Hannah and Hawthorn excel in Off the Track

HANNAH DEEGAN began riding horses at an early age and along the way she has honed her skills to the point where she can realistically look forward to competing in major events on the national stage.

At the tender age of 19 she has already managed to deliver top class performances interstate with her Off the Track horse Hawthorn that began his thoroughbred racing career with Chris Waller in Sydney.

Hawthorn couldn't quite make the grade in the big smoke, so he was purchased by Tasmanian trainer Angela Brakey who also tried valiantly to encourage the gelding to shine on the track.

But after a few starts for Brakey, Hawthorn was offered as a pony club horse and Deegan responded to the Facebook advertisement, and the rest is history.

"I was looking for a suitable OTT horse to train and when Hawthorn passed the vet check and he felt great to ride, we took him home," Deegan said.

"I realised early in that he was guite guirky, but he has a lot of talent, and we have a great time getting to know each other."

Taking to horse riding never came easy for Deegan who followed in her older sister Alexandra's footsteps but once Hawthorn came into her life her equestrian aspirations grew rapidly.

"I started riding when I was eight and progressed to various levels over time at Fern Park Pony Club in Burnie and being a part of that club had an enormous impact on my riding capabilities.

"I loved working with different coaches, and I had some good ponies along the way.

"Alex (sister) and I had an OTT horse when I was 12 and learned early on that they are bred to run and are easier to train because of their previous living environment."

While Hawthorn and Hannah have built a solid working relationship, they have both had to work hard.

"I started riding when I was eight and progressed to various levels over time at Fern Park Pony Club in Burnie and being a part of that club had an enormous impact on my riding capabilities."





"One of my coaches once told me that you are only as good as the horse you are riding, and she was right."

Deegan is in her first year of a fast-track nursing course at university, so she must juggle studies with her riding.

Hawthorn and Deegan train and practice on an arena located on a block of land her parents purchased close to their home in Ulverstone.

"Having an arena just down the road from home is great because I can stable Hawthorn there comfortably and he is close by to feed up twice a day.

Hawthorn and Hannah have excelled in competition this past year, winning the Grade One Tasmanian Pony Club Event in March which is the highest achievement in that class.

On the national front the pair attended Equestriad in Sydney and they won their class against a strong field and that followed their efforts to win the 2020 Tasmanian Dressage Championship.

Deegan has her eyes on attending the Melbourne Three-Day Event in June next year.

"I would dearly love for us to compete in the Melbourne 3-Day Event, but it will depend on how I can work it in with my studies.

"You need Two-Star qualification to compete in that event and we don't have any events with that high a rating in Tasmania, so we will have to go to Melbourne to qualify.

"But wherever we go to compete, I am just going to continue to enjoy the journey with Hawthorn."

STILL A STAR has been given the best retirement present by being named Tasmanian Horse of the Year for season 2021-22.

The Bill Ryan-trained and part-owned mare celebrated her biggest win when she eclipsed her rivals in the \$300,000 Group 2 Rose of Kingston Stakes at Flemington in October last year.

She had only three starts for a first-up third in the Lets Elope Stakes at Flemington and at her final outing she finished out of the placings in the Group 1 Empire Rose in which she suffered a grade three internal bleed and was subsequently retired from racing.


But her Group 2 win was enough to convince those who vote on the horse of the year awards that she deserved the top gong in her final season of racing and gained the nod narrowly over champion mare Mystic Journey.

Still A Star had only 19 career starts, and left racing with the impeccable record of 10 wins and seven minor placings, of which six were seconds, for total earnings of \$873,190.

The mare was sold at the mid-year Magic Millions Broodmare sale in Queensland for \$700,000 to prominent national breeders Widden Stud.

IT came as no surprise when outstanding juvenile Bello Beau was named Tasmania's Two-Year-old of the Year for season 2021-22.

