basis of the scientific and analytical evidence available to them they are satisfied that the detected level in the sample was of endogenous origin or as a result of endogenous activity."

Date of Effect: 1 February 2015

AMENDMENT TO RULE 178G

Please delete AR.178G and insert the following:

"In the case of the presence of testosterone (including both free testosterone and testosterone liberated from its conjugates) above a mass concentration of 20 micrograms per litre being detected in a urine sample taken from a gelding, or above a mass concentration of 55 micrograms per litre being detected in a urine sample taken from a filly or mare, prior to or following its running in any race, it is open to the Stewards to find that the provisions of AR.178 or AR.178H do not apply if on the basis of the scientific and analytical evidence available to them they are satisfied that the detected level in the sample was of endogenous origin or as a result of endogenous activity."

Date of Effect: 1 February 2015

AMENDMENTS TO AUSTRALIAN RULES OF RACING ... AR.1
Definition of Horse handler

SUMMARY OF AMENDED ARR ON DRUG & ALCOHOL TESTING OF HORSE HANDLERS

The ARB Board decided to further clarify the definition of horse handler therefore the amendment below deletes "or any other person" from the scope of the rule.

AMENDMENT TO AR.1

Amend AR.1 as follows:

"Horse handler" means any licensed person who handles any horse at any meetings, trial, jump out or in training and includes but is not limited to stable hands, trainers, veterinarians, farriers and barrier attendants."

Date of Effect: 1st April 2015



AMENDMENTS TO AUSTRALIAN RULES OF RACING ... AR.196(1) and AR.196(2)
Increase in the relevant monetary limits for fines

SUMMARY:

AR.196(1) and (2) prescribe upper monetary limits of \$75,000 for:

- (a) the imposition of fines for any breach of the Rules; and
- (b) the forfeiture of a rider's percentage of prize money for a breach of AR.137A (whip offences).

The ARB Board believes it is necessary for the scope of financial penalties to remain an effective deterrent. Whilst the upper limit of monetary penalties is not often reached, the Rules need to remain relevant and this includes the upper limit which may be imposed as monetary penalty.

The upper limit of monetary penalties for general rule breaches has not increased in over 15 years and has therefore not kept up with increases in prize money and inflation over that time. It is noted that, in particular, prize money has increased at major carnivals such as the Sydney Championships and the Melbourne Spring Carnival.

The ARB Board therefore decided to raise the relevant monetary limits in AR.196(1) and (2) for fines (or forfeitures for AR.196(2)) from \$75,000 to an amount not exceeding \$100,000.

AMENDMENT TO RULE 196(1)

Please delete AR.196(1) and insert the following:

"(1) Subject to sub-rule (2) of this Rule any person or body authorised by the Rules to penalise any person may, unless the contrary is provided, do so by disqualification, suspension, reprimand, or fine not exceeding \$100,000. Provided that a disqualification or suspension may be supplemented by a fine."

Date of Effect: 1 February 2015

AMENDMENT TO RULE 196(2)

Please delete AR.196(2) and insert the following:

"(2) In respect of a breach of AR.137A the Stewards may in addition to the penalty options conferred on them under subrule (1) of this Rule order the forfeiture of the rider's riding fee and/or forfeiture of all or part of the rider's percentage of prizemoney notwithstanding that the amount exceeds \$100,000."

Date of Effect: 1 February 2015

AMENDMENTS TO AUSTRALIAN RULES OF RACING ... AR.196(4)
Extension of the period of time for which a penalty may be suspended

SUMMARY:

Pursuant to AR.196(4), the current rules allow the operation of a penalty to be suspended for a period not exceeding 12 months. The suspension of the operation of a penalty for a period can act as a significant deterrent to the disciplined person breaching the rules during that period.

Stewards support an extension of the period of time for which a penalty may be suspended from 12 months to two years. It is considered that the ability to suspend the operation of a penalty for a longer period will give racing authorities more flexible and broader power to impose such sentences with more deterrent effect.

The ARB Board considers it appropriate and desirable to introduce this reform and to give racing authorities scope to impose penalties with sufficient deterrent effect. Many conduct breaches are due to volatility of personalities and a longer period of suspension of penalty (which may be viewed in a similar way to a bond) will provide a greater deterrent to re-offending.

The Board therefore decided that AR.196(4) be amended to extend the period for which the operation of a penalty may be suspended from 12 months to two years.

AMENDMENT TO RULE 196(4)

Please delete AR.196(4) and insert the following:

"(4) Any person or body authorised by the Rules to penalise any person may in respect of any penalty imposed on a person in relation to the conduct of a person, other than a period of disqualification or a warning off, suspend the operation of that penalty either wholly or in part for a period not exceeding two years upon such terms and conditions as they see fit."

Date of Effect: 1 February 2015



AMENDMENTS TO AUSTRALIAN RULES OF RACING ... AR.182

Restrictions on Disqualified Persons & Suspended Persons

SUMMARY:

This matter involves two issues:

- 1. Further restrictions on disqualified persons; and
2. The extension of restrictions in respect of disqualified and suspended persons.

