

STILL A STAR SELLS FOR \$700K

"

In Tasmania she dominated and will always be remembered as one of the most versatile and courageous gallopers ever produced in the island state.

WHEN classy Tasmanian mare Still a Star was sold at this year's Magic Millions Broodmare Sale on the Gold Coast her trainer and part-owner Bill Ryan likened it to saying goodbye to a child who was leaving home for the first time.

Still a Star and Ryan were as close as any trainer and racehorse could be, and it wasn't only those who were close to the family and to racing who were aware of their bond.

When the auctioneer's gavel crashed onto the sounding board when the bids hit \$700,000, it was then, and only then, that Ryan knew his time with the daughter of Toronado was over.

The mare took Ryan and her other owners on a unforgettable journey.

"I never thought a horse could ever have such an impact on me and even though we got a decent price for her at the sale and that she's gone to a great home (Widden Stud), I still can't believe I let her go," Ryan said.

Still a Star, or Minnie as she was affectionately known to Ryan and the family, was moody at the best of times and she often played games with her trainer.

"I'm sure Minnie watched my wife Mary bossing me around in the stables and she (Still a Star) worked out that she should try and do the same.

"She was a bit quirky and could be a real pain in the butt, but Minnie showed more affection to me than any other horse I've handled."

Ryan was pleased Still a Star was sold to one of the best studs in Australia.

"Minnie has gone to a magnificent home where she will have a wonderful life and be served by some of the best stallions in the country and will spend the rest of her days being a mum at a place that I call horse heaven."

Still a Star was thrust under the national spotlight when, after winning the Group 3 Vamos Stakes at home, she earned enough votes from the public to earn a berth in the \$5 million All Star Mile at Moonee Valley in March 2021.

She encountered a bog track and was buffeted from pillar to post and even though she refused to give in, the gallant chestnut mare finished 13th of 15. With muddied water dripping from every hair on her body she returned to the unsaddling enclosure looking like she had just gone a few rounds with Mike Tyson.

But typically, both mare and trainer refused to accept defeat, so she backed up three weeks later to tackle the Group 3 Victoria Handicap at Caulfield in which she hit the front 200m from home only to be run down in the last stride by multiple Group 1 winner Mr Quickie.

Three weeks later she delivered the goods to easily win the Listed Anniversary Vase over 1400m at Caulfield to end a preparation that could easily have been filled with multiple interstate wins.

The mare suffered a respiratory infection soon after and at one stage Ryan thought her racing days might be numbered. But as usual he ensured his Minnie had the best of care to ensure she recovered.

She was off the racetrack for a year to the day when she stepped out in the 2021 Vamos Stakes on Launceston Cup Day with Ryan using seven trials to get her match fit for the occasion.

It was arguably her most memorable win on home soil and one of the most emotional ever seen on the Launceston track.

In Tasmania she dominated and will always be remembered as one of the most versatile and courageous gallopers ever produced in the island state.

Some say Still a Star is the reason Ryan, 73, has managed to keep going despite being diagnosed six years ago with a terminal lung disease-Idiopathic Pulmonary Fibrosis.

"They gave me four years to live nearly six years ago, so I'm doing well – considering.

"I've come to terms with my situation but as long as they keep coming up with new drugs that work, I'll keep ticking over and I just hope I get to see Minnie's first foal race."

ANOTHER TASMANIAN BRED SUCCESS STORY!

Created by those who have dared to dream.

Quality mare Deroche joined Mystic Journey and Still a Star to the breeding barn this year with the daughter of Needs Further selling for \$260,000 at the Magic Millions Broodmare sale on the Gold Coast in May.

Deroche was an amazing juvenile and carried the form into her three-year-old season. She recorded arguably her most impressive win in the 2021 \$125.000 Listed Newmarket Handicap, leading throughout to defeat a very strong field.

The mare ended her racing career with the impressive statistics of 13 wins and six minor placings from 26 starts and \$562,000 in stakes.

