Glass Warrior

TRAINER John Blacker has long been of the belief that Longford Cup winners should have a great chance of winning one or both major cups and his gallant grey mare Glass Warrior proved him right in 2021.

This years Covid restrictions aside, Longford was especially memorable for Blacker and apprentice Kyle Maskiell who teamed up to take their home-town cup.

Glass Warrior emerged triumphant in the Longford Cup (1800m), ran a luckless seventh in the Hobart Cup before making amends by winning the Ladbrokes Launceston Cup over 2400m in a thrilling three-way photo finish.

Blacker is no stranger to winning the Longford Cup, having won the 2020 edition with Triple Strip that went on to finish a luckless second to Newhart in the 2020 Devonport Cup.

While Triple Strip was more of a miler, capable of stretching out to 2000-metre events, Glass Warrior is pure stayer and one that Blacker believes could turn out to be one of the best stayers he has trained.

A small setback with Glass Warrior's preparation at one stage threatened to curtail plans to tackle the state's two major cups in 2021, but any fears that the mare might not make it to those Group 3 events were quashed when Maskiell guided her to an emphatic Longford Cup win.

Having placed third in the 2020 Ladbrokes Hobart Cup and then fourth in the Ladbrokes Launceston Cup, Blacker was confident the daughter of Glass Harmonium from the Golden Snake mare Hissy Miss would improve enormously this season given the form she showed in last year's major cups.

Bred by Mandy Gunn of Motree Thoroughbreds, Glass Warrior has matured physically and mentally, which is why Blacker was confident she had what it took to deliver in this season's major events.

"Other than for a slight hiccup in her preparation, the mare began to do all the right things to suggest she could improve on what she did in both major cups last season," Blacker said.

The Hobart Cup looked set to play out perfectly for the mare with Siggy Carr aboard, but a split-second decision by Carr at a crucial stage of that race didn't pay off.

Prior to the Ladbrokes Launceston Cup, Carr said she was thrilled that the owners and trainer had stayed loyal and retained her to partner the mare in the last feature staying event of the carnival. It was an evenly run race and relatively mundane until the field of 12 hit the home straight, then it was the last 200 metres of the Group 3 event that had everyone holding their breath.

The Bill Ryan-trained outsider Sh'bourne Renegade (\$81) burst through to hit the front, only to have the \$51 chance White Hawk from the Angela Brakey stable fight back to again share the lead 50 metres out.

But it was Glass Warrior who powered down the outside to grab them both right on the line. It was Blacker's first success in the race and one that he said he will cherish forever.

"I wanted to watch the replay because I didn't believe she'd won," Blacker said.

"I had to step back for a minute and take some deep breaths after the race because I got a bit emotional.

"I told the owners when this mare was a young horse that she was a genuine stayer and that we could win a major cup down the track, and she almost did that last season.

"But this time around I was even more confident and I'm so happy for everyone involved with this mare."

Siggy Carr was grateful to Blacker for his confidence: "I expected to lose the ride after the Hobart Cup, but the owners and John (Blacker) stuck by me and I'm rapt to have paid them back big time," she said after the race.

"About 800m from home the mare was travelling super, but at the top of the straight I was hard at her and then she lifted, and we had to find a way through.

"But once we straightened, she levelled out and finished over the top of them.

"None of us was sure which horse won and I let go a big scream when our number went up." Carr notched her first Group 3 win aboard Geegees Blackflash in the 2015 Hobart Cup but she said this win was as special.

Sh'bourne Renegade was game in defeat and White Hawk, who failed in the Hobart Cup, raced outside of the leader Queen La Diva but defied the tough run to stick on gamely.

Lightly raced stayer Supalopo from the Adam Trinder stable ran a bottler at his first attempt at Group level to finish a game fifth and only 1-1/2 lengths from the winner.

She came, She saw, She CONQUERED!

That's the only way to describe Still a Star's incredible return to racing on Launceston Cup Day after a one-year lay-off.

The Bill Ryan-trained mare lined up in the \$150,000 Group 3 Vamos Stakes (1400m) only days after Australia voted her into the \$5 million All-Star Mile, a popularity-based field draw that saw her gather almost 10,000 votes to finish fourth on the pecking order.

It was an emotional experience for all who cared to pay attention to the race that would mean so much to her All Star Mile campaign, but Ryan had no doubts his four-year-old was ready for the challenge.

With punters' expectations high, Still a Star strolled around the mounting yard without a care in the world and it was much the same for Ryan, who was surprisingly calm before his stable star ventured to the barriers for the first time since winning the Tasmanian Oaks over 2100m almost a year to the day.

