BIG DREAMS BRING BIG DIVIDENDS

WHEN Tasmanian-born businessman Wayne Notman bought former New Zealand gelding Count Da Vinci for an undisclosed sum midway through last year he had a dream to win a Brighton Cup.

Count Da Vinci had won a maiden from 18 starts when Notman asked his good friend and Tasmanian Hall of Fame trainer David Brunton to travel to NZ to ride the horse and offer an assessment before any money changed hands.

Once Brunton delivered his critique the deal was done and Count Da Vinci, who raced as Faaltline in New Zealand, was shipped to Tasmania to take up residence at the Brunton family’s training complex at Seven Mile Beach south of Hobart.

But each week the horse improved and by the time he reached the stage of racing in Tasmania in mid-October both owner and trainer were convinced that he was probably a good thing to win first-up in a class one handicap over 1200 metres in Launceston.

Armed with confidence to take on the bookies Notman backed his gelding in from \$12 to \$4.50 before he eased to start at \$6.

With number one stable rider David Pires in the saddle Count Da Vinci scored a half-length win to give Notman and the stable the best result possible with the net return almost covering the gelding's purchase price.

But Count Da Vinci kept on improving and after he'd won his fourth in succession the gelding was within one win of realising his owner's first goal – winning a Brighton Cup.

"I thought if he could win a Brighton Cup he would get ballot free entry into the Hobart Cup so that's what I set my sights on," Notman said.

After finishing second in the weight-for-age Summer Cup at his sixth start in Tasmania, Count Da Vinci gave Notman his wish and delivered Brunton his dream of winning his home town cup by storming home to take out the 2017 Luxbet Hobart Cup over 2400 metres.

Amid tears and a gross amount of hugging in and around the unsaddling enclosure the gelding's owner and trainer embraced to celebrate a win that both will cherish for a lifetime.

"I had Banca Mo that I really thought would win me a Hobart Cup but everything went wrong with his attempt so I thought if I couldn't win the race with him I would probably never win it," Brunton said.

"But in this game you can never say never because the next real good horse could be the next one that strolls into your stable."

Count Da Vinci almost completed the major cups double but he was beaten into second place in the Luxbet Launceston Cup by Big Duke that turned the tables on the former Kiwi courtesy of a significant pull in the weights.

Brunton also prepares Notman's sprinter Lord Da Vinci that has had his racing career rejuvenated since transferring from Victoria in March last year.

While Lord Da Vinci is yet to win a major feature race in his adopted state he could still achieve that goal before his racing days are up with his victory in a \$25,000 open handicap on Launceston Cup day arguably his best.

Big Duke powers home in the Luxbet Launceston Cup

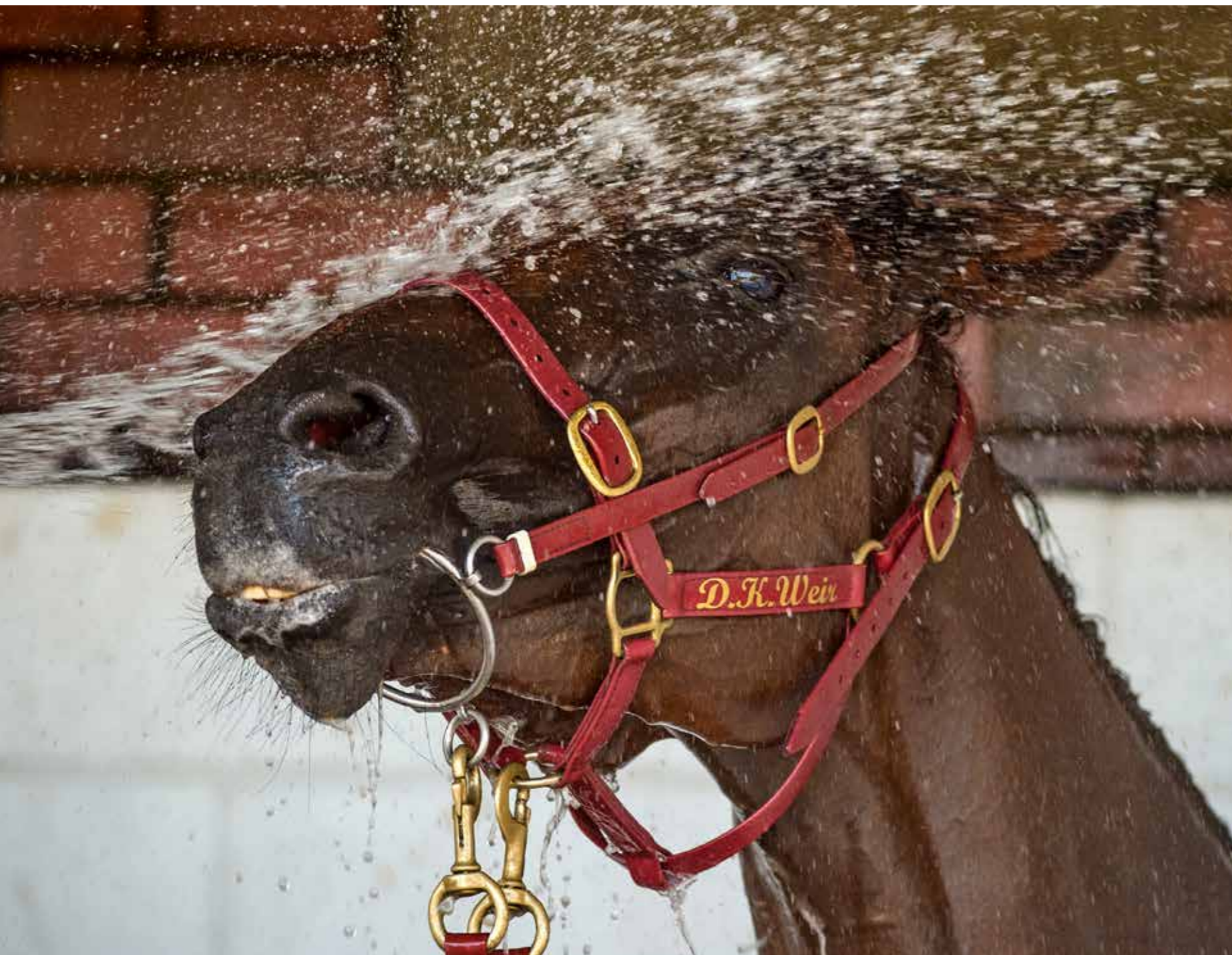

BIG DUKE announced his arrival as a potential star stayer when the Victorian powered home to win the \$200,000 Group 3 Luxbet Launceston Cup over 2400 metres at the Luxbet Racing Centre in February.