Deroche's three-year-old season was outstanding, winning the Carbine Club plate in Hobart before a luckless second in the Group 3 Bow Mistress.

She then went on to win the Tasmanian Magic Millions 3&4YO Classic before going on to win the Group 3 Vamos Stakes in Launceston three days later in the care of Leanne Gaffney.

Deroche, raced by a Star Thoroughbreds syndicate, was purchased at the 2022 Magic Millions Broodmare Sale by Newgate Bloodstock.



SUCCESS in racing is all too often measured by the number of wins a participant or horse achieves during their career, but sometimes it is what sits behind the winner that counts the most.

Tasmanian horseman/trainer Michael O'Grady has spent four decades living the equine dream and his expertise and determination to make the most of his gift led to him being a finalist in the 2022 Darley Australian Stud and Stable Staff Awards (SSSA).

The Australian edition of the SSSA, staged jointly by Thoroughbred Breeders Racing Australia, Australia, Godolphin, is part of the worldwide series of awards that shine a spotlight on the thousands of staff whose devotion, skill and commitment ensures the survival of an entire industry.

These days O'Grady works at JKB racing at Longford and it was John Blacker who nominated him for the prestigious award in the Dedication to Racing category, with the judges deeming him worthy of making it to the final of two.

O'Grady made his way into the industry as a 16-year-old in 1979 after landing a job with Phillip Beveridge and it was at his Hagley training complex that O'Grady began his racing journey.

After three years with Beveridge, he moved on to Armidale Stud and that's where O'Grady sunk his teeth into learning about the animal. This was where he developed his deep love of equines under the guidance of Tasmanian Racing Hall of Fame inductee Royston Carr.

"Mick developed into a great horseman and from the outset, horses just responded well to him." Carr said.

"He is a brilliant horseman and trackwork rider who was also instrumental in the success of Fallacious that was my 1986 Tasmanian Guineas winner."

During his time at Armidale Stud, O'Grady was happy to tackle any task thrown at him, dealing with matings, foalings, and preparing yearlings for sale, as well as general farm duties. It was this experience that proved extremely valuable as he made his way to training in his own right.

After acquiring an owner-trainer's licence in 1988, he trained a couple of his father's horses and his first starter. Nero's Best, was beaten in a photo finish, which deprived him of a fairy-tale start to his training career.

When an opportunity arose to gain experience interstate, O'Grady headed to Mornington in Victoria where he worked with former Tasmanian trainer/horse breaker Tony Krushka.

He left the industry to take on a job as a truck driver carting freight interstate and while that took him away from racing, it proved to be an additional asset when he returned to Tasmania to assume a role with Graeme McCulloch at his Grenville Stud at Whitemore.

When Cressy trainer Cameron Thompson was just starting out O'Grady spent time with the young mentor and was a great asset to that stable's development.

When the word spread in 2015 that O'Grady was on the lookout for a change of scenery, JKB Racing jumped at the chance to secure his services and today he remains an integral part of that team.

"Mick has a skillset seldom found in our industry and his attitude and work ethic are second to none," Blacker said.

"He has never been one to force himself or his opinions on anyone, but he's always there if we want help or advice.

O'Grady attended the SSSA function on the Gold Coast where the winners were announced at the end of May. He was runner-up to Reg Fleming from Godolphin Carbine Lodge in Victoria. But in the eyes of the Tasmanian racing industry, making it as a finalist was a victory.

SIGGY NOTCHES UP 500TH WIN

SIGGY CARR has earned a reputation as one of Tasmania's best jockeys and this season she reached a personal milestone that confirmed her elite status.

Carr rode her 500th winner when she guided the John Blacker-trained filly Cloudy Nights to victory in a two-yearold maiden in Devonport in late May.

It was a gem of a ride to celebrate the milestone and one that landed one of the biggest plunges of the season.

Cloudy Nights was backed in by connections and some astute punters from \$126 to \$17. Carr kept her personal celebrations going by guiding the wellbacked \$3 favourite Rockem' Baby to victory in the following race.

