apprentices in Tasmania

Tasracing and WorkCo Victoria will conduct Certificate IV in Racing (Jockey) training for Tasmanian apprentices from March this year.

The program will be managed by former Racing Victoria Limited's David Cookson with assistance from Tasracing, stewards and local industry participants.

Tasracing chief executive officer Eliot Forbes said since 2006 all Tasmanian apprentice jockeys were required to travel to Victoria to undertake the Certificate IV training to graduate to senior ranks.

"This sort of training was not viable for Tasmanian accredited training providers due to the small number of apprentices taken on every year," he said. "But an increase in the number of Tasmanian-based applicants for apprenticeships, the identification of a need to develop local talent and increasing travel and accommodation costs to Victoria prompted Tasracing to investigate options to offer this training in Tasmania."

Dr Forbes said the flexibility to offer this training in Tasmania was an important development for the thoroughbred industry. "We are very pleased that we have been able to negotiate a successful outcome with WorkCo Victoria to provide the training in the jockeys' home state," he said.

becoming an apprentice

From day one, successful applicants are groomed to be leading professional sports people.

This means significant dedication, personal sacrifices and hard work to become a world class jockey. The top jockeys will tell you that they never stop learning, and the apprenticeship will build the foundations to lead to a successful career.

It is the expectation that apprentices approach the program with the utmost professionalism.

TRAINING FOR HIGH PERFORMANCE

Becoming a leading jockey will just not happen. The program provides you with the necessary skills, knowledge and support, but it will take your hard work and dedication to be truly successful. The training is delivered with a safety first mindset, with Apprentices completing the following training units in the Cert IV in Racing (Jockey):

RGRH310A - Oversee Safe Horse Handling

RGRH311A - Apply Principles of basic Anatomy and Physiology to horses

RGRH313A - Ride horses at Trackwork

RGRH317A - Maintain Horses in a Healthy State and Safe environment

RGRH414A - Ride horses in Industry regulated Competition

RGRH415A - Manage Personal and Business affairs

RGRH416A - Apply Principles of Sports Science to Jockeys

RGRH420A - Plan Training and Racing Programs for Thoroughbreds

RGRH424A - Manage and Perform administrative duties associated with Racing Horses



Craig Newitt, arguably Tasmania's most prominent jockey apprenticed in Tasmania.

Tasmanian born Craig Newitt was destined to become a jockey with both of his grandfathers and his mother and father being jockeys.

Craig was riding trackwork before he was a teenager and became an apprentice jockey, first with his father, Guy, and then with his uncle, Leon Wells. After winning the Tasmanian jockey premiership in 2000-01 he was lured to the Melbourne stables of Lee Freedman in 2002 and won the 2002-03 metropolitan apprentice's premiership.

Craig's career has included more than 1300 winners including wins in the Blue Diamond Stakes, The Metropolitan, Sydney Cup, Goodwood Hcp and Underwood Stakes, accumulating over 20 Group 1 wins. He has also demonstrated success overseas including a win at Royal Ascot in the Group 1 Kings Stand Stakes.

APPRENTICE STRUCTURE

You will be enrolled into the Certificate IV in Racing (Jockey), where you will enter an employment agreement and a Deed of Apprenticeship with Tasracing and an endorsed host trainer.

The contract is for a period of 2 years whilst the apprenticeship is undertaken.

Training will be a mixture of compulsory structured training managed by Tasracing, in partnership with WorkCo, and onthe-job training. For the 2 years, you will be required to attend the structured training at with Tasracing approximately 2 days per month. The final years of your apprenticeship will be conducted in your employer's stables and at the races.

Tasracing and WorkCo will manage your program and conduct workplace visits to monitor and assist your progression.

ON THE JOB TRAINING

Working with your endorsed racehorse trainer, a typical working week involves riding track work 6 mornings per week and providing general horse care at the stables. As you progress, you will also ride in barrier trials and at selected race meetings.

LIFE AFTER RACING

Tasracing in conjunction with the Tasmanian Jockeys Association (TJA) have implemented the following initiatives to support retired jockeys:

- Strengthened education and training, incorporating career transition, retraining programs and professional development programs
- Two investment funds established to meet the retirement needs of jockeys – superannuation and the career benefit scheme
- Access to professional financial counseling services;
- Benevolent fund;
- Jockey Assistance program, counseling support for jockeys and their families.

eorgie Catania wanted nothing other than to become a jockey from as far back as she can remember

She used to hang around the stables and learned to groom horses before she was finally old enough to be an apprentice. She began her apprenticeship with Gary White and enjoyed success soon after securing her licence. There was expectation every time she jumped aboard on race day. For a number of reasons she stopped riding and took time off to determine whether or not she really wanted to be a jockey.

She travelled interstate and affiliated with a prominent stable and it was there that she regained her desire to forge a career as a jockey.

Thankfully for the Tasmanian industry the cards fell in favour of her returning to the saddle.

Catania is now indentured to Brighton trainer Tammy Mollross.

Late last year Catania bagged a treble in Launceston courtesy of wins aboard Can Get Thirsty and Colossus Of Rhodes for Brighton trainer John Luttrell and Status Seeker for her master Tammy Mollross.