Big Duke (\$2.10 fav) produced a long sustained run from back in the field to gun down Hobart Cup winner Count Da Vinci and score by a length with the Ken Keys-trained outsider Tuff Bickie (\$34) running third.

The Darren Weir-trained gelding made amends for his second to Count Da Vinci in the Luxbet Hobart Cup and in turning the tables his trainer predicted a bright future for the former European gelding.

"We've always hoped he would be a Melbourne Cup horse and the way he is progressing we could get there but only time will tell."

Count Da Vinci was game in defeat. He enjoyed a good run in the race and when rider David Pires made his move 400 metres from home he loomed to win but was unable to match Big Duke's powerful finish.

Tuff Bickie ran the race of his life to finish third as he was the lowest rated horse in the race rated 64, having had only won one race from 14 starts.

Settler's Stone missed the start by many lengths but managed to rattle home and finish fourth to be the second Tasmanian horse home.

Big Duke was purchased by Luke Murrell and Jamie Lovett of Australian Bloodstock and they subsequently syndicated the gelding that was born in Ireland but did all of his racing in England before making the trip to Australia.

The gelding had four starts in the UK for a debut third in a maiden at Newmarket followed by a second at Epsom in a maiden.

He was third at his next start but it was his win at his fourth career outing in May last year that sparked Murell and Lovett's interest in the gelded son of Raven's Pass.

"We liked the horse's time that he ran to win that race at Wetherby over 2000m so we eventually contacted an agent to make an offer and we successfully negotiated the sale," Murell said.

Big Duke arrived at Darren Weir's stables on August 14 and just over three months later he made his Australian debut with a fourth at Bendigo in a benchmark 70 handicap over 1500 metres.

"We were hoping we were buying a potential Group 2 or Group 3 horse and after his second start we were more confident we had made the right move in buying him.

"Brad Rawiller rode him at his Australian debut and after the race he said he never got around one bend but he said a set of blinkers would have made the world of difference and once they were applied we realised we had a decent horse."

Before arriving in Tasmania he won at Caulfield (1800m) and Moonee Valley (2040m) which was good enough form for punters to back him into the \$1.80 favourite for the Luxbet Hobart Cup.

"It would have been nice to have won both Tasmanian Cups but we're happy enough with one. "They are races I have been trying to win for a few years but we never seemed to have the right horse."

Big Duke is on a path to the Group 1 Sydney Cup (3200m) which will take him to the Manion Cup (March 18) over 2400m and the Chairman's Handicap over 2600m on April 1.

01 ADMIRAL: Dominating the weight-for-age races in Tasmania is nothing new to Admiral so it came as no surprise that he snared the first three features early in the season.

The Barry Campbell-trained gelding produced a game effort to emerge triumphant in the Conquering over 1400 metres in Launceston before powering his way to an impressive win over Hellova Street in the Kevin Sharkie Tasmanian Stakes over 1600 metres just prior to Christmas.

Campbell then altered the five-year-old's training regime that enabled him to drop back to 1200 metres four weeks later to win the Luxbet Stakes over 1200 metres.

02 NORTHWEST PASSAGE: THE stature of the Tasmanian Derby on the national calendar is likely to be enhanced after the Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott-trained Northwest Passage delivered stellar performances to win the Derby and the Hobart Guineas at the front end of the Tasmania Summer Racing Carnival.

Northwest Passage arrived in Tasmania for the Hobart Guineas, the traditional lead-up race to the Derby, with two wins and a minor placing to his credit so needless to say he started an odds-on favourite to win the Hobart Guineas at his first look at the Hobart track at Luxbet Park.

Admiral has earned the title of king of weight-of-age racing in Tasmania these past two seasons but in Hobart he is vulnerable and that proved to be the case again in the weight-for-age Thomas Lyons over 1400m on Hobart Cup Day when he finished third behind Hellova Street and his stablemate Lord Da Vinci.

Admiral then ran in the Listed Luxbet Mowbray Stakes on Launceston Cup day where he finished 3rd behind Hellova Street and Jerilderie Letter.

The gelded son of So You Think won by 7-1/2 lengths and then stepped out at the very cramped price of \$1.15 in the Derby and cruised to an impressive win over the Danny O'Brien-trained French Snitzel with Igitur and Autmed dead-heating for third to make it an all-interstate finish.

Connections of the talented three-year-old could go to the South Australian Derby after which could be aimed at the Group 1 AJC Derby.

Whatever the outcome, success in either or both would frank the Tasmanian Derby form.

03 TSHAHITSI: Lightly raced five-year-old gelding Tshahitsi delivered a career-best performance to win the \$100,000 Wordsmith Newmarket Handicap over 1200 metres at the Luxbet Racing Centre in November to stamp himself as a potential topline sprinter.

Tshahitsi promised to win a feature race last season but he wasn't quite mature enough. This time in he was bigger and stronger and after a break he will return next season to tackle the next edition of the Newmarket and hopefully remain sound to tackle some weight-for-age events.

The gelding is prepared at Campania by Christine Crook and Imogen Miller who celebrated their biggest win since forming the training partnership.

"We have always had a good opinion of this horse but we had to be patient. We knew we were throwing him in at the deep end but we were proven right by putting him in the race," co-trainer Miller said.

Tshahitsi was having only his 16th start in the Newmarket but his record of eight wins and three minor placings to that point is testament to his ability.

04 OCEAN EMBERS: The connections of talented Victorian mare Ocean Embers targeted the \$125,000 weight-for-age Bow Mistress (1200m) late last year and they were hoping for a good performance to ensure she progressed towards her main Group 1 target in Adelaide in May.

She didn't just do them proud, she proved beyond doubt she will be up to the task when she heads to Morphettville to tackle the \$1 million Group 1 Sangster Stakes over 1200m at Morphettville in May.

