THE NATIONAL APPRENTICE JOCKEY SERIES

During April and May 2013, eighty apprentice jockeys were offered the opportunity to compete in the National Apprentice Series.

The series, which is in its fifth year, has proven to be a great experience for up-and-coming apprentices who are able to meet interstate trainers, jockeys and stakeholders and build networks within the industry. The opportunity to represent their home State provides a great opportunity for apprentice jockeys to compete at different racecourses against new riders and vie for state and individual glory.

The National Apprentice Series concept, initially driven by Racing NSW in 2008, is contested over seven heats – one run in each State. In 2013, both Tasmanian and SA provided an additional non-points race to provide further experience for the riders.

Representatives are selected by a panel in their home state to compete in the heats, with the State accumulating most points at the end of the Series collecting the perpetual trophy.

South Australia has dominated the Series since its inception; racking up three wins in 2009, 2011 and 2012. Victoria secured a win in 2010 with NSW collecting the trophy for 2013.

HOW DOES IT WORK

- Points are awarded for each race on the following basis:
 - First Place 7 points, Second Place 5 points, Third Place 3 points
 All other placings 1 point on behalf of the state in which they are indentured.
 - Apprentices riding in the series are representing the state in which they are registered.







THE TASMANIAN HEAT

The Tasmanian leg of the National Apprentices Series was the feature of an eight-race card at the Launceston night meeting held on Wednesday 20th of March. The program consisted of two Apprentice only races providing all visiting apprentices a chance to display their skills.

The first of these a Benchmark 68 1400m event was taken out by Tasmania's leading Apprentice Siggy Carr aboard the Leon Wells trained Devon Lass, who despite the small field produced an inspired ride and then had to survive a protest to keep the victory.

The Second race was the National Series Points race and saw a full field of 12 runners compete for honours in a Benchmark 68 over 1200m. In a hotly contested event Victorian Apprentice Erhan Kacmaz, a regular visitor to Tasmania, prevailed on the Hobart trained Vision of Beauty.

The Apprentices riding skills were not confined to the two designated races with honours on the night going to Tasmania's Georgie Catania who rode a double. She was joined in the winners circle by Rasit Yetimova and star NSW apprentice Jenny Duggan.

Geegees Blackflash wins the 2018 Launceston Cup

GEEGEES BLACKFLASH has developed into a racing superstar with his on-track efforts in Tasmania these past three seasons earning him star status around Australia.

... At three he indicated he was something special when he outgunned arguably the best field to contest a Tasmanian Derby in decades.

... At four he endured problems that included a bleeding attack that caused a major setback to his major cups campaign.

But the following season he bounced back with a vengeance to win the Newmarket Handicap over 1200 metres, a string of weight-for-age races and capped his season with victory in the Group 3 Hobart Cup and a close-up second to Prevailing in the Launceston Cup.

Those performances earned him the Tasmanian Horse of the Year title for season 2011-12.

This season he attempted the same program and while he fell short with minor placings in two weight-for-age races and the Hobart Cup he delivered the goods in the Launceston Cup.

Geegees Blackflash has a huge following in Tasmania and interstate.

His record that stood at 14 wins and 15 minor placings from 43 starts after his Launceston Cup win is testament to his ability and saw him closing in on \$800,000 in stakes.

The Geegees Blackflash story remains a work in progress and one that will hopefully take him into a feature race campaign in the 2013-14 season.



meet the **geegee** that has stolen the hearts of the Tasmanian racing public

eegees Blackflash has developed almost a nationwide cult following and Nicole has experienced first hand the impact the horse has had on her family's life.

Geegees Blackflash has taken teenager Nicole Luttrell on a journey that she describes as "life changing".

Nicole is the daughter of trainer John and Cheryl Luttrell and from the moment she obtained her stablehand licence at age 14 she was keen to become involved with her father's stable star.

When Geegees Blackflash won the 2011 Tasmania Derby, Nicole tasted being in the limelight for the first time, as she had the responsibility of leading the horse around the parade ring and tending to him in the stripping stalls at Tattersall's Park before and after the Group 3 race.

But in the early days Geegees Blackflash was not the easiest horse to handle and his fractious and sometimes piggish manners prevented Nicole from tending to him in the stables and on race days.

"Flash was a bit of a naughty boy when he first arrived at the stables and Dad insisted I keep my distance," Nicole said.

"I didn't have much to do with him when he was a two-year-old but ever since he won his maiden at three we have been pretty much inseparable," she said.

Geegees Blackflash has developed almost a nationwide cult following and Nicole has experienced first hand the impact the horse has had on her family's life.

"Geegees Blackflash has become a people's horse, not only in racing circles but with the general public."

"I have been talking to people who have asked what I do for a living and when I tell them where I work they say – My God you're with Geegees Blackflash," she said.

While Geegees Blackflash was boisterous as a young horse Nicole says he is just playful these days.

