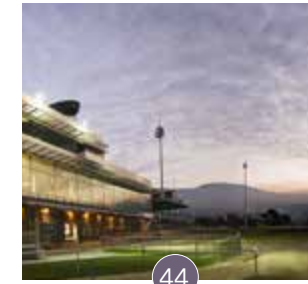
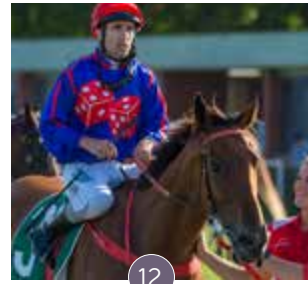
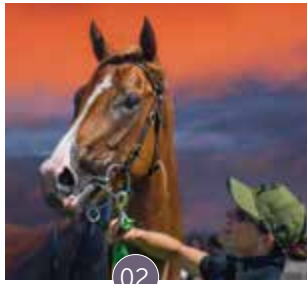

DEROCHE

Dazzling Deroche has the answers

Buying a share in a racehorse, particularly a yearling can be a daunting prospect. Will it make it to the racetrack? Will it win a race? Will it be a champion?

These are just a few of the many questions prospective owners may ask themselves before signing on the dotted line and handing over their hard earned cash.

For the owners of Deroche, a striking two year old filly, none would be regretting their purchase.

Right from the start, the owners (predominantly Tasmanians) and headed by Star Thoroughbreds syndicator Denise Martin would have been anticipating something special.

Deroche was knocked down for \$61,000 at the 2018 Tasmanian Magic Millions sales. Martin bought the filly on the recommendation of renowned NSW bloodstock agent Brett Howard.

"Brett has a close bond with Needs Further, he was asked by the original owners to find a stud home for the horse; he suggested the stallion to Armidale Stud," Martin said.

"He strongly urged me to buy Deroche, saying she was the nicest Needs Further filly he'd seen at the auction since his yearlings were first offered."

Quite a wrap considering Mystic Journey (Needs Further x White Gold) winner of the Group One Australian Guineas and \$5 million All Star Mile and arguably Australia's best three year old went through the sales a year earlier.

The first time Deroche stepped onto a racetrack she won a trial by 10.25 lengths and on the back of that firmed from \$2.05 to start a \$1.35 favourite when she debuted in Launceston in January. But racing can be fickle and after showing blistering speed Deroche wilted to finish third.

A fortnight later, Deroche stepped out at the same track and lead all the way, scoring brilliantly, again starting a red-hot favourite at \$1.24.

That was to be the first of four wins and two placings from just six starts and more than \$160,000 in prize money for the good looking chestnut filly who stands out from the crowd with her two white socks and flaxen mane and tail.

"Whilst she is clearly a very flashy filly, she's also very well put together, and she's strong, athletic, has great balance and a very powerful hind quarter."

DEROCHE rounded out her Tasmanian two year old season in May winning the Armidale Stud Tasbred feature in Launceston. Again punters thought she was unbeatable and she was sent out the \$1.35 favourite.

Despite being in the barriers for a long time, she came out of the gates like a rocket and was never headed.

"We had a bit of luck, she can get agitated in the barriers but the longer we waited the calmer she was, and I almost thought she had fallen asleep at one stage," jockey Craig Newitt said.

"She's very good," he added, she does everything you ask of her. Even though Adam Trinder's horse has beaten her twice I really can't split them, they are the best two year olds in Tassie by a long way. I wouldn't want to swap rides if they meet again."

Trinder's filly is Mystical Pursuit, unbeaten from four starts and winner of the LISTED Elwick and Gold Sovereign Stakes and a tick over \$200,000 prize money. Mystical Pursuit is also by Needs Further and with her unbeaten record and two

victories over Deroche, is most likely to be named Tasmania's champion two year old.

"Deroche is the best two year old in Tasmania (in my mind)," Martin declared. When there is an unbeaten juvenile in the state this is not necessarily a commonly held belief, but I think she's an absolute cracker."

Trainer Barry Campbell is confident Deroche will be an even better three year old and stretch out to the longer trips of Black Type races. Both her jockey and part-owner agree.

"I can't wait to get her out to 1400 metres or a mile, I think she will be even better ridden from behind," Newitt predicted while Martin added, "I think that's what she will be looking for in 12 months. She looks to me to be a filly who will improve significantly as a three year old. It's difficult to know how far up the ladder she will go but I'd say a fair way. She has great acceleration from the gates, together with great acceleration at the end of her races, I always believe they are the hallmarks of only very good horses."

Whether or not Deroche is named two year old of the year, one thing is certain, her owners have very few questions left to ask.

MYSTIC JOURNEY

"Mystic Journey is proof that dreams can come true"

TO say the performances of star Tasmanian three-year-old filly Mystic Journey were outstanding during this summer and autumn would be an understatement. Her trainer Adam Trinder will tell you her feats were exceptional while her owner Wayne Roser remains in awe of what she has been able to produce on the national stage.

Becoming the first Tasmanian-trained and owned three-year-old to win at Group 1 level in the Australian Guineas at Flemington in March was enough to send racing scribes into frenzy mode as they scanned the archives in search of Tasmanian-bred horses to have previously won a Group 1.

But stepping out two weeks later to become the inaugural winner of the \$5 million All-Star Mile at Flemington, defeating some of the best weight-for-age performers over 1600m in the country, confirmed her status as a potential superstar.

Her rider Anthony Darmanin dubbed the filly a "freak" after she won the Lady Lynette over 1100m in Launceston at the start of her preparation in late January.

"To do what she did and win from where she was (last) 200 metres from home convinced me she was a freak and she continued to deliver amazing performances throughout the campaign," Darmanin said.

"She doesn't just win her races, she demoralises her opposition!"

"What she did in the Australian Guineas and more so in the All-Star Mile was incredible and Adam is sure he hasn't yet got to the bottom of the filly."

Mystic Journey sat three-wide with no cover for the entire journey in the All-Star Mile but made light of the task as she cruised to victory by over a length.

Mystic Journey has had only 13 starts for 10 wins for a staggering \$3.262 million in prizemoney, the biggest even prize stakes haul by any Tasmanian-bred galloper.

Her trainer has said many times that the filly has done wonders for his stable but she has also raised the profile of Tasmanian racing to a new level.

Trinder's life partner, former talented jockey Leah Goodrick, explained the affect Mystic Journey has had on her life.

"Any stable, certainly in Tasmania, dreams of having a Mystic Journey stroll into the yard," Goodrick said.

"Having her has been life changing, business changing and has opened doors that might otherwise have been closed.

"It is a total package for us because not only has the horse's efforts eased the financial strain on the business but her owner (Wayne Roser) has become a very close friend.

"Wayne guides us and helps us with our business and we try not to blur those boundaries.

"Having such a close relationship with the filly's owner makes the journey going forward even more special"

Trinder was destined for greatness as a trainer, coming from a long line of master horsemen that includes his father Michael who remains a member of Tasmania's training ranks, although a sudden illness recently threatened to stop him in his tracks.