Ocean Embers defeated the Darren Weir-trained Lyuba with previous Bow Mistress winner I Love It, from the John Salantri stable, a game third.

The Shea Eden-trained mare was unplaced in the Oakleigh Plate in Melbourne before heading to Sydney for a Group race, prior to taking on what promises to be a hot field in South Australia.

"We picked out this race in Tasmania because it is a well-respected weight-for-age event that usually has good quality mares in the race and this year was no exception," Eden said.

05 HELLOVA STREET: Premier trainer Scott Brunton has always had a huge opinion of his talented sprinter Hellova Street and on Launceston Cup day he capped what has been a great season for the six-year-old gelding by winning the \$100,000 Listed Luxbet Mowbray Stakes over 1600m.

Hellova Street gave his rivals a galloping lesson as he set a solid tempo with David Pires aboard and when he wheeled for home Pires asked him to sprint and he quickly put four lengths on his rivals.

06 ELWICK STAKES GOLD SOVEREIGN



He held on to defeat the fast-finishing Jerilderie Letter (\$7.70) by a length with Admiral (\$2.70) a long neck away third.

"To win the state's most prestigious weight-for-age races is a credit to the horse and I am so proud of him," Brunton said.

"He's been a horse that has for some reason flown under the radar which is surprising because he's won two Newmarket Handicaps and other listed races yet his name hasn't even been mentioned in horse of the year voting.

"Hellova Street is a serious racehorse and he has the record to prove it and I just want this horse to be recognized for it.

"We'll make plans to take him back to Melbourne and I'm sure that if he maintains his present form he'll be winning over there this season."

Hellova Street has an imposing record of 12 wins and 10 minor placings from 27 starts for just under \$500,000 in prizemoney.

"For a horse to win more than half his starts and only be unplaced five times in his career is a terrific record.

"He was off the scene for about six months owing to a young farrier shoeing him incorrectly but we managed to get him over that ordeal and he's back bigger and better than ever."

06 PATEENA ARENA: Longford trainer Bill Ryan was hoping his two-year-old filly Pateena Arena would be competitive as a two-year-old and use the experience as a grounding for what he believes will be a very promising three-year-old season for the daughter of Needs Further.

But after a couple of performances he started to think about a bigger picture and on Hobart Cup day the filly delivered the goods to take out the \$100,000 Listed Elwick Stakes over 1100 metres.

With the trainer's godson Luke Currie in the saddle, Pateena Arena rattled home late to run down the odds-on favourite Derasa to win by a narrow margin.

It was her second win of the season as she broke her maiden status in Launceston two starts prior over 1000m and followed up with a second to Derasa in the \$30,000 Alfa Bowl at the same venue.

Pateena Arena is from Needs Further's first crop and she is out of former smart 2YO sprinter Gehenna, that won five races, including the Listed Cascade Classic in 2003.

07 MAGIC MILLIONS 2YO CLASSIC



07 HEAVEN'S DELIGHT: Well-bred filly Heaven's Delight made one of the most impressive debuts by a two-year-old this season when she toughed it out to win the Tasmanian Magic Millions 2YO Classic over 1200 metres at the Luxbet Racing Centre in Launceston in February.

The Gary White-trained filly drew the outside barrier in the field of 10 and she was forced to work hard early to find the lead while Derasa (\$1.40) settled second and trailed the leader to the home turn.

When rider Raquel Clark called on the favourite to extend she quickly moved alongside Heaven's Delight (\$5.50) and drew clear half-way up the home straight but White's filly dug deep under strong riding from Victorian jockey Daniel Moor and fought back to win in a head-bobbing finish.

"I am absolutely thrilled with this win because she is a very good filly and is owned by two of my dear friends David and Louise Adams who have put a lot of money and time into this industry in Tasmania," White said.

"When this filly first came into work she showed something special and I knew a while ago that we had a potential star in the stable.

"She trialed in Hobart the week prior and won without being fully extended. Her rider Sigggy Carr said that she would go to this race and be very hard to beat, so she's a very good judge."

Heaven's Delight progressed to the Gold Sovereign Stakes on Launceston Cup day but after facing the breeze outside of the leader she faded to finish midfield.

08 HAPPY HALLOWEEN: Brighton trainer Stuart Gandy almost heaved a sigh of relief when his talented three-year-old Happy Halloween powered his way to a convincing win in the Tasmanian Magic Millions 3YO Classic in Launceston last month.

Happy Halloween was well backed to start the \$2.90 favourite on the strength of his win at his previous start and he didn't let his supporters down.

Rider Sigggy Carr allowed the gelding to bowl along in front and when challenged strongly in the home straight he forged clear and despite running off the track he held on to defeat Mulley's Idol by a length with Miss Two Pairs a closing third.

Happy Halloween arrived at Gandy's stables late last year after being transferred from Victoria by his Victorian owner Graeme Gathercole.

"This horse was obviously well respected when he first started racing in Melbourne because his first two starts were in Listed races up the straight at Flemington but he wasn't quite up to the mark and that's why he came to Tasmania," Gandy said.

"I knew he had a good race win in him and I'm so glad for the owner that it was a classic.

"We've had to do some chiropractic work on him to help straighten him out and it all seemed to pay off.

"I've still got one more issue to iron out and that's his tendency to run out in the home straight but I'm confident a one-eyed blinker will cure him.

"He is a good acquisition to the stable and he has adapted well to my training methods."

09 KISS ME KETUT: Young Victorian trainer Matthew Brown celebrated his biggest win when his six-year-old mare Kiss Me Ketut led throughout to win the Group 3 \$125,000 Vamos Stakes at the Luxbet Racing Centre in Launceston in February.

It wasn't a shock to Brown who rated her a strong each-way prospect going into the race, but punters thought otherwise because she started as one of the outsiders at \$51 (fixed).

But with talented Victorian non-claiming apprentice Boris Thornton aboard, the mare travelled well to the home turn unchallenged and when Thornton called on her for the supreme effort she responded magnificently.

Kiss Me Ketut staved off all challengers to score comfortably from the heavily backed favourite Lyuba (\$2.40 into \$1.80) with last year's winner I Love It (\$5) a game third.

"I am thrilled that this mare has been able to win a Group race because she tries so hard and today she was at the top of her game," Brown said.