Bello Beau won three times in Tasmania, but it was his last start for the season in the \$1 million Showdown in Melbourne that made the interstate media sit up and take notice as he finished a close-up second to the highly rated Kings Consort at Caulfield in April.

Bello Beau won the Listed Elwick Stakes and Listed Gold Sovereign Stakes that clearly identified the Adam Trinder-trained gelding as the stand-out two-year-old.

The gelded son of Brazen Beau-Bella Princess is owned by Wayne Roser who enjoyed major success with his former champion race mare Mystic Journey.

Bello Beau was undefeated in Tasmania from only three starts and with his runner-up prizemoney for the \$1 Million Showdown he ended his season with \$354,000 in stakes.

HORSE OF THE YEAR AWARD WINNERS



ALPINE WOLF burst onto the scene with a scintillating win on debut at his only outing as a two-year-old and he further emphasised his ability and potential with outstanding performances at three.

The Barry Campbell-trained gelding was unanimously named Tasmanian Three-Year-Old of the Year with his efforts over distances from 1600m-2100m allowing him to deliver in Listed feature races.

Alpine Wolf (Alpine Eagle-Copper Dancer) had his colours lowered in the 3YO Cup and 3YO Trophy by Turk Warrior, but he came into his own then stretched out to longer trips.

His \$125,000 Listed Tasmanian Guineas win over 1600m was emphatic and he dug deep to emerge triumphant in the \$100,000 Listed Launceston Guineas over 2100m after which he was diagnosed with bone chips in his knee which required surgery.

2022 HALL OF FAME INJUUGES









THE Tasmanian Racing Hall of Fame has uncovered many stars of vesteryear and one of the latest discoveries is David Virtue (1867 -1919) who was a leading Tasmanian trainer for about 30 years from the late 1880's.

Virtue trained the winners of most of Tasmania's feature races and some significant Victorian races, and he made an outstanding contribution to enhancing the reputation of Tasmanian horse racing and the Australian thoroughbred industry.

He began training at Lake River, Cressy about 1888. He relocated to Carrick about 10 years later and moved his stables to Mowbray in 1916 where he remained until he died in 1919.

Virtue's Tasmanian achievements include training the winners of four Launceston Cups, two Newnham Cups and Deloraine Cups and four Longford Cups.

He also won three consecutive Tasmanian Newmarket Handicaps, two George Adams Handicaps, and three Carrick Plates.

LUKE CURRIE has been one of Tasmanian racing's unsung heroes.

It was in the latter half of his career that he started to earn the national and international recognition that his record deserves.

As a winner of 13 group 1 events, Currie ranks as one of the most successful riders Tasmania has produced.

Raised only a stone's throw from Mowbray racecourse in Launceston, the recently turned 41-year-old started his apprenticeship with his father Rick in 1996 but quickly moved to Melbourne to serve his time with legendary jockey and trainer Pat Hyland.

He has gone on to ride almost 1400 winners with wins in every state of Australia, Singapore, Malaysia, Mauritius and most recently in Hong Kong.

As well as his Group 1 wins, he has won 12 Group 2s, 20 Groups 3s and 38 Listed races and his mounts have earned total prizemoney of almost \$60 million.

Currie's first Group 1 win came back in 2003 on Roman Arch in the Toorak Handicap.

It is a measure of how his career has blossomed over time that it took him another 13 years to register his second Group 1 win on Suavito in the 2016 C F Orr Stakes.

But wins at the elite level became common with much of his new-found success coming after forming an association with trainer Tony McEvoy.

Currie has been only an occasional visitor to his home state but when he does make the trip, he usually makes it worthwhile.

Although he has ridden only 24 winners in Tasmania, they have included the Tasmanian Stakes, Conquering Stakes and Luxbet Stakes on Admiral, Gold Sovereign and Elwick Stakes on Pateena Arena for his godfather, trainer Bill Ryan, and a Listed Thomas Lyons Stakes on Road Trippin'.