The well fancied Deroche burst from the gates with Craig Newitt aboard while Brendon McCoull slotted Still a Star on the back of the leader with the race favourite Ethical Solution's rider happy to race outside of Deroche.

At the top of the straight Deroche booted clear and looked to be travelling like the winner while Ethical Solution was already starting to feel the strain of facing the breeze.

But when McCoull eased Still a Star off the rail to stake her claim and moved to the hind quarters of the leader, the crowd started to get involved and when Ryan's little "Minnie" poked her head in front and started to draw clear the crowd erupted.

It was a day of reckoning for Still a Star on many fronts, but most of all she proved she was a worthy entry into the All Star Mile, the world's richest race over a mile (1600m).

Ryan was philosophical in his assessment of his training feat and of his horse's efforts.

"It's easy to train good horses because if you think you are a horse and treat the animal as you would treat yourself in various circumstances – it's a simple task," Ryan said.

"I have a great working relationship with Brendon (McCoull) because he knows how I train my horses and when he gets on, he never lets me or the horse down."

During the All-Star Mile campaign to secure public votes, Still a Star rose to the occasion as she worked the media like a pro! At one stage during a photo and video shoot at Ryan's Longford property, she made a fuss when the cameras and photographers walked away from her yard.

"I'm sure she knows exactly what's going on around her and I don't think I've ever seen a more media friendly horse."

McCoull was ecstatic with the mare's first-up performance.

"To come out today in that quality field first-up over 1400m and knowing all the issues she's had, it showed her heart and Bill's training ability," McCoull said.

"She travelled nicely throughout, and I felt like I had a ton of horse underneath me and I felt that if I had the horse of old, she would win and that was the case."

"She has such a brilliant turn of foot and today she ran down a very good horse and won easily. It was an amazing effort."

As this goes to print Still A Star will have contested the All-Star Mile and no doubt she will have given her all. Ryan said the mare will be given a spell in winter and be aimed at the feature races during next seasons Ladbrokes Tasmanian Summer of Racing.

2021 Tasmanian Magic Millions Yearling Sale

After an anxious few days in mid February, with Tasmanian borders once again closing due to Covid-19, Tasmanian breeders breathed a collective sigh of relief when border restrictions were lifted after only a week, allowing interstate trainers and owners to attend the Magic Millions sale on the 22nd of February.

This years sale moved to a new venue at the Agfest Quercus Park grounds near Carrick, a move greeted positively by breeders and buyers alike.

Magic Millions and Tas Breeders once again managed to attract a strong contingent of interstate trainers and bidding was spirited right from the first lot.

Early in the sale Alva Stud sold a beautifully presented filly Lot 5 by successful NSW sire Deep Field for \$120,000 to Vandyke Racing from Queensland. Stud owner Catherine Hills was delighted with the price she received and her stud went on to have their most successful sale ever, with all five lots sold at an average sale price of \$53,400.

Well respected bloodstock agent John Foote paid \$110,000 for an athletic colt from the stakes performed mare Testamarriage by Alpine Eagle, offered by Armidale Stud as agent for breeders Rick and Tina Polley.

The very next lot, an attractive black filly by successful sire Lonhro offered by Editorial & photography by Robin Whishaw

Grenville Stud, also went for a six figure price of \$100,000 to Griffiths de Kock Racing, and Peter Ford Thoroughbreds.

For the first time ever the sale produced no fewer than 6 lots that reached \$100,000 or more.

After some spirited bidding, Lot 104, an imposing colt by exciting first-season sire Impending (Armidale Stud, as agent), topped the sale at \$150,000. A syndicate of new owners for CRT Racing were the successful buyers of the standout colt.

Of the 123 lots catalogued, 97 were sold at an average of \$35,485. A clearance rate of over 85%. The sale grossed just shy of \$3.5 million, which was the best result ever and highlights the strong progress the local breeding industry has made over the past few years.

Grenville Stud's first season sire Zululand was very well received by buyers and two of his yearlings made \$100,000. Their 15 yearlings sold, averaged just over \$42,000. Demand was also strong for progeny by Alpine Eagle, and the 21 sold in the ring averaged over \$46,000.

It was heartening to see the local buyers bidding strongly at this years sale with 48 (almost 50% of the yearlings sold) remaining in Tasmania. Interstate buyers took home 49 yearlings, and two were sold to Hong Kong interests.

It would appear that the recent prize money increases and the local TasBred Bonus scheme have reinvigorated local interest in supporting the Tasmanian product.

WHEN talented three-year-old Swoop Dog powered his way to an emphatic win in the Tasmanian Guineas (1600m) his trainer John Blacker said the gelded son of Husson could end up being the best he has trained.