But he is a Trinder and possess a never-say-die attitude to life and, according to Adam, his Dad is on the road to recovery.

Adam is a perfectionist by nature, so pleasing him doesn't come easy but Mystic Journey has so far been able to satisfy his tenacious appetite for success.

"What this filly has achieved so far is amazing but I really don't think we've reached the extent of her capabilities," Trinder said.

"Once the All-Star Mile was done and dusted I sat back and had a look at the big picture and the canvas was very impressive.

"You only ever dream about a horse like Mystic Journey landing on your doorstep but to achieve what she has as an \$11,000 yearling is quite remarkable."

Mystic Journey was given a spell in the paddock adjacent to the Trinder family home at Latrobe immediately following her win in the All-Star Mile on 16 March.

Trinder recently loaded her onto his double horse float and took her to work with him for what could be the most important preparation of her racing career.

"We will nominate her for the Cox Plate, which is her main mission, but we will also put in a nomination for the Caulfield and Melbourne cups.

"We will nominate for other feature races that could fit into her next prep and that includes the Golden Eagle in Sydney."

The Golden Eagle is a new race on this season's calendar. It offers prizemoney of \$7.5 million and will be run over 1500 metres on November 2 at Randwick and is open to four-year-olds only.

"Right now the Golden Eagle is just a name on a piece of paper but in this game you have to cover as many bases as possible to get the right outcome."

Trinder is aware that with the retirement of Winx it could mean this year's Cox Plate may attract record overseas entries so the Golden Eagle might be an easier option.

"The plan is to keep all of our options open and make decisions only when they need to be made.

"Right at the minute we are looking at her first start being in the Group 3 Bletchingly Stakes over 1200 metres at Caulfield on 27 July followed by the Memsie Stakes (1400m) at the same venue at the end of August.

"But more concrete decisions will be made as her preparation unfolds."

Trinder also prepares Mystic Journey's three-quarter sister Mystical Pursuit, also owned by Roser, that was unbeaten from her four starts this season, making her a strong contender for Tasmanian two-year-old of the year.

If that plays out as expected then Trinder and Roser could feature heavily at the Tasmanian Annual Awards in September. Many will tip Mystic Journey to take out the 3YO and overall horse of the year.

THE Adam Trinder juggernaut continued to roll in Melbourne with his talented mare Twitchy Frank (\$2.90 fav) scoring an impressive all-the-way win in the Blue Gum Farm VOBIS Gold Distaff over 1400 metres at Caulfield in April.

Twitchy Frank showed her customary early speed to lead and, her rider Anthony Darmanin was able to steal a couple of cheap sectionals before stepping up the tempo.

The daughter of Choisir kicked clear in the home straight and went on to defeat Spanner Head (\$5) by a half-length with River Jewel (\$5) third.

The \$150,000 race for fillies and mares carried a \$30,000 bonus of which 90 per cent went into the owners' coffers for an almost \$100,000 outcome.

Twitchy Frank had great form going into the race having won the Group 3 Vamos Stakes in Launceston before heading to Victoria to finish a game third in the \$100,000 Gold Bracelet at Bendigo.

Trinder has only had the mare for four starts, as she was with the Darren Weir stable before he was disqualified in late January.

The owners opted to send her to Trinder and leave the mare in his care, a decision with which they must be pleased.

"This mare has done a great job since she's been in my stable and I must admit it has been a bit of a learn-as-you-go process," Trinder said.

"The Bow Mistress was her first target and she placed third and then won the Group 3 Vamos on Launceston Cup day.

"As time went on I started to understand her ways and with this win it gives us a bit of breathing space to map out a long-range plan."

Twitchy Frank has gone to the paddock and will be aimed at both of Tasmania's Group 3 races for fillies and mares next season.

THE 2019 NATIONAL APPRENTICE JOCKEY *Series* WRAP

A revamped version of the National Apprentice Jockey Series, Australia's premier competition for apprentice jockeys took place over a three-and-a-half week period in March-April 2019.

Inaugurated in 2008, the series draws together apprentice jockeys from across the country to represent the state in which they are registered to ride.

Points are awarded to every state's nominated jockey in each of the five races, with the winner receiving seven points and the runner-up five. Third place is rewarded three points, fourth place two points and all unplaced rides receive one point. The state that accumulates the most points across the series is crowned the overall winner.

Victoria took the title in 2018 and after Tasmania finished runner-up in in both 2017 and 2018 there were high hopes of going one better. Unfortunately Tasmania drew the outsider in four of the five races dashing all hope of taking out the series.

Tasmania was represented by 2017/18 Tasmanian leading apprentice Chris Graham, last season's dux of the Tasmanian Apprentice School Teagan Voorham and Alex Patis. Singaporean apprentice Simon Kok was to have represented Tasmania in the first leg but was injured the week prior and was unable to participate.

Queensland led for most of the 2019 series but was pipped at the post by South Australia who won the final race.

Round 1 – Launceston, Tasmania
Launceston saw the first round of NARS where Tasmania was represented by Teagan Voorham. Teagan rode Gee Gee Musicmaker (\$31 outsider of the field) into sixth place doing a terrific job to secure third place points.

Round 2 – Perth, Western Australia
Ascot provided Chris Graham with an opportunity to ride in the second leg of the series at a metropolitan meeting and whilst Chris' mount was the rank outsider at \$101 he gave his horse every chance finishing 8th of the 12 runners. Chris also xsecured two other rides on the program which gave him further experience and he came within a head of winning to finish second in one race.

Queensland apprentice Baylee Northdurft scored top points for Queensland in the second round, followed by Western Australia and Victoria.

Stephen has achieved more than most people dare to dream. Winner of eight Tasmanian Jockey Premierships, he has ridden three Hobart Cup winners, three Launceston Cup winners and eight winners in the Newmarket Handicap. He has ridden in Macau, Singapore, Malaysia and Mauritius and has been inducted into the Tasmanian Racing Hall of Fame. Stephen is now in charge of Tasmania's young apprentices.

He has 78 career wins with his biggest wins including the LISTED 2018 Tasmanian Guineas on 'Overplay', the LISTED 2019 Elwick Stakes and the LISTED 2019 Gold Sovereign on unbeaten two year old filly 'Mystical Pursuit'.

ALEX PATIS

Age 19 Claims - 3 kgs

Alex commenced race riding in 2018 and transferred her indentures from Victoria to Tasmanian trainer Adam Trinder. Alex is riding winners regularly with 22 winners this season. She is currently placed third on the Tasmanian Apprentices Premiership. Career highlights include winning the 2019 Longford Cup and riding doubles at Devonport and Hobart this season.



TEAGAN VORHAM
Age 23 Claims – 2kgs

Teagan commenced race riding 19 months ago. Previously she was a state representative in polocrosse. She is the current leading Tasmanian apprentice. Career highlights include Dux of the 2017/18 Tasmanian Apprentice School, riding 4 winners in one day and winning the 2018 Longford Cup.