He has also won feature races in Melbourne on two of Tasmania's best horses of the modern era - the Stocks Stakes on Mystic Journey and the Rose of Kingston Stakes aboard Still a Star.

MARGOT SMART has a special place in Australian racing history, being the first woman ever elected as chairman of a principal race club.

Her involvement in racing began long before her appointment to the top position at the Tasmanian Turf Club.

Margot is the daughter of the late Robert Fergusson Snr, a businessman, horse breeder and co-founder of Armidale Stud and, as such, says she can't remember a time when she wasn't interested in horses.

She had been a long-standing member of the TTC when an extraordinary vacancy on the committee occurred in 1990 and she decided to nominate.

Up until then, there had not been a woman stand for the committee of any Australian principal race club, but she was elected and served diligently for the next 16 years.

In 1996 she was elected TTC chairman, another Australian first, and held that position until 2000.

She was also the club representative on the Tasmanian Thoroughbred Racing Council for 10 years and chairman of the governing body for four years.

That position entitled her to a seat on the Australian Racing Board, again the first woman to hold such a position, and she represented the board at racing events in Japan, England, South Africa, and the USA.

In 2005, Margot's long service to thoroughbred racing and the community in general, as a Launceston City Councillor, Launceston Chamber of Commerce board member and Tasmanian Fire Service chairman, was recognised when she was awarded the Medal of The Order of Australia.

Margot Smart OAM has always been committed to the ongoing welfare of the TTC and racing industry as a whole and has never taken a backward step in making decisions and supporting policies that represent those interests.

She continues to indulge in her lifelong passion for racing as an owner.



2022 HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE

PAUL & **ELIZABETH GEARD Associates**

2022 HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE MILTON PETTIT Upgrade to Legend



PAUL AND ELIZABETH GEARD began their foray into racing and breeding at the turn of the century and just 22 years on they are icons of Tasmanian's thoroughbred industry.

They first embarked on their racing journey with pacers in 1985 but in 1999 they took a share each in a galloper trained by good friend Walter McShane and they had no idea that interest would lead to them becoming the most prominent owner-breeders of thoroughbreds in state.

The first horse they raced sparked an interest that would lead to them embracing what they once described as a bold investment.

The first horse they part-owned proved to be a duffer, so they opted to invest in yearlings at the annual Tasmanian sale in 2000.

With experience in breeding champion dairy cattle, the Geards looked at doing the same with their thoroughbred experience and the purchase of a broodmare La Quita that was in foal to Clangalang would deliver them one of the best gallopers to grace the Tasmanian turf.

La Quita's foal became Geegees Blackflash that won two Hobart Cups and a Launceston Cup as well as the state's most prestigious sprint event the Newmarket Handicap over 1200m. He also won the Derby, Tas Stakes & Conquering Stakes.

The gelding ended his illustrious racing career with stake earnings of \$1.193 million accrued from 22 wins and 17 minor placings from 69 starts, a record for a horse that only raced in Tasmania. He also is a Hall of Fame inductee.

Paul and Elizabeth invested heavily in their breeding enterprise and the arrival of stallion Wordsmith (x Testa Rossa) was not only a boon for their business but a bonanza for the state's thoroughbred breeding industry.

Wordsmith's first crop would ensure he was Tasmania's leading juvenile sire, and subsequently awarded the title of leading sire numerous times as well as being recognized as a champion sire of topproducing broodmares.

The Geards own and race all the horses they breed, and they all carry the now famous Gee Gee moniker, with Elizabeth taking on the responsibility of naming their racehorses.

Their GG Horse Stud and Racing Stables is a multi-million-dollar enterprise that at one stage provided just over 11 per cent of the acceptances at each Tasmanian thoroughbred race meeting.

MILTON PETTIT is as much a part of Tasmania's modern day racing fabric as the horses, riders and trainers who have helped mould the industry into what it is today.