After the gelding won the Launceston Guineas over 2100 metres, he upped the ante, and declared he will end up being the best he has prepared.

Swoop Dog had his colours lowered in the Tasmanian Derby when he finished third behind Victorians Explosive Jack and Alloway, but Blacker was proud of the way his rising stable star handled the assignment.

Blacker makes no bones about why Swoop Dog excels on the racetrack.

"This horse has shown me well above average ability from day one and after each race he has improved and since his Tasmanian Guineas win over a mile he has gone to a new level," Blacker said.

"Once in a while you get a horse enter to the stable that stands out from the rest and that was recognisable as soon as this bloke set foot in the yard.

"Not only does he have great ability, but he is a lovely natured horse, and it is rare that you get the best of both worlds with top class racehorses."

Swop Dog was passed in at the 2019 Tasmanian Magic Millions Yearling Sale, so he was retained by his breeder Armidale Stud and is raced by the stud and Phil McMullen, a client of Blacker's stable.

Swoop Dog's record stands at five starts for three wins and a second and a third for \$170,600 in total stakes.

NEWHART BACK TO BACK WINS IN THE LADBROKES DEVONPORT CUP

WHEN star sprinter-miler Newhart powered his way to an effortless win in the weight-for-age Mowbray Stakes over 1600 metres in Launceston his trainer Leanne Gaffney burst into tears.

It was tears of joy and sadness as Gaffney explained it was most likely the last time she would saddle up the gelded son of Fighting Sun.

Newhart is bound to return to the stables of Barry Campbell who is due to resume training in July after spending two years out of racing action due to a disqualification.

"I love this horse and he is one of the reasons I want to get up early every morning to train the team," Gaffney said.

"He is the kindest horse I have ever trained, and he has the talent to match, and it is sad that it will be the last time I will present him to race.

"I thank Star Thoroughbreds for the opportunity to train him and the rest of the Star horses, but I can't help but feel very sad to see this one (Newhart) leave my stables."

The Mowbray Stakes signalled the end of Newhart's summer campaign.

Newhart (Craig Newitt) settled just behind the speed set by Sir Simon but when threeyear-old Swoop Dog made his charge around the field and outsider Mywordis joined the leaders, it looked for a moment as if the favourite would not gain a clear run.

But Newitt never panicked and when the gap appeared about 100 metres out, Newhart burst through the gap and went on to win comfortably from the fast-finishing Mandela Effect with Swoop Dog third ahead of Sir Simon.

Newhart opened his feature race account in the Ladbrokes Devonport Cup and followed up with an effortless victory in the weight-forage Thomas Lyons over 1400m on Hobart Cup day.

But there is no doubt he saved his best for last in the Mowbray Stakes.

Gaffney confirmed the plan was to give Newhart a decent spell and the early plan is for him to come back for a spring campaign, possibly in Melbourne, but those decisions will be left to Star Thoroughbred's Denise Martin and Campbell.

Newhart showed his intentions early this season with a brilliant first-up win over 1400m in Launceston.

He then became the first horse since Brallos (1976-77) to win back-to-back Devonport Cups, a feat achieved by only a handful of middle-distance performers and the 2021 Devonport Cup win also gave jockey Newitt the record of the most wins in the Devonport Racing Club's showcase event over 1880 metres.

Newhart's efforts this season makes him the front-runner to take out the Tasmanian horse of the year title.

Story by Peter Staples Photography by Robyn Whishaw & Alistair Bett Photography **SOPHIE ROLES** was destined to be involved with horses. Her start came from riding a little Shetland pony named Coconut dating back to when she was just four years old.

With her father Terry Roles firmly entrenched as a leading thoroughbred trainer operating out of stables at Deloraine, Sophie can't remember a day when she wasn't involved with horses.

Like most who compete in the equestrian arena, Sophie started out at pony club and she says having a horse that belonged to champion Tasmanian jockey Craig Newitt helped her during the early days of her riding career. His name was Bobby and I had him from when I was five until I was about 12," Sophie said.

"I wasn't very committed to riding when I had Coconut, but he was a lovely little horse. I guess I started to take a real interest when I got off the leading rein with Coconut and that's when I got Bobby.

Sophie doesn't remember ever being taught how to ride because sitting on a horse's back was normal in the Roles household.

Her older sister Erin was a dab hand in the saddle, so sisters being sisters they were very competitive.

Attending the local shows at Deloraine, Chudleigh and Westbury riding in pony classes gave Sophie plenty of experience in the show ring and she did that from age six.