Round 3 – Brisbane, Queensland

Former Tasmanian apprentice Raquel Clark took first place securing her 100th win for the racing season whilst Teagan Voorham finished unplaced on her mount on a rain affected track.

Round 4 – Strathalbyn, South Australia

The fourth leg of the series was taken out by Kenny Lau from South Australia followed by Northern Territory and Western Australia. Unfortunately Alex Patis' mount was scratched at the barriers.

Round 5 – Melbourne, Victoria

The final heat was conducted at Sandown was taken out by Kayla Crowther of SA

with Tasmania's Chris Graham finishing second on the Hayes and Dabernig trained Dalswinton.

Tasracing's Apprentice Jockey Program Manager Stephen Maskiell accompanied all Tasmania's participating apprentices. 'NARS is a terrific initiative and a great opportunity that gives apprentices exposure to different trainers, new tracks and horses, as well as the opportunity to meet fellow apprentices and apprentice jockey coaches' said Maskiell.

Another new initiative of this year's series saw jockeys wearing coloured race breeches clearly showing their State of origin (sponsored by LUCRF Super), with Tasmania donning the green and gold.

Every year in the upper Derwent Valley there is an event that is horse rider's heaven! Cleveland Pastoral Company conduct their annual muster and choose a few capable horse riders to help them out on some very long tough days.

The type of country is what you would expect to find at the foothills of the central highlands. Beautiful undulating pastures divided by steep hills require sure footed, willing and calm horses.

Most of the stock horses have descended from the Australian Stock Horse or the Quarter Horse. Usually there will be an Off The Track mount and this year saw a hardy little Standardbred in Toby pulling his weight magnificently on his very first muster.

The seven year old gelding had a minor meltdown in the first few minutes of eyeing a wonderful line of black Wagyu cattle, but in true Standardbred fashion he accepted his new role, got over it and settled into his new part time job with flying colours!

Capably ridden by owner Kareena Blackwell, Toby is otherwise known as Whelanswish and was bred by Kareena's late father Greg Whelan. This makes the horse pretty special to Kareena and the

fact he is going beautifully under saddle since retiring from racing makes him even more treasured.

By Artesian, he is from a very good dam line with his mother, My Scarlett, a granddaughter of the great French Chef.

Unfortunately Toby showed little interest in finding the winning post but he is happily transforming into a talented riding partner for Kareena.

Toby has attended some of the clinics on offer from Tasracing's Off The Track program where he proved a very quick learner, cantering and jumping for the first time at his first clinic.

Kareena's family has always been involved with pacers and as a child her first memories are double dinking on a retired Standardbred with her grandfather doing stock work. That old mare was a granddaughter of Chamfer called Gentle Luck who had six foals, five of whom won with an aggregate total of 30 victories. Her best known son was Atashy Luck, winner of 19 races who took over the double dinking from his dam.

Toby is not Kareena's only Standardbred mount. She also has Max In Motion who didn't quite make the track, but he is a big black horse making an impressive picture under saddle. Max In Motion has made an appearance at the mountain cattlemen's yearly get together.

Playing Arkabella, by Shadow Play was bred by Kareena and her mother from their mare Arkabe Jewel. Before she was sold to the mainland, Playing Aarkabella won the coveted Bandbox, Evicus and the Two-year-old Sweepstakes. Including one group three she has 10 wins and 12 placings from 47 starts to date. She has a two year old Rocknroll Heaven sister with a He's Watching sibling on the way. Including her job in a rural produce store and her major involvement with Brighton Pony Club, it's safe to say that Kareena's life revolves around horses just as it has done for generations of her proud Tasmanian equestrian family.

GENTLEMAN JAMES

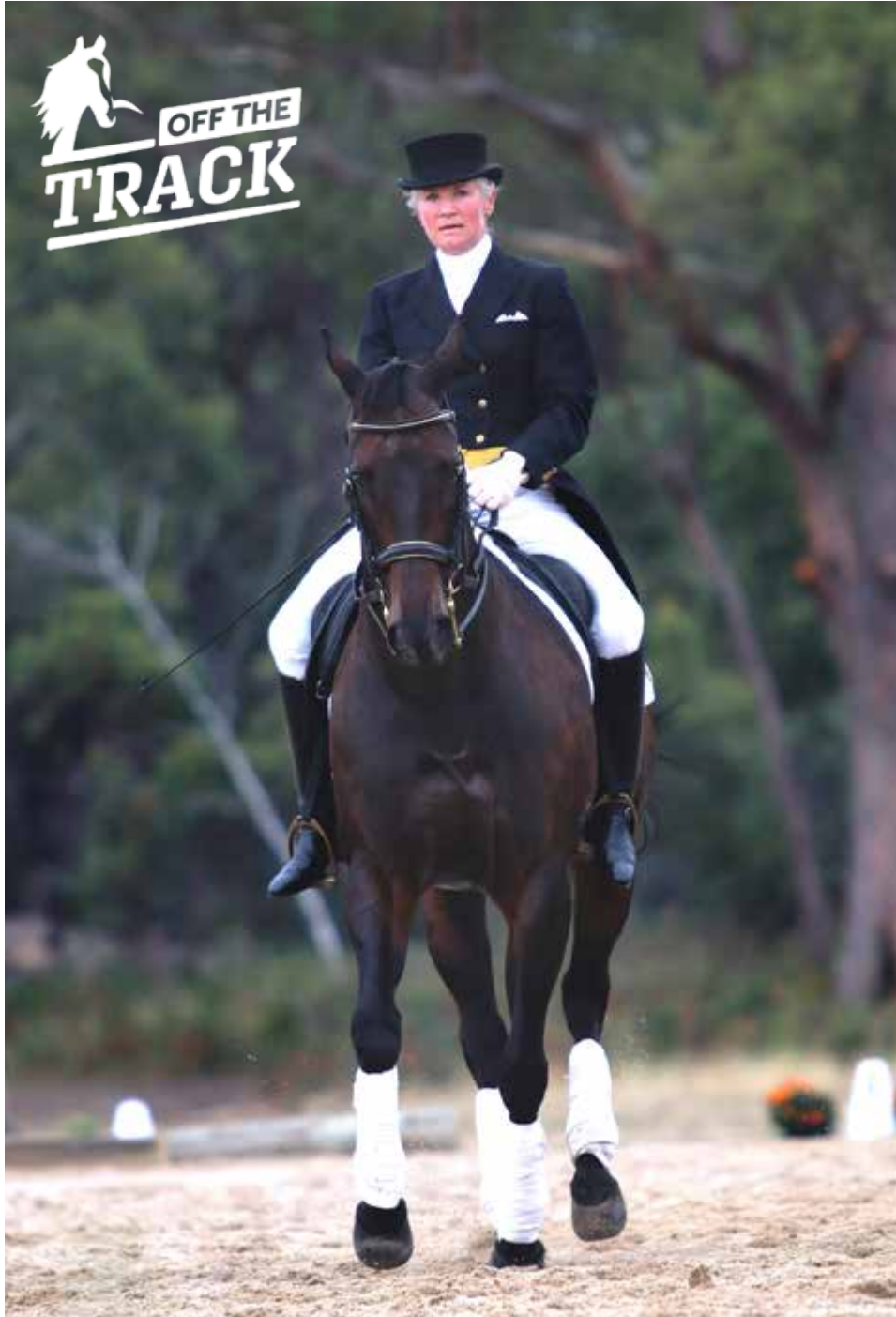

The third of March 2019 was the date for Tasmania's State Dressage championships and there was a treat in store for participants and spectators. What could have been a sad day for the dressage community was instead a celebration of a much loved and widely respected horse and his elegant and talented rider. 22 year old James performed his final dressage test with owner and rider of ten years, Jenny Hodder.