"He has some little tricks that he performs at the stables and they just make you laugh."

"He is very special; and I feel privileged that I've been a part of his journey," she said.

Working for your dad can have its pitfalls and Nicole sometimes feels the pressure.

"My job is like most others. You have some off days but overall I wouldn't change my job for anything else."

Nicole rates Geegees Blackflash's Launceston Cup win this year as one of the most emotional of his long list of feature race victories.

"The Tasmanian Derby was special and so was his Hobart Cup win but winning this year's Launceston Cup and the way he won was out of this world," Nicole said.

"He is a very special horse and I doubt that I will ever have anything to do with one better," she said.

..... the trainer that has contributed to Geegee Blackflash's success

BRIGHTON trainer John Luttrell has been on the verge of walking away from the industry more than once during his 28 years of training racehorses.

Changing economies, a lack of winners and sheer frustrations are just a few of the reasons Luttrell has contemplated a career change.

But not long after Geegees Blackflash arrived at his stables the thought of throwing in the towel diminished quickly.

By the time Geegees Blackflash had won the Tasmanian Derby, Luttrell was planning expansions of his training operation.

Everyone in racing knows that it only takes one good horse to make up for all the heartaches and pitfalls that racing throws at you when you are trying to make ends meet. Geegees Blackflash was Luttrell's savior.

"I am absolutely blessed to have had this horse come into my life," Luttrell said.

"From day one there was something special about him and it is true that I was becoming extremely disgruntled with my life as a trainer until Geegees Blackflash came along," he said.

The Flash's owners Paul and Elizabeth Geard have over 100 horses on their books and Luttrell inherited most of those to train courtesy of his success with Geegees Blackflash.

"The horse is a champion in every sense of the word."

"He had a serious setback (bleeding attack) after he won the Derby and we thought he would never be able to recapture that sort of form but he actually improved and that in itself is quite an amazing feat," he said.

Geegees Blackflash ignores stablehands and strangers who wander in and out of the stable but as soon as his trainer is within sight the big black gelding pricks his ears and watches his every move.

"We are mates and it is just a special bond we have formed over the years," Luttrell said "The horse has definitely changed my life in many ways and it will be a very sad day for me and everyone at the stables when he is eventually retired from racing," he said.

Geegees Blackflash's efforts during the 2011-12 season earned him the title of Tasmanian Horse of the Year winning five of his six starts that included the Group 3 Hobart Cup.

Those efforts also earned him a huge following nationwide through social media and the exposure the races he won received in interstate newspapers and on radio.

"I'm not too switched on with Facebook and Twitter but from what the kids tell me the horse has a big following because of social media."

"I think I've done more television and radio interviews in the past 18 months than I've done throughout the remainder of my training career and it's all been about Geegees Blackflash," Luttrell said.

Luttrell says Geegees
Blackflash has nothing else to
prove in Tasmania, although
the trainer believes there is at
least another season left in the gelded
son of Clangalang.

"There has been speculation that the horse could be heading interstate for a few races but that's all it is – speculation."

"We have discussed the possibility of him being aimed at feature races in Melbourne, Sydney or Brisbane but I doubt that will ever happen," he said.

Geegees Blackflash has earned over \$800,000 in stakes which is an amazing feat but Luttrell says it is the owners' aim to take that beyond \$1 million.

"If Geegees Blackflash can win two or three races during next season's carnival it would take his career earnings beyond \$1 million and that would definitely put him in a league of his own," he said.

Leter Mertens

VICTORIAN JOCKEY
Peter Mertens has shared a
great journey with Geegees
Blackflash over the past
two seasons and he has
openly declared he will ride
the horse anywhere and
anytime.

Mertens joined forces with Geegees Blackflash for the first time in the Newmarket Handicap in November 2011 which was to be the start of a five-win winning streak that included the Group 3 Hobart Cup.

"I pretty much fluked the ride on Geegees Blackflash in the 2011 Newmarket because apparently Johnny (trainer Luttrell) couldn't convince any of the top local riders to take the ride," Mertens said.

"We won the Newmarket coming from well back and for a stayer to win the state's best sprint race convinced me he was a horse that I should keep riding."

"As the season progressed he kept delivering and it is his courage and will to win that impressed me the most," Mertens said.

Geegees Blackflash developed as a stayer during his cups preparation and it was the gelding's sharp turn of foot that set him apart from the rest.

"The horse is versatile in that he can be placed pretty much anywhere you want him to be and he has the ability to sprint sharply as soon as you ask, and that turn of foot makes him special."

Geegees Blackflash is no slouch in the courage department according to Mertens. "It's horses like Geegees Blackflash that you love because even if he isn't at the top of his game you know he is going to give you everything he has in a race."

"It's that sort of courage that separates the good horses from the great ones," he said.

Mertens, who turned 50 this year, says he is very fortunate to have struck an association with such a great horse in the twilight of his riding career.