"I can vaguely remember being led around the show ring at Deloraine and Westbury shows and that's where I gained experience riding in front of people and that was always something I looked forward to."

By the time she was 14 Sophie was ready to move to a more senior level of competition and with that came the arrival of a Clydesdale cross named Shopadoc, and they formed a great relationship that resulted in numerous ribbons and trophies.

"I was very fortunate that some close family friends loaned me Shopadoc, who was 15 at the time, and even though I only had him for a few years he helped me enormously."

Sophie has made a habit of winning trophies since her early teens but one win that she still cherishes, was when she was just starting out.

"I remember a fun day at a show at which I won a trophy and beat my sister Erin.

"While it was a fun day and it didn't really count, it was pretty good beating my older sister and she wasn't too happy about it because she was hacking at the time and way more advanced than me." Her first major trophy came during a Launceston Toyota Show Jumping series taking out first prize when she was 16 aboard Shopadoc.

These days Roles competes aboard former racehorses Pickwick Silver, now known as Cellar Door, and Glenferry Road that was the last horse her father, Terry Roles, trained before retiring as a trainer.

Pickwick Silver had a few trainers but ended her racing career with Spreyton-based mentor Vern Poke who prepared her for her only win, a maiden at Devonport in January 2012.

"I've had Pickwick Silver (Cellar Door) for about six years, and she is very competitive up to 120cm and we have had a lot of success.

"I had to work through a lot of issues with her, but the hard work has been very rewarding for both of us because she has progressed to regularly competing at 120cm and she was getting towards the top level of competition in Tasmania."

Sophie said she has done some one-day eventing on Glenferry Road, but of late they have been concentrating on show jumping.

"Glenferry Road was a bit of a slow learner, but he has started to flourish and is really getting the hang of it and has competed up to 105cm."

Glenferry Road had 29 starts on the racetrack for three minor placings but it seems the 10-year-old son of Hard Spun has found his niche on the equestrian circuit.


Sophie, who works full-time as an administration officer with Page Transport at Carrick, has had her share of injuries along the way.

Her first major injury was when she was 12 and came off her pony and damaged three vertebrae in her back. "I had to stop riding for about four months after I hurt by back and then four years later, I ruptured the ACL in my knee that required a knee reconstruction but that originated from an old injury I got playing touch football at school that wasn't diagnosed at the time."

Sophie suffered a major setback when while having scans for a shoulder injury, associated scans revealed she had a brain tumor. "Having the brain tumor was pretty scary, but thankfully I had that removed and it was diagnosed as a grade two tumor, so once that was removed, I was able to have my shoulder fixed and I was able to get back to riding a year ago."

To say Sophie Roles is infatuated with horses would be an understatement.

"I keep doing it (riding) because I just love horses and the relationships you build with them is quite amazing. When there is a lot going on in your personal life, having a relationship with a horse makes for a really good escape."

The structure of the Autumn-Winter calendar will see the Devonport Synthetic Track return in April to ensure the Launceston track can begin its renovation after the Easter period.

The extended break for Launceston will allow track staff some warmer months to begin a renovation which in previous years has not begun until Winter. This will give the track a longer period of rest than usual to allow this extended renovation which ensures a better recovery and growth period. This will be the biggest renovation Launceston has had since the track was redeveloped.

Turf racing will continue at Hobart through this period with 6 meetings programmed from April to July. These meetings will be monitored throughout the months to ensure the surface is in the best possible condition for racing.

Hobart will hold the two feature meetings for the Winter period with the running of the Tasbred Race Day on Sunday 2nd May followed by the 2YO Tasmanian Sires Produce and 3YO Autumn Classic meeting on Sunday 16th May.

The structure of the programme throughout April to July has been designed to give all horses an opportunity to race and cater to the horse population historically seen at this time. Tasracing have formulated this view from analysing data based around past seasons and the current horse population. Additional lower graded events have been programmed but Tasracing will monitor the situation should additional higher graded races need to be added. Horses above the benchmark will still have an opportunity to race with a strong group of apprentices currently throughout Tasmania able to claim.

\$320,000 in Tasbred bonuses are on offer throughout the Winter calendar with 16 opportunities available from April to July. The \$50k 2YO and \$50k 3YO on May 2nd is also available to horses nominated under the Tasbred Scheme.

There will be limited opportunities to divide races through the Winter months but most race meetings throughout this period already have 8 races programmed on the card.

AMENDMENTS

AR 122 – Jockey helmets lifespan

Summary:

Following consultation with Principal Racing Authorities and industry bodies, Racing Australia has approved amendments to AR 122 to vary the lifespan of a rider's helmet from 5 years from manufacture date to 5 years from purchase date or 8 years from manufacture date (whichever is earlier), and other related changes.