As a racehorse he was known as Federal Member but his name was not going to feature in the archives of racing as his racing career was short and quite uneventful.

Under his new name of L'Esperance, he embarked on a career in eventing where he competed in Tasmania and on the mainland. With his movie star looks and wonderful movement he returned to Tasmania awaiting a new home.

Jenny's riding career started at 12 years old when she began riding a cousin's long suffering pony. This instilled her love of horses and together with her sisters, she successfully nagged their parents for their own horses. Finally able to attend Huntingfield Pony Club, Jenny's sisters went on to do extremely well with their mounts. But for Jenny she was soon without a horse as she took on a career in nursing then went on to have a family.

When Jenny started back in the saddle again she was lucky enough to go on a real cattle muster and totally loved it, making it an annual event. From her experiences with this she was convinced that to be out of the comfort zone is highly beneficial. With new found confidence and commitment she took on a young stock horse with whom she spent a lot of time as well as experimenting and thinking laterally. They became solid partners and due to his wonderful manners he served time with the Riding for the Disabled Association at the age of 20.

With her adored stock horse aging she had become interested in dressage and wished to take her ambition further. Her coach, Lydia Jackson had James agisted at her premises after his return to Tasmania in 2010. Jenny had no intention of owning a Thoroughbred, especially one off the track, but she trusted Lydia and decided to look at him.

As his great temperament was immediately apparent she looked more closely. Her interest in equine mechanics allowed her to see that his great conformation afforded him wonderful movement. This horse had a short compact back, great hindquarters, substantial joints, clean legs and a wonderful length of rein. These attributes were wonderful for a thirteen year old off the track horse. Finally his beautiful soft eye ensured he would be with Jenny for the rest of his life.

Despite the fact that she initially wasn't keen on taking on a Thoroughbred let alone one that had raced, it proved to be the best decision she could make. With hard work and dedication they created the ultimate partnership achieving the international level of dressage of Prix St George.

At the 2018 State Dressage Championships the pair won the prestigious and coveted Susan Henry Perpetual Trophy which is awarded to the highest scoring partnership of which includes freestyle dressage. The fact that Jenny's husband developed the music with her for the freestyle, plus taking out Reserve Champion Prix St George on the same day, was her most glorious honour and her most memorable day.

Jenny's turnout as a rider and presentation of her mount is impeccable, resulting in a stunning overall picture mirroring the depth and quality of their partnership.

Known to his fans as Gentleman James, this gorgeous gelding is now enjoying life with regular exercise with Jenny to keep him tuned and is also a "school master" to a young rider.

Not only is James a thoroughly magnificent ambassador as a Thoroughbred, he is an amazing advocate for Off The Track. There are many reasons he will never be forgotten but he will certainly be remembered for being the only one of his breed competing for a number of years at Federation Equestre Internationale (FEI) level dressage in Tasmania.

ELWICK TRACK REDEVELOPMENT

PROGRESS UPDATE



Solid progress for the Elwick Thoroughbred Track Redevelopment project continued through the start of Autumn with construction activities now

fully underway in line with program expectations.

During this time, principle delivery partner for the track redevelopment StrathAyr has segmented the track into four independent construction stages. This aligns to their proven sequential project construction methodology that has been successfully utilised throughout Australia and the southern hemisphere.

Earthworks, civil works compaction and laser grading to final sub-grade levels have been substantially completed to engineered requirements including modifications for improved spectator line of sight entering the

home straight.

Key drainage and irrigation works are now well underway with mixing of the race track sub-grade growing matrix continuing. Sand and aggregate deliveries are continuing with up to 1,900 tonnes of sand being delivered each week, ready for the next layers of the new race track construction to occur.

The new race track irrigation system pump station and retaining walls are complete with the installation of the new track perimeter security fencing currently being undertaken to secure the site surface.

Activities commencing in July include installation of the new sub-grade layering in preparation for laying 64,000 square metres of the new turf.

PROGRAMME NOTES

Devonport continues to be the racing surface during the winter and early spring months, with synthetic racing continuing into August and September.

The much anticipated return to grass racing is scheduled for October 12th, with Launceston holding a Saturday Sky 1 night meeting to kick off the night racing schedule.

The later start for night racing this season from the last will hold the track in good stead coming into a demanding period from October to March. The ongoing reconstruction of the Hobart track continues with Sunday 2nd February 2020 expected to be the first meeting back on the new surface. This meeting will be headlined with the running of the 2020 Listed Tasmanian Derby.

Programming through August and September has been shaped to alter the structure of our benchmark racing and allow horses to develop through their grades under class conditions.

The focus for June and July was on creating as many options for horses as possible as we approached racing solely at Devonport.

The grid during the first two months brings Class 3 racing back into the program and extends this option through to November. This will allow an extra step for a horse in restricted class conditions before targeting benchmark racing and potentially a feature race during the summer carnival.

Benchmark racing has been raised in weights coming into August and September before a slight re-raise in the rating from October onwards for Benchmark 64 races.

Benchmark 58 and Benchmark 64 races will see the topweight raised to 60kgs to give some disparity between the horses lower in the ratings. This change, as well as the inclusion of Class 3 Races will potentially see a change in the way Benchmarks are run.

Statistics on previous seasons have shown that whilst Class 2 and Class 3 horses are the predominant winners from BM58s and BM64s (76% in BM58s, 52% in BM64s, 60% overall) the ability to stagnate in this grade can arise. This change will allow further options for horses in these grades.

Benchmark 64 races will be raised in October to Benchmark 66 (60kgs) to allow horses coming into the summer carnival multiple opportunities. This will also replicate through Benchmark 72 and 82 graded races, raising to 74 and 84 respectively. These races will remain as a 59kg topweight.

Ratings races have also been brought in when there is a similar race on the program, allowing a lower rated horse an option.

Race meetings through August to November have been programmed predominantly with eight races, with selected meetings at Launceston allocated nine.