"Geegees Blackflash is the epitome of what a tough racehorse should be and there can be no doubt he is the best in Tasmania and probably the best the state has produced for a very long time," he said.

Paul & Elizabeth Geard

PAUL and ELIZABETH
GEARD have always had
more than a slight interest
in the racing industry but
the development of their
Geegees Thoroughbred
Horse Stud at Broadmarsh
over the past four years has
escalated to a point where
they are clearly the state's
most prominent thoroughbred
owners.

This season the Geards have over 100 horses on their books and that includes more than 20 two-year-olds, many of which have been sired by their resident stallion Wordsmith.

The dairy farmers have been the state's leading owners for the past three seasons but they also continue to be involved with the family dairy business that is now primarily run by their son Ben.

Their thoroughbred enterprise has grown due to the success of one horse – Geegees Blackflash, winner of over \$800,000 in prize money accrued over four seasons.

"If it wasn't for Geegees Blackflash we wouldn't have been able to build the numbers at the stud farm like we have in such a short space of time," Paul Geard said

"When he won the Tasmanian Derby we went and brought more horses at the sales and we did the same after he won the Hobart Cup." The Geards have had to deal with pressure from interstate media about the prospects of Geegees Blackflash racing on the mainland but they hope to end that speculation once and for all.

"We are happy for Geegees Blackflash to race only in Tasmania and we are hoping he can be the first horse to win \$1 million in prizemoney without having to leave the state," Paul Geard said.

"I'm not saying we won't race any of our horses interstate because we could breed one that excels at two or three that might be up to a trip across the water but as for Blackflash he will definitely never see the other side of Bass Strait," he said.

THE combination of trainer John Luttrell and owners Paul and Elizabeth Geard have long been a force with which to be reckoned but at Tattersall's Park in Hobart in late April the partnership simply dominated.



STABLE STAR Geegees Blackflash won the Sorell Cup carrying 63.5 kilograms to mark his return to racing after winning the Launceston Cup in February.

But in the following race their underrated two-year-old Gee Gees Style ended an incredible winning streak by star juvenile Grand Tycoon in the Autumn 2YO Classic over 1200 metres.

Grand Tycoon went into the race unbeaten from seven previous starts and punters sent him out the \$1.40 favourite and after the field had travelled 300 metres those who took the short odds would have been pleased with their investment.

Gee Gees Style (Georgie Catania) raced outside the leader Vigilante (Patrick Keane) that set a solid pace to the home turn.

The pair hit the home straight together but Grand Tycoon loomed to stake his claim and looked set to continue on his winning way, but the Barry Campbell-trained gelding was unable to get to them as he did at his previous start.

Under strong riding from apprentice Catania, Gee Gees Style proved too strong over the concluding stages to hold on and score by a neck from the gallant Grand Tycoon with Vigilante running the race of his life to hold third and only a nose astern.

"You can't take anything away from Grand Tycoon because he has been brilliant this season but my horse has not been far behind him in five runs and today it was his turn to win," Luttrell said.

"He deserved to win a good race so it's a nice way to end his season on a winning note," he said.

Gee Gees Style is by Wordsmith, a sire purchased by the Geards about three years ago and this latest win places him in the top first season sires in Australia.

BEAUTIFUL BUNS, Winner of the Vamos Stakes

When Spreyton trainer Adam Trinder set about finding a race that might give his handy mare Beautiful Buns some black type on her CV, few expected him to target the \$100,000 Vamos Stakes over 1400m in Launceston.

But that's what he did, with the mare delivering the goods to cause a boilover in what was the second leg of Tasmania's feature weight-for-age double for fillies and mares.

Beautiful Buns outgunned Tasmanian star sprinting mare Rebel Bride over the concluding stages to defeat that mare by a nose with Victorian mare Tariana the same margin away third.

It was a thrilling finish with Tariana leading and then joined by Rebel Bride 200 metres out. The pair looked set to fight it out just as they did in the \$150,000 Group 3 Bow Mistress (1200m) in Hobart 17 days earlier when Rebel Bride made it back-to-back wins in that race defeating Tariana.

Beautiful Buns was given a soft run behind the leaders by top South Australian jockey Clare Lindop and when she eased to the outside of the leaders 200 metres out, the gallant five-year-old mare dug deep and got the bob in right on the line. Beautiful Buns paid \$37.10 on the Tote but she was backed in from \$151 to \$51 on fixed odds giving those astute punters some sizeable dividends.

Trinder set the mare for the Vamos after she ran midfield in a benchmark 68 race over 1420 metres in Launceston in mid November.

Trinder placed her in two class four races in which she filled minor placings in both leading up to the Vamos. "We really believed there was a feature race win in this mare but it was just a matter of having her at her peak at the right time and everything panned out perfectly in the run to give her that black type win," Trinder said.