The young rider has been back riding for about 20 months with limited success but the treble set her on a roll and the winners have continued to come on a regular basis, especially for Spreyton trainer Adam Trinder.

Rasit Yetimova arrived in Tasmania over two years ago as a competent young rider with a goal to win a premiership.

Last season he achieved his goal when he emerged a clear winner of the Tasmanian Apprentices premiership.

He rode 35 winners and finished 14-1/2 wins clear of

He rode 35 winners and finished 14-1/2 wins clear of his Turkish compatriot Bulent Muhcu.

Yetimova was brought to Tasmania from Victoria by Broadmarsh trainer Walter McShane to whom the Turkish-born rider is indentured but he was placed on loan to Spreyton trainer Leon Wells for three months and that partnership was so successful Yetimova is now permanently assigned to the Spreyton based trainer.

The 24 year old opted to leave the state last year in an attempt to establish himself in Queensland so he had his indentures transferred to Gold Coast trainer Kelly Doughty.

"Things didn't quite work out as I had hoped so I decided to return to Tasmania and it has proved to be for the best," Yetimova said.

It was a rollercoaster ride for the young rider in the first six months of his stint in a new country.

At one stage he was ordered by Tasmanian stewards to travel to Victoria for a reeducation process on safe riding and after that was completed he journeyed back to Turkey to consider his options.

But he bit the bullet and returned to Tasmania and this time around he has gone from strength to strength.

There was never any doubt about his capabilities as a horseman but with a better understanding of what is

going on around him in races he has developed into a talented young rider.

Muhcu is indentured to Broadmarsh trainer Walter McShane for whom he has ridden many winners and his services have been utilised by nearly all of the top trainers in the state. sigrid "Siggy" Carr has made quite an impact since she joined the apprentice riding ranks in October last year.

Carr 24, has been around horses all of her life and she has been riding since she was a toddler.

As the daughter of one of Tasmania's best trainers Royston Carr, she had many opportunities to take up an apprenticeship but her impetuous nature in her formative years probably played a role in her not wanting to follow the family path, so to speak.

Carr said she wanted to wait until she was absolutely sure she wanted to be a jockey before taking the plunge. Carr registered her first race win at her 14th ride when she guided the Michael Voss trained Rose Of Innocence to victory in November last year.

As at 19 February 2013 Carr had ridden 16 winners and 42 minor placings from 162 rides with her tally of winners including a treble on Hobart Cup day.

She won the first two races and should have had a hat trick of wins after three races but her mount in the third, Faith 'N' Courage, was leading close to home but finished third beaten less than half a length. Carr is regarded as one of the most promising female riders since Bev Buckingham graced our turf.

David Fisher Ismail Toker

PORMER Victorian David Fisher made his riding debut at Tattersall's Park in Hobart in September last year aboard Buzzing Away for his masters David and Scott Brunton.

Fisher, 21, began his apprenticeship with team Brunton in October last year.

He doesn't come from a racing background with neither of his parents having any interest in the sport, although they provided the strong support required to ensure their son pursued his dream.

It took him a while to make his riding debut but he was more than ready when the time came. His first winner arrived on November 1 courtesy of Hell Strong scoring a game victory and he capped the day by snaring a double when he partnered Buzzing Along to victory

Fisher spent a few months at Robert Smerdon's stables in Melbourne and it was riding alongside some of the nation's best jockeys that inspired Fisher to pursue his dream.

Ismail Toker is the latest Turkish apprentice to arrive to ride in Tasmania.

Arriving in Australia in 2006, Toker was indentured to Melbourne trainer Heath Connors during the 2006/2007 season, before heading back to Turkey to receive an Australian work permit.

Toker remained riding in Turkey until his international clearance in 2009 and returned to Australia to ride trackwork for leading Victorian trainer David Hayes until 2012, before taking up an apprenticeship with Cambridge trainer Rhonda Hall

Toker arrived in Tasmania in late 2012 and has already begun riding with seven rides to his name across all three Tasmanian venues.



Chantal Willis Rhonda Mangan

A fter numerous stints back and forth between Western Australia and Tasmania, Devonport native Chantal Willis has finally found a home under the care of Leon Wells.

Willis has spent over two years on the mainland in Western Australian honing her craft with trainers Liz Strempel and Shane Edwards, as well as a brief return to Tasmania with Angela Brakey.

Riding trackwork regularly for Strempel, Edwards and Brakey, Willis even spent numerous mornings aboard Guest Wing before his victory in the 2011 Perth Cup. Throughout her time in WA, Willis kept in contact with Wells and when the opportunity arose to become the latest apprentice of the Leon Wells production line, Willis returned back to Tasmania in late 2012 to take up the offer.

Willis will begin riding in early 2013 after completing 20 trials.

hen Rhonda
Mangan was
thrown a wild-card
opportunity to take up an
apprenticeship at age 37, she
grabbed it firmly with both
hands.

Mangan rode for two seasons as an amateur about 10 years ago and last year she returned to riding as an amateur in Victoria.