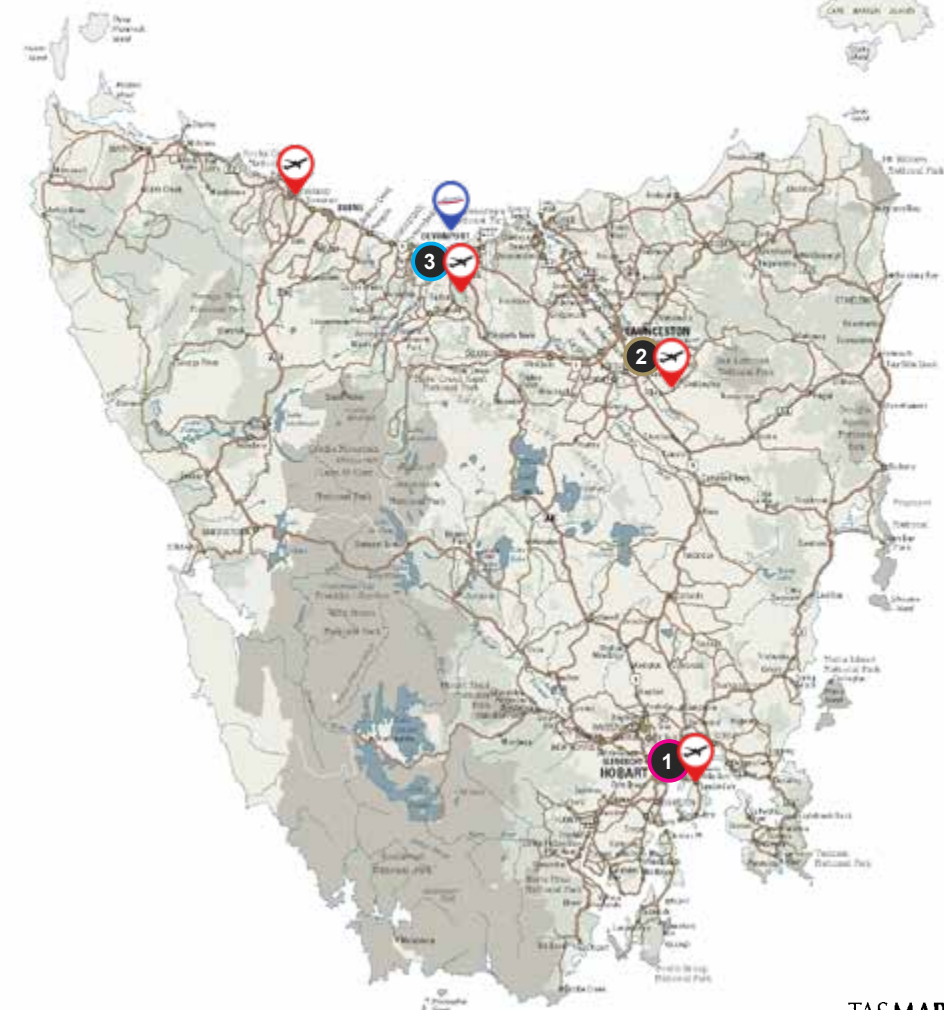

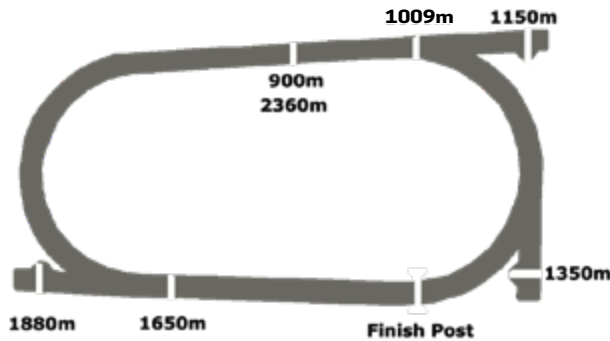

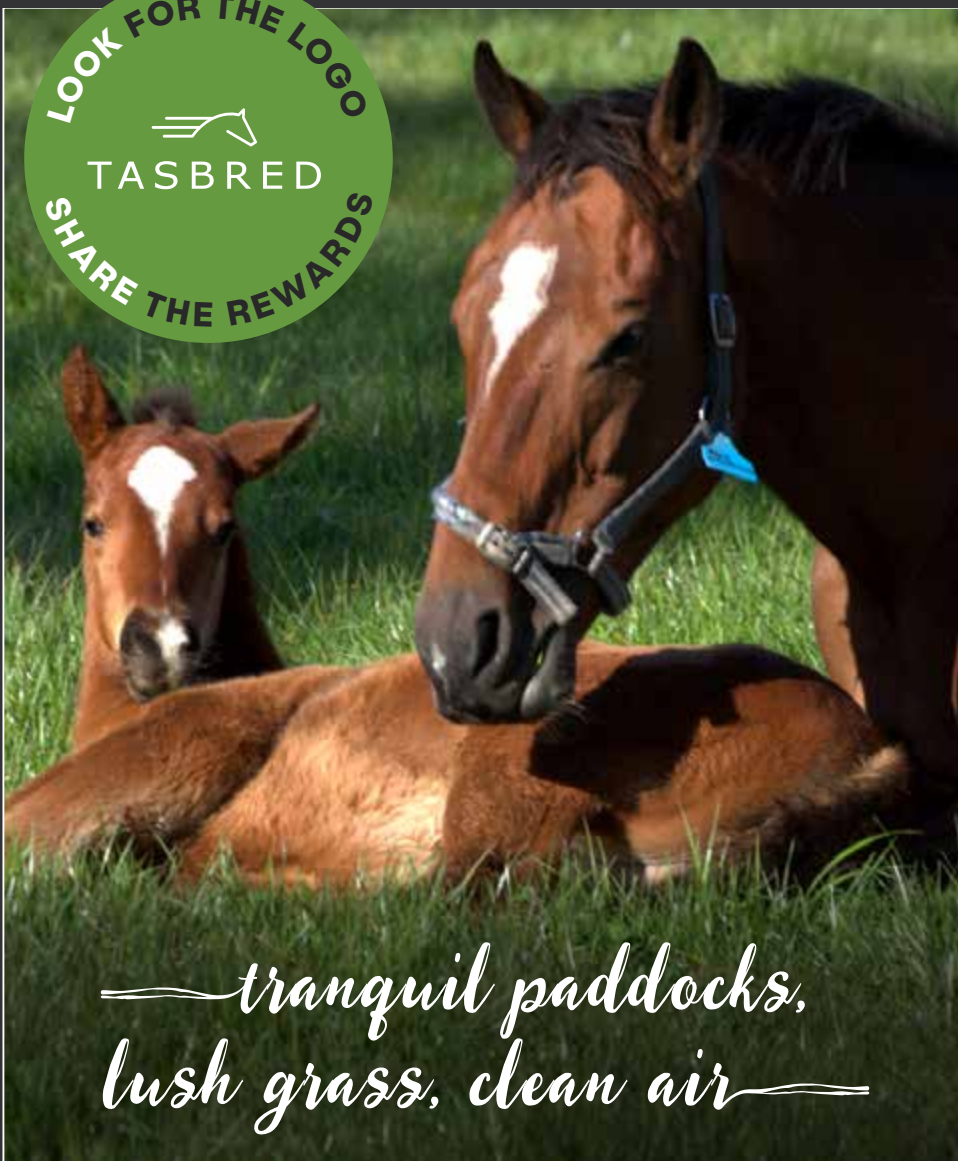
Fillies and Mares: When fillies and mares race against male horses they shall receive a 2.0 kg weight allowance.