"I had been chasing my 500th win for a while and because I was aware of being on 499 it seemed the more I thought about it, the longer my run of outs continued," Carr said.

"But as soon as I got it out of my head Cloudy Nights gave me number 500.

"Winning the very next race was fantastic too."

Carr began her riding career in October 2012 as an apprentice to her father, Hall of Fame trainer Royston Carr.

At her first ride in a race on Summer Downs the stirrup strap broke 400 metres from home which could have spelt disaster. But being a talented rider, she remained in the saddle until she pulled the horse up a few hundred metres past the post.

Two weeks later she secured her first win when she scored aboard the Michael Vosstrained Rose of Innocence in Launceston.

In her first season compising only nine months she rode 47 winners to win the state apprentice's premiership. She repeated the dose the next season with the same number of winners.

Carr outrode her apprentice claim in Tasmania within 18 months and that led to her leaving the state to ride in South Australia in March 2014 where she excelled as soon as she landed on SA soil.

She rode 64 winners during her 18-month stay of which 28 were metropolitan wins at Morphettville including two Group 3 wins.

While in SA Carr also earned the respect of the industry by being named dux of the apprentice school which also earned her a trip to Singapore where she had 20 rides over two meetings at Kranji Racecourse.

When Carr returned to Tasmania, she set her sights on becoming a trainer-jockey and she was the first female in the state to hold a dual licence.

Carr has managed to mix the dual responsibilities with enormous success but admits dealing with owners and running a business is a tad harder than she first thought.

"Training the horses is the easy part but it's the communication with owners and finding new owners that is the hard part, and I have been fortunate to have Tania Coward join the team as racing manager and that has made an enormous difference."

Carr was 24 when she decided to start an apprenticeship, but her love of horses goes back to when she could barely walk.

"I grew up with horses, so I was always destined to be involved in some way."

Carr had a dream of riding a winner at Flemington and that was realised three years ago when she partnered the Scott Brunton-trained gelding The Inevitable to victory in the Group 3 Colin Hayes Stakes.

She also landed two Group winners in South Australia but her most significant wins on home soil came in the state's two major staying races.

Carr partnered Geegees Blackflash to victory in the 2015 Group 3 Hobart Cup and in 2021 she delivered a gem of a ride in the Group 3 Launceston Cup to score aboard Glass Warrior for Longford trainer John Blacker.

Carr has about 24 horses in work at her Brighton stables, but she also trains out of shared facilities at Seven Mile Beach.

"I try to split the team in half and have equal numbers or thereabouts at each location."


There is no doubt the future is bright for the ever capable Carr.

APPRENTICE JOCKEY PROGRAM

Tasracing is committed to attracting, retaining and turning out world-class jockeys.

The primary vehicle for achieving this goal is the Tasracing Tasmanian Apprentice Jockey Program (TAJP).

Led by Tasmanian Hall of Fame jockey Stephen Maskiell, the TAJP takes talented, aspiring race riders and places them in a learning environment that gives them the diverse, in-depth skills and experience they need to become champion jockeys.



BUILDING CHAMPIONS

Apprentices enrolled in TAJP undertake a Certificate IV in Racing (Jockey) via the government training body Skillinvest. This qualification requires two years of study across 17 learning units. This provides all apprentices with a formal qualification.

The diversity and depth of this qualification can be seen in the learning units undertaken:

- · Finance.
- Compliance with regulatory, taxation and insurance.
- · Participating in racing protests and enquiries.
- · Participating in media interviews for racing.
- Prepare for self-management in racing.
- · Riding horses in jump outs.
- Preparing for race riding.
- · Riding horses in trials.
- · Setting goals to improve racing performance.
- · Manage principles of sports science for jockeys.
- · Maintaining financial records.
- · Processing accounts payable and receivable.
- Educating horses ready for racing.
- Modelling the responsibilities of an elite athlete.
- · Designing elite athlete diets.
- Promoting and maintaining effective business relationships with racehorse owners.



