

AUSTRALIA'S NEWEST TURF TRACK! ON TIME AND ON BUDGET!

THE \$12.5 million upgrade of the Elwick track at Ladbrokes Park has been hailed a huge success by riders and trainers after the first two meetings were held on the StrathAyr surface.

The redevelopment of the track was funded and managed by Tasracing, with renowned local turf supplier Strathayr.

The achievement of the project deadline and budget was due in no small part to Strathayr's significant expertise in turf production and track construction. The new turf was grown at Strathayr, the iconic property of the Cassimaty family just a short distance from Elwick in Richmond.

The new track solves all the problems that plagued Elwick for many years impacting participants, wagering customers and spectators. The new track construction includes state of the art drainage infrastructure which is expected to eliminate the previous issue of inconsistent racing surface plus meeting abandonments.

Impressively, construction commenced on the new track the very day after Hobart Cup Day 2019, and was ready for the 2020 Derby Day on Friday 31 January.

Ironically it was the weather that dictated proceedings yet again, with Derby Day moved to Saturday 1 February on account of circa 40 degree temperatures and concerns for horse and participant welfare.

The new world class thoroughbred race track heralds a new chapter in the 146 year history of racing at Elwick.

During the project about 19,000 tons of sand from the North-East of the state was laid on the site each week, along with other quality materials that make up the foundation and turf growing medium.

About 64,000 square metres of StrathAyr turf was laid as part of the project.

The decision to build a single track was taken after extensive consultation by Tasracing with industry representatives, clubs and other key stakeholders.


The project included a revamped mounting yard with the aging asphalt replaced by a state-of-the-art durable rubber-like compound with the returning stalls also replaced with the same enclosures as those used at leading metropolitan tracks around Australia.

Derby Day and Ladbrokes Hobart Cup Day proved the quality of the product, with the consensus from jockeys and trainers that the new surface delivers the goods.

Jockey David Pires gave it the thumbs up: "I'm very impressed with the track, it seems to be holding up very well," Pires said.

"It does feel different, because they have raised the back and taken out the hill in the home straight, so it seems to race a lot smoother.

Cup Day delivered outstanding racing all day, with a fairytale result for Michael Trinder and Toorak Affair. See full Ladbrokes Hobart Cup Day story on page 13. 8



THE STARTER

BEYOND LIFE AS A JOCKEY

Dean did what all horse-mad teenagers did in those days –

he rode trackwork before taking up an apprenticeship and when that first transition was completed, he began to dream of winning a Devonport Cup.

Crowden was ambitious and while making his way through the riding ranks, that included then apprentice Bev Buckingham, he won his share of races until he developed a growth spurt that was to end his riding career much sooner than hoped!

He was indentured to Joe DePasquale, but his first winner was Rhythmic Gleam from the Morrie Long stable at Mowbray.

At 15, Dean Crowden set his sights on becoming a jockey and it wasn't long before he was living his dream.

"You never forget your first winner and when you only rode 14 wins it isn't

hard to forget and I think my last winner was Future Khan," Crowden said.

He rode in an era that included greats such as Max Baker, Geoff Prouse, Bill Ryan, Brian Pullbrook and Billy Eder, who played a dominant role in Crowden's early riding career.

"Bill Eder was probably the biggest influence on my riding career because he was Joe's (DePasquale) senior rider at the time I was at the stable.

"When I moved to Mowbray, Bill Ryan was the stable's number one rider and he helped me a great deal."

Crowden was passionate about riding and when his growth spurt began, he was devastated.

"When I started to get tall it was terrible because I loved being a jockey.

"There isn't a feeling quite like sitting on a galloper travelling at 60kmh. It's a buzz and it's like a drug."

He had collected 14 winners from about 260 rides by the time his height and weight started to become a major issue.

He was forced to retire at the tender age of 18, but he was determined to remain in the industry.

Crowden, 56, turned his hands to race starting and he spent the next 18 years as a barrier attendant.

"I desperately wanted to stay involved with the industry and being a barrier attendant was a logical choice for me."

Crowden successfully applied for the position of starter at Devonport in 2001 and today he owns that role at Devonport and Launceston thoroughbred meetings.

"The starter has a very responsible role in racing because a lot goes on when horses are preparing to be loaded into the barriers and a good start keeps all the horses on a level playing field.