Some Victorian race columns have been included to provide a guide to the weights a horse might expect to receive in these events.

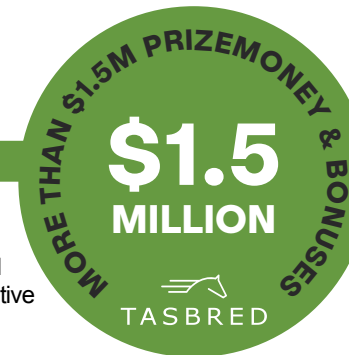

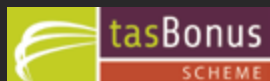

AMENDMENTS TO AUSTRALIAN RULES OF RACING OF RACING

AR.2 – DICTIONARY (DEFINITION OF “OFFICIAL RACING LABORATORY”)

Summary:

The Japan Racing Association’s Laboratory of Racing Chemistry has been added to the list of analytical racing laboratories approved by Racing Australia, for the purposes of reserve portion/B sample analysis only.

1. Amend AR 2 as follows:

AR 2 Dictionary

In the interpretation of these Australian Rules (and any race meeting held under them), unless the context requires otherwise, the words and phrases below have the meanings set out in this rule.

Official Racing Laboratory means an analytical racing laboratory which is approved by Racing Australia.

Note: The following have been approved by Racing Australia as Official Racing Laboratories: Australian Racing Forensic Laboratory, Sydney Queensland Racing Integrity Commission – Racing Science Centre, Brisbane Racing Analytical Services Limited, Melbourne Racing Chemistry Laboratory, Chemistry Centre (W.A.), Perth The Hong Kong Jockey Club Racing Laboratory, Sha Tin, Hong Kong New Zealand Racing Laboratory Services Limited, Avondale, Auckland, New Zealand Sport and Specialised Analytical Services, LGC, Fordham, Ely, Cambridgeshire, United Kingdom Australian Sports Drug Testing Laboratory, Sydney ChemCentre, Western Australia National Measurement Institute (NMI), Sydney (trace element analysis) Institute of Biochemistry, German Sport University, Cologne, Germany Laboratory of Racing Chemistry, Tochigi, Japan (reserve portion/B sample analysis)

Date of effect: 1 June 2019

Approved by Tasracing 29th May 2019, effective 1 June 2019

AR 121 CLOTHES, FOOTWEAR AND EQUIPMENT

Summary:

Under the Rules of Racing, Stewards have specific powers to confiscate riders’ safety gear and equipment such as helmets, safety vests and whips that do not meet the required standards or are not in a suitable condition.

In circumstances where the Rules provide that only clothes, footwear, apparel and equipment approved by Stewards are allowed to be worn or used by riders, Racing Australia has approved an expansion of the rule to give Stewards powers to confiscate such items that have not been approved.

The primary aims of such an amendment are to improve rider safety (by restricting use of potentially dangerous clothing and footwear) and to improve equine welfare (by restricting use of potentially harmful equipment).

1. Amend AR 121 as follows:

AR 121 Clothes, footwear and equipment

- (1) Riders must wear clothes which are clean and appropriate for riding.
- (2) Only clothes, footwear, apparel and equipment approved by Racing Australia, a PRA, or the Stewards may be worn or used by a rider in a race, official trial, jump-out or trackwork.
- (3) The Stewards may confiscate any clothes, footwear, apparel and equipment worn or used by a rider that has not been approved in accordance with subrule (2).

Date of effect: 1 June 2019

Approved by Tasracing 29th May 2019, effective 1 June 2019

AR184 METHOD OF WEIGHING-OUT AND WEIGHING-IN

Summary:

Racing Australia has approved an amendment to this rule to accord with the Stewards’ current practice of including the neck strap in the rider’s weight.

1. Amend AR 184 as follows:

AR 184 Method of weighing-out and weighing-in
When calculating a rider’s weight in weighing-out and weighing-in:

- (a) no account is to be taken of fractions of 0.5kg; and
- (b) the following items must be included by the rider in the weight:
 - (i) all items of clothing worn by the rider except for the rider’s helmet, goggles, other face protection and gloves;
 - (ii) the saddle, lead bag and associated packing (excluding the saddle cloth) and neck strap; and
 - (iii) any other gear attached or to be attached to the saddle.

Date of effect: 1 June 2019

Approved by Tasracing 29th May 2019, effective 1 June 2019

AR 219 MAKING PROTESTS

Summary:

Protests for interference per AR 130(1) may be made on behalf of horses finishing up to one place after the last place for which prizemoney is awarded.

This can result in the Stewards having to deal with largely inconsequential matters (e.g. 9th vs 10th), as well as creating significant delays in authorising betting payouts.

Accordingly, Racing Australia has approved that such protests be restricted to horses finishing up to 5th place, with discretion for the Stewards to consider protests in respect of any lower placed horses.

Discretion for the Stewards to hear protests for lower placings provides flexibility, and may be particularly relevant for bigger races where prizemoney is significant below 5th place.

1. Amend AR 219 as follows:

AR 219 Making protests

- (1) Except for protests to be made prior to a rider weighing-in (under subrule (3)), unless the Stewards order otherwise every protest:

(a) must be made to the Stewards in writing; and
(b) be signed by either the nominator or the nominator’s authorised agent, trainer or rider.

(2) A protest may be made by a Steward or the Starter in their official capacity. In the case of such a protest in relation to a matter referred to in subrule (3), it must be made before correct weight is declared.

(3) Any protest by the persons authorised under subrule (1)(b) against a horse/s on the ground of:

- (a) an interference in the running of a race as provided for in AR 130(1);
- (b) a horse/s not having run the proper course;
- (c) the race having been run over a wrong course;
- (d) the use of a whip as provided for in AR 132; or
- (e) any other matter occurring in a race, must be made to the Steward at scale before the riders of all placed horses are weighed-in or at any other time allowed by the Stewards prior to the signaling of correct weight.

(4) A protest made under subrule (3)(a) is only permitted to be made on behalf of a horse that has been placed first, second, third, fourth or fifth by the Judge, provided that the Stewards, in their discretion, may allow a protest made under subrule (3)(a) to be made on behalf of a horse that has been placed below fifth by the Judge.