She notched about 60 winners from just over 300 rides as an amateur and that form convinced the state's leading training combination of David and Scott Brunton to give her a chance at riding professionally as an apprentice.

Mangan rode her first winner as a professional rider in October last year when she guided the Brunton-trained Enshroud to an all-the-way win in a maiden at Tattersall's Park.

It was a special moment for Mangan who shows great dedication in her quest to pursue her dream of being a full-time professional jockey.

She captured her biggest win at Spreyton in February when she partnered Naadji to victory in the Wynyard Cup over 1650 metres.



Winner of the TattsBet.com Stakes & Bow Mistress WFA

REBEL BRIDE confirmed her status as Tasmania's best race mare when she outgunned a star-studded field to win her second Group 3 Bow Mistress Trophy in succession at Tattersall's Park in Hobart.

With Hall of Fame jockey Stephen Maskiell aboard Rebel Bride came from well back and three-wide for the last 600 metres to run down the race favourite Tariana that is trained in Victoria by Mick Price.

Tariana led and looked to have the balance of the field struggling turning for home with the exception of Rebel Bride that was looming ominous at the top of the home straight.

When Maskiell called on Rebel Bride for the supreme effort 200 metres

from home she dug deep and went on to score by a length from Tariana with Rose Pattern a close-up third.


Rebel Bride won the race last year and did so on a short preparation but as her trainer Leon Wells explained, this year's race was a prime target from day one.

"Last year she just won her way through the classes and when we got to the Bow Mistress we accepted and she won so it was a natural progression to the Vamos but it was all done on the spur of the moment sort of thing."

Winner of the Conquering WFA and Jockey Club Cup

GEEGES BLACKFLASH established himself as one of Tasmania's most recognised gallopers last season and developed a cult following across the nation.

The racing public couldn't get enough of "The Flash" from Tasmania after he won the 2012 AAMI Hobart Cup and there was almost a national "sigh" when he went down by a whisker to Prevailing in the AAMI Launceston Cup at his subsequent outing.

He was spelled and when he returned to racing his trainer John Luttrell was clearly optimistic about his chances of turning the tables in the 2013 AAMI Launceston Cup.

But being a year older he took longer to come to hand but when he ran down star mare Rebel Bride in the Conquering weight-for-age over 1400 metres in Launceston in December it signaled to all and sundry that the champ was back and ready for another assault on the feature races during the AAMI Tasmanian Summer Racing Carnival.

With his regular jockey Peter Mertens aboard, Geegees Blackflash settled midfield inside of Dream Flyer in the Conquering WFA and the duo were in unison when they set out after tearaway leader Rebel Bride (Stephen Maskiell) 500 metres from home.

When Mertens got Geegees Blackflash into clear racing room about 200 metres from the line he knuckled down to his task and dug deep to run down the star mare close to home with Dream Flyer not far away in third spot.


It was a popular win with the crowd cheering loudly as Mertens brought last season's Tasmanian Horse of the Year back to the unsaddling enclosure.

It was an elated trainer John Luttrell who explained the horse had to contend with a few issues leading up to his first start this season in which he finished down the track in the Newmarket Handicap two weeks earlier.

Geegees Blackflash went on to win the Jockey Club Cup over Fieldmaster and Dream Pedlar before finishing a game third in the 2013 AAMI Hobart Cup won by Victorian Hurdy Gurdy Man (Glen Boss).

Luttrell was forced to prepare his stable star differently from in previous years owing to the distance of the Hobart Cup being extended from 2200 to 2400 metres.

Geegees Blackflash is owned by Paul and Elizabeth Geard who treat the gelding like royalty and any wonder as he delivered to them two of the most sought after wins of any owner in Tasmania – a Hobart Cup and a Tasmanian Derby.

HURDY GURDY MAN DELIVERS KNOCKOUT BLOW IN AAMI HOBART CUP

BOOKMAKERS around Australia took a pounding when Victorian owned and trained Hurdy Gurdy Man scored an emphatic win in the Group 3 \$225,000 AAMI Hobart Cup over 2400 metres at Tattersall's Park.

Hurdy Gurdy Man was sensationally backed in from \$7.50 late in the week to \$4.50 and was also the medium of a mini plunge on-course to start the \$3.80 favourite ahead of local stayer Norsqui and the Robert Smerdon trained gelding Westsouthwest at \$7.00.

Early favourites The Cleaner and last year's winner Geegees Blackflash were noticeable drifters in the betting with Geegees Blackflash easing to \$10.00, while The Cleaner touched \$8.00 before firming slightly to start at \$7.50.

The Cleaner was expected to lead and that eventuated while Norsqui enjoyed a cushy run in the one-out line with cover and the Gai Waterhouse-trained Power Broker settled on the leader's back.

Geegees Blackflash settled just better than midfield while Hurdy Gurdy Man was just in arrears and on the rails.

When jockey Jason Maskiell called on The Cleaner to extend his lead the Mick Burles-trained five-year-old responded but that's when Geegees Blackflash was set alight by Peter Mertens and at the top of the home straight it appeared as if "The Flash" would make it back-to-back cups. Three time

Melbourne Cup winning jockey Glen Boss called on Hurdy Gurdy Man and so fast did Hurdy Gurdy Man finish it appeared as if the five-year-old had jumped the fence and just joined in the race.