"You can't become complacent in this job and that's one of the things I love about it.

"I've got a great bunch of barrier attendants working with me at the meetings and without proficient attendants the show doesn't go on."

Crowden prides himself being efficient but even the best laid plans can sometimes go awry.

"Probably the worst thing that's happened on my watch as a starter is when father and son jockeys Jamie and Regan Bayliss were on mounts drawn next to each other and we ended up loading them into the wrong barrier. "They finished sixth and seventh, so it made no difference to the outcome, but I admit I didn't feel too good when I realised we had loaded them incorrectly."

Feature race days are highlights for all the barrier staff but Crowden likes to keep a lid on the enthusiasm.

"The major cup days are good because we usually have the best horses in the state racing and many interstate invaders, but I have a meeting with all the staff and tell them it is just another race day."

Crowden and his team of attendants have a good reputation and the starter attributes that to them all doing their homework.

"It's imperative that we do our homework on the horses because not all of them walk straight into the barriers.


"There are some that need special attention behind the barriers, so it's important that we know what they need to ensure they can be loaded with the least amount of fuss."

"I have a list that I update regularly that identifies whether a horse might require a manup (assistance) or is a late load or needs a tail raised and if I don't know the horse I'll talk to the trainer to try and find out if it has any idiosyncrasies.

"Once the acceptances are done, I'll make notes on every runner, so that come race day or night I am fully aware of what each horse's needs are going to the barriers and behind the barriers."

"Once I've made the notes, I send a copy to the second in charge and that's either Adam Emery or Glenn Armstrong and it's a process that works well."

Crowden has also been a track steward at the Spreyton racecourse for may years and just recently was promoted to the position of course ranger.







TOORAK AFFAIR

A YEAR ago, trainer Michael Trinder was battling cancer and his future as a trainer looked bleak.

But like everything else the 70-year-old has done in his life -he tackled the illness headon and along the way a mare named Toorak Affair arrived in his stable.

At Ladbrokes Park Elwick, Toorak Affair delivered a career-best effort to win the Group 3 Ladbrokes Hobart Cup over 2400m to give the Trinder family the final link in its chain of feature race wins in the state.

"The Hobart Cup was the only feature race the Trinder family hadn't won, so it is especially nice to have finally put that anomaly to bed," Trinder said.

"I have a lot of people to thank for helping this mare to get to the Hobart Cup result and that includes my son Adam who was there for me when I wasn't well and his advice along the way to winning this race also was invaluable.

"I have always believed in this mare as a stayer and when the horse lugged my weight in trackwork most days and thrived on the work, I was convinced she would be good over longer distances."

Trinder still rides most of his own trackwork, leaving only fast work to the younger riders.

"When you ride your horses in trackwork it gives you a much better guide to how they are going and that's certainly been the case with Toorak Affair."

Trinder's battle with bladder cancer didn't dampen his enthusiasm for training horses, in fact he thrived on it.

"This might sound strange, but I enjoyed the experience (cancer and subsequent treatment) because I got to meet some wonderful people that I might otherwise not have met."

"I got through it and I'm back doing what I love most and that's training horses."

Toorak Affair's rider Anthony Darmanin was elated after the win.

"I am thrilled for Michael and the owners who stuck with me through this campaign and it also gave me the chance to win the race that had eluded me," Darmanin said.

"I must admit I didn't think this mare would be any good beyond 1600m but Michael (Trinder) kept telling me she will stay, and he was so right."

Darmanin said he is hoping the mare can complete the major cups double in Launceston.

And that the Tasmanian mares that filled the minor placings in Hobart, Shady Hustle and Glass Warrior, would be his main dangers.

MANDELA EFFECT wins \$100,000 Listed Thomas Lyons

TALENTED four-year-old Mandela Effect proved he is on track to earn a berth in next month's \$5 million All-Star Mile at Caulfield with a brilliant win in the \$100,000 weight-forage Thomas Lyons over 1400m at Elwick.

Mandela Effect settled midfield and was always travelling comfortably and rider Craig Newitt aimed her between runners and turning for home he burst clear and went on to defeat stablemate Hellova Street by a length, with three-time Newmarket Handicap winner I'm Wesley a half-length astern.

Mandela Effect was heavily backed, firming from \$2.35 to start the \$1.80 favourite and with Craig Newitt onboard the gelding delivered the goods, much to the pleasure of his trainer Scott Brunton.