The changes address various issues with the application of the current rule, including:

- a helmet is manufactured, labelled with the manufacture date, dispatched to a saddlery/ supplier, put on a shelf and purchased some time afterwards, which in many cases could be more than one year after manufacture (thereby reducing the helmet's usable lifespan, sometimes significantly); and
- manufacturers generally attach a label with the manufacture date to the helmet's inside lining, which can quickly become unreadable as a result of regular use, sweat etc.

It is important to note the rule change does not increase the maximum allowable period of helmet use by a rider – it is still 5 years.

Under the revised rule, riders will be required to maintain evidence (e.g. receipt) of the date of helmet purchase and provide such evidence to Stewards as required. Stewards' powers in respect of confiscation of helmets have also been broadened. These changes will assist Stewards in seeking to ensure that only safe, serviceable and compliant helmets are being used by riders.

Racing Australia has also taken the opportunity to make some other amendments to the rule to improve its readability, particularly with respect to the requirements of a compliant helmet.

Amend AR 122 as follows: AR 122 Helmets

- (1) When mounted on a horse, every rider must wear a properly affixed helmet which:
 - (a) complies with a standard approved by Racing Australia;
 - (b) is in a satisfactory condition;
 - (c) has not been modified in any way; and
 - (d) has attached to it a manufacturer's label that states:
 - (i) the date of manufacture; and
 - (ii) that it complies with a standard approved by Racing Australia.
- (2) Every rider is responsible for the care and condition of the rider's helmet.
- (3) A helmet will be deemed not serviceable and must be immediately replaced by a rider if:
 - (a) 5 years have expired since its date of purchase or acquisition as a brand-new helmet or 8 years have expired since its date of manufacture, whichever is earlier; or
 - (b) it sustains a severe impact; or
 - (c) the wearer suffers from concussion following a fall.

Note: By way of example:

- (a) If a helmet was manufactured on 1/1/2016 and purchased on 1/1/2017, the helmet will be deemed not serviceable on 1/1/2022 (i.e. 5 years' use).
- (b) If a helmet was manufactured on 1/1/2016 and purchased on 1/1/2020, the helmet will be deemed not serviceable on 1/1/2024 (i.e. 4 years' use).

- (4) Further to subrule (3)(a):
 - a rider is required to maintain evidence (such as a receipt) of the date on which the Rider purchased or acquired a helmet in his or her possession; and
 - a rider must produce such evidence to Racing Australia, a PRA or the Stewards at any time required by any of them.
- (5) The Stewards may at any time seize a helmet for inspection and may in their absolute discretion confiscate any helmet that does not comply with the requirements of this rule, including (without limitation) where the Stewards are of the opinion that a helmet is not in a satisfactory condition as a result of general wear and tear or the manner in which it has been stored or maintained.
- (6) When mounted on a horse during darkness, every rider must affix to his or her helmet a safety warning light of a type approved by Racing Australia, a PRA or the Stewards (except that this rule does not apply to any location where the Stewards have ruled that sufficient artificial lighting exists).
- (7) If an apprentice jockey breaches subrule (1), the apprentice jockey's master and/ or any other person who was in charge of the apprentice jockey at any relevant time may also be penalised unless that person satisfies the Stewards that he or she took all proper care to ensure that the apprentice jockey complied with that subrule.

- **Note:** Pursuant to this rule Racing Australia has ordered that:
- (a) The following helmet standards are approved:
 - (i) AS/NZS 3838 2006;
 - (ii) EN 1384: 2012 or EN 1384: 2017;
 - (iii) ASTM F1163: 20-04: Rev A 2011, ASTM F1163: 20-13 or ASTM F1163: 20-15;
 - (iv) BS PAS 015: 2011;
 - (v) VG1 01.040, Recommendation for Use, 12/12/2014 (also referred to as VG1 01.040: 2014-12).
- (b) All helmets must be fitted with a nylon interlocking chinstrap clip attachment.

Date of effect: 1 January 2021

AR 69 Scratching of horses for Group or Listed races

Summary:

The purpose of the rule is that if a horse has been nominated for a Group, Listed, or Restricted Listed race, and that race is within 30 days' time, then if the horse is to be scratched, it must be done immediately. This is because betting activity increases significantly the closer you get to the race and punters need to be assured that a horse will only be scratched if something happens in the future.

As currently drafted, the rule could be interpreted to only catch horses that are scheduled to race within 30 days of the nomination. This would mean that if a horse is nominated in August for a race in November, then the rule does not apply, i.e. because the nomination is not within 30 days of the race.