Pettit was acknowledged by his peers the best way possible by being inducted into the Tasmanian Racing Hall of fame in 2017 but this year he was elevated to Legend status.

He was born in Kalgoorlie, Western Australia, where he honed his race-calling skills for four years before relocating to Victoria where he called a few harness meetings at Warragul.

"While in Victoria I heard there was a race calling job going in Tasmania, so I applied and got the job with the ABC and that eventually led to going to the commercial radio station 7HO." Milton said.

He is a people person, and it was the participants who gave him longevity in the game.

"Getting involved with owners, trainers and jockeys made the job more exciting and that's the thing that kept me going.

"We had an era in Tasmania when our group of jockeys were all class and Max Baker was one of the best and I think Brallos is the best Tasmanian horse I've seen race here."

Pettit called races in Tasmania since from 1958 to 1999 and during that time he called 41 Hobart Cups, which is a record.

Pettit loved being the course photographer but as he explained, it was tough going in the early days.

"I started the contract of course photographer at Elwick in 1960 and even though I was the race caller I hired a photographer to take the photos.

"But I also had to get someone to develop them, as well as artist to paint the colours on the jockeys' silks and someone to make the frames, so it was a costly exercise.


"But when colour photography arrived the production costs reduced significantly."

Pettit's first Hobart Cup was a memorable one.

"My first cup was 1959 and it was won by King's Thane trained by Jock Dobie and ridden by WA jockey Frank Treen, so it being won by a WA jockey made it special for me.

"I can't say I remember it as if it was yesterday, but maybe last week."

While he has no doubts about Brallos being the best horse he saw race in Tasmania he is hesitant to compare horses from different eras.



MYSTIC JOURNEY has been celebrated as one of the best thoroughbred racehorses to come out of Tasmania, so it was fitting that the mare, despite having only just ended her racing career, was this year inducted into the Tasmanian Racing Hall of Fame.

The Adam Trinder-trained mare created her own piece of racing history when she became the first Tasmanian bred, trained, and owned horse to win a Group 1.

She achieved that in the Australian Guineas as a three-year-old and to prove it was no fluke she tackled the Inaugural \$5 million All-Star Mile two weeks later and donkey-licked a star-studded field over 1600m at Flemington.

By Needs Further from White Gold, Mystic Journey was bred in Tasmania at Armidale Stud, was trained throughout her career by Trinder and owned by Wayne Roser.

Mystic Journey started her career winning her first three starts as a two-year-old including the \$100,000 Listed Elwick Stakes, but it was at three she excelled.

Her All-Star Mile win was the culmination of a six-race winning streak which included Listed and Group two level wins at Caulfield and Moonee Valley.

It was her performance to come from last, running her last 600m in 32.62 seconds to win the 2019 Lady Lynette over 1100m in Launceston prior to heading interstate for the Australian Guineas that caught the attention of racing fans nationwide.

While the Lady Lynette win was epic, so too was her win in the weight-for-age Thomas Lyons (1400m) at Elwick in which she came from last to overhaul star sprinter Hellova Street on a badly rain-affected track which clearly was not her strong suit.

Affectionately known around her Spreyton stables as 'Betty', Mystic Journey finished a creditable fifth on an unsuitable surface in the 2019 W.S Cox Plate at Moonee Valley.

She was a once in a lifetime horse for Trinder, Roser and Victorian-based jockey Anthony Darmanin who was aboard for 11 of her 12 wins

She was retired after the spring of 2021 during which she had three starts, placing in all three group events and in her final appearance she was narrowly beaten into second place in the \$1 million Group One Empire Rose over 1600m at Flemington, courtesy of a freakish ride by champion jockey Damian Oliver aboard Collette.

Mystic Journey won over distances ranging from 1000m to 1600m and her overall race record of 28 starts, 12 wins, of which one was at Group 1 level, two at Group 2 and three Listed wins, which helped take her career prize money to \$4.182 million.