"I'm not sure how many more starts she will have because she is due to head to the breeding barn, most likely this year."

It was an elated Thornton who celebrated his first Group success. "I am so thrilled to have secured my first Group win on this mare and for Matthew (Brown) because he has been a big supporter of mine and to do it in Tasmania is a bonus because this state has played such a dominant role in my career so far," Thornton said.

"When she drew barrier one we thought we could lead and dictate the tempo and that's what happened and from there it all just fell into place."

Kiss Me Ketut went on to contest the weight-for-age Luxbet Mowbray Stakes (1600km) on Launceston Cup day but from a wide draw she settled back in the field finishing fifth.

10 TASMANIAN OAKS

10 PARTHESIA: It took a brilliant performance from a highly promising Victorian filly to end the winning streak of star Tasmanian filly Hot Dipped in an action-packed \$100,000 Listed Tasmanian Oaks at the Luxbet Racing Centre in Launceston.

The Darren Weir-trained Parthesia (\$12) powered home with in-form Victorian rider Damien Lane aboard to grab Hot Dipped in the shadows of the post.

The race was run at a hectic pace with rank outsider Acronym (\$151) leading with another outsider Husson's Kiss (\$81) a close-up second through the first 1000 metres.

Parthesia (Raise The Flag-Notable) was well-placed midfield but when rider Bulent Muhcu called on Hot Dipped to sprint 500 metres from home he appeared to catch the others napping and he had the Brendan McShane-trained three-year-old poised to unleash at the top of the home straight.

The well-backed Wheal Leisure (\$3.40) also loomed to win at the same time with Hot Dipped forging to the lead 250 metres from home.

But just when it looked as if McShane's filly would stretch her unbeaten run in Tasmania to nine consecutive wins Parthesia emerged from the pack and under strong riding from Lane the filly charged home to grab Hot Dipped in the last few strides.

"Parthesia has come a long way in a short time and while she had only won one race before today we have always expected her to do well once she got out in distance." Weir said.

McShane was full of praise for his filly. "I am so proud of Hot Dipped because she gave her all and you can't ever ask for more. She's done a great job to have won two Listed races from her five wins this season and this is her first loss from nine starts on home soil so that's not a bad effort."

FLYNN - racing name DELAGO DUSK

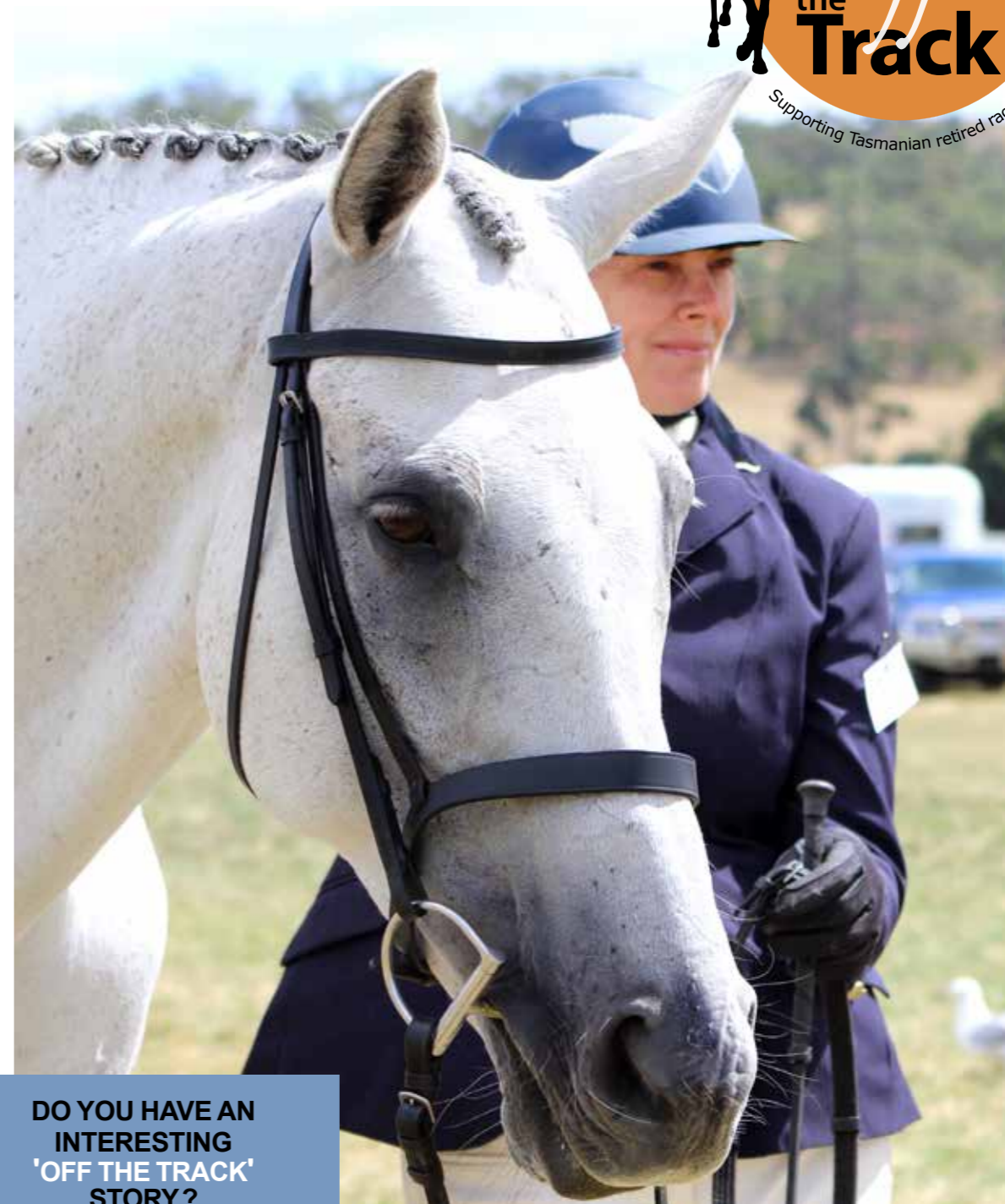

FLYNN (DELAGO DUSK) is a 10YO horse who raced until he was 6 1/2, having won at both Warnambool and Avoca. Purchased by Craig Conron (from Northern Tasmania) and then later sold to Cameron Thompson before being retired, he had two wins and 10 placings from his 25 starts.