Date of effect: 1 June 2019

Approved by Tasracing 29th May 2019, effective 1 June 2019

AR 227 BREACHES OF THE RULES

Summary:

Under the Rules of Racing it is an offence for a person to attempt to commit, aid, abet, counsel, procure, connive at, conspire with another person to commit, or be a party to another person who commits, a breach of the Rules.

Further, where a person is approached or requested to engage in corrupt, improper etc conduct, or conduct detrimental to the interests of racing, that person has an obligation under the Rules to report such approach or request to the Stewards (see AR 230).



AMENDMENTS TO AUSTRALIAN RULES OF RACING OF RACING

Racing Australia has approved the introduction of a specific offence where a person approaches or requests a person to commit a breach of the Rules. This will help improve integrity measures by creating an offence where a person takes steps with the intent of having an offence committed by another person, despite the other person potentially refusing or having no intention to carry it out.

1. Amend AR 227 as follows:

AR 227 Breaches of the Rules

Without limiting any other powers, a PRA or the Stewards may penalise any person who:

- (a) commits any breach of the Rules, or engages in conduct or negligence which has led or could have led to a breach of the Rules;
- (b) attempts to commit, aids, abets, counsels, procures, connives at, approaches or requests another person to commit, conspires with another person to commit, or is a party to another person who commits, a breach of the Rules.

Date of effect: 1 June 2019

Approved by Tasracing 29th May 2019, effective 1 June 2019

Prohibited List A & B thresholds – Estradiol

Summary:

Under the Rules of Racing the threshold for estradiol in male horses is expressed as the ratio of estradiol: estradiol at ≤ 1 . However, under Article 6A of the International Agreement on Breeding, Racing and Wagering (IABRW), the threshold is expressed as an absolute threshold of 45 micrograms per litre in urine, provided that at the screening stage the ratio of estradiol: estradiol is > 1 .

For consistency with the IABRW, Racing Australia has approved an amendment to the way in which the threshold is expressed in the Rules.

1. Amend Schedule 1, Part 1, Division 3 as follows:

Division 3 – Prohibited List A thresholds (anabolic androgenic steroids)

The prohibited substances set out below in this Division 3 when present at or below their respective threshold are exempt from Prohibited List A.

1. In male horses other than geldings, free and glucuroconjugated 5 α -estrane-3 β , 17 α -diol at a mass concentration of 45 micrograms per litre in urine when, at the screening stage, the free and glucuroconjugated 5 α -estrane-3 β , 17 α -diol exceeds the free and glucuroconjugated 5,10 estrane-3 β , 17 α -diol in the urine.
2. Amend Schedule 1, Part 2, Division 3 as follows:

Division 3 – Prohibited List B thresholds

The prohibited substances set out below in this Division 3 when present at or below their respective threshold are exempt from Prohibited List B.

4. In male horses other than geldings, free and glucuroconjugated 5 α -estrane-3 β , 17 α -diol at a mass concentration of 45 micrograms per litre in urine when, at the screening stage, the free and glucuroconjugated 5 α -estrane-3 β , 17 α -diol exceeds the free and glucuroconjugated 5,10 estrane-3 β , 17 α -diol in the urine.

Date of effect: 1 June 2019

Approved by Tasracing 29th May 2019, effective 1 June 2019

PROHIBITED LIST A & B THRESHOLDS – TESTOSTERONE

Summary:

Article 6A of the International Agreement on Breeding Racing and Wagering (IABRW) now contains a plasma testosterone threshold for fillies and mares (unless in foal): 100 picograms free testosterone per millilitre in plasma from fillies and mares.

Racing Australia has approved the inclusion of the international threshold in the Rules.

1. Amend Schedule 1, Part 1, Division 3 as follows:

Division 3 – Prohibited List A thresholds (anabolic androgenic steroids)

The prohibited substances set out below in this Division 3 when present at or below their respective threshold are exempt from Prohibited List A.

2. Testosterone:

- (a) in geldings: free testosterone and testosterone liberated from its conjugates at a mass concentration of 20 micrograms per litre in urine;
- (b) in fillies and mares: free testosterone and testosterone liberated from its conjugates at a mass concentration of 55 micrograms per litre in urine;
- (c) in geldings, fillies and mares: free testosterone at a mass concentration of 100 picograms per millilitre in plasma;
- (d) in fillies and mares that have been notified as pregnant under AR 84(2): free testosterone and testosterone liberated from its conjugates at any concentration in urine, or free testosterone at any concentration in plasma.

2. Amend Schedule 1, Part 2, Division 3 as follows:

Division 3 – Prohibited List B thresholds

The prohibited substances set out below in this Division 3 when present at or below their respective threshold are exempt from Prohibited List B.

7. Testosterone:

- (a) in geldings: free testosterone and testosterone liberated from its conjugates at a mass concentration of 20 micrograms per litre in urine;
- (b) in fillies and mares: free testosterone and testosterone liberated from its conjugates at a mass concentration of 55 micrograms per litre in urine;
- (c) in geldings, fillies and mares: free testosterone at a mass concentration of 100 picograms per millilitre in plasma;

- (d) in fillies and mares that have been notified as pregnant under AR 84(2): free testosterone and testosterone liberated from its conjugates at any concentration in urine, or free testosterone at any concentration in plasma.

Date of effect: 1 June 2019

Approved by Tasracing 29th May 2019, effective 1 June 2019

PROHIBITED LIST B THRESHOLDS – PREDNISOLONE

Summary:

There is now evidence that prednisolone is an endogenous substance in horses. In light of this, Article 6A of the International Agreement on Breeding, Racing and Wagering (IABRW) now includes a prednisolone threshold.

Racing Australia has approved the inclusion of this threshold in the Rules.

1. Amend Schedule 1, Part 2, Division 3 as follows:

Division 3 – Prohibited List B thresholds

The prohibited substances set out below in this Division 3 when present at or below their respective threshold are exempt from Prohibited List B.

12. Prednisolone (free prednisolone) at a mass concentration of 10 micrograms per litre in urine.

'Racing Australia completed and implemented the rewrite of the Rules of Racing, effective 1 March 2019. The Tasmanian Thoroughbred Local Rules of Racing were updated to reflect the RA rewrite.'



TASRACING - AMENDMENTS LOCAL RULES & POLICIES

TRACK CLOSURE TRAVEL SUBSIDY POLICY - ELWICK REDEVELOPMENT

1. OBJECTIVE

1.1 The objective of this policy is to clearly define the criteria for determining whether or not a travel subsidy is payable to Southern Tasmanian Trainers and Jockeys that travel to race meetings, trials, jumpouts or track gallops that have been transferred from Elwick racecourse during the major track redevelopment period.

Tasracing understands that temporary track closure may result in inconvenience and additional financial burden where participants are required to travel further in order to attend an alternative track for the purposes of training or racing. This policy seeks to minimise the financial burden on participants in these circumstances.

2. POLICY

2.1 Administration

A participant may be eligible to claim a travel subsidy where, as a result of the Elwick track closure, the track at which a participant ordinarily races, trials, jumpouts or track gallops their horse(s) (Ordinary Track), the participant has attended an alternative track for the purpose of racing, trialing, completing jumpouts or track galloping their horse(s) (Alternative Track).