Racing Australia has amended the rule to clarify the wording and achieve its intended purpose.





Amend AR 69 as follows:

AMENDMENTS

AR 69 Scratching of horses for Group or Listed races

If a person:

- (a) nominates a horse for a Group Race, a Listed Race or a Restricted Listed Race; and
- (b) decides within 30 days of that race that the horse will not start in the race, the person must immediately scratch the horse from that race.

Date of effect: 1 January 2021

AR 104 Trainers must keep treatment records

Summary:

Treatment records often represent an important part of the evidence considered by Stewards in relation to prohibited substance and administration on race day matters. It is important the requirements of the rule with respect to keeping treatment records are clear and it provides for the recording of all information which may be relevant to a matter before the Stewards.

As a record of all treatments administered to a horse must be recorded in the trainer's treatment records, it is considered that the requirement to enter the reason for which a treatment was administered may, in addition to clarifying matters before the Stewards or during stable inspections, have the effect of prompting trainers to review the necessity of some treatments or medications. Accordingly, Racing Australia has added subrule (2)(h).

Subrule (2)(d) has also been amended to replace "paste" with "orally" for consistency in terminology, as paste describes a substance rather than a route of administration.

Amend AR 104 as follows: AR 104 Trainers must keep treatment records

- (2) For the purpose of subrule (1), each record of administration must include the following information:
 - (a) the name of the horse;
 - (b) the date and time of administration of the treatment or medication;
 - (c) the name of the treatment or medication administered (brand name or active constituent);
 - (d) the route of administration including by injection, stomach tube, orally, topical application or inhalation;
 - (e) the amount of medication given (if applicable);
 - (f) the duration of treatment (if applicable);
 - (g) the name and signature of the person/s administering and/or authorising the administration of the treatment or medication;
 - (h) the reason for administering the treatment or medication.

Date of effect: 1 January 2021

AR 106 Saddling a horse

Summary:

The Chairmen of Stewards Committee has noted a number of instances of horses not carrying the correct saddlecloth numbers at official trials.

Accordingly, Racing Australia has amended AR 106, which includes the correct saddlecloth number as part of proper saddling at races and official trials. (Note that AR 207 does not include trials and relates to the raceday process rather than the proper saddling of horses.)

Amend AR 106 as follows:

AR 106 Saddling a horse

(1) The trainer of a horse is at all times responsible for the proper saddling and application and fitting of all gear to a horse (including the correct saddlecloth number) presented for a race, official trial, jump-out or trackwork.

Date of effect: 1 January 2021

AR 113 Electronic devices not permitted while riding

Summary:

. . .

The Chairmen of Stewards Committee has noted an increasing and concerning trend of riders holding mobile phones whilst mounted on a horse. Under the current rule, it is only an offence to use a mobile phone (or other electronic device) whilst mounted.

To improve the safety of riders and other participants, Racing Australia has amended the rule to also make it an offence to hold a mobile phone (or other electronic device) whilst mounted.

Amend AR 113 as follows:

AR 113 Electronic devices not permitted while riding

Unless permitted by the Stewards, when mounted on a horse a rider must not hold or use any mobile phone, radio or other electronic appliance, apparatus, instrument or equipment capable of receiving, transmitting or playing information.

Date of effect: 1 January 2021

AR 122 Helmets & AR 123 Safety vests Summary:

Under the Rules, when riding in darkness a rider must affix a safety warning light to their helmet (AR 122(5)).

In the Northern Territory, TRNT has trialled a new initiative where licensed persons riding trackwork during darkness wear a high visibility harness/braces with front and rear built in flashing lights over the top of their approved safety vest. This was done in response to situations where the current standard was not as effective as intended in some cases. For example, in the event a rider is dislodged and the helmet is subject to severe impact, the lights could come off or stop working.

Following consideration of TRNT's trial, as well as feedback from industry stakeholders, Racing Australia has approved changes to AR 122 and AR 123 such that when riding in darkness riders may now wear either:

- a helmet with a safety light affixed to it (as per the current rule); or
- a harness/braces with safety lights over the top of a safety vest.

Note: Under the Rules, trackwork may only be conducted where the Stewards have ruled that sufficient natural or artificial lighting exists.

Amend AR 122 as follows:

AR 122 Helmets

...

(6) Subject to subrule (7), when mounted on a horse during darkness, every rider must affix to his or her helmet a safety warning light of a type approved by Racing Australia, a PRA or the Stewards.