SPECIALISED MINDSET TRAINING

During 2022 Tasracing included a new, specialised mindset training program for TAJP participants. This was delivered through a partnership between Tasracing, led by Stephen Maskiell, and high performance athlete coaching consultants Elite Minds.

The new six week program was delivered to all Tasmanian apprentices and track work riders on the path to becoming an apprentice.

"The career of a jockey comes with many challenges and training our apprentices to be able to best address the challenges they encounter is critical. These skills will help them not only professionally but in their personal lives too" - quote from Stephen Maskiell, Apprentice Jockey Program Manager.

The Elite Minds Program is a mindset coaching program that teaches and inspires young athletes to use their mind to achieve their sporting goals through a focus on:

- · Understanding the mind.
- · How to set meaningful goals.
- · Changing unhelpful habits.
- · Attitudes for success.
- Maintaining positive self-image.
- Creating self-belief.
- · Daily activities to maintain the mind of an elite athlete.

The Elite Minds program proved a valuable addition to the TAJP in its first year of delivery. Head of the TAJP Stephen Maskiell summarised its impact:

'The power of having the skills to manage your mind as an elite athlete is critical. It was fantastic to see all our Tasmanian aspiring apprentices dive into the new program with such enthusiasm and willingness to learn. I have no doubt this new focus on giving our apprentices the tools to manage their mindsets for elite-level performance will lift the long-term success of all our graduates moving forward'.

■RICA BYRNE BURKE arrived in ■ Tasmania in December 2019 to join the Adam Trinder stable at Spreyton, hoping the move would give her the chance to live out a dream she had as a child.

She was quick to taste success, riding her first winner at her fifth race ride.

The Irish-born apprentice ended her first season in the saddle with 14 winners from only 44 rides for a winning strike rate of 31 per cent.

In the 2021-22 season she has ridden her way to near the top of the premiership table. with trainers and owners keen to seek her services, especially as she has yet to outride her claim.

Byrne Burke wanted to be a jockey from an early age. She lived opposite the Fairyhouse Racecourse in her hometown of Ratoath County Meath, about 20 minutes-drive from Dublin.

"My aunt was the only one in my family who had anything to do with riding and it was through her that I made the connection with horses," Byrne Burke said.

"I started out at the Broadmeadows Equestrian Centre in Ashbourne, near Dublin, where I did show jumping and that is what got me started.

Her interest led to spending time at the Ireland Racing Academy where the promising young rider was offered a spot working for internationally acclaimed trainer Dermott Weld and it was there she really started to hone her craft as a rider and horsewoman.

At Weld's yard she worked alongside her close friend Lauren Govern but when she left to travel to Australia to join the Chris Waller stable in Sydney, Byrne Burke asked her if there were any jobs going with Chris and the answer came back in the affirmative.

"I arrived at Chris Waller's stables with no real plan, but I was looking forward to my future there."

"However, when Lauren moved back to Ireland a month after I arrived, I was a bit lost and didn't know what I was going to do."

Byrne Burke was an acquaintance of Sean O'Donovan who had established himself in Tasmania with Armidale Stud and while chatting, Sean told her Trinder was looking to take on an apprentice. One phone call later she was on her way to Tasmania.

"I arrived at Adam's and a month after arriving I broke my hand and was out of action for about four months, but it's been relatively smooth sailing ever since."

The 23-year-old is enjoying and is thriving in Tasracing's Apprentice Training Program run by Tasmania Hall of Fame jockey Stephen Maskiell. She lauds Maskiell for all the work he puts into the Apprentice Program, and for his quidance.

"We all learn heaps from the apprentice school and Stephen (Maskiell) is very attentive to each of us and helps us enormously.

"Adam and Leah (Goodrick) are fantastic, and I've learned so much from them, especially Adam who is a very understanding boss, because he was a jockey and knows everything we must go through, to be good at what we do."