"I hope everyone gets behind this horse and votes for him to get into the All-Star Mile because if he makes it into the race he is going to be very competitive," Brunton said.

The All-Star Mile is the richest race over 1600m in the world and it is a popularity race with the 10 nominees with the most public votes added to the field of 15.

It is the only event in Australia that derives two thirds of its field from votes cast by the public.

Star Tasmanian mare Mystic Journey won the inaugural running of the All-Star Mile at Flemington last year but with her dispatched to the spelling paddock it opens the door for Mandela Effect to fill the void.

While Brunton was thrilled to have won the race with his All-Star Mile candidate, it was also a bitter-sweet result because his star sprinter Hellova Street had to settle for second.

"It is very difficult for me when these two horses clash because Hellova Street has been such a great horse to me personally and the stable, so I don't like seeing him beaten.

"But in the end Mandela Effect is a star in the making and hopefully he gets the chance to prove that by earning a berth in the All-Star Mile."





Still A Star secures victory in \$100,000 Listed Strutt Stakes at Elwick.

HALL OF FAME trainer Bill Ryan breathed a big sigh of relief when a photo-finish went his way to give his quality three-year-old filly Still a Star victory in the \$100,000 Listed Strutt Stakes over 2100m at Elwick on Ladbrokes Hobart Cup day.

Still a Star (\$1.65 fav) travelled second to the home turn behind race leader Sacred Valley (\$13) and when rider Brendon McCoull called on the daughter of Needs Further for the big effort she sped clear and looked set for another effortless win.

However, another talented Tasmanian filly Mystical Pursuit (\$3.20) had other ideas and kept grinding away, 50 metres out she dug deep and put in an almighty lunge right on the line but the Adam Trinder trained filly failed by the narrowest of margins. "That was a bit too close for comfort but I'm rapt the photo went our way," Ryan said.

Still a Star was supposed to run in the Tasmanian Derby last week but a blood test revealed she had a high white blood cell count that forced her to be scratched from the Derby.

"It was just a slight hiccup but you never know how much these little setbacks take out of a horse. She was flat out and feeling the pinch a bit today at the end of the race but we've got the result we wanted."

Still a Star has gone to a new level this season and her Strutt Stakes win has her as favourite to take out the three-year-old of the year title, having won the Tasmanian Guineas (1600m), Launceston Guineas and Strutt Stakes (2100m) with all being \$100,000 Listed events.





Zargos powers to impressive win in the \$150,000 Group 3 Bow Mistress

WELL-BRED mare Zargos enhanced her value as a broodmare when she powered her way to an impressive win in the \$150,000 Group 3 Bow Mistress over 1200m at Elwick on Hobart Cup day.

With talented 3kg claiming Victorian apprentice Blaike McDougall aboard, the David and Ben Hayes and Tom Dabernig trained four-year-old burst through a narrow gap in the home straight to go on and score a convincing win from the luckless Deroche and Twitchy Frank.

None of the trainers were at the meeting but stable representative Gary Fennessy said the Bow Mistress had been on the drawing board for some time as one of the mare's main targets this season.

"We always believed this mare would be suited to this race and we wanted to keep her fresh because that's when she races best," Fennessy said.

"We were very pleased with her last start at Flemington and that convinced us to bring her to Tasmania for this race and it was a very good ride from Blaike (McDougall).

"We will more than likely take her to Launceston in a fortnight for the other Group 3 mare's race (Vamos Stakes) over 1400m."

When Newitt wanted to make his run he looked to his right and eased out but Twitchy Frank (John Allen) kept him in the pocket for 100 metres and while that battle ensued, McDougall drove Zargos through the gap on their inside and that move won the race.



As members of Monmouth Pony Club, they have already qualified to compete over 95cm jumps at the Pony Club State Trials in March. The talent of this mare is allowing their fairly rapid progression.

Within pony club circles Hayley has been applauded for her dedication, hard work and her ability to face challenges. She has taken Fancy "slow and low", letting this lovely mare get her confidence and allowing her to evolve into a very brave horse.

Fancy is calm, stress free and has no anxiety issues, and has already won her first event.

Cheryl and Hayley believe in keeping their horses fresh by mixing their work with trail rides and bush work which really suits Fancy. They live at Nugent, surrounded by bush and miles of tracks on which to ride.