BOLD front-running stayer Richoman notched the best win of his career when he triumphed over star Tasmanian stayer Geegees Blackflash in the Tasmanian St Leger in May.

Richoman led his rivals a merry chase in the St Leger but despite being joined by Geegees Blackflash at the top of the home straight he refused to wilt and fought back to win narrowly.

The St Leger win was a turning point in Richoman's career according to his Spreyton-based trainer Mark Ganderton.

"We went into the race expecting to finish second to Geegees Blackflash because he has an amazing record and he is an amazing horse," Ganderton said.

"Having a very good front-running horse gave us a chance to win and that we were carrying significantly less weight than Geegees Blackflash also encouraged a few people to back our horse ... but it was only a glimmer of hope."

"When Blackflash came at my horse I knew he would offer some resistance but he really dug deep and I was so proud of him."

Ganderton wasted no time in showing his emotion when Richoman's number was posted on the semaphore board. "Of course I was pumped and carried on a bit but I was excited not so much because he had won the St Leger

but that he'd beaten Geegees Blackflash that is probably the greatest horse I've ever seen race here in Tasmania," he said.

Geegees Blackflash looked set to run straight past Richoman 250 metres from the finish line but Ganderton's horse was up for the fight and proved too strong for last season's Tasmanian horse of the year, winning in a photo-finish.

"Geegees Blackflash is clearly a 10 or 12 length better horse than Richoman so when you put that in perspective it shows just how deep my horse had to dig to win," he said.

Stephen Baster on Global Balance, Winner of the Tasmanian Oaks.

Global Balance enriched the form of the Tasmanian Oaks by winning an \$115,000 Group 3 race for three-year-old fillies in South Australia in April before finishing ninth but only 5-1/2 lengths from the winner in the Group 1 Australasian Oaks at Morphetville (SA).

Top Victorian trainer David Hayes made it a clean sweep of the three-year-old fillies Listed races when Global Balance won a thrilling PFD Food Services Tasmanian Oaks over 2100 metres at The TOTE Racing centre in Launceston in February.

Hayes prepared Green Roller to win the \$100,000 Strutt Stakes in Hobart but winning the Oaks was a much tougher task for Global Balance.

It was a race packed with action and suspense with plenty of early interference and more to match in the home straight after a thrilling final 100 metres that saw local filly Settler's Joy run down by the eventual winner and First Bloom.

The rider of First Bloom, Michelle Payne, fired in a protest against the winner claiming interference from the winning post to the 1600-metre mark the first time around had cost her the race.

Stewards deliberated for almost 30 minutes before deciding that the interference did not warrant them reversing the placings.

Global Balance is raced by Jonathon Munz of the Pinecliff Racing Syndicates of which former Launceston Cup winning trainer Rod Douglas is manager.

Douglas trained Larry's Never Late to win the 2011 Launceston Cup. He later switched professions to turn manager of Pinecliff Racing that has over a dozen horses in work with a number of trainers.

The syndicate also owns Strutt Stakes winner Green Roller.

NNER WARRIOR, Winner of the Tasmanian Sires Produce Stakes

INNER WARRIOR stamped himself as one of Tasmania's most promising two-year-olds when he scored an emphatic win in the \$50,000 Sires Produce Stakes over 1400 metres at The TOTE Racing Centre in Launceston.

Inner Warrior endured what looked to be a torrid run, racing no better than three-wide for the entire journey but he defied the task to score a 3 1/2-length win over Geegees Velvet with her stablemate Gee Gees Black Fury a closing third.

For Brighton trainer Terry Evans it was his third successive Sires Produce having won previously with Pittenweem (2011) and Western Hero (2012).

Evans has a reputation for being nervous before big races and sometimes prior to a maiden if he thinks his horse has a chance of winning, but it is not the case with Inner Warrior.

"I don't know why but I never get nervous before a race with Inner Warrior, probably because I just know he will run well," Evans said. "The Sires was his main aim in Tasmania this preparation and leading up to the race I have probably never been as calm and sure about winning."

"I've only ever been this way with this horse. I really think he is something special," he said.

It was only Inner Warrior's second win from seven starts but his efforts at his two previous outings were good enough to ensure punters sent him out the \$3.70 favourite.

Inner Warrior is owned by the Horse Racing Tragics Syndicate Number 3.

TASMANIAN born jockey Craig Newitt showed why he has become one of Australia's leading jockeys with a sensational ride aboard the Tony Vasil trained Under the Eiffel in the \$100,000 George Adams Plate in Launceston on Launceston Cup day.

Under the Eiffel had not won a race since Melbourne Cup day two years ago but the gelding had shown enough improvement this preparation to warrant a trip to Tasmania to tackle the two most prestigious weight-for-age races on the calendar – the Thomas Lyons and George Adams.

He finished just off the placegetters in the Thomas Lyons but he gave his connections plenty to cheer about with an all-the-way win in the George Adams.