It was an emphatic win and with the Tattsbet \$100,000 Cups Double Bonus up for grabs he is likely to proceed to the AAMI Launceston Cup in an attempt to cash in on the bonus. It was a great result for trainer Darren Weir as this was his fourth AAMI Hobart Cup success.

Hurdy Gurdy Man was aimed at the Hobart Cup with the hope of getting in with a light weight, and was well treated carrying the minimum of 54 kilograms.

Mister John

Winner of the Tasmanian Guineas

TASMANIAN Guineas winner Mister John has been dispatched to the spelling paddock and may not resume racing until next season.

The gelding's owner-breeder Dr John Burke indicated after the three year old won the Guineas that he would be "tipped out" owing to his immaturity.

"I really believe this horse is special so I want to give him every chance to mature without being over taxed on the race track," Dr Burke said. "There was always the temptation to go on to the Hobart Guineas over 2100 metres and he may well have been able to do that but I had doubts."

"Sending him out for a spell now will do him the world of good," he said.

The gelding scored an emphatic win over Kenjorwood and What Life Brings in the \$90,000 Listed race over 1600 metres under lights at the TOTE Racing Centre.

Mister John is prepared at Brighton by Royston Carr who predicted at the end of the gelding's two-year-old season that he thought the horse was a genuine Guineas prospect.

Mister John is by Strada from former classy mare Kats Clause that won multiple races on metropolitan tracks in Victoria as well as numerous races in her home state.

The Cleaner

Winner of the Kevin Sharkie Tasmanian Stakes WFA, 1600m Quality Handicap, and the 2100m Summer Cup

The Cleaner showed enormous potential last season and his return to racing was eagerly awaited by both punters and thoroughbred enthusiasts.

The Mick Burles-trained gelding could not have been more impressive at his first start. The four-length win over quality opposition in the weight-for-age Kevin Sharkie Stakes over 1600m had pundits on and off the track talking about the ease with which the gelding dispensed with his rivals.

Last season's Tasmanian horse of the year Geegees Blackflash and Dream Pedlar finished in his wake and after the race Burles found it difficult to contain his elation.

The Cleaner looked set to be a force in last year's Hobart and Launceston Cups but after finishing out of a place in the 2012 Devonport Cup the gelding was diagnosed with small bone chips in both knees so he underwent surgery that proved successful.

He resumed racing with two wins in Hobart before heading to Victoria where he won a race at Sandown and was placed at Moonee Valley.

After the Sharkie Tasmanian Stakes The Cleaner went on to win the Field Family Quality Handicap over 1600 metres in Launceston in which he again defeated Geegees Blackflash and Dream Pedlar and followed up with a win in the 2100 Summer Cup.

He proved his worth as a genuine stayer when he led and finished a gallant third in the AAMI Hobart Cup over 2400 metres. He set a strong pace and when jockey Jason Maskiell called on him for the supreme effort he responded magnificently but he was unable to hold out the lightly weighted Hurdy Gurdy Man (54kg).







Winner of the Thousand Guineas

TALENTED three-year-old filly Settler's Joy stamped herself a genuine Tasmanian Oaks prospect when she scored an effortless win in the \$30,000 Aceland Stud Thousand Guineas over 1600 metres at The TOTE Racing Centre in Launceston.

With Craig Newitt aboard, the Troy Blacker trained filly came from last on the home turn to blitz a quality field by almost three lengths.

"This filly is a dead set stayer and when she gets out to 2100 metres or beyond we will see the best of her," said trainer Troy Blacker.

"I've thought all along that she was an Oaks prospect so that's where we'll head."

"She will go to the paddock after the Oaks and hopefully she can come back and get prepared for the distance races next season and possibly the Hobart and Launceston cups," he said.

Settler's Joy is a graduate of the 2011 Tasmanian Magic Millions Yearling sale where she was purchased for only \$4500.

L renzano

Winner of the 3YO Vase & 3YO Cup

STAR three-year-old filly Arenzano entered the 2012-13 season with a big reputation and she lived up to it and then some.

Arenzano began this season by setting a track record in a maiden on her home track at Spreyton in September last year.

She sizzled over the 1000 metres in 59.4 seconds and scored by 15 lengths without being pushed right out.

But it wasn't until she scored successive wins in the 3YO Vase in Hobart and the 3YO Cup in Launceston that she earned the title of star act.

The filly is trained at Spreyton by Barry Campbell and is owned by a syndicate including Star Thoroughbreds director Denise Martin and prominent Tasmanian owners Ron and Trudy Schwanke and Bruno Calabro.

Arenzano finished a gallant fourth in the 3YO Trophy race over 1400m before ending her campaign with a game fifth in the Tasmanian Guineas over 1600m on January 2.

She was purchased by Denise Martin at the 2011 Tasmanian Magic Millions Yearling sale for \$60,000



Green Loller

Winner of the Strutt Stakes

VICTORIAN trainer David Hayes looked set to win another Tasmanian Oaks after his three-year-old filly Green Roller outstayed her rivals to win the \$100,000 Listed Strutt Stakes over 2100 metres at Tattersall's Park in Hobart on Sunday.