Developing her understanding of horses, especially OTT's is what Hayley is really interested in. She considers the reactions and results obtained from different training methods to be of great importance.



PROGRAMME NOTES

With the completion of the Hobart track redevelopment, the structure of the winter racing calendar reverts to that of previous years. Grass racing will return to the south of the state and will continue throughout winter, with seven meetings programmed on the new 28m Hobart track from April to July, showcasing a new era of racing in the South.

Feature Races throughout the period which were altered or brought forward to March in 2019 to compensate for the Hobart redevelopment, have been returned to their Autumn time slot.

The Tasbred Scheme will conduct the Tasbred Raceday at Hobart on Sunday 3 May with the running of the \$50k Tasbred 2YO and inaugural 3YO Tasbred races over 1200m. The race series, eligible to Tasbred nominated horses only, will be run under Set Weights and Penalty conditions with the prizemoney scaled on acceptances.

The 2YO Tasmanian Sires Produce and 3YO Autumn Classic will run on Sunday 24 May at Launceston. Both 1400m events will carry prizemoney of \$50k.

TASMANIAN RACING CLUB

Ratings races have been implemented across certain meetings with lower Benchmark races added throughout the period to focus on the horse population during these months.

Age based maidens have been allocated through this grid giving horses an opportunity to win a Tasbred bonus, with two-yearolds also given the opportunity to contest programmed maidens with the threshold lowered in April to 2YO&Up.

Hobart will continue to race through the winter but will be monitored on a meeting by meeting basis. The new Strath-Ayr track will take time to condition itself to the rigour of raceday and trials but will be monitored closely by Racecourse Manager Sam Webster.

Trials at Hobart, which were previously always on a Tuesday, will alter to the day after a raceday. The change enables the track staff to maintain the track consistently and gives more time to prepare the track between meetings.







AMENDMENTS TO AUSTRALIAN RULES OF RACING

ARR AMENDMENTS 1.1.20

AR 2 DICTIONARY (Definition of "qualified veterinary surgeon") AR 86 Shockwave therapy AR 87 Intra-articular injections AR 143 Apprentices' winning rides book AR 231 Endoscopy of the respiratory tract AR 257A Blood doping AR 270A Breach of suspension restrictions Approved by Tasracing 19 December 2019, Effective 1 January 2020

AR 2 DICTIONARY (DEFINITION OF "QUALIFIED VETERINARY SURGEON") Summary:

The term "qualified veterinary surgeon" is currently used in AR 34(3) (regarding horse registration) and AR 225 (regarding euthanasia).

From 1 January 2020 the term will also be used in new/amended rules which provide that:

- only a qualified veterinary surgeon can perform shockwave therapy on a horse – AR86(4);
- only a qualified veterinary surgeon can perform endoscopy of the respiratory tract on a horse – AR 231(6); and
- a defence to blood doping offences exists where certain therapy is provided by aqualified veterinary surgeon – AR 257A.

The term is being defined in the Rules to provide clarity as to what constitutes a qualified veterinary surgeon.

In addition to having the relevant qualifications, the definition includes an additional requirement that the veterinarian be approved by the relevant PRA if required, given such a requirement applies under the Racing NSW Local Rules.

Amend AR 2 as follows: AR 2 Dictionary

In the interpretation of these Australian Rules (and any race meeting held under them), unless the context requires otherwise, the words and phrases below have the meanings set out in this rule.

"qualified veterinary surgeon means a veterinarian who is:

- (a) registered with the Veterinary Practitioners Board (or equivalent regulatory body) in a State or Territory of Australia; and
- (b) approved by the relevant PRA (including by way of permit, approval or licence) if required by a Local Rule of that PRA."

Date of effect: 1 January 2020

AR 86 SHOCKWAVE THERAPY

Summary:

. . .

The Racing Australia Veterinary and Analysts Committee (VAC) advises:

- there is increasing evidence of the use of shockwave therapy by lay people and that this treatment is not being reported as required under the Rules of Racing; and
- there are increased risks of tissue injury in horses that are subject to shockwave therapy performed by untrained lay people.

Accordingly, VAC has recommended that the Rules are amended to restrict the performance of shockwave therapy to qualified veterinarians only. This position is supported by the Racing Australia Chairmen of Stewards Committee.