In soft ground that was considered unknown territory by his trainer, Under the Eiffel relished the slow seven-rated track to score an easy win over local star Banca Mo with the heavily backed favourite Lord Of Brazil a distant third.

Vasil said it was probably the ride more than anything that secured the win.

"This horse has always shown us above average ability and he has often had bad luck in his races as well as some bad barrier draws," Vasil said.

"He was pretty much unknown in those conditions (track) but we didn't think there was a lot of speed in the race, so Craig made a decision to be positive and ride him forward."

"Craig took his time in getting to the front and didn't use him up too much and then he rated him well – it was a tremendous ride," he said.

Champion jockey Brendon McCoull partners Grand Tycoon to

STAR Tasmanian two-year-old Grand Tycoon scored arguably his best win in the \$100,000 Shaw Contracting Gold Sovereign Stakes over 1200 metres in Launceston.

The Barry Campbell-trained gelding had not been tested beyond 1100 metres and there were some doubters who believed his winning streak would be curtailed by interstate invader Gracious Prospect that was backed in to start the \$2.40 favourite.

The weight of money for the David Hayes trained colt was so strong that Grand Tycoon's odds drifted from \$2.50 to \$3.40.

Grand Tycoon settled just off the speed but was always travelling comfortably under the guidance of top jockey Brendon McCoull while Gracious Prospect was caught three-wide without cover for the first half of the race.

When McCoull called on Grand Tycoon (Written Tycoon-Scottattitude) to sprint at the top of the straight the pint-sized gelding forged to the lead.

While Grand Tycoon looked certain to be headed twice over the final 100 metres he refused to give in and hit the line a half-neck clear of Geegees Velvet with her stablemate Gee Gees Style the same margin away third.

"He's tough and just wants to win and we saw that today," said trainer Barry Campbell.

The trainer wasn't sure if Grand Tycoon would ever win a race.

"After we had him broken in we thought he had potential but he didn't grow much so we were just hoping he might be able to win one race."

"As the season progressed he just took every race in his stride and now he's unbeaten from seven starts and he's won both \$100,000 Listed races and the Alfa Bowl – he's a marvel," he said.

Grand Tycoon expanded his stake tally by winning the Autumn 2YO Plate after having a short stint in the paddock following his Gold Sovereign win.

Unfortunately his unbeaten run came to an end in his final outing of the season when second, beaten a neck, to Gee Gees Style in the Autumn Classic over 1200 metres in Hobart in late April.

Grand Tycoon is owned by Charlie and Wendy Langmaid who paid only \$16,000 for the gelded son of Written Tycoon and ended his season winning around \$230,000 including bonuses.

COME FOLLOW ME proved she is a filly with a bright future following her impressive win at the TOTE Racing Centre in Launceston during the Tasmanian Summer Racing Carnival.

In a small but elite field of seven in the \$50,000 Veolia Environmental Services 3YO Classic (1200m) she made her rivals look ordinary as she ploughed through the slow seven-rated surface to score an emphatic win over Little River Girl and Royal Rapture.

The David and Scott Brunton-trained filly was one of three runners the stable had in the race that originally boasted eight starters.

Minute Repeater dumped his jockey Jason Maskiell on the way to the barrier and it took about 10 minutes for him to be recaptured but he was subsequently withdrawn from the race.

The Bruntons also had the easing favourite Streetwise Savoire but he did not handle the wet track and finished well back.

But nothing could be taken away from the brilliance of Come Follow Me (\$10) that ran on powerfully to overhaul race leader Little River Girl with the winner's stablemate Royal Rapture making ground late to grab third.

Co-trainer Scott Brunton said he was not surprised by the filly's win.

"A lot of people probably underestimated this filly's ability," Brunton said.

"We have taken our time with her and it is starting to pay dividends."

"We might have a look for a suitable midweek race for her in Melbourne – I think she's good enough," he said.

Come Follow Me was sent for a spell after the Classic win and resumed with an eyecatching effort in the Autumn 3YO Plate in Hobart.

FROLICKED, Winner of the Magic Millions 2YO Classic

TALENTED two-year-old Frolicked enhanced the chances of future interest in the progeny of highly rated sire Incumbent when she scored an impressive win in the Magic Millions 2YO Classic at The TOTE Racing Centre in Launceston in February.

Frolicked (Incumbent-Flying Diva) won on debut in a 2YO Maiden and on the strength of that win when she raced outside of the leader she was backed in to start favourite at \$2.10.

The filly again faced the breeze and when jockey Shannon Brazil called on the daughter of Incumbent to extend she dug deep and forged to the front and then had to stave off late and determined challenges from Inner Warrior and Hoop.

Frolicked had a full sister (Lot 48) that went under the hammer at the Tasmanian Magic Millions Yearling sale in Launceston the following day but she was subsequently passed in when the bidding stopped at \$24,000.