AMENDMENTS

- (7) Subrule (6) does not:
 - (a) apply to any rider who complies with AR 123(4);
 - (b) apply to any location where the Stewards have ruled that sufficient artificial lighting exists;
 - (c) affect the requirement that trackwork may only be conducted where Stewards have ruled that sufficient natural or artificial lighting exists.
- (8) If an apprentice jockey breaches subrule (1), the apprentice jockey's master and/ or any other person who was in charge of the apprentice jockey at any relevant time may also be penalised unless that person satisfies the Stewards that he or she took all proper care to ensure that the apprentice jockey complied with that subrule.

Amend AR 123 as follows: AR 123 Safety vests

- (4) Subject to subrule (5), when mounted on a horse during darkness, a rider must wear:
 - (a) a safety vest that complies with the requirements in subrule (1); and
 - (b) over that safety vest, or over clothing worn over that safety vest, a harness or braces that contains safety warning lights of a type approved by Racing Australia, a PRA or the Stewards.
- (5) Subrule (4) does not:
 - (a) apply to any rider who complies with AR 122(6);
 - (b) apply to any location where the Stewards have ruled that sufficient artificial lighting exists;

- (c) affect the requirement that trackwork may only be conducted where Stewards have ruled that sufficient natural or artificial lighting exists.
- (6) If an apprentice jockey breaches subrule (1), the apprentice jockey's master and/ or any other person who was in charge of the apprentice jockey at any relevant time may also be penalised unless that person satisfies the Stewards that he or she took all proper care to ensure that the apprentice jockey complied with that subrule.

Date of effect: 1 February 2021

AR 241 Prohibited substance in sample taken from horse at trial etc

Summary:

...

Under the current rule, detection of substances on Prohibited List A or B in horses participating in official trials, jump-outs and other tests only constitutes a prohibited substance offence where the event is "for the purpose of the horse obtaining a permit to start in a race (whether after suspension or otherwise)".

In circumstances where official trials and their results are increasingly relied on by industry participants (including punters), Racing Australia is of the view that, to improve the integrity of official trials, substances on Prohibited List A and B should not be permitted at such events regardless of the purpose a horse is participating. AR 241 has been amended accordingly.

The amendment does not change the current rule with respect to horses participating in jump-outs or other tests (subrules (b) and (c)).

Amend AR 241 as follows:

AR 241 Prohibited substance in sample taken from horse at trial etc

If a horse is brought to a racecourse or recognised training track to participate in:

- (a) an official trial;
- (b) a jump-out for the purpose of obtaining a permit to start in a race (whether after suspension or otherwise); or
- (c) any other test for the purpose of obtaining a permit to start in a race (whether after suspension or otherwise),

and a prohibited substance on Prohibited List A and/or Prohibited List B is detected in a sample taken from the horse prior to or following the relevant event, the trainer and any other person who was in charge of the horse at any relevant time breaches these Australian Rules.

Date of effect: 1 February 2021

AR 267 Prohibitions on conduct of trainers during suspension

Summary:

Racing Australia is of the view the current rule restricting the actions of trainers while suspended should be clarified to ensure that such trainers do not continue to have influence over training operations while suspended. This has the potential to affect both the integrity and the public perception of racing.

Accordingly, Racing Australia has amended AR 267 by clarifying the specific restrictions on suspended trainers and making the opening paragraph consistent with AR 270A (penalty for breach of terms of suspension).

Amend AR 267 as follows:

AR 267 Prohibitions on conduct of trainers during suspension

Unless otherwise authorised by the PRA or the Stewards in whose territory a suspension was imposed on a trainer (and upon such conditions as the PRA or the Stewards may in their discretion impose), a suspended trainer must not, during the period of that suspension:

- (a) as a trainer or permit holder, nominate a horse for a race, official trial or jump-out;
- (b) train, or participate in any way in the training or preparation for racing of, a horse (including without limitation the giving of instructions);
- (c) be registered as a stablehand;
- (d) be employed by, or otherwise engaged to provide any service in any capacity to, any thoroughbred racing stable; or
- (e) enter the mounting yard, scales area or horse stall area at a racecourse, save that a suspended trainer may enter such an area if he or she is the owner of a horse in that area.

Date of effect: 1 February 2021

AMENDMENTS

Prohibited List B thresholds – Theobromine

Summary:

The International Federation of Horseracing Authorities has amended the status of the prohibited substance theobromine from a threshold level to an International Residue Limit (IRL) within Article 6 of the International Agreement on Breeding Racing and Wagering. The current IRLs for theobromine are 2ug/mL in urine and 0.3ug/mL in plasma.

In the interests of international harmonisation, Racing Australia has amended the rules to remove theobromine from the list of substances that have a threshold applied (Schedule 1, Part 2, Division 3 – Prohibited List B thresholds).