Further, VAC has noted that Equine Veterinarians Australia does not support shockwave therapy performed by lay people.

Racing Australia has approved the addition of new subrule (4).

Amend AR 86 as follows:

"AR 86 Horses that have had shockwave therapy

(4) A person must not perform shockwave therapy on a horse unless he or she is a qualified veterinary surgeon."

Date of effect: 1 January 2020

AR 87 INTRA-ARTICULAR INJECTIONS Summary:

The Racing Australia Veterinary and Analysts Committee (VAC) notes there is significant anecdotal evidence of the increasing use of antiinflammatory and pain relieving medications – as an alternative to corticosteroids – being given by intra-articular (IA) injection, such as the opioid morphine or the non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drug (NSAID) ketorolac (Toradol), and IA desensitising substances such as ammonium sulphate (Nuromene) and polyacrylamide hydrogel which may have a neurotoxic mechanism of action.

VAC has expressed concern that the use of IA opioids and NSAIDs close to racing would promote significant analgesia (pain numbing effect) and compromise the welfare of the horse, and the safety of the rider, in at least the same way as a corticosteroid IA injection close to racing would. Substances such as P-block which have come to attention at recent inquiries are unregistered injections and as such should not be held by trainers under AR 252.

Accordingly, VAC has recommended that AR 87 be expanded to prohibit the IA administration of any substance at any time during the 8 clear days prior to a race, official trial or jump-out. The Racing Australia Chairmen of Stewards Committee supports VAC's recommendation. Racing Australia has approved the amendments to AR 87 as set out below.

Amend AR 87 as follows:

"AR 87 Horses that have had an intra-articular injection

- (1) If a horse has been subjected to an intraarticular injection:
 - (a) the horse is ineligible for; and
 - (b) a trainer must not enter or start the horse in,

any race, official trial, or jump-out for 8 clear days following midnight on the day of the administration.

- (2) If a horse has been subjected to, or the Stewards reasonably suspect a horse has beensubjected to, an intra-articular injection at any time during the 8 clear days prior to theday of a race, official trial, or jump-out, the Stewards may order the scratching of thehorse from the relevant event.
- (3) If a horse has been nominated and/or entered for a race, official trial, or jumpout, aperson must not:
 - (a) administer;
 - (b) cause to be administered;
 - (c) attempt to administer; or
 - (d) be party to the administration of,

an intra-articular injection to the horse at any time within 8 clear days of the race, official trial, or jump-out.

Date of effect: 1 January 2020



AMENDMENTS TO AUSTRALIAN RULES OF RACING

AR 143 APPRENTICES' WINNING RIDES BOOK

Summary:

Racing Australia is amending AR 143 to accord with the current practice of apprentice jockeys being required to provide their winning rides book to a Steward before weighing-out in a race.

Amend AR 143 as follows:

AR 143 Weight allowances for apprentice jockeys

"(12)(a) A winning rides book must be issued to every apprentice jockey by a PRA.

- (b) It is the responsibility of the apprentice jockey and the apprentice jockey's masterto ensure that the apprentice jockey brings the winning rides book to each racemeeting the apprentice jockey participates at and that winning rides are entered inthat winning rides book and endorsed by a Steward before the apprentice jockeyleaves the racecourse.
- (c) An apprentice jockey must provide his or her winning rides book to a Stewardbefore weighing-out in any race."

Date of effect: 1 January 2020

AR 231 ENDOSCOPY OF THE RESPIRATORY TRACT

Summary:

The Racing Australia Veterinary and Analysts Committee (VAC) advises there is increasing evidence of training establishments performing endoscopy of the respiratory tract without any veterinary involvement. Endoscopy is an invasive procedure with risks to horses and human handlers.

The act of introducing an endoscope into the respiratory tract is not itself considered an act of

veterinary science within the relevant legislation where it is performed by a lay person on a horse in their care and without a fee for service being charged. However lay persons performing this procedure are by virtue of the action then accordingly making a diagnosis – which is considered an act of veterinary science – and, further, instigating some form of drug therapy as a result of that lay diagnosis (often without any veterinary consultation).

Accordingly, VAC is of the view that endoscopy of the respiratory tract on a horse should only be performed by a qualified veterinarian. The Racing Australia Chairmen of Stewards Committee supports this position.