Flynn was initially purchased by Sally as a riding horse so that she didn't have to stand and watch her daughter ride, thus enabling her to join in the fun. He now goes to Adult Riding Club, Jump Club and has completed a 20km Endurance ride. Sally and Flynn compete simply for the experience and fun of spending the day together, however Flynn showing an eagerness to jump may mean that his

reins are shared with Sally's daughter who will take him forward in that domain and hopefully have him competing soon in the inter school's competitions. Flynn has had previous success mostly in breed classes and the aim is to progress him towards the Hunter classes.

Flynns recent success was winning the OTT Award for Led Supreme (TB) at the recent unofficial dressage series challenge hosted by the Dodges Ferry Horse Riding Club at Pembroke Equestrian Park, Sorell.

2017 DEVONPORT CUP POWERCHARGED!

ABOUT two-years ago thoroughbred trainer John Blacker predicted his then three-year-old gelding Powercharged had the potential to develop into a feature race winner. On the Luxbet all-weather at Spreyton, Powercharged lived up to those expectations by powering his way to an emphatic win in the \$100,000 Simons Design Centre Devonport Cup over 1880 metres.

It was Blacker's third success in the race having won with Pral D'Or in 1998 and with his talented mare With Decorum in 2010 but Blacker said the Devonport Cup win was special.

"This horse showed me something special almost from the first time I worked him on the training track, but he was prone to injuring himself because of his antics around the stables. He has improved his ways as he's got older but we still have to keep a close eye on him at the stables. He went into the race with good form in weight-for-age races and he dropped from carrying 59 kilograms to only 54kg and that is why I thought he would be very hard to beat. His jockey (Ismail Toker) had a plan and he carried that out exactly as he said he would so he's done a great job to get the result."

Powercharged was only a \$5 chance when corporate bookies opened betting but the gelding drifted alarmingly throughout the day and started at \$9.10.

Toker settled Powercharged midfield with cover while the well-backed Electric Crimson (\$41 into \$27) found the front and held sway by two lengths when the field thundered towards the home turn but when Toker balanced Powercharged at the top of the home straight he swept to the lead and went on to score by almost a length from the fast-finishing Siorca (\$16.70) that came from last turning for home with Electric Crimson hanging on gamely for third ahead of the sole interstate invader Leica Day.

Powercharged showed enough last season to suggest he was destined to win a major race, especially after he finished a close-up second to star sprinter-miler Admiral in the \$100,000 weight-for-age Thomas Lyons in Hobart on Cup day last year. He progressed through the grades and went into this latest assignment having won six and been placed seven times for over \$100,000 in stakes.

HOT DIPPED

STAR Tasmanian filly Hot Dipped has had a remarkable season with five wins from her six starts likely to make her favourite to be crowned Tasmanian 3YO of the Year.

Hot Dipped was unbeaten from eight starts in Tasmania prior to finishing a gallant second in the Tasmanian Oaks with her five wins this season including two Listed events setting her apart from all other three-year-olds in the State.

She opened her account in the 3YO Cup and toyed with her rivals over 1200 metres in Launceston and followed up with an equally impressive win in the 3YO trophy over 1400m at the same venue.

Her next test was in the Tasmanian Guineas (1600m) in which she defeated another classy filly Life on the Wire, so it was a natural progression to the Thousand Guineas for fillies (1600m) and once that was accomplished trainer Brendan McShane aimed her at the Strutt Stakes.

"There seemed to be a lot of speculation that this filly might not handle stepping up to 2100 metres but I was supremely confident all along.

"When she won the Strutt Stakes so emphatically there was never any doubt in my mind that she should go to the Oaks and it was only ever going to be dependent on whether or not she pulled up well enough from the Strutt Stakes outing."

HOT DIPPED

Hot Dipped was unbeaten from eight starts in Tasmania prior to finishing a gallant second in the Tasmanian Oaks, with her five wins this season including two LISTED events.

Hot Dipped was last season voted Tasmanian 2YO of the Year and while it takes a very special three-year-old to win the Horse of the Year title this filly should be a top chance to secure the main award.

The filly finished second to Parthesia from the Darren Weir stable in the \$100,000 Tasmanian Oaks but she was gallant in defeat.

"Whenever a horse gives their all in a race you can't ask for more and while I'm disappointed she didn't win I was still so proud of her the way she fought to fend off the eventual winner."

McShane was thinking about next season for his filly while she was contesting races this time in and his long-range forecast is for a first-up tilt in the state's most prestigious sprint race the Newmarket Handicap in November.

"In this game you have to be thinking well ahead and with this filly it is very important that we try and map out a program so it gives us a blueprint from which to work each preparation."

Hot Dipped was exceptional at two winning three races in Tasmania before heading to Melbourne later in the season to contest a couple of quality races including the VRC Sires Produce (1400m) at Flemington in March last year.

She resumed racing in August for a first-up tilt at the Group 3 Quezette Stakes at Caulfield in which she finished ninth of 13 and after one more start in Melbourne in which she finished fourth of six behind Leotie she returned home.

"I have no doubts the interstate trip toughened her up and it has helped her become a better racehorse.

Hot Dipped's regular jockey Bulent Muhcu has struck a brilliant relationship with the filly and every time he rides her in a race he treats it more like taking a stroll in the park with a close friend.

"My relationship with Hot Dipped is quite unique in that I have never felt as close to a horse as I do this filly," Muhcu said.

"It was love at first sight really. She responded to my voice and when I rode her we were as one and that is very important for a rider and a horse to have that sort of relationship.

"She also taught me things about myself as a rider and that has never happened before.

"When she is in the paddock and I am near her she plays with me and I haven't had that with any other horse.

"She has a wonderful character and as a racehorse she is the real deal with a record to prove it."

Hot Dipped has become a valuable commodity as a broodmare with estimates on her value upwards of \$500,000.

"Because she is a multiple Listed winner by Written Tycoon and free of any Danehill blood she is valuable but that she is proficient at 1200 metres and 2100 metres makes her a rarity," McShane said.

Hot Dipped was last season voted Tasmanian 2YO of the Year and while it takes a very special three-year-old to win the 3YO and Horse of the Year title this filly has done enough to warrant serious consideration to take out both awards this season.