Soon after her gallant second in the Empire Rose, Mystic Journey was sold for an undisclosed sum to Northern Farm Stud in Japan where she will continue her journey as a broodmare.

"Mystic Journey started her career winning her first three starts as a two-year-old including the \$100,000 Listed Elwick Stakes, but it was at three she excelled."

Apprentices enrolled in TAJP undertake a Certificate IV in Racing (Jockey) via the government training body Skillinvest. This qualification requires two years of study across 17 learning units. This provides all apprentices with a formal qualification.

The diversity and depth of this qualification can be seen in the learning units undertaken:

- · Finance.
- Compliance with regulatory, taxation and insurance.
- · Participating in racing protests and enquiries.
- · Participating in media interviews for racing.
- Prepare for self-management in racing.
- · Riding horses in jump outs.
- Preparing for race riding.
- · Riding horses in trials.
- · Setting goals to improve racing performance.
- Manage principles of sports science for jockeys.
- · Maintaining financial records.
- Processing accounts payable and receivable.
- Educating horses ready for racing.
- Modelling the responsibilities of an elite athlete.
- Designing elite athlete diets.
- Promoting and maintaining effective business relationships with racehorse owners.

SPECIALISED MINDSET TRAINING



During 2022 Tasracing included a new, specialised mindset training program for TAJP participants. This was delivered through a partnership between Tasracing, led by Stephen Maskiell, and high performance athlete coaching consultants Elite Minds.

The new six week program was delivered to all Tasmanian apprentices and track work riders on the path to becoming an apprentice.

"The career of a jockey comes with many challenges and training our apprentices to be able to best address the challenges they encounter is critical. These skills will help them not only professionally but in their personal lives too" - quote from Stephen Maskiell, Apprentice Jockey Program Manager.

The Elite Minds Program is a mindset coaching program that teaches and inspires young athletes to use their mind to achieve their sporting goals through a focus on:

- Understanding the mind.
- How to set meaningful goals.
- Changing unhelpful habits.
- Attitudes for success.
- Maintaining positive self-image.
- Creating self-belief.
- Daily activities to maintain the mind of an elite athlete.

The Elite Minds program proved a valuable addition to the TAJP in its first year of delivery. Head of the TAJP Stephen Maskiell summarised its impact:

'The power of having the skills to manage your mind as an elite athlete is critical. It was fantastic to see all our Tasmanian aspiring apprentices dive into the new program with such enthusiasm and willingness to learn. I have no doubt this new focus on giving our apprentices the tools to manage their mindsets for elite-level performance will lift the long-term success of all our graduates moving forward'.

WHEN Codi Jordan began apprenticeship, she had no goals other than to be as good as she could be at her chosen profession and see how she felt about being a jockey after a year in the saddle.

After winning the Tasmanian apprentices' premiership in her first season and by clinching the title by riding a treble at the last meeting of the season at Elwick, the mild-mannered rider was no longer thinking about assessing her future after the first year.

Jordan then set a goal to win the apprentice's title again but hoped that she would figure in the top five on the State jockeys' premiership table.

But halfway through the 2021-22 season she discovered that winning the State title was a distinct possibility,

Jordan achieved the goal by taking out the apprentice and state jockeys' title by landing

61 winners and 117 minor placegetters with a winning strike rate of 14.3 per cent and earned for the owners \$1.468 million in prizemoney.

Of her 61 wins she says winning Newmarket Handicap aboard Deroche was the most significant.

"The Newmarket is the state's best open sprint and to have been given the opportunity on such a great mare was big in itself, but to have won is amazing and the night is still a big blur," Jordan said.

Winning both titles in only her second year as an apprentice replicated what champion Tasmanian jockey Beverley Buckingham did in 1981-82, a feat that wasn't lost on Jordan.