Racing Australia's Veterinary and Analytical Advisory Group has previously agreed to a national uniform approach to dealing with the detection of low levels of prohibited substances known to be environmental substances or feed contaminants, whereby IRLs are not formally adopted into the Australia Rules of Racing. It has previously been agreed that Australian racing laboratories would maintain their currently agreed local reporting levels for substances of environmental concern, and Australian and New Zealand Official Racing Analysts (ANZORA) would manage a collaborative approach between the laboratories to ensure these reporting limits were applicable to each laboratory.

Accordingly, theobromine has been removed from Division 3 – Prohibited List B thresholds and the Australian racing laboratories have been advised that theobromine at 2ug/mL in urine and 0.3ug/mL in plasma is to be included in the currently agreed list of local reporting levels for substances of environmental concern. Amend Schedule 1, Part 2, Division 3 as follows:

PART 2 – SUBSTANCES PROHIBITED ON RACE DAYS, CERTAIN TRIALS ETC

Division 3 – Prohibited List B thresholds

The prohibited substances set out below in this Division 3 when present at or below their respective threshold are exempt from Prohibited List B.

Notification Forms

Under the Australian Rules of Racing, a notification form must be lodged when a decision has been made to retire a horse or to not commence racing a horse (AR 51) or upon the death of a horse (AR 52). Penalties may apply if failing to comply with notification obligations under the rules.

Notification forms for retirement of horses should be completed

Named horse within 1 month of the decision to retire the horse from racing or within 24 hours of the horse's death.

Unnamed horse within 1 month of the decision to not commence racing the horse, or within 24 hours of the horse's death.

LOCAL RULE 13 DECLARATION OF RIDERS

- 13.1. The Nominator or Trainer (or authorised agent of either of them) of a horse engaged in any race held under the Tasmanian Rules of Racing, shall declare the name of the rider to the Secretary of the Club conducting the meeting, or other official appointed for the purpose, on the day of Declaration of Acceptance as set down by Tasracing.
- In exceptional circumstances an extension of time may be allowed by the Stewards.
- 13.3. Failing any such declaration the Stewards may order the withdrawal of the horse and/or punish the Nominator or Trainer.
- 13.4. Any horse drawn in a field excluding emergencies that has no declared rider will remain in that field until after official scratching time, that horse will then be declared a late scratching by the Stewards if there is no suitable rider available.
- 13.5. For all races scheduled to start at 6 p.m. or later and for any race during the period from 1 June until 31 August, regardless of start time, the following is permitted for horses weighted up to 54 kgs –
 - (a) One kilogram overweight If a rider is to be one kilogram overweight, permission must be obtained from the Stewards who may grant approval if the Nominator or Trainer agrees.

- (b) More than one kilogram overweight – Unless special circumstances apply the Stewards will not permit a rider to ride 1.5 kg overweight.
- 13.6. Once a rider has been so declared no other rider may be substituted without the permission of the Stewards.
- 13.7. Notwithstanding the provisions of AR143, Apprentices shall not be permitted to claim the allowance to which they are entitled under that Rule in any race classified as a Quality handicap, Group and Listed Race or any other race published from time to time in the Racing Calendar as being a race for which apprentices cannot so claim. (Amended effective 26/6/19)
- 13.8. Subject to LR 13.7 in maiden races run at set weights or weight-forage, restricted races run at set weights unless otherwise provided in the conditions of the race, any Apprentice entitled under the Rules to ride in races may claim an allowance in accordance with the scale set out in AR.143(4), (5) and (6). (Amended effective 1/3/19)
 - Winning rides for the purposes of Apprentice allowances shall in Tasmania be in accordance with AR.143(5) and (6) unless otherwise provided for in the conditions of the race. (Amended effective 1/3/19)
- No Apprentice who is entitled to claim 4 kgs may ride in any Group, Listed or Feature race in Tasmania. (Amended rule effective 01/08/13)

- 13.10. No Apprentice who is entitled to claim 4 kgs may ride in any 2yo race without approval of the Chairman of Stewards. (New Rule effective 01/08/13)
- 13.11. No Apprentice who is entitled to claim 3 kgs may ride in any Group, Listed or Feature race in Tasmania without approval of the Chairman of Stewards. (New Rule effective 01/08/13) (New Rule effective 23/02/16)
- 13.12. No Apprentice who is entitled to claim 4 kgs may ride a horse having its first official race start. (New Rule effective 23/02/16)
- 13.13. Any race meeting with no scheduled Feature Race of \$50,000 or more shall carry the Meeting Type status of "Country". (New Rule effective 14/10/19)