Racing Australia has approved the addition of new subrule (6).

Amend AR 231 as follows: AR 231 Care and welfare of horses

"(6) A person must not perform endoscopy of the respiratory tract on a horse unless he or she is a qualified veterinary surgeon." Date of effect: 1 January 2020

AR 257A BLOOD DOPING

Summary:

The Racing Australia Veterinary and Analysts Committee (VAC) has recommended that a new rule is introduced to mitigate the manipulation of normal blood parameters by infusing stored blood or blood products (commonly referred to as 'blood doping' in human sports).

This is because blood doping may be used to illegally increase the oxygen-carrying capacity of the blood. Accordingly, it represents a threat to both equine welfare and racing integrity.

The Racing Australia Chairmen of Stewards Committee is of the view that a prohibition on blood doping should be introduced into the Rules of Racing in accordance with VAC's recommendation. Racing Australia has approved the addition of a new rule as set out below. Note the rule contains a defence in subrule (3) to any charge where blood doping was conducted for life-saving purposes and/or as part of certain veterinary regenerative treatment.

Insert new AR 257A as follows:

"AR 257A Prohibition on blood doping

- (1) A person must not:
 - (a) withdraw and re-infuse; or(b) withdraw, manipulate and re-infuse.

homologous, heterologous, or autologous blood, blood products or blood cells into the circulatory system of a horse.

- (2) A person must not administer any quantity of homologous, heterologous, orautologous blood, blood products or blood cells of any origin into the circulatory system of a horse.
- (3) Notwithstanding subrules (1) and (2), a PRA or the Stewards may find that it is a complete defence to a charge laid under subrule (1) or (2) if in their opinion:
 - (a) the relevant conduct was for lifesaving purposes; and/or
 - (b) the relevant conduct was part of a veterinary regenerative therapy for the treatment of musculoskeletal injury or disease administered by or under the supervision of a qualified veterinary surgeon."

Date of effect: 1 January 2020

AR 270A BREACH OF SUSPENSION RESTRICTIONS

Summary:

When licensed or registered persons are suspended, they are subject to certain express restrictions under the Rules of Racing and may also be subject to other conditions imposed by the relevant PRA or Stewards.

In contrast to the rules regarding disqualifications (AR 263(4)) – which expressly provide that a breach of any restriction while disqualified results in an automatic recommencement of the disqualification and possible further penalty (subject to PRA discretion) – the rules regarding suspensions do not specify the consequence of a breach of any restriction while suspended.

The Racing Australia Chairmen of Stewards Committee is of the view that a new rule should be introduced for breaching suspension restrictions while suspended, which is consistent with the rule in respect of disqualified persons. This will add a further deterrent for suspended persons who may be inclined to contravene the conditions of their suspension.

Racing Australia has approved the addition of a new rule as set out below.

Insert new AR 270A as follows:

"AR 270A Penalty for breach of terms of suspension

- (1) Except with the consent of the PRA or the Stewards in whose territory a suspension was imposed, a suspended person must not during the period of the suspension contravene any of the Rules in respect of, or the terms or conditions of, the suspension.
- (2) Unless otherwise determined by the PRA or the Stewards in whose territory a suspension was imposed or adopted, if a person breaches subrule (1), the period of suspension imposed on that person must automatically restart from the most recent date of the breach, and the person may also be subject to further penalty.
- (3) The provisions of subrules (1) and (2) apply to any suspended person, regardless of when the suspension was imposed."

Date of effect: 1 January 2020

tasracing AMENDMENTS LOCAL RULES & POLICIES

TRIALS, JUMP-OUTS & GALLOPS POLICY - TPOL0035

1. OBJECTIVE

The objective of this Policy is to clearly define the eligibility requirements, standards and fees set by Tasracing Pty Ltd ('Tasracing') for horses at Official Trials, Jump-outs & Track Gallops of a varied nature.

2. **DEFINITIONS**

2.1 Official Trial

"Official Trial" means a trial that is;

- a) approved and advertised by Tasracing;
- b) conducted in accordance with the conditions set by Tasracing;
- c) supervised by the Stewards from the Office of Racing Integrity ('ORI');
- d) attended by a veterinarian; and
- e) where official nominations are required, and results are officially recorded.