Trainer-breeder Graeme McCulloch was on tenterhooks during the race but he emerged with a broad smile and exuded confidence.

"I was really hoping this filly would win because of the full sister going around in the sale the next day but unfortunately the money didn't arrive for her (Lot 48).

McCulloch said he wanted \$30,000 for the filly so he kept her and in a way he is glad she didn't sell.

"The yearling broke in really well; in fact she is very similar to Frolicked as she is easy to handle and do anything with, and from what she's showing dashing up the straight track she should be every bit as good as Frolicked," he said.





CALIFORNIA WISH, Winner of the Magic Millions 3YO

STAR three-year-old filly California Wish ended her season on a high when she scored an emphatic win in the \$50,000 Magic Millions Classic over 1200 metres at The TOTE Racing Centre in Launceston.

California Wish (California Dane-Pirate's Sirene) was solidly backed to start the \$2.50 favourite and at no stage did she give her backers cause for alarm.

It was a fitting end to a long preparation that resulted in three wins from four starts.

Connections had been contemplating taking the filly to South Australia for a Group race for three-year-old fillies but they have instead opted to send her for a spell.

"The filly had a bit of trouble travelling down to Hobart for a race last week so a trip to SA might be a bit too taxing on her, so she'll go to the paddock," said trainer Adam Trinder.

"I don't have any doubt that she would be up to contesting the Group race in Adelaide but she is a bit highly strung and mentally she might not handle the trip too well."

"She has done a great job and if she comes back as well as I hope, then she more than likely has a big race win in her next preparation," he said.


California Wish is part-owned by Gary Richards who was elated with the win. "We are thrilled with what this filly has done this time in and hopefully she can come back and go on with it next prep," Richards said.

"Winning this race is great because she more than doubled her prizemoney."

"She only missed winning once in four starts this prep, if you don't count the time she left the gates without the rider and was declared a nonrunner."

"But I will be asking my brother Dean (Richards) not to come to the races when she races because each time he's watched her run something has either gone wrong or she didn't place," he said.

Richards and a few of his fellow owners purchased a striking filly by California Dane from Nevertrice for \$20,000 at the 2013 Tasmanian Magic Millions Yearling sale, that they hope can at least emulate the feats of California Wish.

BANCA MO SHINES INTERSTATE

Star Tasmanian galloper Banca Mo scored the best win of his career when he powered his way to an effortless win in the \$200,000 Warrnambool Cup over 2350 metres in May.

Banca Mo's trainers David and Scott Brunton decided to set the five-year-old gelding for the race after he had campaigned successfully in Victoria last preparation.

The Warrnambool win was a procession and the ease with which he handled his first try beyond 2100 metres suggests there could be success at Group level in the not too distant future.

Talented young Victorian apprentice Ben Knobel partnered Banca Mo to victory and he was well backed to start the \$3.70 favourite and that was on the strength of his form leading up to the Warrnambool Cup.

He had no luck at his three starts in Tasmania when ridden by high-profile senior riders in three weight-for-age races during the Tasmanian Summer Racing Carnival.

Banca Mo was third in the \$90,000 Listed Conquering weight-for-age in Launceston in late January followed by a fourth in the \$100,000 Thomas Lyons over 1400 metres on Hobart Cup day and he ended his Tasmanian campaign with a second to Under the Eiffel in the \$100,000 George Adams on Launceston Cup day.

After having no luck in his home state, team Brunton took him to

Victoria with the Warrnambool Cup as his main target, but along the way the gelding also picked up the \$100,000 Pakenham Cup over 1750 metres and an \$80,000 race at Flemington (2000m).

The Tasmanian-bred gelding by Tough Speed from the Mukddaam mare, I Gotcha Babe, was purchased by Mandy Gunn at the 2009 Tasmanian Magic Millions Yearling Sale for only \$2,100.

Banca Mo was sent to the spelling paddock straight after his Warrnambool Cup success and provided he returns in good health the gelding may be set for a crack at the 2014 Hobart-Launceston Cup double.





TASMANIAN BRED ... TASMANIAN OWNED TASMANIAN TRAINED ...

BROADMARSH trainer Walter McShane celebrated his biggest thrill in racing when his courageous home-bred stayer Norsqui gave his rivals a staying lesson to win the \$400,000 Group 2 Adelaide Cup over 3200 metres at Morphetville in South Australia.

Despite finishing third in the race last year and being very competitive in the two major cups (Hobart and Launceston) leading up to the race he opened at \$21 with most fixed odds bookmakers and drifted out to start at \$26.

But the drift was no concern to his trainer or jockey Chris Symons and owner Keith Graver who is a long-time friend of McShane.

"They forgot him but I didn't," McShane said.

"He ran a very good race last year at the end of a preparation but he

was prepared specifically with this race in mind this time around."

"I've had some big thrills in racing but this is the biggest," he said.

Symons had Norsqui settled just better than midfield and the gelding was always travelling comfortably in the run.