"To achieve something that Bev Buckingham was the first to do and that nobody had done it since, is a massive achievement, so I am humbled and privileged to share that record.

"If anybody had asked me five years ago if I was capable of accomplishing such a feat, I would have said no way."

Jordan took her time deciding on becoming apprentice, a decision forced on her by her parents who insisted she finish her studies at college so she had something to fall back on should being a jockey not work out.

"I believed I couldn't do this (being a jockey) if I went into it half-hearted, so I finished my schooling and spoke to as many people as I could about what might lay ahead, so I decided let's go all-in and give it a go."

Jordan signed on with Wesley Vale trainer Glenn Stevenson who has been a great mentor for the young rider.

"I couldn't ask for a better master than Glenn (Stevenson) because he has given me the opportunities to evolve as a rider, he is always mindful of safety and the hours that we work. "And he is prepared to slave away doing afternoon feeds if I'm out improving my fitness or riding skills on a mechanical horse or the likes."

Jordan outrode her claim last season, so she is already competing like a senior rider as far as weights are she has earned the respect of all senior riders against whom she competes.

She plans to continue riding in Tasmania but from the middle of October she will reside in Adelaide, South Australia, where she will ride trackwork daily for the Leon Macdonald-Andrew Gluyas stable at Morphettville.

"I am looking forward to the SA venture, but I will continue to fly in and out so that I don't miss many or any of the Tasmanian meetings and hopefully after I've been riding work for a while, I can get the odd ride or two."

By relocating to SA Jordan will regain her three-kilogram claim at metropolitan meetings and reduce that according to how many winners she rides.

Notification Forms

Under the Australian Rules of Racing, a notification form must be lodged when a decision has been made to retire a horse or to not commence racing a horse (AR 51) or upon the death of a horse (AR 52). Penalties may apply if failing to comply with notification obligations under the rules.

Notification forms for retirement of horses should be completed

Named horse within 1 month of the decision to retire the horse from racing or within 24 hours of the horse's death.

Unnamed horse within 1 month of the decision to not commence racing the horse, or within 24 hours of the horse's death.

Stewards Segment



Treatment Books - trainers are reminded of their obligation to record all treatments in a properly formatted and maintained treatment record books. Recent inspections have identified deficiencies in this area, and we ask that you comply with this important aspect of our operations.

Matters Effecting Performance - From time-to-time reasons/explanations for a horse's disappointing performance may not become evident until after the race meeting has concluded. When such reasons/explanations are found then these should be conveyed to the Stewards. At the same time, it is a reminder to riders to ensure they report anything that may affect the performance of their horse in a trial or race.

Timeliness – As racing has become more and more a television spectacle there is a demand on administrators to ensure that we present a product that meets both industry best practice and expectations. From the Stewards end this means ensuring our races start on time and are not delayed by matters that can be avoided. While acknowledging that sometimes we will encounter issues (horses can be unpredictable) with respect to presenting horses in the parade area on time, we nonetheless ask that all trainers place emphasis on ensuring that they are in the parade area by the prescribed time.

Barrier Manners – Over recent months the number of horses requiring to trial because of poor barrier behaviour has increased. The consequence of such bad behaviour is a risk to not only their riders but also to other horses. Additionally, this conduct reflects poorly on the Tasmanian industry. Moving forward the Stewards will be taking a stricter approach with respect to barrier conduct with the aim being to better protect not only rider and horse, but also provide for a greater overall safety for all participants.

Late Rider Notifications – Trainers are advised that if you are finding it difficult to obtain the services of rider, and the declaration deadline has past, then the Stewards must be advised. In such instances the Stewards may be able to assist by advising of those riders that may not have engagements in the race causing difficulty.

Trials and Jump Outs - Stewards now manage and monitor the running of jump outs at trials. Any changes to the jump outs must be approved by Stewards prior to the jump outs being conducted. Stewards, in consultation with Tasracing may make changes to the composition of the jump out fields.