2.2 Jump-out

"Jump-out" means an unofficial "short" trial that is;

- a) organised, supervised and controlled by Tasracing;
- b) attended by a veterinarian;
- c) started from barrier stalls for education purposes; and
- d) conducted in accordance with any and all conditions set by Tasracing.

2.3 Track Gallop

"Track Gallop" means the training gallop for a racehorse that;

- a) excludes Official Trials and Jumpouts;
- b) is undertaken in the care of the horse's trainer; and
- c) is on a racecourse or recognised training track controlled by Tasracing.

3. POLICY

3.1 OFFICIAL TRIALS

3.1.1 Trial Dates

Official Trials will be held weekly or fortnightly across the state as determined by Tasracing. Tasracing shall advertise the Official Trial dates in the "Thoroughbred Racing Calendar" and on its website in advance.

3.1.2 Nominations

Nominations for Official Trials must be made through Racing Australia ('RA') and will close at 9:00am on the day prior unless otherwise advertised. All nominated horses must be registered with a current stable return lodged before close of entries or they will be rejected.

3.1.3 Barrier Draw

Trainers may make an application to Tasracing to request a specific barrier which may be granted at Tasracing's discretion. All other barriers shall be drawn by lot. Horses which require barrier certificates are not permitted to draw the outside unless otherwise authorised by the Office of Racing Integrity.

3.1.4 Distances

- a) Hobart 800m and 1400m
- b) Longford 700m and 1400m
- c) Devonport 800m and 1350m

3.1.5 Postponement / Transfer

Tasracing reserves the right to transfer or postpone any set of trials at short notice.

3.1.6 Riders

- a) A rider must be a licensed jockey, apprentice or trials rider.
- b) A Trainer must nominate a rider.
- All riders must wear appropriate clothing and safety equipment as defined in the Australian Rules of Racing; Division 3 – Safety equipment of riders.
- d) All riders must be able to produce current licensing identification when on a Tasracing controlled venue.

3.1.7 Ambulance and Veterinary Services

Tasracing will provide Ambulance and Veterinary services only during Official Trials & jump-outs.

3.2 JUMP-OUTS

3.2.1 Availability

Jump-outs will be available on advertised official trial days at official venues across the state, provided the track is deemed suitable. Jump-outs will be conducted after the official trials have concluded.

3.2.2 Nominations

Nominations for Jump-outs must be made through Racing Australia and will close at 9:00am on the day prior unless otherwise advertised. Unnamed horses must be nominated by email to nominations@ tasracing.com.au. The same closing time for nominations applies to both named and unnamed horses.

3.2.3 Distances

- (a) Hobart 400m or 600m
- (b) Longford 700m
- (c) Devonport-400m

3.2.4 Riders

- (a) A rider must be a registered jockey, apprentice, trials or trackwork rider.
- (b) All riders must wear appropriate clothing and safety equipment as defined in the Australian Rules of Racing; Division 3 – Safety equipment of riders.
- (c) All riders must be able to produce current licensing identification when on a Tasracing controlled venue.

3.2.5 Ambulance and Veterinary Services

Tasracing will provide Ambulance and Veterinary services during jump-outs held at the conclusion of official trials.

3.3 TRACK GALLOPS

3.3.1 Track Gallops Availability

Track Gallops at Longford and Elwick racecourses will be available to trainers throughout the year as determined by Tasracing. Available days and times will be advertised in the Thoroughbred Racing Calendar, however may vary at the discretion of Tasracing. Track Gallops are not available on the day of race meetings.

3.3.2 Out of Session Track Gallops Availability

Horse trainers can request an Out of Session Track Gallop at Mowbray and Elwick racecourses.

These are available to horses meeting any of the following criteria:

- (a) Carry a rating of 90 or higher
- (b) Be nominated for any race both in Tasmania and interstate which carries prizemoney of seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) or more.
- (c) Have won a race that;
 - Carries seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) or more as the total prizemoney within the last 24 months of the request;
 - (ii) Is of Group or Listed status within the last 24 months of the request.

All requests for Out of Session Track Gallops are subject to the approval of Tasracing in its sole discretion and whilst time and date requests will be considered, applications will only be approved subject to track condition and maintenance schedules.

The Trainer will be allowed to gallop one additional horse with the nominated eligible horse. If additional horses are presented, they will be refused entry to the racetrack.