Erica is certainly a shining example of the calibre of rider being produced by the Tasmanian Apprentice Jockey Program.

CONTENDERS FOR THE HORSE OF THE YEAR AWARDS

ADAM Trinder's smart two-year-old Bello Beau looks to be a shoe-in to take out this season's Tasmanian 2YO of the Year title with his brilliant wins in the \$150,000 Gold Sovereign Stakes and \$100,000 Elwick Stakes placing him streets ahead of his competition.

The annual awards can sometimes produce a controversial outcome, but it is probably safe to assume the gelded son of Brazen Beau will capture this season's top gong.

Bello Beau also won the \$30,000 Alfa Bowl but his best came interstate.

He produced two eye-catching efforts in Melbourne for a luckless fifth in the Listed St Albans Stakes at Moonee Valley and a close-up second in the \$1 million Showdown at Caulfield towards the end of April which ended his preparation.

"Bello Beau did an awesome job for us this season and while it would have been great had he won the Showdown he was very game in defeat," Trinder said.

Bello Beau ended his two-year-old season with three wins and a second from five starts for over \$350,000 in stakes.

Trinder also produced another talented juvenile in Jaguar Stone that won the \$75,000 Tasmanian Magic Millions 2YO Classic as well as a maiden in Hobart before finishing third to Bello Beau in the Gold Sovereign.

Another juvenile worthy of mention is the Stuart gandy-trained Geegee Jet By that won the first two-year-old race of the season and went on to take out the \$50,000 Alfa Bowl.

The three-year-old category is likely to go to the Barry Campbell-trained Alpine Wolf who after finishing second to Turk Warrior in the 3YO Cup and 3YO Trophy over 1200m and 1400m respectively, excelled when he stepped up in distance to win two Listed races.

Alpine Wolf was dominant in the \$125,000 Tasmanian Guineas over 1600m and went on to win the \$100,000 Launceston Guineas over 2100m before being forced to undergo surgery to remove a bone chip from a knee that prevented him from contesting the Tasmanian Derby.

Turk Warrior won the \$100,000 3YO Cup and the \$50,000 3YO Trophy before having his colours lowered for the first time in the Tasmanian Guineas.

Trinder's three-year-old fillies Miss Charlie Brown and Miss Tuppence also excelled with Miss Charlie Brown winning the \$100,000 Listed Strutt Stakes before going on to finish second to Bundle of Fun in the \$150,000 Tasmanian Oaks and Miss Tuppence scored an emphatic win in the \$50,000 Lady Lynette (1100m).

The outcome of the open horse of the year title will depend on how judges view the value of interstate form over that delivered on home soil.

In Tasmania, Lim's Cruiser dominated the two major weight-for-age races for milers winning the Tasmanian Stakes (1600m) and Mowbray Stakes (1600m) each worth \$125,000.

However, Still a Star only raced in Melbourne where she placed third in the Group 2 Let's Elope before winning the Group 2 \$300,000 Rose of Kingston Stakes over 1410m at Flemington before going into the Group 1 Empire Rose in which she suffered a bleeding attack and was subsequently retired.

Mystic Journey also only raced interstate finishing second in the Let's Elope and third in the Rose of Kingston before ending her career with a narrow second in the \$1 million Group 1 Empire Rose.

Mystic Journey was later sold to Japan as a broodmare prospect for an estimated \$2 million.

Other contenders on the local front are the Angela Brakey-trained White Hawk, who won the \$100,000 Devonport Cup, \$75,000 Summer Cup and \$30,000 Golden Mile and the Bill Ryan-trained mare Take the Sit that won the \$150,000 Group 3 Vamos Stakes.







FILLIES AND MARES:

When fillies and mares race against male horses they shall receive a 2.0 kg weight allowance.