Local stayer Waratone loomed to win at the top of the straight and sped clear but he was unable to stave off the staying power of the Tasmanian with Norsqui going on to defeat Waratone by a half-length with talented mare Dame Claire 1-1/2 lengths away third.

Norsqui won the Mornington Cup last year with Symons aboard and the gelding's form convinced McShane to tackle the Group 1 Sydney Cup over 3200 metres and the gallant little chestnut almost delivered the goods.

Norsqui was a game second to Mourayan, beaten less than a length, which was the best result from a Tasmanian horse in a Sydney Cup.

Norsqui settled third in the run and rider Symons nurtured the son of Matsqui to the home turn where he called on his charge for the supreme effort.

He ended up in a jostling duel at the top of the straight but when he gained clear racing room on the rails he let down well and showed his determination by fighting back to grab second ahead of Aliyana Tilde.

Given the gelding's staying prowess connections may now consider tackling the Melbourne Cup this year.

programme notes

The programme was delivered after consultation with industry delegates following the completion of the initial draft grid supplied by the RVL programming department.

The August - November grid sees a number of minor alterations brought to fruition to enhance diversity in options for owners, acknowledging the commercial restraints of racing only once a week, particularly without the availability of the TOTE Racing Centre, Mowbray, from early August to late October as the track is prepared for the Night Racing season.

These include:

- The re-introduction of the TRC Melbourne Cup day meeting, which has been denied SKY channel coverage and in turn will be restricted to on course wagering only. As a result this meeting will be staked at Non TAB stakes accordingly.
- A consequence of the Non Sky status of the TRC 5 November meeting was the need to relocate the Goodwood Handicap. Mindful of the race being a traditional Hobart event and an important lead in to the Newmarket Hcp, the nearest available TRC date was the 20 October meeting. An additional \$20k 1100m Quality Handicap has been added to the TTC 6 November meeting to assist runners leading into the Newmarket.
- The 2YO racing season commencing at the TRC Goodwood Hcp meeting on 20 October, with the running of the \$15k Debutante over 900m.
- The continuation of Class 4 races over the duration of the winter programme, providing a natural progression for progressive horses through their grades.
- The maintenance of increased open class races over the winter period, with acknowledgement from the RVL handicapping department, that during the winter months horses competing out of their classes due to programme restrictions will not be adversely effected, in rating, by their success.
- Tasracing, maintains flexibility in its programme grid, acutely aware of the need to provide the ability to tailor additional races to the requirements of the racing population. It welcomes feedback on possible inadequacies throughout the programme.

Yearlings that qualify for the scheme are:

- a) Tasmanian-sired (Tasmanian-based sire)
- b) Tasmanian-bred (mare must be Tasmanian-owned), based on Australian Stud Book registered breeder location
- c) Catalogued for sale at the Tasmanian Yearling Sale (any breeding)

COSTS

Breeder Nomination: \$220 (incl GST) Owner Nomination: \$330 (incl GST)

A horse may be only breeder nominated or only owner nominated or both. A once-off fee is paid to Tasracing when the horse is a yearling and the horse then becomes eligible for a bonus whilst it is a 2, 3 and 4 year old, for its maiden win or for one of any special bonus races.

SPECIAL BONUS RACES

In addition, owners and breeders will receive an additional \$4,000 (\$3,000 owner/\$1,000 breeder) bonus for nonmaiden horses winning specified 2YO and 3YO races (of \$50,000 or less).

A maiden winning a specified race will however only be eligible for its maiden bonus (i.e. The special race bonus will not apply). These will include four feature 2YO races, three feature 3YO races and approximately 16 open 2YO and 3YO races throughout the season.

DOUBLE UP SALE VOUCHER OPTION

The scheme will also feature a "Double Up Sale Voucher" facility for owners (this feature does not apply to breeders). These will allow the winning owners of specified races as mentioned above, the option of converting their \$3,000 cash bonus into a \$6,000 sale credit. This credit must be redeemed at the subsequent Tasmanian Yearling Sale.

Owners will be given 14 days to notify whether they would like their \$3,000 cash bonus converted into a \$6,000 sale credit.

STEWARDS SEGMENT

MINIMUM PENALTIES

Trainers are reminded of the recently introduced rule AR 196(5) which was effective from 1/3/13. The introduction of this rule sets out penalties of disqualification that must be imposed by Stewards unless a finding of a special circumstance exists.

Please familiarise yourselves with the following rules: AR 64G(1)(a), AR 83(d), AR 84, AR 135(d), AR 175(aa), AR 175 (h)(i), AR 175(hh)(i), AR 177B(3) and AR 178E.

If participants have any query or need further clarification of this rule please contact the Stewards.

RACEDAY TREATMENT

The provisions of Rule 178E are quite clear however recently there has been some query relating to some substances in order to clarify this your attention is drawn to the following:

Trainers are advised that the use of Glycerine and/or Vicks Vaporub (or preparations of similar composition) by any means is not permitted prior to racing.