Green Roller came from well back in the field to score a runaway win from First Bloom and Papillon.

Hayes won last year's Tasmanian Oaks with Rock Robster and Green Roller gives the impression she may be more talented.

She was ridden by Chad Schofield who was patient and prepared to wait until the 1000-metre peg to make his move.

"We had a nice run in the race but the pace wasn't strong and I was wary of the leader getting too far in front," Schofield said.

"I had to be patient but once I pulled her out into clear running she was really strong to the line," he said.

Hayes' assistant trainer Gary Fennessy was full of praise for the filly that is by Flying Spur from the Canny Lad mare Given.

"She had already proven to be competitive over distances up to 1800m but we were quite confident she would handle the extra distance of this race," Fennessy said.

"We won the Oaks with Rock Robster last year and then took her up to Sydney but she didn't handle the wet tracks but we could do the same with this filly if she is still going well.

Youthful Lack

Winner of the Thomas Lyons Stakes

GALANT NSW sprinter-miler Youthful Jack made it back-to-back wins in the \$100,000 weight-forage Tattsbet.com Thomas Lyons Stakes over 1400 metres at Tattersall's Park in Hobart.

With his veteran jockey Robert Thompson aboard, Youthful Jack stormed home from near last on the home turn to score a runaway win over Cellarmaster and local mare My Temptation.

Youthful Jack came to Tasmania last year and cleaned up the triple crown of sprint-mile weight-for-age races during the carnival that comprised the Tattsbet.com Stakes (1200m), Thomas Lyons and the George Adams (1600m) in Launceston. He missed a place in this year's Tattsbet.com Stakes but was well on the way to capturing two of the three features this time in.

The seven-year-old gelding is owned and raced by his NSW trainer Ross Stitt and Geoff Sheedy and trained during his Tasmanian campaign by Spreyton-based mentor Adam Trinder.

Trinder was thrilled with the win and admitted the gelding needed the outing in the Tattsbet.com Stakes to have him at his peak for the last two features during the carnival.

"He had two runs in NSW before coming to me and he probably went into the Tattsbet.com Stakes a bit underdone but he has come on in leaps and bounds since that race and what we saw today was what we had expected in all three races that were planned for him in Tasmania," Trinder said.

The win put Youthful Jack into an elite group as the \$60,000 first prize money took his career earnings to beyond \$1 million.

Thompson has had a great association with Youthful Jack having partnered the gelding to all of his 17 wins.





Winner of the Goodwood Handicap

PUNCTUATE was one of Tasmania's most consistent sprinters two seasons back but after an unsuccessful stint interstate struggled to recapture his best form.

In November last year, almost 18 months after his previous win, the David and Scott Brunton-trained gelding scored a brilliant victory in the Goodwood Handicap over 1100 metres at Tattersall's Park in Hobart.

It was a much overdue win and one that gave connections confidence going into the 2012 Newmarket Handicap. But why he had taken so long to win another race had more to do with him finishing third in the Newmarket Handicap the previous year. That third placing cost him eight rating points and that put great restrictions on where the horse could be placed.

Nevertheless the gelding continued to be competitive and he ran another bottler in the Newmarket finishing third behind It's Crunch Time and Dream Flyer.

Punctuate has continued to be competitive finishing fourth in the Winzenberg Quality and third in the Adam Brooks Sprint on the synthetic at Spreyton on Devonport Cup day.

Terra Dimata

Winner of the Carbine Club Trophy

In racing there is nothing better than when a long-range plan is realised with a win in a feature race.

And such was the case with Terra Amata's thrilling victory in the Betfair Carbine Club Trophy for three-year-olds over 1100 metres at Tattersall's Park.

Terra Amata is prepared by Charlie Goggin and Luella Meaburn and six weeks prior to the race the training combination and owning syndicate manager Joe O'Neill forged a plan to set the filly for the Carbine Club race.

They had combined to win the race three years ago with Too Many Reds and many from that syndicate are also shareholders in Terra Amata.

With Craig Newitt aboard the filly showed good early speed and was able to comfortably share the lead with the speedy Little River Girl.

The pair turned for home locked together and it wasn't until the final 50 metres that Terra Amata showed her superiority.

It was Terra Amata's fourth start giving her two wins and two second placings for over \$30,000 in stakes.

Goggin was thrilled with the win and was adamant the lightly raced filly has a bright future.

Winner of the Tasmanian Derby

TALENTED three-year-old Ollie's Gold gave Brighton trainer Gary White the win he has long been seeking when the gelding outstayed his rivals in the \$100,000 Schweppes Tasmanian Derby over 2200 metres at Tattersall's Park.

Courtesy of a gun ride from in-form jockey Jason Maskiell, Ollie's Gold settled just off the speed and made his run along the rails from the 500-metre peg to go on and score convincingly from Keep The Cash with the Peter Moody-trained Strive To Excel a closing third.

Ollie's Gold put the writing on the wall with a game third in the Hobart Guineas behind What Life Brings and Kenjorwood over 2100 metres on January 20.