3YO's:

APPROVED WHIPS

For the purposes of AR 132(1), the following padded whips have been approved by Racing Australia for use in races, official trials, jump-outs and trackwork:

- 1. Pro Cush
- 2. International Lite-Touch
- 3. McKey Slick Stick
- Persuader
- 5. Enforcer
- Protekta
- 7. Celtic Equine
- 8. Goostick
- 9. P-Train Prompter

Padded whip specifications

- Maximum length of whip not exceeding 70cm.
- 2. No binding within 18cm of end of whip.
- Minimum width of pad 2.5cm.
- 4. Minimum length of pad not less than 18cm for whips 60cm in length; for longer whips the flap length must not be less than 30% of the whip length.
- 5. The overall weight of the whip must not exceed 160gm.
- The contact area of the shaft (including pad) must be smooth with no protrusion or raised surface.
- 7. The padded segment of the whip shall consist of a material approved by Stewards that does not harden over time. Padded materials must not absorb water.
- 8. Leather pads are not permitted.
- The inner padded section shall consist only of closed cell foam of not less than 7mm (one side) in thickness.
- 10. The thickness of the outer pad can be no greater than 1mm.
- 11. All whips must be dark in colour.

AR 2 DICTIONARY

In the interpretation of these Australian Rules (and any race meeting held under them), unless the context requires otherwise, the words and phrases below have the meanings set out in this rule Division 2 – Rights and obligations of trainers official means any:

- (a) director, board member or committee member of Racing Australia, a PRA or a Club;
- (b) person employed, engaged or appointed by Racing Australia, a PRA, a Club or a government body in relation to the management and/or control of racing, including but not limited to the conduct of race meetings or any other matter regarding its business and affairs.

[amended 6.4.22]

AR 36A & AR 36B - FITNESS AND PROPRIETY OF OWNERS

Summary:

The introduction of new rules covering the fitness and propriety of owners (AR 36A and AR 36B) has been under consideration by the Racing Australia Board since February 2021.

Following extensive consultation, Principal Racing Authorities unanimously supported the introduction of these new rules which were subsequently endorsed by the Racing Australia Board.

Challenges have previously been faced when seeking to restrict certain persons from being owners in order to protect racing's integrity. Express ownership restrictions are now to be included in the Rules which cover all aspects of ownership and leasehold of horses including ownerships within trust or equitable holdings.

Further, ownership restrictions will be imposed on undischarged bankrupts (and other similar persons, eg, those entering into a personal insolvency agreement), to protect trainers and co-owners from issues resulting from non-payment of training fees.

In order to ensure individual circumstances can be taken into account, the ownership restrictions for persons with criminal offences or animal cruelty offences and undischarged bankrupts would be subject to the discretion of racing authorities to allow such persons to be owners.

In addition to AR 36A, AR 36B has been introduced to ensure racing authorities have a line of sight to all persons that could possibly have an interest in a horse.

Insert new AR 36A as follows:

AR 36A Fitness and propriety restrictions on persons who can own or race a horse

(1) Racing Australia, a PRA or the Stewards (as applicable) may restrict any person from holding an ownership or lease interest in a horse if, in their opinion, the person is not a fit and proper person to own or lease a horse.

- (2) Without limiting subrule (1), except where otherwise permitted by Racing Australia, a PRA or the Stewards (as applicable), a person is not permitted to hold an ownership or lease interest in a horse if the person:
 - (a) has been convicted of an indictable criminal offence or a criminal offence involving violence against a person or dishonest activity in the previous 10 years;
 - (b) has been convicted of an offence under any animal welfare or prevention of cruelty to animals legislation in the previous 10 years; or
 - (c) is an undischarged bankrupt or is taking advantage of the laws in force for the time being relating to bankruptcy.
- (3) Subject to subrule (4), a person must not enter or cause to be entered a horse in a race, official trial or jump-out where a person who is not permitted to hold an ownership or lease interest in the horse pursuant to subrule (1) or (2) purports to hold such an interest in the horse.
- (4) Notwithstanding Racing Australia, a PRA or the Stewards assessing a person as fit and proper or not, any other PRA/s may conduct its own assessment as to that person's fitness and propriety before permitting him or her to own, lease or race a horse in that PRA's jurisdiction.
- (5) For the sake of clarity and without limiting any other provisions of the Rules, an ownership or lease interest includes an interest held by a person (from 0% to 100% inclusive) as a:
 - (a) director or shareholder of a company;
 - (b) partner of a partnership or firm;
 - (c) trustee of a trust;
 - (d) manager or member of a syndicate, and any other interest or position where the person is able to exercise any control or influence in respect of a horse, or either directly or indirectly has the power to vote or participate in decisions in respect of the horse.