3.3.3 Exhibition Gallops Availability

Exhibition Gallops are available by invitation from Tasracing only. Exhibition Gallops will be arranged by Tasracing in consultation with the relevant Racecourse Manager. No fee is payable for Exhibition Gallops..

3.4 **RESPONSIBILITY**

Trainers shall be fully responsible for their horses while on all Tasracing controlled venues. At Trials, Jump-outs and Track Gallops Tasracing staff will be entirely responsible for the loading of all horses and operations of the barrier. Trainers will be responsible for ensuring Tasracing Operations & Barrier staff are aware of any relevant information relating to horses.

3.5 **FEES**

Fees payable for Official Trials, Jump-outs and Track Gallops are set by Tasracing and will be advertised in the Thoroughbred Racing Calendar and on the Tasracing website.

3.6 CONDITION CHANGES

Tasracing reserves the right to vary any of the above conditions in its absolute discretion.

INFORMATION TO THOROUGHBRED TRAINERS – CCA TIMBER AS A SOURCE OF ARSENIC

WARNING TO TRAINERS – CCA-TREATED TIMBER AND HORSES

Trainers are advised to be extremely cautious allowing horses access to/administering products that contain arsenic close to racing as this may inadvertently lead to a rise in urinary arsenic levels. Access includes the ability to lick, chew and ingest arsenic treated timber that may be in the horse's environment including the stable/paddock/yard construct. Horse's that are known to regularly 'wood chew' are advised to be kept in stables/fields with fences made from substances other than arsenic-treated timber.

An inorganic form of arsenic is used as an insecticide in the timber treatment chromated copper arsenate (CCA). CCA has been used to treat wood for many decades. Inorganic arsenic is more toxic than organic arsenic and can affect the skin, and respiratory, immune, urinary, reproductive, gastrointestinal and nervous systems of mammals.

The presence of arsenic above a mass concentration of 0.30 milligrams per litre (mg/L) in a raceday equine urine sample is a prohibited substance.

Other products that contain arsenic include, but are not limited to, Ferrocyl, Jurocyl, and Invigorate injections. Arsenic can also be present in some seaweed based nutritional supplements. It is the responsibility of each trainer to carefully consider access to any sources of prohibited substances and the use of any supplements/additives to ensure that the horse is presented for racing free of any prohibited substance.

Trainers are put on notice that environmental contamination (through CCA timber or other

means) will not necessarily be considered a significant penalty mitigating factor for presentation of a horse with urinary concentrations above the arsenic threshold in the future. Trainers are advised to take measures to ensure that racing horses do not have access to environmental sources of arsenic including treated timber products.

TRACKWORK

Participants are reminded that when using any training facilities eg: Brighton, Longford or Spreyton, they must abide by the relevant track rules and any direction given by the track supervisor. Any person failing to do so may be liable for a penalty.

LATE NOTIFICATION OF RIDERS

Stewards are aware that at times it can be difficult to engage a rider prior to the advertised closing time of rider declaration

If any trainer is experiencing difficulty in engaging a rider, please contact and notify the Office Of Racing Integrity Stewards, failure to do so may result in a penalty.

MOUNTING YARD

Trainers are reminded of their obligation to present horses to the mounting yard in accordance with AR 194 which states:

AR194 Horse to be in mounting yard 15 minutes before start time.

Unless otherwise permitted by the Stewards, every horse must be presented in the mounting yard no later than 15 minutes prior to the advertised start time for a race.


Failure to comply may result in a penalty.

JOCKEY WEIGHTS JOCKEYS

- 1. Jockeys are permitted to ride 1kg overweight only on the minimum weight of 54kg with the permission of the Stewards. Permission will only be granted with the approval of the connections of the horse which the rider must first obtain prior to seeking approval from the Stewards.
- 2. Jockeys are permitted to ride 0.5kg overweight at the allotted weight to a ceiling of 57kg with the permission of the Stewards. Permission will only be granted with the approval of the connections of the horse which the rider must first obtain prior to seeking approval from the Stewards.
- 3. In races where the allotted weight of the horse is lower than the standard minimum weight, the Stewards may, at their discretion and on the request from the Owner(s) and/or Trainer permit Jockeys to ride up to 1kg overweight. Such application must be made at the time of final rider declarations to allow sufficient time for the riding weight of the Jockey to be printed in the race book and relayed to media publications.