The field was packed with interstate invaders many of which were backed solidly late in betting but it was two local outsiders that fought out the finish.

White was ecstatic after the win and understandably so given he had provided second placings in the Derby a few times in the past two decades.

Ollie's Gold was bred by Mike Norman and he is raced by him and a syndicate of close friends including Claire Pettit and Kim Boyer who are long-time clients of White's stable.

Winner of the 2013 Devonport Cup

Fieldmaster gave his rivals a galloping lesson at Spreyton Park on his way to scoring an emphatic win in the \$100,000 Simons Design Centre Devonport Cup over 1880 metres.

With Victorian jockey Steven Arnold in the saddle, Fieldmaster travelled well in the run just off the pace set by race favourite The Cleaner and outsider Makes Cents.

When the leaders started to capitulate nearing the top of the home straight, Arnold called on his charge for the supreme effort and the six-year-old gelding forged clear and went on to score comfortably from Lightly Spiced (Craig Newitt) and Jakcorijim.

Arnold was ecstatic after the race and declared the Patrick Payne trained gelding would take a lot of benefit from the outing.

'He stepped well from a good gate and put himself in a good spot and all I had to do was get him going after those favourites in front a long way from home," Arnold said.

"We had to take off about 600 metres from home so he has done a good job to keep going like he did," he said.

Payne campaigned Fieldmaster in Tasmania last season for a win in the Jockey Club Cup at

his first try in the state in January last year and he went on to finish on the heels of the placegetters in the AAMI Hobart Cup before finishing third to Prevailing and Geegees Blackflash in the Launceston Cup.

Arnold said he would more than likely ride Fieldmaster in the Hobart Cup at Tattersall's Park but it would depend on whether the trainer's sister Michelle Payne was back riding by that race.

Winner of the Hobart Guineas

TALENTED three-year-old gelding What Life Brings signalled his arrival as one of the state's most promising gallopers when he scored a courageous win in the Betfair Hobart Guineas over 2100 metres at Tattersall's Park in Hobart.

What Life Brings outgunned a courageous Kenjorwood over the concluding stages for what was their first test beyond 1600 metres.

It was a slowly run race early with Added Bonus sharing the lead with Alarmist to the 500-metre peg where the complexion of the race changed dramatically with the swoopers staking their claims.

Kenjorwood (Craig Newitt) headed What Life Brings in the home straight and looked set to cruise to victory but What Life Brings refused to wilt and gave his all to go on and score by a half-length from Kenjorwood with a gallant Ollie's Gold a distant third ahead of Keep The Cash.

What Life Brings, trained by David and Scott Brunton, was third to Mister John in the Tasmanian Guineas over 1600 metres at his previous outing in which Kenjorwood ran second and edged out What Life Brings in head-bobbing finish for second place.

His Crunch Time wins 2012 Newmarket

TALENTED VICTORIAN SPRINTER IT'S CRUNCH TIME GAVE TASMANIAN JOCKEY STEPHEN MASKIELL HIS EIGHTH NEWMARKET HANDICAP WIN WHEN THE GELDING EDGED OUT LOCAL STAR DREAM FLYER IN THE 2012 EDITION OF THE STATE'S PREMIER SPRINT RACE.

The 2012 Country Club Tasmania Newmarket Handicap over 1200m in Launceston was won by the sole interstate invader It's Crunch Time.

But no sooner had the Doug Harrison-trained five-year-old crossed the line just ahead of the luckless Dream Flyer, the focus turned to the horse's Tasmanian rider Stephen Maskiell who realised a personal goal in winning his eighth Newmarket Handicap.

Maskiell and former astute jockey Max Baker shared the record with seven wins each in the state's most prestigious sprint race and Maskiell had made no secret of the fact that one of his main ambitions was to grab the Newmarket riding record before retiring.

"This is the race I've wanted to win for a while and it feels great to have finally achieved that goal"

"He is a very nice horse and had the right form to win this race.

I want to thank the connections for putting me on," he said.

It's Crunch Time was caught threewide but Maskiell was able to get cover most of the way on the back of Rebel Bride that was forced to race three-wide without cover for the entire race.

Dream Flyer (Ibrahim Gundogdo) was always travelling well on the inside of It's Crunch Time but when Maskiell eased out to make his run Gundogdo elected to hold his line and search for inside runs in the straight.

The Troy Blacker-trained gelding was held up momentarily when Rebel Bride shifted in slightly and Geegees Blackflash laid in under pressure, which was enough to cost him the race.

Punctuate led and the David and Scott Brunton-trained gelding was game at the business end of the race to hold onto third spot ahead of his stablemate Galibier with Catwen Boy rattling home from well back in the field to finish sixth and definitely a member of the unlucky brigade.

It's Crunch Time is Harrison's first runner in Launceston but he might keep the gelding in the state for a crack at a couple of the upcoming weight-for-age races over 1200m and 1400m.

Last year's winner Geegees Blackflash enjoyed a cozy run in the race. Peter Mertens had the John Luttrell-trained gelding placed fifth and in the one-out line to the home turn.