For the purposes of administration of the policy:

- A designated track closure is the temporary closure of a track for a period in excess of three (3) months by, or as a result of a decision by, Tasracing.
- A participant ordinarily races/trials/jumpouts or track gallops their horse(s) at a track where that track is the closest main racecourse available to them.
- A Trainer/Jockey is based in Southern Tasmania during the period of the Elwick track redevelopment period.

In order to apply for a travel subsidy, a participant must complete the Track Closure Travel Subsidy Form and submit to Tasracing within thirty (30) days from the date of the meeting, trial, jumpout or track gallop.

Payment of any travel subsidy under this policy is at the discretion of Tasracing, and Tasracing is under no obligation to pay any amount under this policy.

Tasracing may require a participant to submit documents or other information in support of an application for travel subsidy.

Tasracing reserves the right to amend this policy at any time.

2.2 Eligibility

- **RACE/TRIAL** – This travel subsidy is eligible to be claimed for any of the following circumstances during the Elwick track redevelopment period:
 - Any race meeting transferred from Elwick (TRC) to an alternative track
 - Any official trial
 - Any track gallop of jumpout
- **LOCATION** - The participants regular place of work/home must be South of Campbell Town. If a participant relocates during the Elwick track redevelopment period, they must notify Tasracing in writing with proof of address prior to being able to lodge any claim.

- **TRAINER** – must have a horse(s) travel to participate during the nominated transferred meeting, trial, jumpout or track gallop. Any horse declared a non-runner or late scratching must have written confirmation from the Chief of Stewards that their horse was present at the track prior to its withdrawal.
- **JOCKEY** – must be a licensed jockey or apprentice jockey. Must ride in a minimum of one (1) race, trial, jumpout or track gallop during the nominated transferred meeting, trial, jumpout or track gallop. Any jockey injured or unable to ride once on course must have written confirmation by the Chief of Stewards that the jockey was withdrawn from engagements once travel had taken place.

2.2 Travel Subsidy Payable

2.2.1 Horse Transport/Trainers

In accordance with the conditions of 2.1, if a race, trial, jumpout or track gallop has been transferred due to the Elwick track redevelopment the participant will be eligible to claim a travel subsidy based on which location is closest to their primary place of training.

2.2.2 Trainers/Jockeys

In accordance with the conditions of 2.1, if a race, trial, jumpout or track gallop has been transferred due to the Elwick track redevelopment the participant will be eligible to claim a travel subsidy based on their home location.

2.2.3 Owner

In accordance with the conditions of 2.1, if a race, trial, jumpout or track gallop has been transferred due to the Elwick track redevelopment any Owner of a horses that is trained in Southern Tasmania and his/her normal place or residence is South of Campbell Town will receive the following subsidy:

- Any meeting transferred from Elwick (TRC) to either Mowbray (TTC) or Spreyton (DRC) will receive a \$15 food and beverage voucher which will be available for on course use only.
- The complimentary vouchers will be available for collection from the relevant track race day office on supply of an owners pass and once identification has been verified.
- No subsidy will be available to Owners for Trials or track gallops.

STEWARDS SEGMENT

Participants are reminded of their obligation under the following rules.

Division 5 – Traceability of horses

AR 50 Manager to disclose the location of an unnamed horse

The manager of an unnamed horse or his or her authorised agent, or any other person with the relevant knowledge, must disclose:

- (a) the location of the unnamed horse upon request by Racing Australia and/or the relevant PRA, including as required by any registration, ownership transfer, or other form; and
- (b) any change in the previously notified location of the unnamed horse, to the satisfaction of the relevant PRA, within 7 days of that change occurring.

AR 51 Manager to notify Racing Australia of the retirement of a horse

- (1) Within 1 month of a decision to retire a named horse, or not commence racing an eligible horse, the manager of the horse or his or her authorised agent must notify Racing Australia of that, by lodging the relevant form (including a Stable Return or relevant retirement form) prescribed by Racing Australia.
- (2) Once a form has been lodged in accordance with subrule (1), the horse will be ineligible to race or be trained unless it is reinstated to race or be trained.
- (3) If a horse ceases to be eligible to race or be trained under this rule, a person must not reinstate the horse to race or be trained without the express permission of a PRA or the Stewards.

AR 52 Deaths of named and unnamed horses to be reported

- (1) Upon the death of a named horse which has not been retired from racing under AR 51:
 - (a) the manager or his or her authorised agent must, within 24 hours of the horse being deceased, notify Racing Australia of that by lodging the relevant death notification form prescribed by Racing Australia; and
 - (b) the manager must not dispose of the horse without the written approval of the relevant PRA unless a veterinary certificate as to cause of death is provided to the relevant PRA.
- (2) Upon the death of an unnamed horse, the manager or his or her authorised agent must, within 48 hours of the horse being deceased, notify Racing Australia of that fact by lodging the relevant death notification form prescribed by Racing Australia.
- (3) Any person who fails to comply with subrules (1) or (2) is not guilty of a breach of the relevant subrule if he or she proves to the satisfaction of the Stewards that he or she was not aware, and could not reasonably have been aware, of the death of the horse

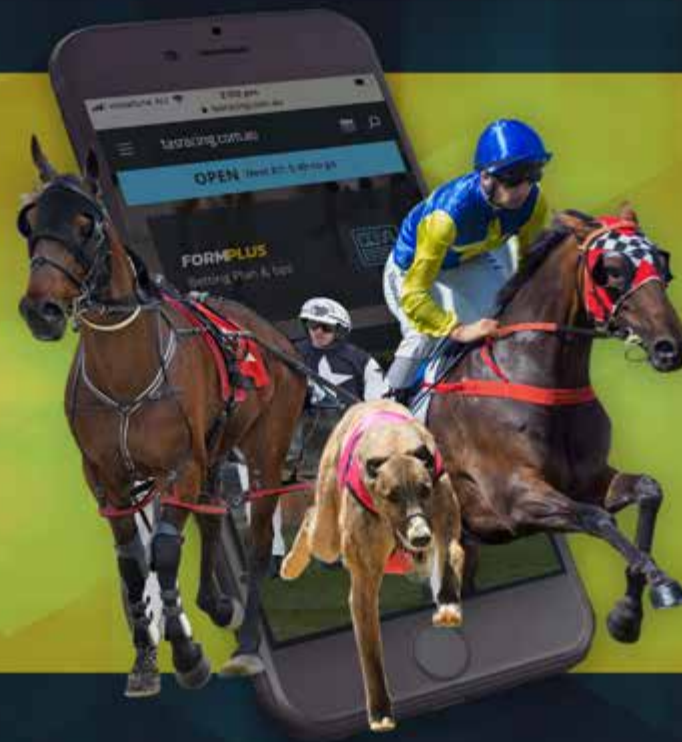