Date of effect: 6 May 2022

Insert new AR 36B as follows: AR 36B Ownership via certain trusts prohibited

Without limiting any other provisions of the Rules and except where permitted by a PRA, an ownership or lease interest in a horse is not permitted to be held in a trust where the persons having an interest in the horse, beneficial or otherwise, are not readily and accurately identifiable (for example, where the trust is a discretionary trust with broad and potentially unlimited beneficiaries).

Date of effect: 6 May 2022





AMENDMENTS



AR99 DISQUALIFICATION OF WRONG HORSE WHICH COMPETED IN RACE OR TRIAL Summary:

Under AR 234, PRAs/Stewards may disqualify a horse entered or run in any race under a fraudulently false description or in connection with any other improper or dishonourable action or practice. This rule was designed to deal with matters which generally involve an element of misconduct.

However, there is no rule which expressly provides for disqualification where the wrong horse competes and misconduct is not present, such as the wrong horse running as a result of trainer error. Cases in Victoria and Queensland have highlighted that such offences would be better dealt with under a specific rule, rather than relying on AR 234.

Following a recommendation from the Chairmen of Stewards Committee, Racing Australia has introduced a specific rule - AR 99(2) - which gives PRAs/Stewards the express power to disqualify the wrong horse which competed in a race or official trial (for example, due to neglect or carelessness). Under the rule, there is no need to establish that the wrong horse competing was the result of fraudulent or improper practice or dishonourable action before disqualifying the horse.

Amend AR 99 as follows:

AR 99 Obligation to ensure an identified horse is presented and races

- (1) The trainer of a horse and/or the trainer's authorised representative must ensure, including by reference to the horse's Thoroughbred Identification Card, that if a horse is engaged to run in any race or official trial, the correct horse:
 - (a) is brought to the racecourse;
 - (b) is presented to start in the relevant race or official trial;
 - (c) starts in the relevant race or official trial.
- (2) Where a horse is brought to a racecourse, is presented to start in a race or official trial, and/or starts in a race or official trial, contrary to the provisions of subrule (1), a PRA or the Stewards must disqualify that horse from the relevant race or official trial.

[subrule added 1.1.22] Date of effect: 1 January 2022

AR 279 - NO DAMAGES FOR DECISIONS MADE UNDER THE RULES

- (1) A person is not entitled to make any claim for damages by reason or in consequence of the imposition, annulment, removal, variation, or remission of any decision made, or penalty, restriction or sanction imposed or purporting to be imposed, under the Rules.
- (2) Neither Racing Australia (including the Australian Stud Book), a PRA, a Steward, a Club, or an official shall be liable to any person for any loss or damage sustained by that person as a result of, or in any way (either directly or indirectly) arising out of the exercise of any right, privilege, power, duty, function or discretion conferred or imposed, or bona-fide believed to have been conferred or imposed, under the Rules.

[subrule amended 6.4.22]

Notification Forms

Under the Australian Rules of Racing, a notification form must be lodged when a decision has been made to retire a horse or to not commence racing a horse (AR 51) or upon the death of a horse (AR 52). Penalties may apply if failing to comply with notification obligations under the rules.

Notification forms for retirement of horses should be completed

Named horse within 1 month of the decision to retire the horse from racing or within 24 hours of the horse's death.

Unnamed horse within 1 month of the decision to not commence racing the horse, or within 24 hours of the horse's death.