When Mertens eased him out to make his run he had the eventual winner on his outside but when Mertens called for the supreme effort the gelding was unable to produce that turn of foot he showed to win the race last year.

TALENTED two-year-old Grand Tycoon has given his owners plenty of cash to spend at the 2013 Tasmanian Magic Millions Yearling Sale courtesy of this seasons impressive wins at Tattersall's Park and the TOTE Racing Centre.

Grand Tycoon is unbeaten from five starts and has collected bonuses that tally \$39,000 that was spent by the gelding's owners Charlie and Wendy Langmaid at the 2013 Tasmanian Magic Millions Sale held in Launceston in February.

While Grand Tycoon was impressive in winning five in succession there is no doubt his fifth win in the Listed \$100,000 Elwick Stakes was his best.

The Elwick Stakes field was peppered with talent and this time Grand Tycoon came from behind to win.

It was the way he delivered the goods that impressed most even though the winning margin over the highly promising Gee Gees Velvet was only a long neck.

Grand Tycoon earned three \$5000 Magic Millions vouchers and the owners have converted four \$3000 Tasbred bonuses into \$6000 vouchers for the sale, from each win.

Owners have the option of taking the Tasbonus prize of \$3000 in cash or doubling it by replacing with Magic Millions Yearling Sale vouchers, which the Langmaids opted to do for each of the gelding's tasBonuses.

The Langmaids purchased Grand Tycoon (Written Tycoon-Scotattitude) privately prior to the yearling sale in November last year from Dean Woodhouse at Guthrie Park.

Programme Notes

The program was delivered following consultation with industry delegates, this occurred following the completion of the initial draft grid supplied by the RVL programming department.

The April 2013 – July 2013 grid sees a number of minor initiatives which are predominantly centred around enhancing diversity in options for owners, These include:

- The Autumn feature racing series, which remains in line with the series as completed in 2012, the notable exception being that the Tasmanian St Leger will now be run as a Quality Handicap, replacing the previous WFA conditions. This will enable a fairer contest for progressive horses looking to compete against seasoned stayers.
- As of 1st of May, the incorporation of 2yo & Up Maiden races, allowing more alternatives for trainers and owners in racing their 2yo's as they approach the end of the season.
- The programming of two additional midweek meetings the first at TRC Elwick on Tuesday 7 May, with the second at DRC Tapeta Park on Tuesday 4 June. The meetings recognize the deficiencies experienced by racing once a week in winter, and seek to address that through increasing opportunity.
- The maintenance of increased open class races over the winter period, with acknowledgement from the RVL handicapping department, that during the winter months horses competing out of their classes due to program restrictions will not be adversely effected, in rating, by their success.







AMENDMENT TO AR.82

Delete existing rule and replace with the following:

"AR.82. A rider shall not when mounted on a horse use any telephone, radio or other electronic appliance, apparatus, instrument or equipment capable of receiving, transmitting or playing information, unless permitted by the stewards." Date of Effect: 1st January,2013

AMENDMENT TO AR.64H

Delete existing rule and replace with the following:

"AR.64H. A horse that has been subjected to any form of shockwave therapy shall not be eligible to participate in any race or trial for seven clear days excluding the day of treatment and day of race or trial following such therapy."

Date of Effect: 1st January,2013

PROPOSED NEW RULES AND AMENDMENTS TO AUSTRALIAN RULES OF RACING

Proposed new and Australian Rules of Racing in respect of Minimum Penalties

- 1. AR 64G(1) to be amended to read as follows: AR 64G.
- (1) No person without the permission of the Stewards may stomach-tube, attempt to stomach-tube, cause to be stomach-tubed or be a party to the stomach-tubing of a horse within 24 hours of the appointed starting time of:
 - (a) a race in which it is engaged to be run; or
 - (b) an official trial or jump-out in which it is engaged to be run.

For the purposes of this rule "stomach-tubed" and variations of that term means any application to a horse of a nasogastric tube.

(2) Any horse that has been stomach-tubed in contrary to the provisions of sub-rule (1) may be prohibited from starting in any relevant race, official trial or jump-out.

2. New rule AR 83(d)

AR 83(d) If he bet, or has any interest in a bet on any race, or contingency relating to thoroughbred racing involving a race in which he is riding. For the purposes of this rule, bet includes a lay bet (as defined in AR 175B(7)).

3. New rule AR 135(d)

AR 135(d) Any person who:

- in the opinion of the Stewards, has breached, or was a party to breaching, subrule 135(a); and
- (iii) has a lay bet or an interest in a lay bet on the subject horse and/or has an interest in a bet on another horse in the subject race, must be penalised in accordance with AR196(5). For the purpose of this rule, a lay bet is as defined in AR 175B(7)).

4. New rule AR 175(aa)

AR 175(aa) Any person, who in their opinion, engages in conduct that corrupts the outcome of a race or is intended to corrupt the outcome of a race.