The application of ice to the limbs of any horse which has been presented on a racecourse for the purposes of competing in a trial/jump out or race is not permitted.

REPLACEMENT OF RIDERS

Where a rider needs to be replaced it is still the policy of the Stewards to replace a senior rider with a senior rider or an apprentice with an apprentice. Stewards will consider applications contrary to this policy on a case by case basis.

CHANGE IN TRACK CATEGORIES

During Winter dependent on conditions the track category may change after final scratching time. Trainers are reminded that Stewards will only permit a scratching where the category has been changed and the application has been made under the provisions of local rule 14.10.

AMENDMENTS TO LOCAL RULES

AUSTRALIAN RACING BOARD

HYPOXIC TRAINING

The Australian Racing Board (ARB) has undertaken a scientific assessment of altitude/hypoxic training in horses to address potential welfare, probity and public perception issues.

The concern is that hypoxic training in horses by intermittently breathing a gas mix with artificially reduced percentage of oxygen through a mask or in a chamber promotes a transient red blood cell production response.

However, there are currently no definitive, rigorously peer-reviewed studies that demonstrate a performance effect, beneficial or otherwise. Hypoxic training can be compared with other novel training modalities such as hill work, interval training, beach training and aqua walkers and is unlikely to be capable of improving a horse's performance beyond its genetic potential.

On the basis of current scientific knowledge of the effects of hypoxic training in horses, the ARB does not believe that this technology warrants regulation at this time.

However, authorities will continue to monitor the science and if evidence in the future suggests that hypoxic training should be regulated, the ARB will act. Investors in equipment or infrastructure for the purposes of altitude/hypoxic training should take note that there are ongoing research efforts into the technology with unknown outcomes.



TASRACING POLICY

INTERSTATE JOCKEY TRAVEL SUBSIDY

1. OBJECTIVE

1.1 The objective of this policy is to clearly define the eligibility requirements and amount payable to subsidise non-Tasmanian based jockeys for their travelling expenses.

2. **DEFINITIONS**

Day Meetings – Where the scheduled starting time of the 1st race is before 4 pm.

Night Meetings – Where the scheduled starting time of the 1st race is 4 pm or later.

3. POLICY

3.1 Amount Payable

DAY & NIGHT MEETINGS

Tasracing will pay a minimum of \$150 per meeting for each jockey. This amount can be varied in special circumstances at the discretion of Tasracing.

NIGHT MEETINGS

Accommodation will be provided in a shared room.

3.2 Eligibility

- 3.2.1 To be eligible for the Interstate
 Jockey Travel Subsidy (including
 accommodation) a jockey must
 have ridden at a minimum of four (4)
 Tasmanian race meetings during the
 current racing season, prior to that day.
 This can be varied at the discretion of
 Tasracing.
- 3.2.2 Interstate Jockeys must make themselves available to ride at all races at the race meeting and endeavor to fulfill all riding commitments, with the exception of injury or illness, or unless otherwise approved by Tasracing.
- 3.2.3 Abandoned or Postponed Race Meeting Subsidy

When a race meeting is abandoned or postponed after acceptance time for that meeting, the Interstate Jockey Travel subsidy for that meeting will apply. The amount will be paid directly into the jockey's prescribed bank account within ten working days of the race meeting.

TASMANIAN RULES OF RACING

ADDITIONS TO DEFINITIONS

"Feature Race" means any race for which the total prize money (excluding bonuses and trophies is \$25,000 or greater.

"Official Trials" means a trial as defined by the Australian Rules of Racing.

NEW AND AMENDED RULES

- 4.11 The Stewards may suspend from starting, for a period as they think fit, any horse which they consider has been unruly, wayward or uncompetitive. (amdt effective 1/8/2013)
- 8.3 Unraced horses must have a barrier certificate obtained in a official trial prior to the closing of acceptances. (New effective 01/8/2013)
- 8.4 Horses that have been placed under an embargo must have a barrier certificate or clearance obtained prior to the closing of acceptances. (New effective 01/8/2013)
- 8.5 No horse shall be eligible to be entered for or to run in any race within the State of Tasmania unless it is trained by a Trainer licensed or registered by any Principal Racing Authority, or recognised International Racing Authority or Association. (amdt effective 1/8/2013)
- 13.9 No Apprentice who is entitled to claim 4 kgs may ride in any Group, Listed or Feature race in Tasmania. (amdt effective 1/8/2013)
- 13.10 No Apprentice who is entitled to claim 4 kgs may ride in any 2YO race without approval of the Chairman of Stewards. (New effective 1/8/2013)
- 13.11 No Apprentice who is entitled to claim 3 kgs may ride in any Group, Listed or Feature race in Tasmania without approval of the Chairman of Stewards. (New effective 1/8/2013)