PROGRAMME NOTES

BLAYNE HUDSON

The April to July grid has been slightly restructured from the 2016 calendar coming off the Tasmanian Summer Racing Carnival and into the Autumn period.

Keeping in line with the recent trend to provide more Class racing opportunities, additional Class 2 races have been added to the Autumn program with an aim to assist a horse through its classes.

Since the inclusion of Class 3 races to the Tasmanian program in April 2015, 39 Races have been run over varying distances with statistics showing that the split between Class 2 and Class 3 wins being practically identical (20 Wins for C3, 19 Wins for C2). Meaning C2 horses are able to win out of grade and on a regular basis in Class 3 events.

The step to add these additional Class 2 races will not only give progression for a horse to go through their grades, but also gives the Class 1 horse an additional option. With the ever increasing Class 1 pool rising on a weekly basis this need to maintain a horse's preparation is essential and the additional races will ensure an option is available for the horse to progress.

A monthly maiden mile has been added to the Autumn program to allow these horses a chance to win in their own grade. Statistics show a large percentage of Maiden/Class 1 miles are won by Class 1 horses so the opportunity for a maiden to progress through these races is uncommon. These maiden mile races have been programmed to still coincide with the Maiden/Class 1 miles and 2100m to give a horse every possible option.

Benchmark racing has also been amended in the Autumn period with the inclusion of reintroducing Benchmark 68 races. The rating gap between BM62 to BM72 can be a substantial jump in quality for some horses and the inclusion of another ratings bracket can help assist in the progression between BM ratings. Whilst the Autumn grid has only one BM68 per month, the feedback will hopefully be well received from participants to warrant additional races of this rating moving forward.

Age based races have also been highlighted in this grid to give two and three-year-olds more opportunities to win in their age group.

Finally some Meetings across the Autumn grid have been reduced by a race. This is to ensure we have the option to divide or add additional races throughout the period when required. Grids previously have had races which have attracted lower nominations then projected, this step ensures that we can review the horse population closer than is permitted currently and provides the opportunity to a divide or additional race when nominations suffice.

The April to July program is highlighted by the 2017 Autumn Carnival which continues in the same lead up format from 2016 and concludes as a finals day on Sunday 21st May in Launceston with four \$30k races including the Tasmanian Sires Produce and the Tasmanian St Leger.

Key Program Notes:

- The Jack Frost Quality HCP, which has previously been run at the last Launceston Night Meeting of the season, has been removed due to programme rescheduling.
- The Fillies & Mares sprint series continues in the Autumn with the running of the \$25k Autumn HCPs over 1100m & 1200m on April 9th and 24th in Hobart.

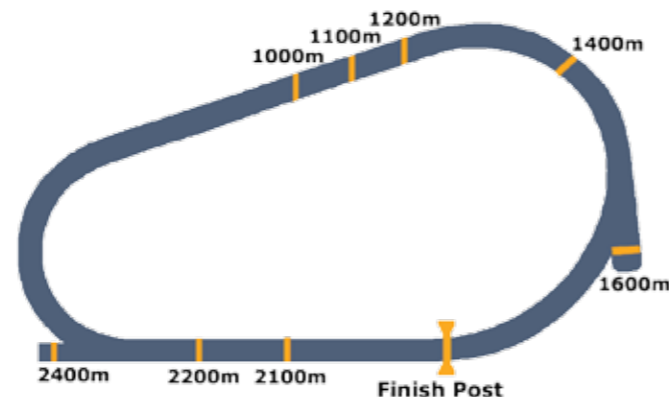

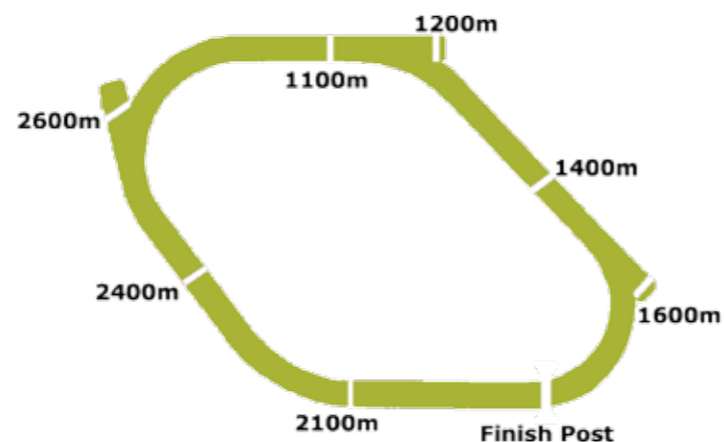

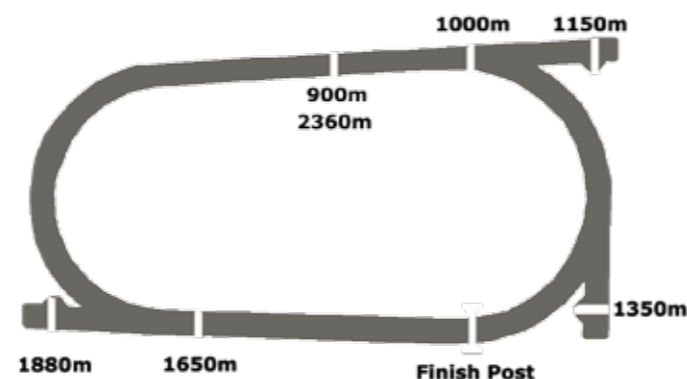

The current tasBonus Breeders Scheme has been under review by Tasracing.

A sub-committee of Tasracing, Tasbreeders and the Tasmanian Racehorse Owners Association have formulated a position in relation to a new scheme which will inject renewed confidence into the Tasmanian Breeding Industry. The sub-Committee is still to finalize the final aspects of the Funding and unfortunately this has not been able to be achieved prior to the 2017 Tasmanian Magic Millions Yearling Sale Yearling.

The Committee has therefore decided that tasBonus will not be operating for graduates of the 2017 Sale.

We look forward to announcing the makeup of the new Scheme prior to the 2017 Breeding Season.