- In this rule:
- (i) conduct corrupts the outcome of a race if it:
 - (a) affects or, if engaged in, would be likely to affect the outcome of any race, and
 - (b) is contrary to the standards of integrity that a reasonable person would expect of persons in a position to affect the outcome of a race.
- (ii) conduct means an act or an omission to perform an act.
- (iii) engage in conduct means:
 - (a) do an act, or
 - (b) omit to perform an act.
- (iv) outcome is to include any result within the race and is not to be limited to winning or placing in the race
- 5. AR 175(hh) to be amended as follows:
- (hh) Any person who:
- uses, or attempts to use, any electric or electronic apparatus or any improper contrivance capable of affecting the
 performance of a horse in a race, official trial, jump-out or
 training gallop; or
- (ii) has in his possession, any electric or electronic apparatus or any improper contrivance capable of affecting the performance of a horse in a race, official trial, jump-out or training gallop.

For the purposes of this provision where an electric or electronic apparatus has been designed to deliver an electric shock it is deemed to be capable of affecting the performance of a horse in a race, official trial, jump-out or training gallop.

6. New rule AR 177B(3)

AR 177B(3) Any person who, in the opinion of the Stewards, administers, attempts to administer, causes to be administered or is a party to the administration of, any prohibited substance specified in subrule (2) to a horse being trained by a licensed trainer shall be penalised in accordance with AR196(5).

7. New rule AR 196(5)

AR196(5) Where a person is found guilty of a breach of any of the Rules listed below, a penalty of disqualification for a period of not less than the period specified for that Rule must be imposed unless there is a finding that a special circumstance exists whereupon the penalty may be reduced:

- (i) AR 64G(1)(a) 12 months
- (ii) AR 83(d) 2 years
- (iii) AR 84 2 years
- (iv) AR 135(d) 3 years (v) AR 175(aa) – 5 years
- (vi) AR 175(h)(i) 3 years
- (vii) AR 175(hh)(i) 2 years
- (viii) AR 177B(3) 2 years
- (ix) AR 178E 6 months

For the purpose of this sub-rule, a special circumstance is as stipulated by each Principal Racing Authority under its respective Local Rules.

LOCAL RULE 4.21 - Special Circumstances

- 4.21 Special circumstances relevant to the imposition of penalties under AR 196(5) For the purpose of these Rules and the imposition of a penalty under AR 196(5), a special circumstance may be found if:
 - (a) the person has assisted the Stewards and/or Tasracing or has given an undertaking to assist, after the imposition of a penalty on that person, the Stewards and/or Tasracing in the investigation or prosecution of a breach of the Rules;
 - (b) the person has pleaded guilty at an early stage;
 - (c) the person proves on the balance of probabilities that at the time of the commission of the offence, he or she:
 - i. had impaired mental functioning; or
 - ii. was under duress; that is causally linked to the breach of the Rule and substantially reduces his or her culpability; or
 - (d) in the interests of justice, the circumstances may be deemed or considered to be special. [added 1/3/13]

TREATMENT LOG BOOKS

During the course of annual stable inspections treatment books must be presented for scrutiny by the inspecting stewards and also at any other time in accordance with AR 178(F)(1)(3). It has been noted that some of these are substandard, either in that they have not been comprehensively filled in or have not been kept current.

These matters will be referred to the steward's panel for further action or subject to a mandatory fine.

AR.178F(1) A trainer must keep, and retain for a period of twelve months, a record of any treatment administered to any horse in his care. Each record of treatment must, as a minimum requirement, include the following information:

- (a) name of the horse;
- (b) date of administration of the treatment;
- (c) name of the treatment (brand name or active constituent);
- (d) route of administration;
- (e) amount given;
- (f) name and signature of person or persons administering and/or authorising treatment.
- (2) For the purposes of this rule "treatment" includes:
 - (a) all Controlled Drugs (Schedule 8) administered by a veterinarian;
 - (b) all Prescription Animal Remedies (Schedule 4), including those listed in AR.178C(2);
 - (c) all Prescription Only Medicines (Schedule 4), prescribed and/or dispensed by a veterinarian for off-label use;
 - (d) all injectable veterinary medicines (intravenous, intramuscular, subcutaneous, intraarticular) not already included above;
 - (e) all Pharmacist Only (Schedule 3) and Pharmacy Only (Schedule 2) medicines;
 - (f) all veterinary and other medicines containing other scheduled and unscheduled prohibited substances;
 - (g) all alkalinising agents;
 - (h) all herbal preparations.
- (3) When requested, the records of treatment kept by trainers in accordance with the provisions of subrule (1) must be made available to the Stewards. [rule added 1.9.09]

NOTIFICATION OF RIDERS

Trainers are reminded of the importance of submitting their riders on time. Stewards will not contact trainers who do not have riders after the closing time has expired. If a trainer is experiencing difficulties in obtaining a rider they should contact the Stewards. If the Stewards are not contacted a trainer may be fined for declaring a late rider.

FOOTWEAR

With the warmer weather approaching all licensed persons who attend or are in the vicinity of horses are reminded of the requirement to wear footwear that covers their entire foot.

IDENTIFICATION BADGES

All licensed persons are reminded of the requirement to display their identification badges when entering a racecourse. Stewards will conduct random checks at horse gates to ensure that badges are being displayed to gain admittance to the course.