The Board believes that:

- It is essential that restrictions placed on disqualified and suspended persons are clearly and comprehensively addressed in the Rules of Racing.
• The issue of disqualified persons attending horse sales and related events needs to be directly addressed in the Rules

AMENDMENT TO RULE 182:

Please delete AR.182 and insert the following:

- “(1) Except with the consent of the Principal Racing Authority that imposed the disqualification, and upon such conditions that they may in their discretion impose, a person disqualified pursuant to these Rules must not, during the period of that disqualification:
(a) enter upon any racecourse or training track owned, operated or controlled by a Club or Principal Racing Authority or any land used in connection with such properties;
(b) enter upon any training premises, complex or establishment of any Club, Principal Racing Authority or licensed person;
(c) be an office holder, official, member or employee of any Club or Principal Racing Authority;
(d) be employed by, or otherwise engaged to provide any service in any capacity to, any thoroughbred racing stable;
(e) ride any racehorse in any race, official trial, jump-out or test;
(f) enter or nominate any horse for a race or official trial whether acting as agent or principal or in any other capacity;
(g) subscribe to any sweepstakes;
(h) race or have trained any horse whether as owner, lessee or in any other capacity;
(i) share in the winnings of any horse;
(j) participate in any way in the preparation for racing or training of any racehorse;
(k) open a betting account, operate an existing betting account, transact a bet or have a bet transacted on his/her behalf, have any interest in or share in any bet, receive a benefit from any bet placed with a licensed wagering operator in connection with any thoroughbred race meeting held in Australia;
(l) conduct or assist with thoroughbred breeding in Australia;
(m) attend or participate in thoroughbred racehorse sales or related events;
(n) permit or authorise any other

person to conduct any activity associated with thoroughbred racing, thoroughbred race horse sales and/or breeding for or on behalf of the disqualified person; and/or

- (o) receive any direct or indirect financial or other benefit derived from thoroughbred racing and/or breeding in Australia.
(2) In addition to any of the restrictions that may apply in respect of a disqualified person, including those set out in AR.182(1), the Principal Racing Authority or the body which imposed the disqualification may order the disqualified person:
(a) not to participate in social media or mainstream media in relation to any racing or wagering matter;
(b) to adhere to such other restrictions as may be necessary or desirable to prevent conduct by the disqualified person that could be prejudicial to the image or interests or welfare of racing.
(3) Except with the consent of the Principal Racing Authority that imposed the disqualification, no person who in the opinion of the Principal Racing Authority is a close associate of a disqualified person shall be permitted to train or race any horse.
(4) A disqualified person who breaches an order made pursuant to AR.182(2) is guilty of an offence and may be penalised.
(5) Unless otherwise determined by the Principal Racing Authority that imposed or adopted the penalty, the period of disqualification of any person who contravenes any of the provisions of rule AR.182(1), shall automatically recommence as from the most recent date of such contravention, and the person may also be subject to further penalty.
(6) The provisions of subrule (5) shall apply to any person to whom AR.182(1)

applies, regardless of when such penalty that gives rise to the application of the rule was imposed. “

Date of Effect: 1 February 2015

EXTENSION OF RESTRICTIONS ON DISQUALIFIED AND SUSPENDED PERSONS

The ARB Board holds concerns over the potential active participation of disqualified or suspended individuals in certain public aspects of racing, which has the potential to reflect negatively on the industry.

The ARB Board considered that the Rules ought to be flexible enough to provide restrictions on disqualified or suspended persons so that they do not act to undermine or negatively impact upon the image of racing during their disqualification/suspension. It was considered preferable for there to be an express power to place certain restrictions on suspended or disqualified persons in respect of entering racecourses or other places, participating in media, and other matters.

ADDITION OF RULE 183F

Please insert AR.183F as follows:
“In addition to any of the restrictions that may apply to a suspended person under the Rules, the Principal Racing Authority or the body which imposed the suspension may order the suspended person:

- (1) not to enter designated places at racecourses except at times or on conditions as may be specified in the order;
(2) not to participate in social media or mainstream media in relation to any racing or wagering matter; and
(3) to adhere to such other restrictions as may be necessary or desirable to prevent conduct by the suspended person that could be prejudicial to the image or interests or welfare of racing.”

Date of Effect: 1 February 2015

CHANGE OF TACTICS

Trainers and connections are reminded of their obligations under AR 135A to advise Stewards no later than 30 minutes prior to the race if they intend to race their horse in a manner different from the manner it was ridden at its most recent starts.

RIDERS SAFETY EQUIPMENT

Jockeys, Trial Riders and Trackwork Riders are reminded that their safety equipment (Safety Vest and Helmet) must conform with the requirements of Australian Rules 86A, 86B, 87, 87A, 87AA, 87AAA, 87B, 87C, 87D. You are required to familiarise yourself with the requirements of these rules.

TRIAL RIDING ATTIRE

Trial Riders should now be aware that jeans are no longer accepted to be worn in official trials. Riders are required to wear riding jodhpurs. If the correct attire is not worn the rider may be fined and not allowed to ride in the trial.

LICENCE RENEWALS

Participants are reminded that licence renewal applications will be distributed in early June and should be returned early July to allow processing to be completed prior to the commencement of the racing season on 1 August 2015.

If you need to have a medical examination as part of your licence renewal, it would be a good idea to organise an appointment to save any possible delay.