- Tasmanian-sired (Tasmanian-based sire)
- Tasmanian-bred (mare must be Tasmanian-owned), based on Australian Stud Book registered breeder location
- Catalogued for sale at the Tasmanian Yearling Sale (any breeding)

Breeder Nomination: \$220 (incl GST)

Owner Nomination: \$330 (incl GST)

A horse may be only breeder nominated or only owner nominated or both. A once-off fee is paid to Tasracing when the horse is a yearling and the horse then becomes eligible for a bonus whilst it is a 2, 3 and 4 year old, for its maiden win or for one of any special bonus races.

SPECIAL BONUS RACES

Special bonus races will offer owners and breeders an additional \$4,000 (\$3,000 owner/\$1,000 breeder) bonus for non-maiden horses winning specified 2YO and 3YO races (of \$50,000 or less).

These will include selected 2YO and 3YO feature races and 2YO and 3YO handicap races.

STEWARDS REPORT

JOCKEY, TRIAL RIDERS AND TRACKWORK RIDERS

Please be advised that the Stewards will commence random audits to ensure helmets and vests comply with the standards required under the rules.

Only padded whips are to be used by riders when riding Trackwork.

Trial riders are reminded that whilst jeans are permitted to be worn in trials they cannot be of blue denim material.

TRAINERS - TRACKWORK AND TRIALS

Trainers are requested to ensure that gear ie saddles, girths, breastplates reins etc are of adequate standard when being used at Trackwork and Trials

HORSE IDENTIFICATION CARD

It is a requirement that the horse identification card be produced when horses are being assessed for their initial barrier certificate at trials. The rules provide that a horse may not be permitted to start in a trial if the identification card is not produced.

LATE NOTIFICATION OF RIDERS AT RACE MEETINGS

The Stewards are aware there are times when it is difficult to engage a rider and submit it to Racing Australia within the required timeframe.

If a trainer is experiencing difficulty in this area , they are strongly encouraged to contact the Stewards otherwise a fine may be imposed.

HORSES LEAVING RACECOURSE

Once a horse has entered the racecourse for the purpose of competing in a race it is not to leave the course until such time it has competed.

After a race the horse is required to remain on course for half an hour unless permission to leave earlier is granted by the Stewards.

STABLE INSPECTIONS HORSE WELFARE

The Stewards have recently commenced what we term '**Horse Welfare Stable Inspections**'. These inspections are designed to allow trainers to ask questions or seek counsel on any matter that they would like clarified.

The initial inspections and co-operation by trainers has been excellent and the condition of all horses inspected thus far has also been excellent.

The Stewards and trainers see these particular inspections as a proactive measure to maintain the excellent reputation that Thoroughbred Trainers in Tasmania have with the broader community that animal welfare is a primary concern of all involved.

Updates

SUMMARY:

The definition of "A Class Five Race" as it is currently shown in the Australian Rules of Racing has been reviewed.

It has always been the intent of the definition and the practical application that a multiple 2-year-old Listed winner is an Open Class horse and ineligible to run in both Class Five and Class Six races.

Racing Australia has resolved that the definition of a Class Five Race under AR.1A should be amended by adding the additional wording from the definition of a Class Six Race..

1. Amend sub-paragraph of AR.1A as follows:

...
 "A CLASS FIVE RACE is one restricted to horses which, at the time of starting, have not won more than five races on the flat provided that, in determining the eligibility of any horse, no account shall be taken of any wins in Class A, Class B or Trophy races other than a win as a Maiden horse.
 Further provided that, notwithstanding the foregoing provisions, the winner of the following races shall be ineligible:
 (a) Any Group Race;
 (b) Any Listed Race or Restricted Listed Race in which horses older than 2yo could run; or
 (c) More than one Listed Race or Restricted Listed Race in which 2yos only could run."

SUMMARY:

ASIC has announced that the maximum number of members in a registered syndicate will increase from 20 to 50

1. Amend AR.69(c) as follows:

AR.69 ... "(c) A combination of one or more registered syndicates and/or natural persons totalling in all not more than fifty."

SUMMARY:

The Racing Australia Board has determined that a stewards' discretion will be incorporated into AR.137A(5) so that stewards enforcing the rule have regard to the circumstances of the race including distance and context of the race, such as a staying race or a rider endeavouring to encourage his mount to improve.

1. Amend AR.137A(5) as follows:

AR.137A.

- ...
 "(5) Subject to the other requirements of this rule:
 (a) In a race, official trial or jump-out prior to the 100 metre mark;
 (i) The whip shall not be used in consecutive strides.
 (ii) The whip shall not be used on more than 5 occasions save and except where there have only been minor infractions and the totality of the whip use over the whole race is less than permitted under AR.137A(5)(a) and (b) and also having regard to the circumstances of the race including distance and context of the race, such as a staying race or a rider endeavouring to encourage his mount to improve.
 (iii) The rider may at his discretion use the whip with a slapping motion down the shoulder, with the whip hand remaining on the reins.
 (b) In the final 100 metres of a race, official trial or jump-out a rider may use his whip at his discretion."

SUMMARY:

Recent cases of fraudulent behaviour have highlighted the issue of secret commissions in racing.

The new rule applies to all those involved in the selling and trading of Thoroughbreds.

1. Add AR.28 as follows:

"AR.28.

1. This rule applies to:
 (a) any person bound by these Rules (person); and
 (b) any Named Horse or Unnamed Horse (for the purpose of this rule, "relevant horse").
 2. Any person who is in any way party to or involved in the sale of a relevant horse, must not, directly or indirectly:
 (a) seek or solicit from any person for himself or herself or for any other person any benefit;
 (b) receive for himself or herself or for any other person or entity any benefit, unless the person has first:
 (i) fully disclosed, in writing, to the registered owner(s) of the relevant horse that the person:
 A. will be seeking or soliciting for himself or herself or for any other person a benefit;
 B. will receive for himself or herself or for any other person a benefit; and
 (ii) obtained the written consent of more than 75% of the registered ownership to seek or solicit, and/or to receive, the benefit.
 3. Any person who is in any way party to or involved in the purchase of a relevant horse, must not, directly or indirectly:
 (a) seek or solicit from any person for himself or herself or for any other person any benefit;
 (b) receive for himself or herself or for any other person or entity any benefit;
 (c) offer to provide, or provide, to any vendor of the relevant horse, or to any other person (including a person acting, or purporting to act, on behalf of the vendor), any benefit in connection with the sale of the horse;
 unless the person has first:
 (i) fully disclosed, in writing, to the prospective purchaser(s) of the relevant horse that the person will:
 A. be seeking or soliciting for himself or herself or for any other person a benefit;

- B. receive for himself or herself or for any other person a benefit;
 C. be offering to provide to any vendor of the relevant horse, or to any other person (including a person acting, or purporting to act, on behalf of the vendor), a benefit in connection with the sale of the horse; and
 (ii) obtained the written consent of more than 75% of the prospective purchasers to seek or solicit, to receive and/or to provide, the benefit.
 4. Where, in the course of one transaction, a person acts, or purports to act, on behalf of both:
 (a) a registered owner (or owners) of a relevant horse in connection with the sale of a relevant horse; and
 (b) a purchaser (or purchasers) of a relevant horse in connection with the purchase of the same relevant horse, that person must comply with the provisions of both sub-rules (2) and (3).
 5. For the purpose of the consent required by AR.28(2)(ii) and AR.28(3)(ii), consent shall be deemed to have been given by a person where that person fails to provide reasonable notice of dissent in writing within 72 hours of receiving the written disclosure pursuant to AR.28(2)(a)(i) or AR.28(3)(i).
 6. For the purpose of this rule:
 (a) "benefit" includes any valuable consideration, rebate, commission, gratuity, profit, fee, benefit or payment of any kind, whether direct or indirect, and to be provided at any time;
 (b) a reference to the sale and/or purchase of a relevant horse includes the sale or purchase of a share or beneficial interest in that horse.
 7. The purchase price of a relevant horse must be disclosed on the relevant Transfer of Ownership form lodged with the relevant Principal Racing Authority, with such disclosure being made on the Transfer of Ownership form prior to any of the outgoing or incoming owners signing that form.
 8. The Principal Racing Authority (or in the case of Tasracing, the delegated Stewards) may, at any time, require any person who is party to or involved, directly or indirectly, in the sale or purchase of a relevant horse to provide full details as they may require of such sale including, without limitation, the purchase price and any benefits.
 9. Any person who refuses or fails to comply with any requirement of this rule may be penalised."



WINX HEADLINES STELLAR YEAR FOR AUSTRALIAN RACING

Australian wonder mare **WINX** has been crowned the world's highest-rated racehorse on turf during a stellar year for local horses at the 2016 Longines World's Best Racehorse Rankings (LWBRR).

Winx, whose winning streak has extended to 13 races over two and a half years of racing at the top level, achieved the equal highest Australian rating of 132 in the history of the LWBRR listings. She finished third on the 2016 list behind American duo **ARROGATE** (134) and **CALIFORNIA CHROME** (133).

Winx headlines 50 Australian-trained horses which feature on the list of 318 horses. This number represents a significant increase from 2014 and 2015, when 40 Australian horses made the listings. Her rating of 132 equals the previous Australian record set by champion mare **BLACK CAVIAR**, who reached the milestone in 2011 on her way to amassing an incredible 25 wins from her 25 career starts.

Winx's highest rated win came after her eight-length demolition of the 2016 William Hill Cox Plate field.

As well as the LWBRR top horses, the world's 100 top Group 1 (G1) races for 2016 was also released. The Cox Plate was rated equal second in order of international rankings (124.75) behind the Breeders' Cup Classic (125.25) - a race run on dirt in which Arrogate defeated California Chrome.

The China Horse Club-George Ryder Stakes (122), where Winx defeated Kermadec and Press Statement on her way to winning The Star Doncaster Mile during The Championships, was equal seventh on the list alongside the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe.

Twenty-three Australian races featured in the list of the top-100 G1 races for 2016.

Winx's main opposition during the 2016 racing year - **HARTNELL** - was equal eighth on the global rankings (124) and was the next highest rated Australian horse.

His most notable win of the season was in the G1 Yellowglen Turnbull States, in which he beat eventual BMW Caulfield Cup winner, **JAMEKA**.

CHAUTAUQUA'S incredible efforts during the year, including a second T.J. Smith Stakes win during The Championships, was also etched into the 2016 history books, when he was crowned the equal highest rated sprinter in the world (122) alongside Great Britain's **LIMATO**.

His breathtaking win in the Hong Kong Chairman's Sprint Prize at Sha Tin was the shining light in the six-year-old's star-studded season.

Chautauqua was also rated 122 in the 2014 listings and was the Champion Sprinter in the world in 2015 on a mark of 123.

Queensland sprinter **BUFFERING** was the oldest horse recognised on this year's list. He reached the ranking of 118 in overseas competition with a memorable victory in the Al Quoz Sprint at Meydan on Dubai World Cup night in March.

Buffering retires as one of the most popular racehorses in Australia having won seven G1 races.

First-time G1 winner **FLYING ARTIE**, who flew down the Flemington straight to claim the Coolmore Stud Stakes in style, was the highest rated three-year-old sprinter in the world on 120.

The Mick Price-trained colt led a world class group of Australian three-year-old sprinters with stablemate **Extreme Choice** (119), **Astern** (118), **Star Turn** (118) and **Russian Revolution** (117) all prominent in the list of the world's best sprinters.

Australia's LWBRR representative, Greg Carpenter, said the list reflected a superb year for Australian-trained horses highlighted by Winx.

"It has been a magnificent year for racing fans in Australia, categorised by the increase in the number of Australian horses honoured in the highest possible way by their inclusion in the LWBRR," Carpenter said.

"There is no higher recognition for a racehorse than to feature on this list and to have 50 horses included, as well as 23 races in the world's top 100, is testament to the continuing strength of Australian racing."

"Winx's rating of 132 puts her on an equal footing with arguably Australia's best ever race horse **Black Caviar**, who in 2011 reached her peak position on the list by winning the fastest ever Newmarket Handicap by three lengths carrying 58kg."

"In my opinion her eight-length Cox Plate victory over a world class field including **Hartnell** was every bit as good as **Black Caviar's** extraordinary performance in the 2011 Newmarket Handicap."

To be eligible for inclusion into the list, a horse must have been rated at 115 or above in the period under review. In total, there were 318 horses from 16 countries that made it into the 2016 listings.
